



Hope For Mombasa's

AT ONE point I feared there would be nothing tangible to show for the much publicised European Union Project in the Old Town of Mombasa but was reassured when I saw two buildings that have been restored.

This multi million shilling fund given to the National Museums for the Revitalisation of Swahili Culture at the Coast had so far built a new centre at Gedi, done renovations at Takwa and Lamu but I had seen nothing on the ground in Mombasa.

Mombasa, which after all is the main centre of the Swahili Coast and where the administrative office for the project was located

So I must confess I was relieved and same small part of my faith restored in international aid organisations, when I saw these two buildings glistening in all their newly restored glory.

In June last year a Community Trust Fund had been launched with much pomp and ceremony at Fort Jesus.

Hopes were raised.

Tasteful give-away were handed out to favoured guests But still nothing was actually

The Trust Fund totalling 30 million shillings to be split between the old towns of Lamu and Mombasa was specifically earmarked for restoring the historic buildings.

In line with current thinking the money allocated was not to be an out and out gift, but was to require a degree of community participation.

Owners of buildings were requested to come forward, fill in a form and apply for a grant for the restoration of their building.

The work done would be under supervision from the Old Town Conservation office and using specified qualified craftsmen

House owners were expected to contribute percentage either in funds or material.

Sorting out the free loaders who just wanted a new extension on their house done on the cheap and the wishful thinkers who hoped for a total rebuild costing millions, was not an easy task

Eventually strict criteria had to be adopted where a fixed budget was allowed per house and of course the building in question had to be of proven historic merit.

The location was also important so it was decided to concentrate on the main tourist route - Vasco da Gama Road, Government Square, Thika Street and Ndia Kuu.

One of the stated aims of the European Union Project had been to promote tourism and employment in the Swahili Old Towns so they decided to concentrate the funds to create a showcase along the major roads rather than diluting the effect in the back streets where it would not be seen.

The first two buildings to be restored under this scheme are now finished.

They are situated opposite the Mandhry Mosque and are well worth a visit.

No doubt this extension was an incentive as householders were proving reluctant to come forward unless they could see a definite personal benefit.

It seems therefore that the conservation ethic is not well understood and restoration for its own sake is not something

important of all, instead of depressingly endless talk and no do, here is a physical result.


Hopefully the repair and restoration of one of the collapsed balconies will be the next on the list.

This would be a practical improvement to uplift living standards and enhance the appearance of the main street. The restoration work has been

carried out by craftsmen trained at the Swahili Cultural Centre, local men working in their own area to help their own community.

This also is an encouraging trend as unemployment is high among the youth of Old Town.

If local manpower can be properly harnessed in restoring and maintaining the old buildings so that tourists are tempted back to the shops and streets then jobs will be created and prosperity will walk once more and the Old Town Project will have achieved what it set out to do.

IN A SPEECH delivered at a Hoover Institution Conference before The National Press Club in Washington, D.C. in 1995, Stephen Moore, Director of Fiscal Studies at the influential Cato Institute writes that there are four benchmarks by which a tay system must be measured.

tax system must be measured. Impact on economic growth, Complexity, Intrusiveness and Visibility.

In Kenya, under Structural Adjustment Programmes mandated by the IMF and World Bank, we abandoned a universal sales tax in favor of value added tax (VAT).

In addition to VAT, Kenyans also pay income tax

Both these taxes are progressive (that is graduated), albeit the term progressive is a misnomer because graduated taxes are not fair or equitable in

They tax some groups at disproportionately higher rates

They also hurt individuals who

On all of Moore's measures,

climb up the economic ladder

Too Much Tax Will Kill You In The End

Graduated income tax and VAT limit economic growth by taxing more productive citizens more heavily

They limit the individual's incentive to work.

They discourage savings and investment because they involve double taxation - after-tax double taxation - after-tax income that is invested in stocks, bonds and similar investments is taxed again in the form of withholding taxes on dividends and interest income.

Income tax and VAT tend to be complicated and impose enormous compliance costs on individuals and businesses

Many small entrepreneurs in Kenya today will attest to this

These taxes are also inconspicuous (they are withheld at the source or absorbed in the quoted retail prices of goods and services) and this makes them easy increase without pub

They also facilitate the creation of powerful tax agencies which undermine economic freedom.

Today, the Kenya Revenue Authority requires that you estimate your annual personal income or business revenue when filing your returns - the socalled presumptive taxation method

The Kenya government presumes to know how much you will (or should) make and taxes your income even before you have made it.

Not to mention that KRA agents

seize private property on the mere appearance of tax evasion.

The burden of proof is on not exactly constitutional.

VAT in particular has been used liberally in European economies in addition to punitive income tax

The result has been low nivestment, high inflation and unemployment

Despite the damnation of these tax policies provided by empirical evidence, the Bretton Woods institutions continue to push them as panacea for the sluggishness of the Kenyan and other

It is not surprising that Kenyans pay indirectly for these ills without so much as a whimper because Bretton Woods policies are held sacrosanct in our nation

In "The Lexus and The Olive ree", a current New York fimes bestseller, Thomas riedman, a big government liberal, provides a surprisingly astute analysis of the rules a country must follow to succeed in the global economy.

He calls it (in characteristic fashion) the Golden Straightjacket.

Among the rules are eliminating or lowering tariffs on imports and eliminating government corruption, subsidies and kickbacks as much as possible.

He writes, "As your country outs on the Golden Straight acket, two things tend to happen: your economy grows

Government waste and corruption are made possible by unlimited tax-collecting power.

If even a big government liberal can recognize the benefits of minimum taxation, then we need a new radical thinking on our tax

Scrap all existing taxes and replace them with a single-rate sales tax.

Moore writes that a national ales tax (such as the one Kenya had in the 1970s) is the most preferable tax regime.

For one, if it replaces graduated taxes, it will encourage rapid economic growth, and the resultant boom will yield more tax revenue for government operations

Second, it will vastly reduce

All the deadweight losses as a

accountants and lawyers to find tax loopholes will be eliminated.

A low, flat tax rate means individuals will have less of an incentive to evade taxes (that is illegally not pay them altogether).

There will be no more double

Third, and perhaps most significant, it will eliminate the need for large, intrusive state bureaucracies such as the KRA because tax-collecting responsibility will be dissipated to local governments and municipalities.

And finally, the point-of-sale nature of a sales tax makes it highly visible, and politicians will have to work harder to justify

For example, .ke is used for Kenya, .us is used for United States, .uk or .gb is used for United Kingdom or Great Britain. There are an amazing number of countries connected to the Net, all having their own designated domains.

It is easy to identify and it gives the country distinction. There are six common top-level domain types that are non-eographical:

.com for commercial organizations, such as apple.com .net for network organizations such as internic.net. .gov for parts of governments within the United States, uch as nasa.gov.

.edu for organizations of higher educations, such as mit.edu .mil for nonclassified military networks, such as army.mil. org for organizations that do not otherwise fit the commercial or educational designations, such as apdk.org.
