## MOON NEWS

on the winter solstice, Wednesday, December 22, commonly called first day of winter in the Northern Hemisphere.

Since a full moon on the winter solstice occured in conjunction with a lunar perigee the moon appeared about 14 per cent larger than it does at apogee.

Also, since the Earth is several million miles is several million miles closer to the sun at this time of the year than in the summer, sunlight striking the moon is about seven per cent stronger, making it appear much brighter.

In laymen's terms it was a super bright full moon, much more than the usual, AND it won't happen again this way for another 133 years!

### **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ON RAMADHAN**

Q. How did the fast during Ramadan become obligatory for Muslims?

A: The revelations from God to the Prophet Muhammad that would eventually be compiled as the Quran began during Ramadan in the

year 610, but the fast of Ramadan did not become a religious obligation for Muslims until the year

The obligation to fast is explained in the secondchapter of the Quran

"O ye who believe ! Fasting is prescribed to you as it was prescribed to those before you, that ye may (learn) self-restraint
. Ramadan is the (month) in
which was sent down the Quran,
as a guide to mankind, also clear (Signs) for guidance and judgment (between right and wrong). So every one of you who is present (at his home) during that month should spend it in

.. " (Chapter 2, verses 183

and 185)

Q. What do Muslims believe they gain from fasting?

A: The main benefits of Ramadan are an increased

compassion for those in need of the necessities of life, a sense of self-purification and reflection and a renewed focus on spirituality.

Muslims also appreciate the feeling of togethemess shared by family and friends throughout the month.

Perhaps the greatest practical benefit is the yearly lesson in self-restraint and discipline that can carry forward to other aspects of a Muslim's life such as work and

education.

Q. Do people normally lose weight during Ramadan?

A: Some people do lose weight, but others may not.

It commended that meals eaten during Ramadan be light, but most people can't resist sampling special sweets and foods associated with Ramadan

Q. Why does Ramadan begin on a different day each year?

A: Because Ramadan is a lunar month, it begins about eleven days earlier each year.

Throughout a Muslim's lifetime, Ramadan will fall both during winter months, when the days are short, and summer months, the days are long and the fast is more difficult. In this way, the difficulty of the fast is evenly distributed between Muslims living in the northern and southern hemispheres.

Q. What is Lailat-ul-Qadr ?

A: Lailat-ul-Qadr ("Night of Majesty") marks the anniversary of the night on which the Prophet Muhammad first began receiving revelations from God, through the angel Gabriel.

An entire chapter in the Quran deals with this night:

"We have indeed revealed this (Message) in the Night of Majesty: and what will explain to thee what the Night of Majesty is?

The Night of Majesty is better

Therein come down the angels and the Spirit by God's permission, on every errand.

Peace ! .
morn." (C (Chapter 97)

Muslims believe Lailat-ul-Qadr is one of the last odd-numbered nights of Ramadan.







The skillful use of colour sprinkled into minute detail, creates a rich repertoire of designs and pictures as will be seen in this display.

The 24 ladies under the main artist Mrs. Vibha Shah have been working tirelessly for the past eight weeks preparing groundwork to create this masterpiece.

It will take them six days to draw on the floor and apply powder colour on the design and two for the grand flower display which will also be part of this event.

The approximate size of the Rangoli will be 30 feet in diameter.



Kate Hoey, the Sports Minister, also discussed the issue at a meeting with sports women.

Institutions might be able to maintain some single-sex facilities during certain periods if this was felt necessary for the sake of "privacy and decency".

Gyms could hold women-only or men-only sessions in their swimming pools if members wanted this for religious reasons.

Ministers want to ensure that some women-only facilities are kept and hope that by including such a dispensation it would allow single-sex gyms, saunas and Turkish baths to continue for male and female users.
