That is, standing in prayer on that night is better than the actions of that man.

It is also narrated that night of Al-Qadr being better than a thousand months means that the good deeds performed on it, fasting on it and standing in prayer on it are better than a thousand months' good deeds, prayers and fasting.

Likewise, it is narrated that whoever goes to Friday prayers neatly-dressed, with a pure intention, it will be written for him the reward of a year's good deeds, as if he had fasted on it and spent its nights in prayer and in other acts of worship.

It is reported from Abu Hurairah that he said:

"When the month of Ramadhaan







Mr Dalip Singh Danjal, prominent coast personality was selected interim chairman by the founding sub-committee.

The other participants included Mr. J. S. Garbiyal the Assistant Commissioner of India to Mombasa, Mr. Noorudin Tejpar, Mr. Natu Nathwani, Mr. Ivan Fernandes Mr. S. C. Jain, Dr. Dinesh Soni and Mr. Anil Karndar,

KIFA a non-political, non-profit making association would work as a branch of KIFA Nairobi registered under the Kenyan law.

The asso-ciation would work in close cooperation with Kenyan and Indian institutions with a view to promote better under-standing between Kenyans and indians to the mutual advantage of both.






Mr. Strecker first visited Kenya 12 years ago and each year he leaves a Kenyan Charity the richer for his efforts.

EAST AFRICAN WOMEN'S LEAGUE MILLENNIUM PROJECT

NESTLING NEAR the Jumba Ruins at Mtwapa, once a thriving Islamic town on Kenya's north coast, will soon be a lovely retirement home for frail and elderly folk, regardless of ethnic background, with medical care - if needed.

Named Kilulu (meaning Pearl' in Swahili) and of a rich Swahili style of architecture it will comprise unfurnished semi-detached cottages in either bed-sitter, one or two bedroomed units with dining room and lounge, kitchen, offices etc. on a three acre plot

This is presently being lenced, trees and shrubs planted, a sweet water well excavated and staff quarters built.

Those interested can buy a unit while a monthly charge (set at a non-profit making level) will be made to cover meals, care, security, water, electricity, general maintenance and the necessary staff.

A 'Show Home' is presently being built for viewing.

The idea of providing a badis needed retirement home at the coast was the brainchild of the East African Women's League and the 'dream' of Rola Kissling.

She named it 'Kilulu' but, unfortunately, diedbefore it could

It was Pola's family that donated Kshs. 2 million to EAWL towards making her 'dream' come true.

Rola had named it after the dream home she once had, and lost, at Watamu.

Then, some caring members of Mombasa's business community joined together with EAWL members to form 'Kilulu Ltd' whilst meanwhile seeking 'charity

It was three years ago that fund-raising started earnest, the very first donation

having come from Rola's family followed by Kshs. 1 million from Pat and Maia Hemphill thus enabling land to be bought.

The building of a 'Show Home' was made possible by two Trusts providing most of the funds.

However, with a depressed economy, plus the slump in tourismatthe coast, fund-raising, which has never been easy, became virtually impossible.

It is understood that similar homes up-country were luckily bequeathed legacies, thus making their establishment much

At the coast they are having to start from scratch and even putting in the infrastructure, including water and electricity, is a very costly exercise.

It was Jill Simpson from Gilgil who had been on Charity Walks before (in camel country for Gertrude's Garden) who came up with the idea of a similar walk for 'Kilulu' with cars instead of camels as 'support'.

DELIGHTED

Itattracted eleven intrepid senior citizens in an 'Oldies' for Oldies' walk who were delighted to find afterwards that their effort had raised over Kshs. 1.4 million, thus swelling the 'Kilulu' kitty to around Kshs. 31/2 million

The 132 Km Walk over eight days and sleeping under canvas at night, was organised by Ursula Brenneisen of Mombasa who is also Chairman of the Kilulu Fund Raising Committee.

The age range of participants was between, 60 - 85, the average age being 65!

Through this radio contact they heard, on the very first day, that Jill's friend, Mirni Merttens in the UK, had managed to raise £1,700 for 'Kilulu' at a coffee-morning cum plant sale, while other good news was that Pam Eccles of Rongai Workshops now had a tenth grandchild.

There were one or two scares in the animal kingdom of Tsavo East

An elephant disputed a 'Dongo' crossing and the KWS Rangers had to sort it out through tactful persuasion, while one morning it was discovered that lions had walked just a few feet away from

(Obviously, not of the same breed as those who used to raid workers' camps at Voi when the railway was being built to select dinner for themselves!)

dinner for themselves !)

These senior citizens, covered about 15 Kms a day, setting off early in the morning and resting in the afternoon, with much to observe in the way of flora, fauna and bird life which included twenty pelicans circling above them in the Aruba area and large herds of elephant coming to the dam, also buffalo: zebra, giraffe and lion. buffalo, zebra, giraffe and lion.

The 'Walk' for such a worthy cause also attracted comestible support with gifts of fruit, nuts, rice, pasta, UHT Milk, fruit juice emergency dawas and 'Clearly Kenyan' drinking water so that no time was wasted in having to boil water and filter river water.

ENJOYABLE

Participants themselves made handsome food and beverage contributions and dinner around a camp fire at night was a much looked forward to culinary

It proved to be a most enjoyable and social way of raising money for 'Kilulu' with unexpected friends dropping in at their camps to say

The last leg (10 Km) ended at Satao Camp with supporters and staff greeting their arrival together with chilled towels and a fruit juice/ bubbly welcome drink.

Lunch was enjoyed with great austo

The 'Kilulu' project was born when various concerned individuals realised there are many elderly folk across the ethnic divide in the Coast Province who

need support. For some of them age has taken an unkind toll of their health.

Others have lost their life partners and are exceedingly lonely.

Perhaps their children have offered homes, but the accommodation may be crowded.

If they no longer live at the coast or have left the country it means a major upheaval which they would prefer not to do if there was a retirement home for them at the

At the moment there is none catering for middle-class elderly folk

It is a growing problem which can no longer be ignored and there is also the question of security for those living alone in

It was this which prompted the idea of establishing such a home. Chairman of the Board of Directors of Kilulu Ltd. is Beverley Herd, Deputy Chairman, Geoff Turner and members - John Antoni (alt. Audrey Antoni); Ursula Brenneisen; Peter Doenhoff, Maia Hemphill; Mike Kirkland (alt. Elizabeth Tsakiris and Geoff Weeks).

Declarer won in hand, drew East's third trump and played the Ace of Spades and conceded the fourth round of the suit to West's Queen.

He lost to the Ace of Hearts and went one down.

Declarer should have led his Singleton Knave of hearts at the second trick.

West rises with the Ace of Hearts and East overtakes his King of Clubs switch with the Ace to play the Three of Trumps.

Declarer wins with dummy's five - if East had led the Ten of trumps declarer would unblock the Seven and win the Knave and continue by leading the King of Hearts, discarding a Spade and ruffing a low Heart, noting the fall of the Queen.

He crosses to Knave of Diamonds and discards his two remaining Spades on the two established Heart winners.

If We Are Not Y2K Compliant The **Vehicles Do Not Stand A Chance**

THE millennium we have all been talking about and preparing for is with us today.

Those involved in the Information Technology world have hyped up this date to no end such that a new phrase has firmly etched itself in current vocabulary and that is the "millennium bug". Even tiny tots have learned to pronounce the words and also know what it is.

What will happen at midnight on December 1, 1999 is not clear but we sure have done all

we can to prepare for it.

Billions of dollars have been spent worldwide in ensuring that all the risks have been analysed and understood and where possible, "fixes have been patched on.

National committees were formed to drive the efforts of key organisations.

Being Y2K compliant is the buzzword and certification by independent bodies has been seen as proof that organisations have done all that is technically possible to beat the bug.

The last stage in the whole effort has been contingency planning. In this one assumes that despite all that has been done there is still the remote chance that something has been missed and will go wrong.

In this area, there is very little that has been said. Most organisations have told us that they are Y2K compliant and large adverts and features in the papers have been the in thing.

Very few have said what their contingency planning is. Round the world there is plenty that has been done, some very sober and others rather radical.

Where the risks of anything going wrong are high and the consequences serious, some organisations have decided that they will suspend operations

Large chemical processes that have batch operations are typical ones which will shutdown

The impact of releasing large quantities of chemical into a neighbourhood if systems fall has made the decision prudent.

Nuclear power plants in some parts of the world are to be shutdown for similar reasons.

Some airlines will ground their aircraft despite the fact that the manufacturers have certified

their planes to be compliant.

Some have decided that they will have all the emergency services at the ready to mitigate any unforeseen happenings.

Alroots for example have decided that they would have all their emergency services on standby in case of plane emergencies. Manual systems are available in case automated systems stop functioning.

Other organisations have allowed for a change to manual mode the instant things are seen to

be going haywire.

People have been told to be available for the

rollover period just in case they are needed.
The contingency planning has meant that a lot of people who would have otherwise gone on holiday and witnessed the coming of the millennium in some exotic far off place have had to stay behind just in case.

This has affected tourist bookings in a lot of countries, Kenya included.

What does all this Y2K frenzy mean to motorists? Very little.


There are very few cars that have date dependant chips in engine critical components

already passed and the residual risk is very small. For those of us who will be driving to celebrate the New Year away from our homes it is time to take care.

The millennium for some means a big, big binge. There will be a lot drunk and eaten and the chances of having accidents will be highest this New Year than in any other.

Bars hotels, clubs and other places have stocked up with beers, spirits and other items that bring cheer

Before we go and commit ourselves to the cheer let us consider the following. For medical purposes, alcohol is measured in units of ethyl alcohol.




