

#### Spanish Subtle Flavour

SPANISH cooking, like the country and its people, is colourful, lively and robust

It owes much to the influences of various people, and countries that have played a part in their

most commonly used ingredients, were introduced long ago by the Romans. Garlic and olive oil, two of the

Arab invaders brought saffron, spices like nutmeg and pepper and, even more important, sugar.

The discovery of America by Columbus, in 1492 changed cooking immeasurably, bringing new ingredients like potatoes, tomatoes, peppers, chillies and chocolate, which have all become endemic to the Spanish cuising.

There has been considerable give and take between Spain and France.

The Spanish have learnt subtlety and refinement from French cooking while the French, although they tend to look down on Spanish cooking as rather crude, owe more to Spain than its resulted. is usually realised

Alioli, the famous Spanish garlic sauce was the inspiration

for the French Aioli, and the tortilla, the hearty Spanish omelette, preceded the more delicate French omelette.

#### SOPA DE **TOMATE**

(Tomato Vegetable Broth) Cooking time: 30 mins. Preparation time: 20 mins. Main cooking utensil

For six people you need:

two lbs. tomatoes, choose 8 very small ones four medium-sized onions two cloves garlic (optional)

four tablespoons oil water, and two chicken stock cubes

three-inch piece cucumber

one green pepper about 1/4 small cabbage

Tomato soup is a favourite in Portugal, and tomatoes are used in soups with a variety of ingredients.

Chop 1 ½ lbs. large tomatoes, do not skin, for the soup is generally sieved.

Peel and chop three of the onions and crush the garlic

Heat three table-spoons oil and toss the tomatoes and onions in this, then add the stock, or water and stock cubes.

Season well and simmer for 15-20 minutes, sieve and put on

Slice the remaining onion, the cucumber and the pepper, discarding core and seeds, and shred the cabbage.

Toss in remaining oil for a few minutes, add remaining skinned tomatoes, heat for a few minutes only. Add the sieved mixture and heat together gently until soup is very hot.

To serve: With crusty bread. To vary: Add sliced hard-boiled





### SEVENTH FREEMASONS' CONFERENCE - MOMBASA, AUGUST 25-26, 2000

THE ANCIENT fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons is the oldest and largest secular fraternal and charitable organisation in the world.

It has an estimated membership of over seven million in more than 114 Grand Lodges throughout the world.

The Grand Lodge is the administrative authority in its territory, which is known as the jurisdiction.

It consists of free and equal representation of its constituent lodges, it is independent, sovereign and self-governing and is formed and maintained by the Freemasons of its jurisdiction.

It assumes through written constitutions, all legislative powers of its constituent lodges together with wide administrative and judicial powers.

It is controlled by a Grand Master, elected annually by the members of the Grand Lodge.

It is generally believed that the Freemasons originated in England in the late 16th or early 17th century, descending directly or indirectly from the craft of medieval stonemasons.

Indirectly by operative lodges accepting non-operative members who gradually took over and transformed the lodges into purely speculative units.

Directly, in that a group of men inferested in promoting tolerance in an intolerant age came together and adopted the stonemasons' tools and customs as allegorical aids to teach their precepts through a series of ritual dramas.

It is believed by some historians, but by no means all, that Freemasoury is directly descended from associations of operative masons, the cathedral builders of the middle ages who travelled through Europe enjoying the secrets and skills of their crafts.

Freemasonry teaches moral

lessons and self-knowledge.

Freemasonry offers its member an approach to life which seeks to reinforce thoughtfulness for others, kindness in the community, honesty, courtesy in the society and fairness in all things.

Members are urged to regard the interest of the family as paramount but importantly Freemasonry teaches and practices concern for people, care for the less fortunate and help for those in need.

FREEMASONRY is not a religion.

It has no theology and does not teach any route to salvation.

Freemasonry requires a belief in God and its principles are common to many of the world's great religions.

Freemasonry does not try to replace religion or be a substitute for it.

Every Freemason is exhorted to practice his religion and to regard its holy book as the unerring standard of truth.

Freemasonry does not instruct its members in what their religious belief should be, nor does it offer sacraments.

Freemasonry deals in relations between men; religion deals in man's relationship with his God and its membership includes Christians, Jews, Hindus, Sikhs, Muslims, Parsees and others.

Freemasonry is not a secret society but lodge meetings, like those of many other groups, are private and open only to members. The rules and aims of Freemasonry are available to the public.

Members are encouraged to speak openly about Freemasonry.

The Grand Lodge organises itself with administrative structures - Provincial and District Grand Lodges - although this does not entail devolution of masonic powers but it does delegate to these Provincial or District Grand Masters and Grand Officers are appointed and these bodies meet generally on an annual basis.

The District of East Africa was constituted in October 1926 with 14 Lodges in Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and Zanzibar as its constituents.

THE FIRST Masonic Hall in Mombasa was located in a building known as Tangana Hall, which is now Babu Motors in Moi Avenue.

There is little record in this hall except that it was reported as being rather stuffy, poorly ventilated and until 1921, oil lamps were used.

In 1920, Sir Ali Bin Salim, a generous and very influential local dignitary, offered to donate a plot for a permanent Masonic Hall.

He offered a choice of three plots and the present site was chosen

In 1922 the new Masonic Hall was built of mud and wattle.

In 1930 a more permanent and larger Hall was built adjoining the original hall.

By the early 1950s there was need for a larger hall and one was built behind the existing August 2, 1909, attended a meeting of Lodge Harmeny in Nairobi.





Adding 'the tourism agenda, as I would call ourselves, should be able to push its case forward, whatever it might be, and shout scream to make its

She explained the time for pushing our case is very ripe, for now everybody seems to

Adding 'tourism, which for many years had been the No. 1 earner of foreign exchange, had fallen to fourth place after tea, coffee and horticulture.

This year the rains had falled and tourism is likely to be once again the largest earner of foreign exchange, but we must be able to push our case.

On the subject of 'where KTB is going', Mrs. Buyu said 'a point I would like to bring up is that o recognition from all stakeholders as to the capability of KTB

She explained 'today it has only a team of 15 people

It is restructuring and has to get more people on the ground'.

She pleaded 'give us a little time to be able to get things in

On the question of funding and accusations of KTB spendir 'lot' of funds, she pointed that in 1999 government had only allocated Kshs. 40 million to KTB for the entire financial year.

Their stand at the International Tourism Bourse in Berlin, the largest tourism fair in the world, had cost something like Kshs. 32 million, in addition to which KTB has the cost of running its office.

For destination marketing, Egypt had received US Dollars 50 million (about Kshs. 4 billion) and South Africa US Dollars 20 illion (close to Kshs. 1.6 billion)

#### DESTINATION MARKETING

This year, KTB had been much luckier being allocated Kshs. 90 million for destination marketing, maintaining itself and for the restructuring process.

Last year's allocation had been (shs. 40 million.

Continuing Mrs. Buyu said 'from the European Union we are going to get Kshs.100 million'.

Here Mrs. Buyu mentioned that it costs close to Kshs. 1 million to get just a page in one tour operator's brochure alone.

She went on 'customers are becoming more sophisticated more educated and more trave experienced and they deman increasingly higher standards

They are looking for better value for money and transparent cost structures as they make comparative value judgements.

She urged those in the tourist industry 'deliver the goods that you promised'

Said Mrs. Buyu 'the key issues facing Kenya's tourist industry, therefore, is a complete repositioning of its product to satisfy future international tourists and effectively communicate the new image current and potential source

image problem and it was very encouraging to hear from a French tour operator only recently that we have a fantastic product

Their clients had been asked to rate the destinations they had visited in terms of their experiences and that of the product offered

Kenya was rated No. 3 after Thailand and Vietnam with Egypt coming much behind being classed as too congested.

Explaining why KTB had opted not to be involved with Tourist Offices abroad she said 'in order to be able to go ahead we must work out a plan on how we are going to handle the market.

We have consulted government and said we would be able to develop a market representation network by having representatives in various markets together with PR consultants who will also be and international

So we are going to employ more marketeers who will, initially, be working very closely with marketing representatives

In about 18 months time they will be sent to those markets as we must have Kenyans based there.

That is the objective

They will be sitting in premises with these representatives so as to be able to reduce costs.

Mrs. Buyu also revealed 'last week we received the Board's approval to be able to engage the services of somebody to do the sourcing of people for us

Our target is that by the end of September or mid-October we shall be pressing the button and everyone should be in place raring to go'

She explained 'until we get these people in place it is quite an uphill task to even try and service your needs

The emphasis will be on regaining lost business in our key source markets which are Germany, UK, USA, France, Italy and Switzerland and not looking at potential markets

It is also important' she said 'to erase the perception held by many of Kenya being a cheap mass market destination and to raise the quality of tourists that

Here Mrs. Buyu said 'something that is cracking my mind at the moment is that if we are not making enough money to carry out necessary improvements we can't attract visitors to come and pay more

She asked 'how can we help in such a situation' adding 'I think it is to the Kenya Tourism Development Corporation that you should be talking because they deal with investment

(NB .Some time ago the industry did appeal government for soft loan to b help improvements urgently needed to help maintain and improve standards, to which there has been no response)

Continuing Mrs. Buyu set many hoteliers minds at rest when she said 'we will never ignore the beach', explaining 'the beach and safaris are our core product and the centre of our business'.

She revealed that at the World Travel Market in London we are going to have a Safari Camp / concentrating on the attractions to be found the coast, including golf courses and the other on safaris

On talking about the more judicious use of its funds she

gave as an example that 'the WTM stand we are making will

On the subject of Product Objectives Mrs. Buyu also mentioned that when in the UK she had met the Chief Executive of the International Association of Golf Tour Operators to try and encourage them to bring the golf travel market to Kenya in the

An approach is also being made to attract Cricket Knock-Out Tournaments here to play matches in Mombasa and in

#### **ON ATTRACTING** REPEAT GUESTS

Mrs. Buyu also mentioned how lucky Kenya is in attracting so many 'repeat' guests, saying 'about 50 per cent of those coming here want to come back

She told the industry 'we hope to make our own 'Destination Kenya' video soon, but in the meantime have been using the Ministry's 'Exotic Kenya' which is now rather old.

We then hope to produce a 'Destination Kenya' brochure as well as smaller brochures on specific subjects - I Safaris, History, etc.

In his observations earlier Mr. Sondhi had said the main thrust in the 1999-2002 Marketing Plan

potentially a big market with very high returns.

While we don't want to open new markets right now we are already in the USA and ASTA has been doing an extremely good job in that market.

What KTB is saying is that it is high time we raised our profile as Kenya in that market'

She explained the Road Show from September 18-23 covering Vancouver, Seattle, Los Vancouver, Seattle, Los Angeles and Las Vegas is 'not being done by KTB but by ASTA using their own funds.

KTB is going along with a delegation from all sections of the Ministry of Tourism, Trade and Industry to visit these

Replied Mrs. Buyu 'PR and press contacts will be taken care of and we are co-ordinating with media houses outside'.

The 20-page discussion paper 'DESTINATION MARKETING DESTINATION MARKETING presented by the KAHC, Coast Chairman, Harald Kampa, had concluded 'since the issues raised here are mainly beyond the scope of the Board, the association recommends that KTB should immediately arrange for an urgent meeting between for an urgent meeting between KAHC and the Minister for Tourism, Trade & Industry, Mr K.N. Biwott, to discuss them

The meeting ended with Irs. Buyu being thanked the 'enlightening us on issues which are very much at the heart of Destination Kenya marketing by the KAHC, Coast Executive Officer David Destination with a coast Executive Coast Caree Co Officer, David Osiro, who also thanked the Directors Travellers Beach Hotel making their conference to and refreshments available

It appears that many members, some with hotels barely able to exist, have lost hope after three years of talking and waiting for the industry's recovery.

Hence, the meeting was not well attended which is a share as much more than ever before is being planned for its revial.



### Preserving Our Heritage - Swahili Cultural Centre Is Doing Some Wonderful Work With 'Mombasa Old Town Conservation Office'

GOOD NEWS: Your correspondent and Coastweek's "Coastdrive" column both commented favourably on pot-hole filling activities.

This blaze of attention seems to have been too much for the hole fillers, who promptly disappeared leaving our pot holes to re-establish themselves and flourish with the on going showery weather

This is not strictly speaking, good news, but I promise that if I ever see another pot-hole being filled, I'll keep the secret to myself and not write a word about it.

But do not despair, good things ARE happening in our town as related hereafter.

#### **OLD TOWN** CONSERVATION

After decades of neglect and decay the first glimmers of conservation of historical buildings and sites were initiated decay the fit in Lamu District some thirty years

It seems strange that in a country, where the concepts of wildlife conservation had been accepted as long ago as the 1940's, it took another 30 years before even the first efforts were made to conserve what man had created in this land.

And then still another 15 years before conservation eventually came to Mombasa.

Many fine buildings were lost forever, to be replaced by concrete towers or heaps of

But weep no longer

Things are getting better

In 1985 the Mombasa Old Town Conservation Programme was launched and by 1991, the "Mombasa Old Town Conservation Area" was gazetted as a monument

As we discussed in our August newsletter, conservation of wildlife and the subsequent manipulation of the natural environment can be full of pitfalls in spite of the best of intentions and the same can be said for conserving historical towns which are inhabited by people

Before any conservation of inhabited buildings can be effected, first those who own and inhabit the buildings have to be convinced of the usefulness of the project.

It has been quite an up-hill struggle to have the programme accepted but recently real progress has been made and the house owners are able to see for themselves the benefits of co-operating with the programme.

buildings, who destroyed them to avoid having their property "conserved", now regret their

The Mombasa Old Town Conservation Office, with the financial support of the European Union, is offering property owners a very handsome deal

If the owner agrees to have his property renovated to the requirements of MOTCO, he then contributes only 25 per cent of the cost of the work and the whole project is handled by the Swahili Cultural Center as implementing contractors.

As the average cost to restore one building is about K Shs. 2.5 million, the property owners are getting a very good deal indeed.

Interested readers can see for themselves the first fruits of the programme by taking a stroll down Mbarak Hinawy road (leading to the Old Port past the Mombasa Club).

Half way down the street, just before the Mandry Mosque you come across a cluster of renovated houses.

Two adjoining houses belonging to the Badawi family and Sheikh Saleh Taib, on your and Sheikh Saleh Talb, on your right hand side, were completely renovated last year and the house of Sheikh Ali Al Mandhry across the road, is in the final

Kuu with the building housing the Bahari Boutique, the house of Bi. Hafsa Taib and the Gharwan dried fish warehouse being lined up for treatment.

The whole concept has widespread ripples of benefit through out the area, which is now coming back to life after years of neglect and has inspired many other householders to do their own renovations and

Swahili Cultural Centre, which faced a very uncertain future a couple of years age, and couple of years age, and generates employment in this formerly economically depressed area.

A sign of the returning pride in their home area is the emergence of The Kibokoni Self-help Society, (KISHESO.), who keep a watchful eye on security, drugs, cleanliness and social assistance in the conservation






