## INTENSIVE CARE UNIT TO RE-OPEN AT MOMBASA AGA KHAN HOSPITAL

The Intensive Care Unit (ICU) at The Aga Khan Hospital, Mombasa is set to re-open and will be operational before the end of September.

The four-bed unit has recently undergone major refurbishment and modernisation concurrently with the development of the hospital's new theatres. The new fully operational ICU will be complete with a spacious lounge area for visitors together with many other upgraded facilities.

As with all service provision at Aga Khan Hospital, Mombasa, "the patient" has been the major focus in considering this development.

This has enabled the ICU to be designed in a way that will provide for specialized care within a unit focused clinical area that is equipped with the highest standard of modern patient monitoring systems and life saving respiratory equipment.

The importance however has not been missed for the friends and relatives of patients who require ICU treatment. An area for them to stay has been designed within the unit complete with bathroom and showering facilities.

The requirement for ICU treatment is often a very traumatic experience for the patient and the whole family so we have attempted to cater not only for the highest clinical care but also for the comfort of the whole family.

"This exceptional clinical facility would however not be complete without the skilled nurses and medical staff who care for our patients," Mr. Cripwell, C.E.O. added.

Initially established in 1980 with funds from the Mombasa Club of Mombasa and the oldest of I.C.U.'s in Mombasa, the ICU has continued to provide high quality specialized care to our patients admitted to the hospital.

"This new development will now enable the Aga Khan Hospital, Mombasa to continue with this high standard of care that we have become renowned for," Mr. Cripwell concluded.

# GOOD WORK BY 'FRIENDS OF TSAVO'

THE 'FRIENDS OF Tsavo' are still very much alive and kicking and on September 18 will be busily engaged in erecting six warning signs to motorists on what is considered to be 'high risk' areas for wildlife along the Nairobi - Mombasa highway.

They are being placed between Mito Andel and Bachuma Gate. On June 2, *Coastweek* published a grim report from the 'Friends of Tsavo', about a baby elephant killed by a hit and run lorry 'its face having been turned into pulp'.

On the same day (May 18) another was found badly injured just 10 kms from Mito Andel.

The highway separates the west of Tsavo East and Tsavo West National Parks and drivers are being reminded to be particularly careful in that area.

Many other species of wildlife have met a similar fate.

The 'Friends of Tsavo' have many supporters to whom they can turn for help and in this particular case the signs they will be erecting were donated by Umoja Rubber (4), Apollo Insurance (1) and Reliable Electrics (1).

Also benefiting by the 'Friends' visit to that area will be the Kenya

Wildlife Service's Education Centre in Tsavo East which badly needs rehabilitating.

Helping in this exercise are Galaxy and Crown Paints, also Kenral Industries, which have donated lots of paint which the 'Friends' will be presenting on their behalf as well as a gift from themselves of 3,000 pieces of makuti.

In addition, they will be placing

in designated spots in Tsavo East a further supply of refuse bins received from Crown Paints.

Those previously donated by this company are now in Tsavo West.

Meanwhile, the 'Friends of Tsavo' will be holding their second 'Charity Walk' on October 7, this time starting from the Patel Samaj, Haile Selassie Road, Mombasa, at 8.30 in the morning.

Last September all were delighted with the unexpected response to their first Charity Walk.

It covered 10 kms attracting 500 participants and raising Kshs. 246,681/-.

It was brilliantly organised by their 'cubs' attracting mainly schoolchildren intent on preserving Kenya's magnificent wildlife heritage.

The money is going towards an urgently needed Firebreak around the perimeter of Tsavo National Parks to avoid a repeat of the disastrous fire which devastated nearly 4,000 sq.kms of this 21,000 sq.km area.

Unfortunately, this fell short of the target of Kshs. 1 million needed by KWS to carry out this work.

All money raised goes into the 'Friends of Tsavo' Charitable Trust formed 'with a commitment to contribute towards conservation undertakings in Tsavo National Parks'.

The 'Friends' are also busily engaged in planning their float in the Mombasa Cultural Carnival on Nov. 4 with the hope that this time it might be among the prize-winners.

It was UTC's driver/guides, concerned about the degradation of the Tsavo National Parks who conceived the idea of encouraging members of the public, companies, tourist associations, schools, to give KWS a helping hand in its protection - so the 'Friends of Tsavo' was born and continues in helping preserve this unique heritage increases.

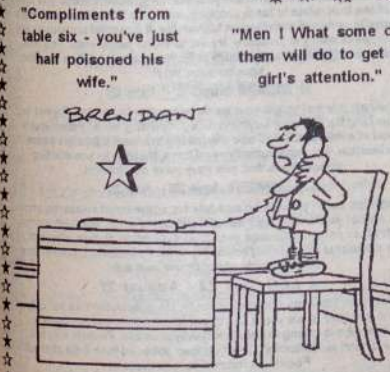

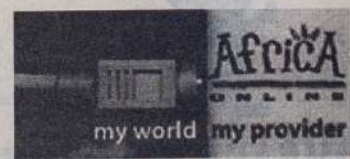

# It Wouldn't Take Much For Kenya's Traffic Police To Show A Little Home-Grown Initiative And Get All Our Highways Moving Again ?

**KENYAN ROADS** are getting busier by the day.

Traffic control facilities are mainly non-existent except for traffic lights on some of the roundabouts in Nairobi.

It is unlikely that those that existed previously which are currently not working will be restored to a working condition.

This is in line with the current experience where it appears that the reconstruction of the road infrastructure by either the El Niño fund, the Road Maintenance Levy or whatever funding excludes the reinstatement of the traffic control facilities.

Traffic lights may be asking too much but what about a coat of paint to put in lane dividers and direction signs on the roads.

How about putting up informative road signs ?

Do our technical experts consider the job done when they complete laying the tar ?

It will be a long time before we get to the stage where a road repair job is completed in its totality.

In the meantime, we should be grateful that some kind soul has condescended to slap some tarmac on whichever road we have screamed loudly about.

The fact that we can get around without some bone shaking antics should be enough solace.

In all this we wonder where the cops are.

Utumishi Kwa Wote is the motto.

This very apt statement was coined at the time when the force was supposed to be omnipresent.

There would very rarely be an occasion when anything requiring attention would occur without the presence of the force of law and order.

This did not necessarily mean the physical presence of the boys in blue but the very threat that they would very quickly appear was enough.

Efficiency and anticipation was the name of the game.

The name Vigilance House did not come by for nothing.

It meant that the boys in blue had their ears to the ground not only for mega crimes but

also for small things like traffic hot spots and potential black spots.

It was a true omnipresence.

The truth is that in this day and age, the force is spent as far as road users are concerned.

It may be that there are completely different priorities to occupy the focus of the force.

There are however still boys in blue who have some white on their sleeves and this means that they have some responsibility for traffic control and administration.

It seems that there are very few of them wherever they are needed.

It is only last month when we had the top brass coming out to recognise and congratulate a cop who was deemed effective, by public opinion, in controlling traffic and also adding some entertainment to the traffic queues.

A year or so ago, we had another traffic cop recognised for cheerful dedication to duty.

Is it coincidental that both of them happened to operate from the same patch ?

Is there something that Eastlands has that no other road network in the country has ?

Or is it that the traffic volume of this stretch is so heavy that there is bound to be some person somewhere who will bring to peoples attention the fact that some cop out there is trying hard to make things work against all odds ?

There must be something there.

However, when one travels to neighbouring countries, what we consider extraordinary in one cop in Eastlands is done by all cops every day.

The traffic cops are out every day one some section of the road armed with only a whistle and plenty of energy.

They will spend the morning hours in a frenzy keeping traffic flowing by some of apparent wizardry that only the cops seems to know.

As the traffic peak passes,

these hard workers go back for a rest and they are out again at the midday peak to ensure that the hasty workers are able to get home for lunch and back and that school kids are also able to make their way home.

In the later part of the day, they are out again to make sure that we get home with the minimum of fuss.

How come that in such an apparently developed country like ours we are efficient enough to plan the use of our resources effectively.

It would not take very many boys in blue to effectively control traffic in Nairobi or

Mombasa.

The few would have to be totally committed to the job when they are on duty without thinking of the soft touch of hanging around a matatu or bus park and making easy money from harassing drivers and tourists.

The top brass should perhaps travel to some of the nearer countries and study how well they are utilising their resources in traffic control.

If we were able to do half as much as they did, we would be able to free half the number currently deployed to help in other more pressing areas like

crime prevention and dealing with car jackers.

Sudan, Ethiopia, Djibouti, Cairo, South Africa and other countries are effectively using their cops to keep traffic moving.

We should be able to follow examples which have been tested and tried and proven to work without investing too much.

Mr. P and his cronies should take a walk on the wild side and get to grips with the inefficiency that we perceive exists in the cadres.

As Kachumbari says, it is costly to reinvent the wheel.

It is however very cheap to buy tested, popular technology that has been proven to work time and time again in relevant surroundings.

In keeping with her namesake the crew's uniform incorporates a Lion!

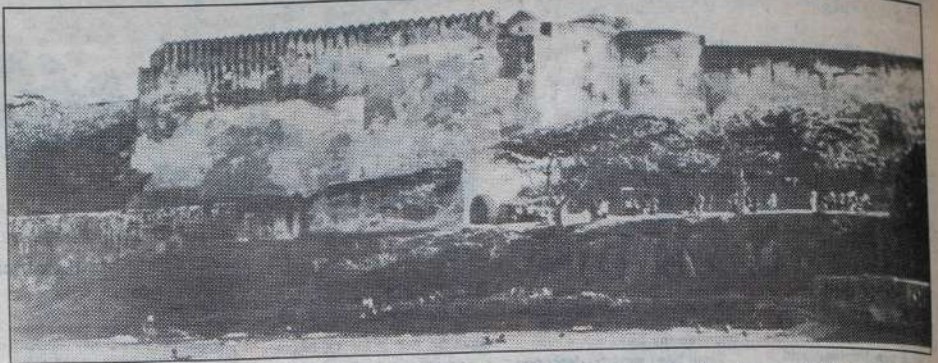
Simba-ka-Zaa, boasting two masts, is unique in Kenya the boat-builder being Bruce Trzebinski and represents a three year 'labour of love' assisted by a fundi from Tanga.

This was their second Sambuk - the first being 'Pilli Pipa'.

The deck is spacious and lined with stacks of plump cushions all in 'Sultan of Zanzibar Red' which can be arranged to suit individual needs - which could be a sunbed!

The centre piece is a Persian carpet which would make a wonderful stage for Taarab players!

Light Mid-East music was played and there is a plentiful supply of chilled white wine, beer and sodas, while covered baskets offered to each passenger contains a delightful assortment of freshly prepared snacks prepared by Pipa who is a Cordon-Bleu cook.

'Simba-ka-Zaa' is based on a traditional design and made from Mbamba Kofi placed over mangrove frames.

Bruce explained that the Arab way of boat building is very different to that in Europe.

In Europe they build the ribs first putting the planks in afterwards.

However, with a Sambuk the planks go in first and are lashed in place.

In next to no time you have the basic shape of your boat with the ribs going in afterwards.

Adding 'while the wood is curing you can then adjust the shape.

In fact, you can actually sculpt your boat at that point in time.

It has a 45' long keel which said Bruce 'is one single piece of wood which was very difficult to find'.

Bruce is the son of Zbigniew and Errol Trzebinski.

His father being a well-known and respected architect, and his mother a talented authoress among her books being 'Silence will Speak' which became one of the three main sources for the award winning film 'OUT OF AFRICA' starring Meryl Streep and Robert Redford.

Her latest best seller is 'The Life and Death of Lord Errol'.

# Großzügige Deutsche helfen der "Port Reitz" Rehabilitationsklinik

**DER JUGENDCLUB** Weingarten, Deutschland, hat DM 35000 (Kshs 1,4 Millionen) gesammelt zu Gunsten der Port Reitz Rehabilitationsklinik, ein Projekt der "Vereinigung für Körperbehinderte von Kenya" (Association for the Physically Disabled of Kenya - APDK).

"Betätigt euch als Botschafter der Klinik, wohin ihr auch geht," sagte er.

Dr. Patel erwähnte ferner, dass die Klinik zwei schwierige Probleme bei der Behandlung und Rehabilitation von Behinderten zu bewältigen hat.

- Abglaube und Vorurteile der einheimischen Bevölkerung

- Beschaffung der finanziellen Mittel, um die

Kosten für Behandlung und Medikamente zu decken.

Der Chairman wies darauf hin, dass die Rehabilitation von Kindern ein ständiger Vorgang ist, da jeden Tag behinderte Kinder geboren werden, während andere durch Unfälle, Unterernährung auf Grund von Armut oder Trauma erkranken.

Die Klinik behandelt jährlich 3000 Kinder im Rahmen verschiedener Programme, darunter die mobile Klinik und das Rehabilitationsprogramm vor Ort.

Dr. Patel erklärte der aus dreißig Clubmitgliedern bestehenden Delegation, dass Armut und Behinderung praktisch synonym sind, da alle Patienten der Rehabilitationsklinik aus bedürftigen Familien stammen

und es den meisten unmöglich ist, das Geld für die in den letzten Jahren eingeführte minimale Kostenbeteiligung für die Behandlung aufzubringen.

Herr Gerhard Junginger, Präsident des Jugendclubs Weingarten, bestätigte, dass seine Gruppe sehr zufrieden ist mit der Art und Weise, wie die Spenden jeweils im Laufe des Jahres verwendet werden und versprach, auch weiterhin die Klinik zu unterstützen.

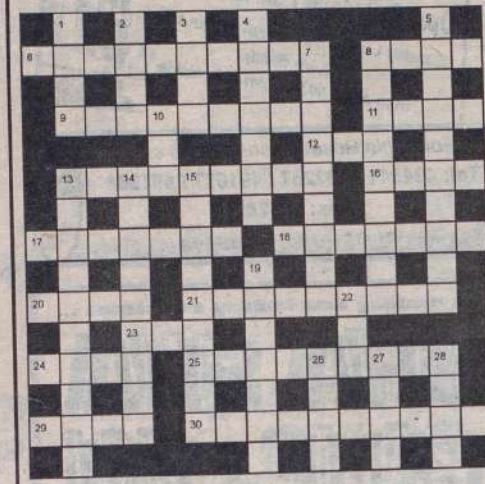

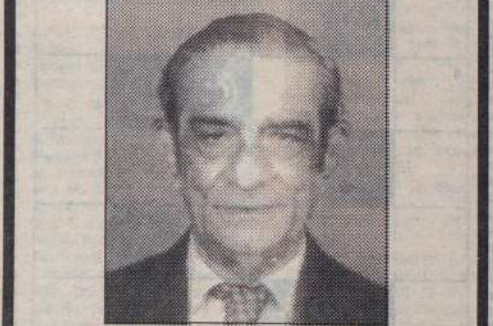

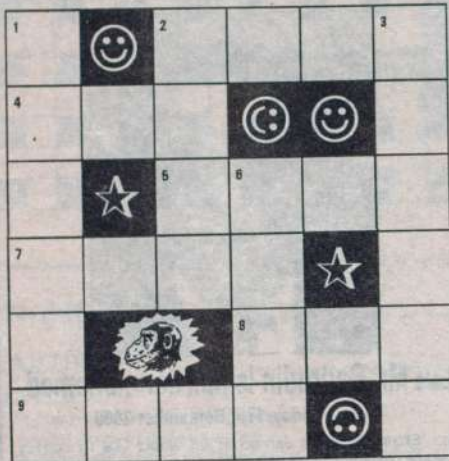

# Mtwapa Anglers Need Persistence And Luck As Fish Gorge On Mantis Prawns

PERSISTENCE and luck were needed last week by Mtwapa anglers as the fish continued to gorge on the vast swarms of mantis prawns that have distracted them from the baits for some time now.

But some fish were caught, notably another small black marlin of about fifty kilos, to add to the number of similar-sized marlin that have been caught since the beginning of this season.

This one attacked the bait pulled by Walter Brun's boat, Baloo, one of the South African anglers on board did the rod-work to bring the fish to the side, and the wireman slipped out the hook to send the fish on its way to live and grow and battle again another day.

The only other encounter with billfish by Mtwapa boats during the week was a got-away one that looked to be twice the size of the one above, about a hundred kilos, a decent-sized fish, that came to Walter's other boat, Nala, with Dave Green of the United States on the rod, but it was only in contact for three or four minutes before the sad limp line had to be wound in.

That was on Sunday, but earlier in the week, on Thursday, another angler fishing on the same boat, Wolfgang Maxt, was more successful when he brought in a small hammerhead shark.

And on the same day a wahoo of 18 kilos was caught by an angler on Nala.

Persistence paid off on Saturday for two Mtwapa boats that fished in Mombasa waters, with the backdrop of the tall city buildings rising from the palm-fringed island while two hump-

back whales spouted their plumes of spray and showed their backs lazily just in front of the city skyline.

But the fish were there, shoals of yellowfin tuna, whose presence was signalled by flocks of screeching, diving white birds.

Nature has been kind to us in supplying these helpers, as useful to us as the honey-bird is to the honey-hunters of the forest, and if ever an award could be made for assistance to anglers it should surely go to our sharp-beaked, raucous friends, the terns, which are our sign in the sky, saying, "Fish here!"

These are the Common Terns, the Roseate Terns, the Crested Terns, both Greater and Lesser, the black ones, the Sooty terns, and others besides.

Some ducks seem to have got confused early on Saturday morning - White-Faced Whistling Ducks, thinking they were terns perhaps and were sitting on the sea but they soon left things to the terns.

From early morning till late afternoon on Saturday these birds did their work following the yellowfin, with the two Mtwapa boats, Fair Maid and Tengesi cutting the water behind them, and when they got there while the fish were still on the surface it was a wonderful sight.

## Fat And Sleek

Yellowfin tuna, fat and sleek were shooting up out of the surface that was churned to foam by a wild melee of fish, and if you switched off the engines of the boat there was a roar of tail-beaten water as loud as any

boat, which of course is why bilfish come to the sound of the boat.

Millions of years of evolution when the only churning of the sea was done by the fish themselves.

One tuna even even caught a cast lure in mid-air, mouth wide open, heading at the boat - an airborne fish, what a thrill!

That one dropped off, but for Nigel Spencer and Neil Reed on Tengesi it was a dream day again, with the light casting rod bent double as the yellowfin bored deep and had to be coaxed up, some also on the trolling rods, work all day, chasing the shoals, casting, bringing in lines, leaning back against the bend of the rod.

## Humpback

Most of their fish stuck on, wireman Kazungu did a great job on the gaff so that not a single fish was lost at the boat, and the two fishermen brought in thirteen yellowfin between five and nine kilos, all caught on lines of fifteen to thirty pound breaking strain line.

Fair Maid, captained by Hafiz Mangajji, caught quite a few too.

With so many tuna around it was reasonable to expect some bilfish to be batting them, but nobody encountered any, although Tengesi pulled plenty of shiny fresh wolfferring bats.

Tengesi was out on Monday too, fished by Nigel, but the yellowfin came up for only half an hour, but he got two and lost a better one of about twelve kilos.

James Adcock's Vuma was in Mombasa waters also on Monday, looking for the tuna, but missed the crucial half hour and fisherman Gilbert Cooper of

Kent in Britain had to be content with a dorado, although he did have the rare and beautiful experience of seeing a humpback whale jumping repeatedly, clearing the water, long fins flailing, to land with a splash like the Fall of the House of Usher.

Back at home base, The Moorings, the only floating restaurant on the coast, umbrellas are the last word in style on the porton outside the roof.

White umbrellas, three of them, sunshades, waiting, many thanks, for a good strong northeasterly wind to lift them up and go sailing high above houses and people to a land that nobody knows.

The northeast wind is what anglers are all waiting for, the Kaskazi, that we might call The Fisherman's Wind, the northeast monsoon, and it did blow for a few minutes one night recently, yes, we're sure of it, really and truly.

The CCA has resolved that the game between Kenya and Bangladesh on September 28 is to be free of charge for all.

This is in recognition of the disappointment faced by the ticket paying public who saw the previous match played at the Mombasa Sports Club between Kenya and Karnataka washed out on Sunday, 6th August last.

Despite the prohibitive cost of hosting such a match, the Association feel that it is right that the cricket supporters should not be further penalised by having to pay for this match as well.
