and private atmosphere.

It is located on the first floor of Palli House, Nyerere Avenue, away from the hustle and bustle of the streets, giving its patrons a quiet and peaceful environment.

The link to the Internet is provided by Interconnect.

All computers have 17 inch

The pricing structure is flexible enough to suit all users. Internet time can be bought in advance at a reduced rate and used at your convenience.

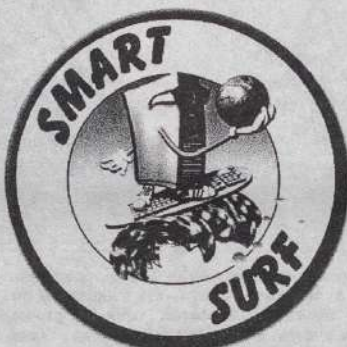

ONCE AGAIN, Hollywood has entwined fiction with reality, releasing yet another blockbuster that will be remembered for a long time to come (a la Titanic).

This time the setting is Pearl Harbour in Hawaii, December, 1941.

The world is enmeshed in the throes of World War Two, as the Japanese send in almost all their flying fire power to bomb the American Naval and Air Force Base in Pearl Harbour in a bid to crush the Americans.

This kamikaze mission succeeded in killing almost 2,500 American servicemen and decimating a major portion of their battleships including the gigantic U.S.S. Arizona.

As things start to twist and turn, the Japanese decide to bomb Pearl Harbour, setting off the climax of the movie.

CYCLE FOR JUSTICE (C.L.E.A.R.) Nairobi-Mombasa, August 17-20, 2001

What is Cycle for Justice? Cycle for Justice (Kenya) is a charity cycle ride from Nairobi to Mombasa which will take place from 17 - 21 August 2001.

The aim of the cycle ride is to support the legal aid project of the Kenyan Christian Lawyer's Fellowship (the 'KCLF').

The project is called CLEAR and has been in formal existence for the past year in both Mombasa and Nairobi.

The cycle ride will leave from the offices of CLEAR Nairobi on Friday, 17 August and, after navigating the traffic and nearly

500 kms. of the Coast Road, the participants will arrive at the CLEAR Mombasa office on Monday, 21 August 2001.

It is the hope of the participants to cover over 120 km a day for four days.

All money raised from the cycle ride will go directly to fund the ongoing work of CLEAR as it seeks to provide justice for all in Kenya.

The motto of the cycle ride is 'Justice for All'.

What is C.L.E.A.R.? CLEAR stands for Christian Legal Education Advice and Reform - A society registered under the Society's Act (CAP 108).

This is a volunteer organisation whose members are volunteers from the Kenyan Christian Lawyers Fellowship.

There are over 200 members of the KCLF who are based throughout Kenya and give their time and skills voluntarily to CLEAR.

Members of the KCLF formed CLEAR out of their desire to be a voice for the poor, marginalized and vulnerable and to seek God's justice in Kenya.

"Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere" Martin Luther King

CLEAR is non-discriminatory and seeks to provide assistance to all persons regardless of age, sex, religion, race or social status.

For example, our Mombasa office has acted for a significant number of Muslim clients.

We have also tried to take cases, which other legal voluntary organisations are unable to assist.

Aims and Objectives: CLEAR has three broad aims and objectives:

- To provide legal advice to those who are unable to pay for the services of a lawyer and will suffer injustice as a consequence.

- To educate community groups through legal education and

- To provide publications focused on the laws that affect community members, particularly those concerning poverty

- To promote and actively seek law reform of the legal systems and legislation in Kenya as it concerns the poor and the oppressed.

What does CLEAR do? In the past year CLEAR have been able to establish two offices from which to co-ordinate and extend its operations.

These are based in Nairobi and Mombasa respectively.

Justice for All? It has said that in Kenya justice is open to all and so is the Inter-Continental Hotel.

The problem of access to justice is increased by the poverty of many persons.

Poverty not only prevents many from affording the advice of an advocate but also to the affording of court filing fees.

In addition poverty prevents many from obtaining the education necessary to understand legal rights and be empowered to be advocates for them.

The needs are huge and are beyond the existing organisations such as FIDA(K) and Kituo Cha Sharia.

C.L.E.A.R. in 2000-1 In the past year CLEAR has established two full time legal aid centers in Mombasa and Nairobi from which it co-ordinates its operations and provides access to the general public.

As a snap shot of CLEAR activities in the past year each center has on average:

- interviewed over 35 new clients per month.

- provided full legal representation for over 20 new cases per month.

- has a panel of over 20 volunteer advocates to undertake the cases.

- Daily legal advice and education on local radio stations.

- At least monthly education workshops to community groups

- Published a series of education leaflets in both English and Swahili

- Undertaken cases seeking

law reform on areas concerning: harassment of street children; ID card requirements for the poor; legal representation for victims of torture.

How you can help? The needs which CLEAR is seeking to tackle will always outweigh our resources.

COASTWEEK, August 14 - 18, 1981:

MINISTRY of Environment and Natural Resources was at the centre of a long running scandal involving the mis-management of the ill-fated fishing vessel m.v. Kusi, which had cost the Government millions of shillings to maintain.

The modern vessel was acquired in 1978 at a cost of K.Shs. 21,400,000 - through a loan given to the Kenya Government by a foreign government in aid of the Fishing Scheme along the Coast. The vessel was then handed over to the Kenya Fishing Industries Limited - a subsidiary of ICCD - who were supposed to undertake commercial fishing and in return pay the Government 20 per cent of the catch or an amount of two million shillings per year. But the vessel operations failed to show any profits and Kenya Fishing Industries went to incur a net loss of K.Shs. 700,000 - during the first year of the undertaking.

TOURISM Minister Elijah Mwangale was to be the Guest of Honour at the official opening of the new 80-room luxury Neptune Beach Hotel - the latest venture for the Marali Group of Companies under the direction of Managing Director Amin Marali and co-directors Salim and Wazir Marali.

CREW members of the U.S.S. Coronado applied 250 litres of ivory white paint to Mombasa's world-famous Tusks on Moi Avenue. A number of local contractors including Civicon, the Municipal Fire Brigade and The Wempe assisted.

SOME ten thousand Mombasa pupils joined the queue for standard one admission but only half would manage to get places.

ELEVEN bikini-clad devastatingly charming beauties brought the screen to life with Roger Moore as James Bond at KENYA CINEMA in 'For Your Eyes Only'. ALEC Guinness and young Ricky Schroder starred in 'Little Lord Fauntleroy' at NAAZ CINEMA. LAUGH a minute with Bud Spencer in 'Soldiers of Fortune' at REGAL CINEMA. WHO really was 'Ajja Ka Mahatma' ('Great Person Of Today') between Randhir Kapoor, Rekha, Ranjeet and Bindu at CHOX CINEMA.

LETTER writers were J. Gardiner, Elizabeth Wilson and Brian Tetley all favouring the live television screening of the Royal Wedding between Prince Charles and Lady Diana; Zulfikar Fazel who pointed out that 'Ted did not mean Disco' as advertised by a local hotel; Councillor Gasper Walele suggesting a road be named after the recently departed first African Mayor of Mombasa, David Kayunga; Jumaia Carberry reliving that John Walters was back with the Shipping News; Faisal Ahmed Brek cheering the American sailors for giving our famous tusks a face lift and 'Bare Buttocks' who lamented the lack of privacy at the Shika-Adabu Health Centre where doctors were injecting patients in full view of everyone around.

It was soon time to disembark and these servicemen, glad to get home were soon going their own ways with family members who had come to the airport to meet them.

Like with so many projects that are performed at Baobab Farm, a number of foreign students were involved in various aspects of the rehabilitation process, bringing with them their enthusiastic and learned approach to this unique opportunity to be intimately involved in such a worthwhile greening exercise.

Unlike 'Haller Park', with its emphasis on integrated ecosystems, animal farming and game enclosures, the 'Forest Trails' are a recreational and leisure facility, encouraging the visitor to enjoy the tranquil surrounds at their own pace with no need of a guide, and with the vast expanse of the quarry allowing for new areas to be explored all the time.

In 1998, the charming Butterfly Pavilion was opened to the public.

At the time of its development, such facilities were quite fashionable in Europe and it is certainly something unique for Mombasa.

What Are The Roles Leaders Can Play?

(Part One) WHAT ARE SOME OF THE ROLES LEADERS SHOULD PLAY?

Most leaders in industry complain they need many pairs of hands to cope with the demands of work that are placed on them.

However as we don't have more than one pair how can we be more effective at work?

How can we become more effective and produce more and meet more people when we feel we now have too much work to do?

There are many management roles placed upon the leader who if they ignore them in favour of others, it is possible for the whole job to suffer.

The time we spend on those roles will vary depending on the job we have, but our role, as a leader will generally fall into three main categories.

These are as follows:-

- * Interpersonal roles.
- * Information roles.
- * Decision roles.

If you are an Operational Manager then your primary role will be a decisional one.

However your success will be affected by your interpersonal and information roles.

One of your 'interpersonal' roles is where you act as 'FIGUREHEAD' this means acting in a ceremonial nature, making speeches for retiring employees, playing host to visitors, being seen on public occasions.

Even though these situations may be boring and time consuming, they are important to the smooth running of your company and departments so don't neglect your 'FIGUREHEAD' role.

Please don't minimise this role because it is very important to your organization and it's future as well as your career as a leader.

Try not to constantly delegate the role to others feeling it is not important to you as a manager.

Now we come to a role that is also very important to your

organization, that is the role of 'LEADER'.

This role involves hiring, training and managing those juniors to you.

(This managing will also involve the motivation and the achievement of agreed goals and targets with your staff).

Try to be a model for your staff in consistency of action and behavior so that they handle one another the way you handle them.

Try and lead your staff in a direction that is 'good' for the organization and also 'good' for them!

The 'MONITOR' role is one of gathering information from those around you, inside and outside the organization.

To be successful in this role, you should try to make an effort to get out of your office regularly, talk to your staff and avoid

Der nautische uahelikalender hat zwölf onate mit 354 Tagen, was en Differenz von 11 Tagen egenüber dem Sonnenjahr it 365 Tagen ergibt.

Die landwirtschaftlichen

Aktivitäten stimmen mit den Mondmonaten überein.

Das Jahr wird aufgeteilt in Dekaden; jeweils zehn Tage werden **"Mwango"** genannt.

Viele Suaheli Farmer und Seeleute sind mit den Mondmonaten vertraut und rechnen nach **"Miyinga"** (Mehrzahl von **"Mwango"**).

Die Zeremonien fallen auf das Ende des nautischen Suaheljahres und der Feiertag wird **"Neiruz"** genannt.

Viele Orte entlang der Küste Ostafrikas wie Sansibar, Mombasa, Tanga, Pemba und Lamu feiern an diesem Tag.

Andere berechnen **"Neiruz"** zehn Tage früher als das entsprechende Datum im Vorjahr.

- Am Neujahrstag wurden am frühen Morgen zwei Ochsen durch die Stadt geführt mit großer Zeremonie, gefolgt von einer Menschenmenge, Gebete und Koranverse zitierend.

- Die Feier endete auf dem Gelände der Allidina Visram Schule, wo die Ochsen geschlachtet und dazu der Gungwitanz aufgeführt wurde.

- Am Mittag wurde das Fleisch mit Brot gegessen und auch an die Armen abgegeben.

Was früher üblich war, ist heute kaum mehr anzutreffen.

Das einzige was übrigblieb, ist das Schlachten der Ochsen beim Grab von Sheikh Mvita, der von den Portugiesen 1563 an dieser Stelle getötet wurde.

Mr. Daud sagte, dass in Zukunft das Suaheli-Neujahr wieder nach alter Tradition für die neue Generation eingeführt werden soll, um das überlieferte kulturelle Erbe zu bewahren.

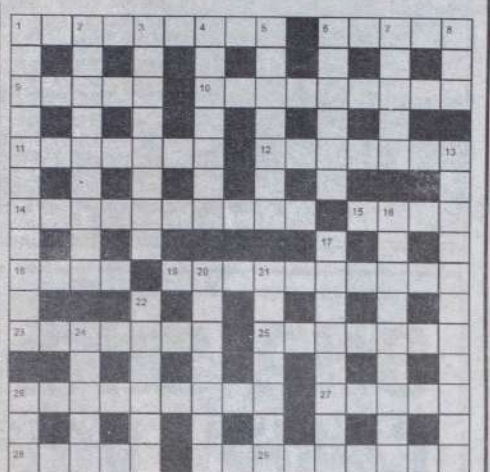



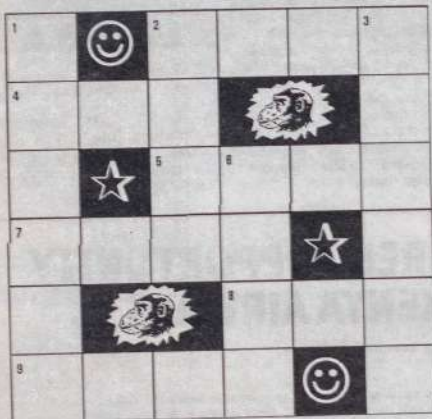

West led the Ten of Hearts and declarer won dummy's Ace.

The contract seemed to hinge on the location of the King of Diamonds (which rated to be off side in the light of East's Bid), but declarer saw one small extra chance.

If East held a singleton Queen or Knave of Clubs, then he could finesse twice against West and make four Club tricks enabling him to discard a Diamond.

After drawing trumps in two rounds he therefore led dummy's Three of Clubs.

If East had followed low, declarer would quickly have abandoned the plan and fallen back on the Diamond finesse.

But East did not play low - he played the Queen. Can you see what happened next?

Declarer played a Club to dummy's Eight and East won the Nine. Contract defeated.
