Hundreds Treated At NHIF Sponsored Free Medical Camp

MORE than 2,400 Mombasa residents have been screened during the National Hospital Insurance Fund (NHIF) sponsored 'Free Medical Camp' at Coast General Hospital.

Hospital chief administrator, Dr. Khadija Shikely said the two-day event cost the sponsor K. Shs. 500,000.

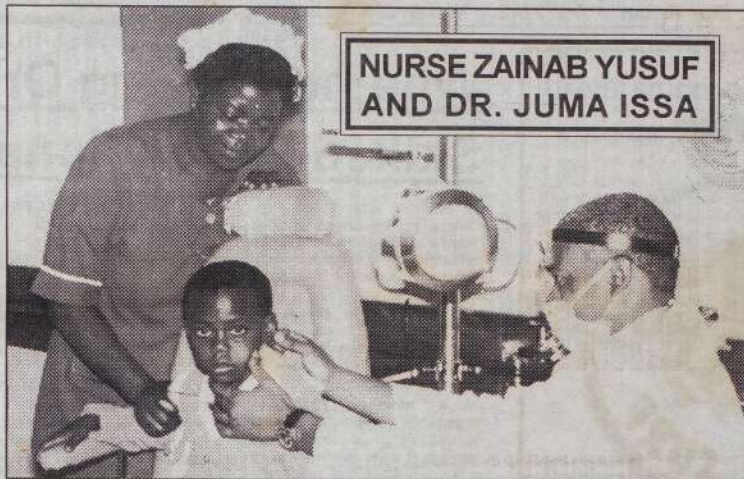
malaria cases were admitted at the hospital.

Mwangi said further cases for special attention such as surgery, lab tests, or operation will be done at the sponsors cost.

The hospital offered milk and Fuji-mix to children suffering from severe malnutrition.

Rebecca Abonyo, a Mombasa polytechnic nutrition student, said the F-100 Formula recommended for severe malnutrition treatment and Fuji-mix was given according to the weight of the affected children.

Other donors in Mombasa who supported the event included Pyramid Pharmacy, Faiz pharmacy, Pearly Water and bakeries, Fayaz, Seifee and Hussain.

The NHIF catered for free medicines, lab tests for TB, anaemia, malaria, urine and stools.

"Unlike in the past where donors sponsor one special medical camp, the NHIF has surged forward to aid the entire community by offering treatment and other medical services in all departments", said Shikely.

Free services were also offered on X-ray ultrasound, eye treatment, dental, children welfare and Ear nose and Throat department.

Other special services were also offered on physiotherapy, gynaecology, surgery, dermatology, and talks on STI, with great emphasis on HIV/AIDS.

Attendants were invited for talks about family planning services.

National NHIF manager, Mr D. K. Fumbo said that time has come for his organisation to help local residents countrywide in various medical fields.

Fumbo revealed that NHIF has already conducted a similar exercise in Mwatate district and with assistance from Kenya Women Medical Association (KWMA) others were held at Dandora and Kibera in the city.

According to the hospitals Head of Clinical Services (HSC) as well as deputy chief administrator, Dr. David Mwangi, the seen cases included 487 males and 741 females for general ailments, 650 paediatrics, 122 at the ENT clinic, five ante-natal mothers and 200 each for dental and eye service.

No Shortage Of Electricity...

NEW POWER IS NOW EXCESS OF DEMAND AT THE COAST!

KENYA POWER and Lighting Company now has 'an excess of power for the Coast Province'.

This was the Good news received by a seven-strong delegation of Executive Members of the Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association led by its Chairman, Kuldeep Sondhi, when paying a courtesy call on its Area Manager, John Masimbo.

He told them that the Coast needs 120 megawatt hours and the supply now available is for 250 mwh.

Other good news is that KP&L

is making arrangements to place senior officials in various zones in the coast region in order to improve its services to the industry.

The MCTA chairman had initially told the Area Manager 'electricity is one ingredient without which tourism cannot survive, hotels being one of the major consumers of electricity.'

'Almost every hotel room has an air-conditioner consuming quite a lot of power.'

He also mentioned that 'our members, especially hotels, received letters from your office

asking for an additional deposit to match the consumer's average monthly consumption in compliance with new statutory requirements.'

He told the Area Manager 'these demands cannot be met as it would only lead to closure of our businesses, especially hotels which are among the largest consumers of electricity in the coast region and play a vital role in poverty alleviation by providing employment.'

'We would also ask that you favourably consider the tourism industry and reduce your tariffs, taking into account the current state of the economy at the coast.'

In his reply Mr Masimbo explained that as far as the increase in deposits was concerned, KPLC had relaxed the issue and would give hotels a period of up to one

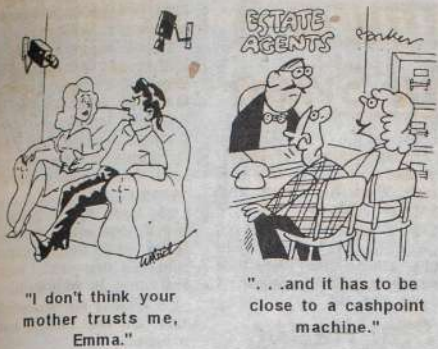

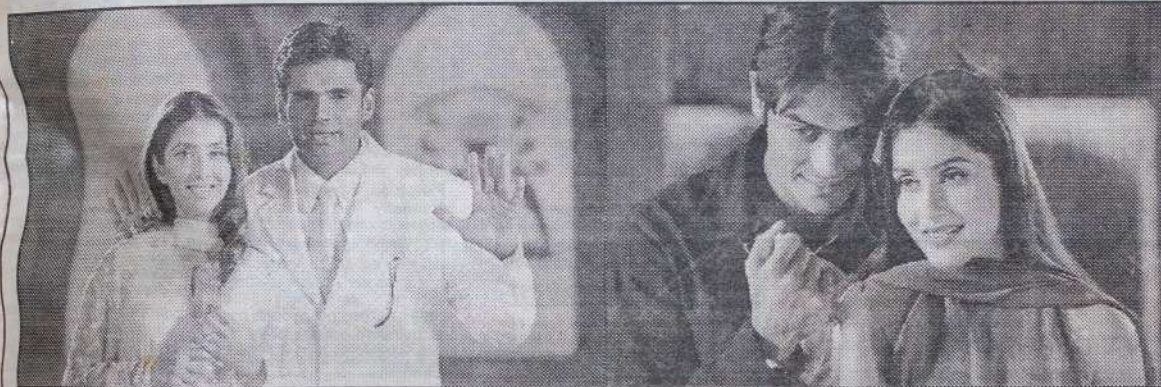

TWENTY TWO YEARS' AGO...

COASTWEEK, August 24-30, 1979:

OPERATION CENSUS: Kenyans were gearing up Friday night for the 1979 population census which was estimated to cost KSh 45 million. In Mombasa, projected to have about 413,000 residents, all bars, restaurants and nightspots were to close at 5.00 p.m. to facilitate the exercise and allow people to be counted at home.

According to the 1979 Kenya Population Census Guide, the 1969 census showed that Kenya's population was just under eleven million and growing at a rate of 3.3 per cent each year, the highest rate in the world. This meant that if the population continued to grow at that rate, Kenya's population would double in another 21 years.

A four-man team from the Indian Institute of Petroleum Exploration were making preliminary analyses with help from the University of Dar es Salaam on traces of oil found at Songo Songo in Kilwa District, Tanzania. The Tanzanian government meanwhile imposed restrictions on the sale of petrol to further conserve the fuel.

MUSLIMS were celebrating Idd ul Fitr marking the end of the holy month of Ramadhan with a special Idd message from Kenya's Chief Kadhi, Sheikh Abdullah Saleh Farsi.

NAAZ cinema was ending its run of 'Scandal in the Family' and moving on to 'Heroes' starring Henry Winkler and Sally Field. **REGAL** cinema was showing 'Edge of Fury' a Kung-Fu flick starring Yasuki Kurata and Bruce Lee look-alike Ho Chung Tao. Meanwhile, **KENYA** cinema was winding down its run of 'Moonraker' and despite extra shows added to their schedule, queues continued to build at the booking office. At the **CHOX** it was Randhir Kapoor and Jaya Badhuri in 'Jawani Diwani,' (Crazy Youth).

LETTER WRITERS included Abdala wa Khalidi of Takaunga who urged readers "In the name of women's rights" and "In the name of unadulterated Christianity" to "not abolish the right to polygamy" following "recent debate and rejection of the Marriage Bill by Parliament which focussed attention on the African and Islamic institution of polygamy." Others were Mbogholi wa Maghanga, G. L. Antoni, Mishi Mwachatain of Kwale and Nabila Ali and Shelina Vellani of Mombasa.

TOP TEN on the music charts compiled by 'Disco Bug' saw "Bad Girls" by Donna Summer rising from sixth place to the number one slot, pushing "Good Times" by Chic down to number two. Three new entries, "Bright Eyes" by Art Garfunkel, "Bridge Over Troubled Waters" by Linda Clifford and "Ring My Bell" by Anita Ward filled in slots seven, eight and nine respectively, while "Boogie Wonderland" by Earth, Wind and Fire looked set to leave the Top Ten, sliding to number ten from number three the previous week.

What Are The Roles Leaders Can Play ?

(Part 2) WHAT ARE SOME OF THE ROLES LEADERS SHOULD PLAY??

Last week we examined three roles, that of a LEADER, FIGUREHEAD and MONITOR.

This week we will examine four more roles.

Our fourth role is one of a 'COMMUNICATOR' of information.

You will possess more information about your work than your staff, so please determine carefully what and when you communicate and what you decided not to.

Weigh the consequences of not passing/sharing information to your staff that is important to them and will help them be more effective in their work.

Check how often they make mistakes all because you did not share certain information with them.

Try and check one day how far down the organization level information your communication has travelled.

Has it become distorted or possibly has it not reached someone because someone prevented the communication from spreading?

The next role is called 'FIRE FIGHTER' or 'TROUBLE SHOOTER' where if you're not careful you will end up managing by crisis.

It is often enjoyed by managers because it involves a lot of action and has visible results.

Please don't spend a lot of time personally in this role but delegate to others to also handle work to prevent it ending in crisis.

We may not encourage staff to come to us early with a problem because we enjoy the 'FIREFIGHTING' nature of this role and therefore we are seen as being 'needed' to 'sort out' work difficulties.

You need to help your staff to prepare in advance, to prioritize, otherwise all work will 'finish' in crisis!

We now come to the role of 'RESOURCE ADVOCATOR'.

A lot of this role is involved

with the resource of time! Do we allocate enough time to people and also the job?

Do we understand how to prioritize jobs/ situations based on it's 'urgency' and 'importance'?

If we learn to do this effectively then we become much more effective in our work.

It helps them a lot when the understand how to prioritize work and they also help the staff to do so as well.

The final role I would like us to examine is that of NEGOTIATOR.

This is working with others to develop goals and objectives i.e. working with unions and customers even the engaging of new staff requires the skill of negotiation.

Consider now in order to be more effective whether the decisions you make alone could

be more effective than if you had involved others!

Are you too 'autocratic' in your leadership role?

Decide very carefully which situations at work call for your presence and which others could effectively be handled by your staff.

Your work is based upon how you handle it and the roles you practice.

You will find you will be able to meet the demands of your job with others you will be much more effective if you practice the roles we have examined.

You will find that two hands are enough.

Recognizing these roles in yourself, I hope will help you, but if you have any questions please contact me.

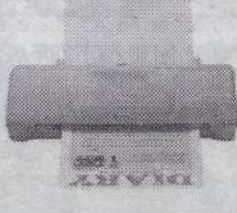

Spain. Skål is managed by an Executive Committee of nine members, elected by Club delegates to the General Assembly, which is held in conjunction with the World Congress.

This five day Congress is hosted by a different country each year, thus offering members and their companions the opportunity of observing, at first hand, the travel and tourism industry potential of other countries.

Tony Clegg-Butt, a member of Skål Nairobi is part of the Executive Committee as International Vice President and Kenyans can be proud of their achievements within Skål especially as Tony will stand for possible election to become International President at the next World Congress to be held in October this year at Puerto Rico.

DOING BUSINESS BASED ON FRIENDSHIP

Skål is not a business association, nor can it be used as a forum to conduct business.

However, while Skål does not involve itself directly in business, it does encourage Skålleagues to do business with each other, and with Skål supporters, thus worldwide networking and business opportunities through Skål contacts are in todays modern world seen as a distinct

advantage. By joining Skål and attending Club, National and International Congresses and other events, members are able to meet industry colleagues from around the world.

These meetings, held in an atmosphere of amicale, give members the chance to make contacts, on both a business and personal level, and to forge new friendships.

Skål is totally non-political and does not discriminate on the grounds of sex, age, race, religion or social standing. It does, though, support charitable causes.

The Florin and Volckaert Fund aims, through voluntary contributions, to help fellow Skålleagues and their immediate families who are in need or suffering personal hardship (serious sickness or the loss of personal property, for example).

'Operation Hope' is an individual Club scheme to help orphans and retarded, disabled or under-privileged children, by organising social events, outings and holidays, while a youth exchange programme has been developed.

Other Clubs, and National Committees, undertake their own charity work, and some even involve themselves in environmental projects.

BECOMING A MEMBER

Membership of Skål is by invitation, from the Club closest to your place of work or home. However, potential members

who believe they are qualified to be Skålleagues, and who are interested in the Skål ideals, are welcome to approach their nearest Club.

Every Club secretary has a Skål Directory which lists all the Clubs, when and where they have their meetings and the names of their main officers, and members are encouraged to visit other Clubs when on business or pleasure trips.

Members are expected to live up to the objectives and principles of Skål, which remain the same today as when the first Club was formed in 1932: to promote friendship, peace and harmony without discrimination.

Members also are expected to promote Skål, the formation of new Clubs where needed and

the recruitment of qualified new members, especially among the younger professionals in the industry.

Skål aims to consolidate its status as a professional association, based on quality, exclusivity and acceptance within the travel trade industry, by evaluating opportunities to promote the movement more fully within this industry.

Greater involvement and participation in seminars and conferences is considered as a means of strengthening Skål's role as a link between representatives of the different branches within the industry.

Skål International also promotes its image by re-enforcing the prestige of the Movement's magazine, 'Skål News', among

both members and travel trade personnel.

The international friendship and close personal contact of Skål has to be experienced to be appreciated.

Every tourism professional, in managerial capacity is eligible for membership of Skål International, provided they have worked in the travel and tourism industry for at least three years.

Membership applications should be proposed and seconded by two existing members of Skål and submitted to the Club nearest you.

EXECUTIVES

After 25 years as one of the industry's top Executives in the hotel business on the Kenya Coast, I can look back to the ups

and downs of our once thriving tourism sector.

Since 1997 the road to recover seems to get more distant as time passes and tohy we believe these are the main points that the tourism industry needs to concentrate on gearing across to the government and potential markets.

1. Kenya Coast has the POTENTIAL to have a tourism product, which competes with the best in the world.

However, we need to ensure that we uphte our product so that it is innovative and well maintained in order to compete with other 'longhaul' destinations

in the Caribbean, Africa, Indiar Ocean and Far East.

Recently, few only of the tourism stakeholders in the hotel industry or Kenya's Coast have taken steps to refurbish, renovate and introduce new facilities (Voyager Bead Resort, Bambun Beach Hotel on the North Coast, Turtle Bay Resort in Watamu and the Leopard Beach Hotel on famous Diani Beach).

It is up to the government to do the same in respect a approach roads from the airport to the beach resorts (rubbish dump at Makupa etc.) and to find ways of encouraging other stakeholders by way of tax incentives as done in most other Countries were the growing importance of tourism is recognized and fully appreciated.

2. We have a mis-match between bed capacity at the coast and incoming flight seats.

Until this is addressed it will be impossible for all our hotels to achieve high occupancies.

We urge the government to start encouraging airlines to increase their services and to rntroducing new airlines to Mombasa.

We need the government to discuss with the airlines what incentives they would need to start operating more flights to Mombasa.

POLICE UNIT

Only increased direct flights to Mombasa can put a stop to the downwards spiral of reducing hotel occupancies resulting in further reduced rates tarnishing the image of this great Country which results in further job losses and less and less revenue for the exchequer.

3. One of the key factors for any destination to attract tourists is the issue of 'perceptions of safety'.

We need the gorvenment to give strong support to the Tourist Police Unit at the Coast so that this is strengthened and expanded.

The matter of re-location of Beach-vendors must be finalized

once and for all successfully and satisfactorily for all parties concerned.

4. In the modern global market place the matter of marketing, promotion and advertising is vital.

We cannot afford to be left constantly behind by our competitors like Barbados, Egypt or Malaysia who are committing substantial sums to promoting themselves in their main source markets which have soared since ours collapsed on Kenya's most beautiful Coast.

We have taken tourism for far too long as granted and have slice been overtaken left, right and center by many countrics who have far less to offer but know how to sell and market an image.

5. Finally, we need to 'get better appreciation that tourism can be the key to transforming and revitahsrng our national economy.

Tourism can create hundreds and thousands of jobs for both directly and indirectly.

A flourishing tourism industry can boost many other sectors economy creating a much-needed turnaround in our currently declining economy.

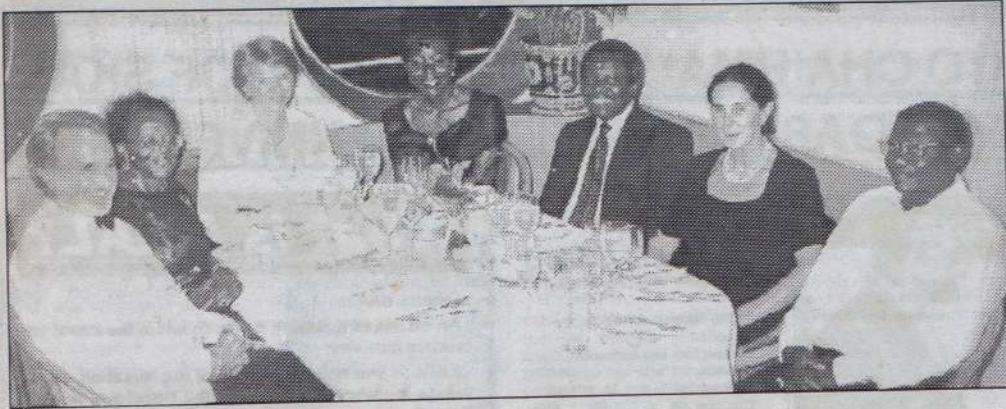

SOME FEEBLE attempts are being made to put 'signage' on some roads in Nairobi and Mombasa.

For the residents in each of these towns it is a sign that there are about to be special visitors.

For Mombasa it is the annual clean up before the Mombasa ASK show when traditionally some VIP and more often than not, the Head of State, pays a visit to the town to officially open the event.

I have not attended this annual event since the late 'eighties and it is unfortunate that I will miss it this year round as I will be away during the time it is on.

But going by records in other parts of the country where I have attended such events, the nature of what was once a display of the top producers in the country and the best experimental activities has taken a sad turn.

Remember: Those Far Off Days When It Was Fun To Visit The Showground ?

The shows I remember from long ago were centred on three main areas.

The first of these were the livestock 'bandas' where one would see the best dairy and beef cattle the area could produce on display.

Some participants came from remote districts so that they could display their fatstock and entice buyers.

Others came to show off their breeding abilities and hopefully clinch deals to sell improvement stock or semen for artificial insemination.

The animals would be trans-

ported over long distances with their minders who would stay with them for the duration of the shows.



Goats, sheep, chickens and other smaller animals were also on display in the same general areas.

These areas were the preserve of the serious livestock farmers and the few miros who were townies and had never set foot outside the towns.

The second area I remember was the farm produce banda where the finest agricultural produce was on display. Here people would exchange ideas and techniques about effective ways of growing horticultural produce and fruits.

On display were also cereals,

legumes and other produce from the 'wild' such as honey.

There the agricultural experts were on hand to tap ideas which they would take back to the research stations and develop for the benefit of the greater farming community.

The third area that would keep us busy was the arena.

In the earlier days it was mainly the armed forces displays that attracted crowds to the place especially the floodlit tattoo.

The spectacular uniforms and loud marching music sent children into a frenzy as they tried to follow the antics of the bands-men along the pavilion fences while the wazees and akina mama were quaffing their pints of beer or king size fantas in the adjacent catering facility. Sadly all that has changed.

The shows have changed into more of trade fairs rather than serious agricultural shows.

The focus has been to entice exhibitors of a commercial nature who pay to allow them to trade in the show grounds in order to support the shows which would otherwise be unable to make financial ends meet.

Most of the show grounds were demarcated and built up years back and are now so congested that they now attract shoppers, pickpockets and revellers rather than serious farmers.

For most of the year these areas are deserted and fall into disrepair necessitating large repair bills to make the place suitable for the three to five days that the shows are now held.

It is high time that the national body and the branches get creative and give the organisation a new focus.

In this changing world where agriculture, which was once the mainstay of the country's economy, is now being marginalised the body needs to look at new directions in which to utilise the attractive bit of real estate that they own or lease.

These are green lungs in otherwise bare towns and cities and they should be kept that way.

Regular use of the facilities would be a way of continually raising funds for the organisation without relying on the once a year activity and the goodwill of the business community who are now struggling to make ends meet.

Each show rejoices that they can attract foreign exhibitors. These are the people who are in fact coming in with keenly priced goods that compete with out national industries killing them off.

The Nairobi show ground has been home to football clubs and rugby clubs which at least means custom for the occasional day in the week.

This is not enough to keep the place working.

Each town has its own potential for utilising the facilities offered at the ASK show grounds.

Rather than spend the whole year planning one show to the next the Society should open up to the wider public and consider what radical uses they could put the real estate to and still remain open to the agricultural angle once a year.

As Kachumbari says, the dinosaur is extinct not out of choice but out of circumstances.

Let the Society not follow the same route.

year to comply appreciating the industry was in the process of recovery from an economic slump.

As far as considering claims for compensation on damaged property in hotels as a result of power fluctuations is concerned, he requested those affected to forward details.

ENDOSCOPIC (MINIMAL INVASIVE) SURGERY

Endoscopic surgery, also known as "Minimal Invasive Surgery" is a new technique that is gradually being applied to general and gynaecological surgery.

This procedure eliminates the need for a large incision and instead surgeons use an endoscope, a thin 10mm telescope like instrument that provides excellent and magnified interior views of the human body.

The endoscope once inserted into the body is attached to a tiny camera and light source that allow well correlated images to be seen through a fibre optic cord to television monitor.

By watching the monitor, surgeon with the appropriate training and skills, can now undertake to perform virtually 70-80 per cent of the common surgical procedures by using small hand instruments inserted through secondary punctures.

This surgery technique is being applied to a growing number of procedures.

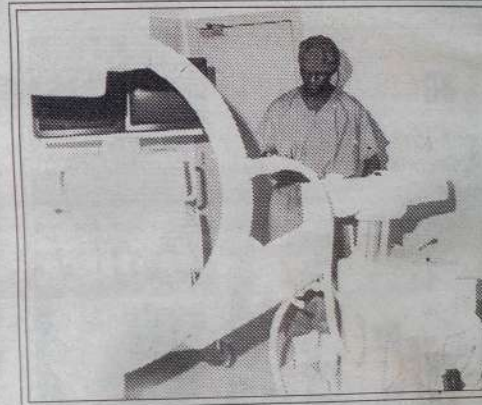

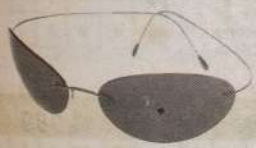

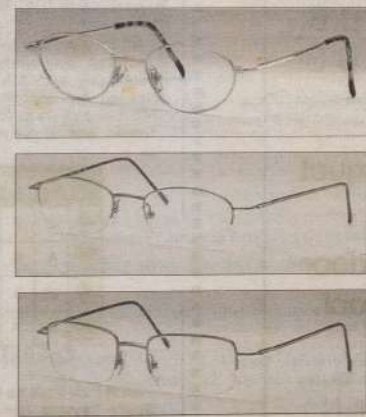

AGA KHAN FOUNDATION HELPS DURUMA VILLAGERS

JENGO VILLAGE in rural district, Samburu division came a beehive of activities as it held the district's third Community Development Open Day on August 17th.

The theme of the event was: 'Fighting Poverty Through Bottom-Up Planning and Implementation of Projects that lead to Food Security and Eradication of Poverty at Community Level'. The Open Day was co-organised by the communities in partnership with SOMBEZA meaning support was to provide a forum for farmer-to-farmer learning.

It was also an opportunity for research and other development institutions to interact with farmers directly and get a feedback necessary for input into the research process and agenda. Consequently, farmers use the open day which is christened Kwale rural show as an opportunity to reflect on the progress made following collaboration with KRSP.

According to available records, the first show was organised by Mwabila Village of Mwavumbo location in 1999. The second event last year was organised by Bofu cluster of villages. This year's event organised by nine villages from Chigato and Mnyenzi sub locations drew participants from sixty villages in collaborations with KRSP. The main activities in the area involve mainly crop and livestock productions. According to the show chairman Mr. Dab, the communities collaboration with Sombeza has brought up many changes. He said Sombeza has involved the communities in various welfare improvements including crop and livestock productions, saving mobilisation and access to credit, development of water-supply infrastructure, skills improvement and social organisations in the villages.

He named main activities as:

- small-scale irrigation technology,
- better farming practices with respect to food production,
- use of langstroth hive bee-keeping technology,
- poultry improvement,
- goat upgrading programme for better milk and meat production, and
- saving and credit scheme.

Dab told the gathering that a total of 46 villages have functional saving banks

accounts and have managed to mobilise over K. Shs. two million.

He added that a total of 526 community members have benefited from loans amounting to K. Shs. 1.8 millions, which have been very useful in farming, small business and bee keeping activities.

In one year, farmers in the area produced 700 kgs of honey with a total income of K. Shs. 53,000.

On display were farm products for both crops and livestock, craftsmanship in wood work, pottery and metal work.

Also home made foodstuffs and fabric were exhibited.

The crops included maize, sorghum, millet and togerrenbug goat, chicken and cattle.

Impressed by the development

in the area, Mr Bell told the gathering that DFID will continue to support farming activities in the area.

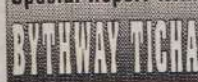
Bell who was the chief guest, said the British government spend yearly over five million shillings on development projects in Kenya.

WSPA has been working hard in Lamu, on many different projects, for a number of years including a sterilisation programme for the island's cats, which has been highly successful.

This clinic will be the first of its kind on the island, although there have been clinics elsewhere in Kenya.

The WSPA 'Free Rural Animal Clinic' programme has now spread to Tanzania, Uganda, Egypt, Ghana, Nigeria, Zambia, Zimbabwe and WSPA has plans next year to hold them in Namibia, Swaziland, Sierra Leone and Senegal as well.

The aims of the clinic are to educate, through the local children, the community in animal welfare and handling, and also to provide free veterinary attention to communities that are normally unable to afford it.

As Matthew Joyce, Humane Education Officer explains: "They are designed to benefit the community's pets

and livestock in the short-term, through the vaccinations and treatment they receive.

"However, there is also an emphasis on benefiting all animals in the long term through education about proper animal welfare."

Gill Richardson, WSPA's Head of Humane Education, agreed and commented:

"I am very excited that we have the opportunity to do a WSPA animal clinic at Wiyoni Primary School. "The Kindness Club is very active, with an excellent leader and has shown a lot of commitment in helping to improve the lives of their local animals, those throughout Africa and the World.

"It really is an excellent club and an example of how WSPA's humane education programme is working here in Africa in changing attitudes for the better."

Last year over 8,500 animals were treated at the clinics and so far this year 6,000 animals have already been treated.

Previous clinics have treated over 1800 animals in a day and this has attracted journalists and media attention worldwide, including a BBC film crew from the U.K.

DIE "Vereinigung für Körperbehinderte von Kenia Küstenzweigstelle" wurde 1971 gegründet und betreut derzeit über dreihundert körperbehinderte, blinde und gehörlose Frauen und Männer in fünf Projekten.

In der Rehabilitationsklinik mit 60 Betten werden jährlich über 100 behinderte Kinder operiert und rund 1000 behinderte Menschen in ländlichen Gebieten und in den Slums betreut.

In einer **Möbelwerkstätte** sowie im Bomboluluprojekt werden 14 Behinderte ausgebildet und 200 Mitarbeiter in Kunsthandwerk und Möbelproduktion beschäftigt.

Bewerber

Durch ein Kreditprogramm erhalten behinderte Bewerber Beratung und Startkapital, um ein Kleingeschäft aufzubauen.

In den **Schmuckwerkstätten** werden von geschickten Arbeitern aus Messing, Kupfer, Holzern, antiken Münzen, geschnitztem Bein, Bananenfasern, Samen und Halbedelsteinen mehr als 800 verschiedene Schmuckdesigns kunstvoll gefertigt; etwa 60 Prozent der Produktion wird in 20 Länder exportiert.

Mit finanzieller Hilfe von "Brot für die Welt" wurde 1987 eine **Schneiderwerkstätte** erbaut, in der eine große Auswahl an handbedruckten Kleidungsstücken aus 100 Prozent kenianischer Baumwolle hergestellt werden.

In der **Lederwerkstatt** werden handgearbeitete Gürtel, Sandalen, Taschen und geprägte Souvenirs kunstvoll produziert.

Über 30 **Holzschnitzer** stellen Schmuck und Produkte aus Ebenholz und Mahagoni her, während in einer **Metallgießerei** Messing gegossen wird.

Im Verkaufsraum kann man die von Behinderten hergestellten Produkte zu günstigen Preisen kaufen.

In Kenia benötigen schätzungsweise 100'000 Körperbehinderte einen Rollstuhl.

Die einzige Möglichkeit für sie bestand darin, teure importierte Rollstühle zu kaufen (für die es keine Ersatzteile gab) und nur wenige konnten sich diese leisten.

Deshalb entschloss sich die Vereinigung 1993, eine Werkstätte aufzubauen, um Rollstühle in angepasster Technologie herzustellen.

Mit einer Spende von DM 50000 vom Förderverein **POLIO HILFE KENIA** in Oberwolfach wurden die Gebäude erstellt und Maschinen und Werkzeuge für die **Rollstuhl-Werkstatt** importiert.

Dreiräder

Dieser werden monatlich etwa 30 Rollstühle von körperbehinderten und gehörlosen Arbeitern unter der Aufsicht eines Werkstatteleiters produziert.

Die meisten Behinderten an der Küste bevorzugen sogenannte Dreiräder, die mit Fahrradpedalen handbetrieben sind.

Damit können sie sich schnell auch auf schlechten und verschlammten Straßen fortbewegen.

Diese Dreiräder werden aus einem gebogenen Rahm und Fahrradteilen fabriziert, haben

Die Vorbereitungen zu dieser alljährlich durchgeführten Landwirtschaftsausstellung gingen reibungslos vonstatten unter der dynamischen Aufsicht von Stewart Madzayo, dem neuen Chairman der *Agricultural Society of Kenya (A.S.K.)*, Coast Show, der gleichzeitig ein bekannter Rechtsanwalt in Mombasa ist.

Kenia ist ein Agrarland mit einer Bevölkerung von rund 30 Millionen Einwohnern.

Die Küstenprovinz erstreckt sich über 83'583 km² und wird unterteilt in sieben Distrikte, nämlich Mombasa, Kilifi, Malindi, Tana River, Kwale, Lamu und Taita Taveta, die mit Ausnahme von Taita Taveta alle an die Küste grenzen.

Gemäß Volkszählung von 1999 hat die Küstenprovinz 2.491'000 Einwohner.

Von den sieben Distrikten hat Mombasa mit 653'000 Einwohnern die höchste, Lamu mit 73'000 Einwohnern die niedrigste Zahl.

Die Provinz ist reich an Naturressourcen und hat eine Reihe agro-ökologischer Zonen.

In der Küstenprovinz gibt es einen Viehbestand von 68'612, der jährlich rund 74 Millionen Liter Milch produziert, was den Farmern 1999 mehr als 2 Milliarden Kshs einbrachte.

Es werden jedoch 82 Millionen Liter benötigt und die fehlende Menge wird haupt-sächlich beschafft durch Aufbereitung von Pulvermilch aus anderen Pro-vinzen. Noch vor wenigen Jahren wurden die Bruttoeinnahmen aus der Landwirtschaft von den Deviseneinnahmen aus dem Fremdenverkehr übertroffen, bis der Tourismus nach den Unruhen in Likoni 1997 an der kenianischen Küste beinahe

zum Stillstand kam.

Der Export von Tee, Kaffee und anderen Agrarprodukten hat die Einnahmen aus dem Tourismus nun überholt.

Bahati Mbaya For David And Peter Horsey As Front Ball Joint Snaps!

THIS YEAR'S KNRC Shell BP-Sponsored Coast Rally 2001 took place on Saturday, August 18, on the South Coast, writes **STEVE DAVIDSON**.

Rally Headquarters, the Start and Finish were at Raymond Matiba's Jadini Beach Hotel, which contrary to popular belief is still very much in business and was at 100 per cent occupancy for the weekend!

Generous sponsorship of cash prizes for each section made the whole event more attractive as the large entry of 33 proved.

However, only 30 cars actually started the rally for one or more reasons.

First off the 'ramp' was Rory Green and Orson Taylor in the Subaru Impreza but he could only manage third fastest in the Super Special Stage (SSS) which was the first competitive section.

Quicker by four seconds around the dusty and twisty quarry track was Alistair Cavenagh and Greg Forster in another Subaru Impreza, but fastest in the first stage was Glen Edmunds and Gary McIntyre in car number seven, a Mitsubishi Evo with a time of four minutes 40 seconds.

W.E.C Lines had donated a cash prize of U.S. Dollars 500 to each of the fastest two and four-wheel drive cars in the SSS and so competition in the quarry was fast and furious.

Glen Edmunds retired before he had a chance to better his first time in the quarry but only Ian Duncan came close in the subsequent two laps, his best (second round) equalling that of Alistair Cavenagh's first lap time (4:44).

Paul Bailey and Raju Sehmi in car number four, the Toyota Celica GT4 were impressive in the quarry with a time of 4:51, just ahead of Lee Rose and Toby Wright's 4:54 in car number 26, a Subaru Impreza.

Local heroes, Stephano Rocca and Crispin Sassoon were consistent in the first two laps of the quarry with identical times of 5:05 but suddenly found some extra speed (or a short-cut) in the third lap to gain ten seconds and clock an excellent 4:55.

Rob Hellier and Des Page-Morris managed 5:08 the first time around but then caused a traffic jam at the first hairpin after the start when the gearbox/transmission seized.

Sadistic Pleasure

The Start Controller radioed headquarters to inform them that a car was blocking the route, and from the high vantage point it looked like a "normal private road-car" had got stuck.

Dave Williamson was about to take sadistic pleasure in "rolling the car out of the way" as the quarry is private land and the vehicle shouldn't be there!

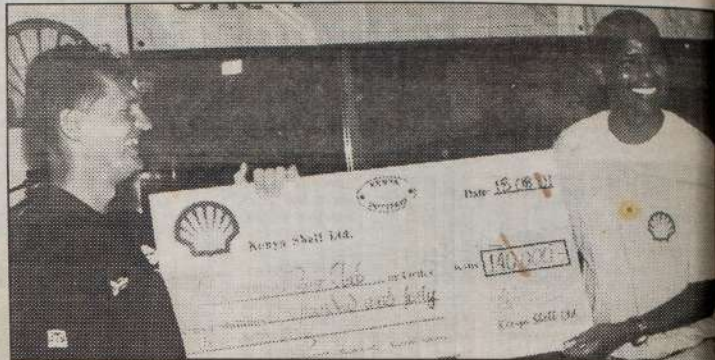
