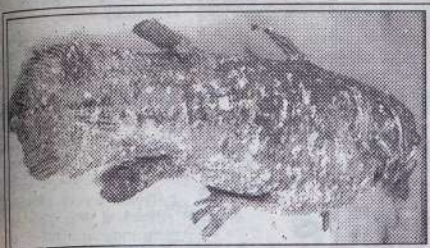

## 'COELOCANTH' FISH CAUGHT OFF KENYA

## LARGE, RARE FISH IS A LIVING FOSSIL

WHAT IS BELIEVED to be a rare 'Coelocanth' fish has been brought to Mombasa by fishermen who caught this unusual specimen while fishing off Malindi.

The remains of the fish weigh 70 kilograms and it measures one metre thirty centimeters in length from tail to mouth.

Until 1938, when a live specimen was caught, this ancient species was thought to have been extinct for about 70,000,000 years.

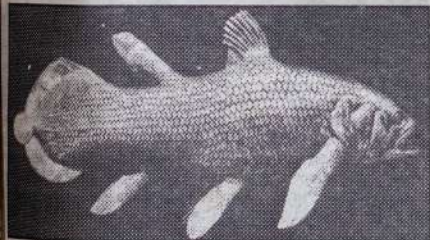
Fossil 'coelocanths' up to about 350,000,000 years have been found in Europe and North America.

Living 'coelocanths' have been found in waters off the East Coast of Africa, South Africa, Indonesia and Hong Kong.

The fish is blue-gray and sometimes brown in colour, with large scales and small leglike fins.

A specimen caught in 1952 weighed 45 kilograms and measured one meter fifty centimeters.

The 'coelocanth' specie name is *Latimeria chalumnae*.

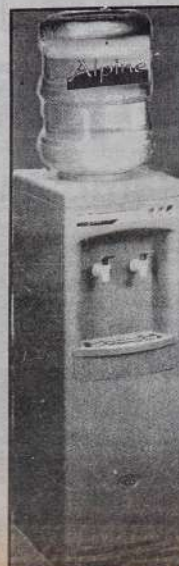

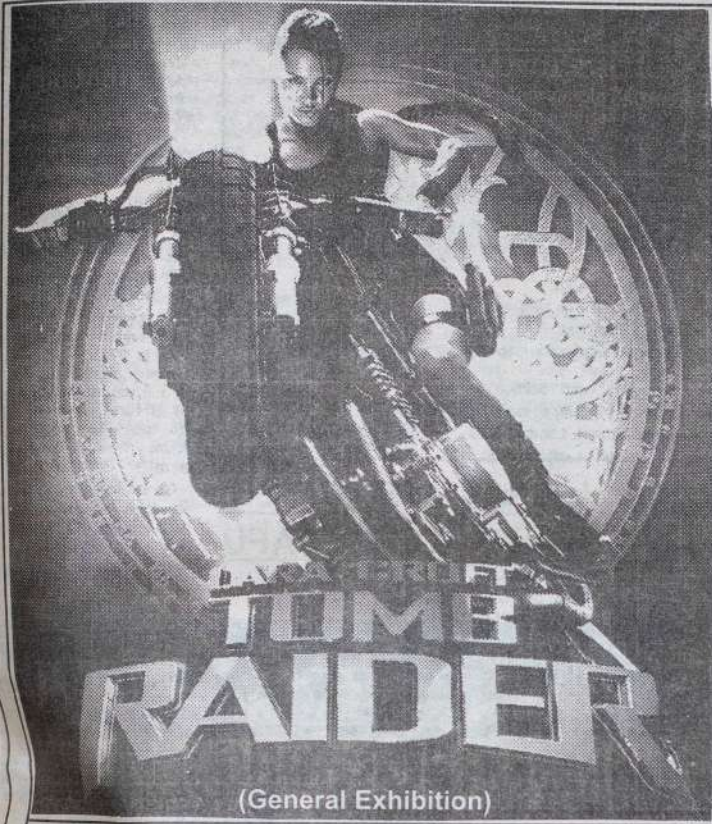

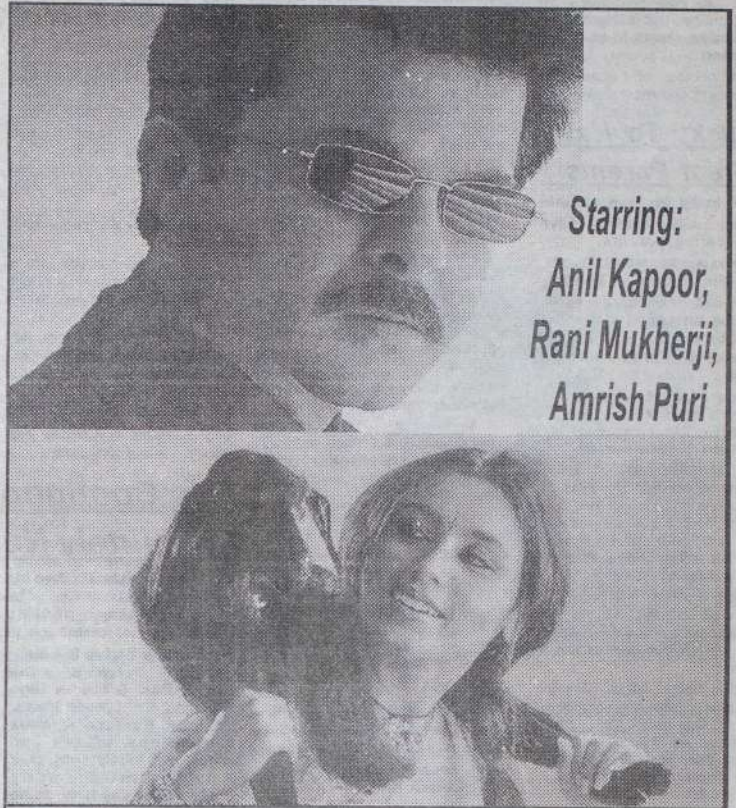

'BLACK SPOT' CLAIMS ANOTHER SIX PEOPLE KILLED IN 'HEAD ON' COLLISION

**A 'Dreadful Accident' Caused Not Only By Awful Road But Also 'Incompetent' Driving**

AS ON my to 'shags' recently to collect the 'logs' so that they could be ready to go back to school after staying with 'ir' 'cucu' for part of the vacation.

In the process I saw several road accidents which can be blamed on driver incompetence rather than bad driving. The most striking one was in the notorious Mbaruk section of Nairobi - Nakuru road. It is called a 'black spot' as a lot of all the accidents that have happened there. It is this case should in fact be a cause for worry from the road authorities and also the cops.

There are some pretty simple and costly actions that can be taken to correct the reputation of the road has.

In this accident, a Peugeot 504 was packed with passengers and luggage was speeding along towards Nakuru.

**BUS DRIVER**

Ahead was a bus that was also tearing away at the kilometres. In the distance was a broken down vehicle with the usual foliage strewn on the road to mark its presence.

Beyond the broken down vehicle was a small brown and a white bus. The bus driver decided that he

would go round the broken down vehicle and decided to move into the right lane in preparation.

The driver of the estate vehicle, who was following close behind, decided he would match the moves of the bus and also pulled out to the right without checking.

A lot of drivers do this in the false belief that whatever a large vehicle such as a bus or lorry can do, a small car can do in less time and space.

As they neared the broken down vehicle, a 'matatu' suddenly appeared, round the bend and over the brow, driving in the opposite direction also at high speed.

The driver of the bus and also the one from the 'matatu' quickly realised that they would collide if nothing happened.

The 'matatu' driver started to brake.

The bus driver decided that he would first get into his lane and then start braking since the road surface was better in the left

hand lane.

The driver of the estate car did not follow the bus and stayed in the right hand lane to continue overtaking.

This was the fatal mistake



made. The oncoming 'matatu' had stopped braking seeing what the bus had done and then all of a sudden was faced with another emergency in the form of an approaching speeding vehicle.

**'STEER OFF'**

This time the 'matatu' driver braked but also wanted to steer off the road to avoid an inevitable head on collision.

The driver of the estate vehicle had few options since he was

now abreast of a braking bus and could not return to the left-hand lane.

He also decided to brake hard and also veer off the road to avoid collision with the 'matatu'.

The road surface was very corrugated and the braking action was of no consequence since the tyres were only in contact with the road surface for half the time.

The drivers lost control of the vehicles and they headed for a collision.

One of the cars rolled due to the violent lurches brought on by the corrugations on the road and the 'matatu' impacted on it.

Some six fellows died on the spot and all the other passengers were injured seriously.

The two drivers were amongst the dead.

The bus also had its fair share of trouble as it also hit a corrugated patch on the road and the driver lost control and hit the back of the stationary vehicle instead of making it to the other side on the escape road.

Five passengers were injured with the driver having to be hospitalised for fractures.

The main cause here was driver error.

However, the Mbaruk section of road is known to be a 'killer section'.

The reason why this is so is that the road has corrugations and in the event that there is a need to take emergency action

The roads authority, by investing in a small amount of money, could straighten out the problems on this section of road and lead to great savings.

The number of lives that have been lost on that section of road that could have been saved would have given a short pay back on the investment.

Priorities should be set on the basis of what returns can be obtained.

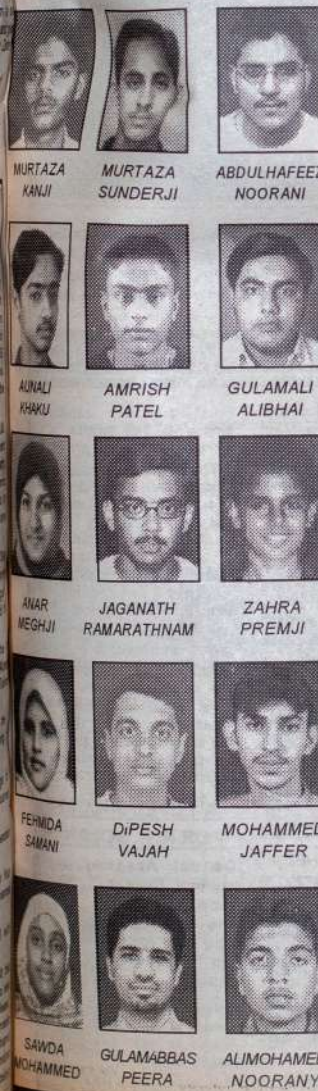
A short section such as this one can be done now whilst awaiting the major repairs of the section of road which are now (over)due.

As Kachumbari says, the old adage of "a stitch in time saves nine" is still very valid today.

## EMERGENCY MEDICINE - A TRADITION OF ISRAELI KENYAN COLLABORATION

**Emergency Medicine, Basic Trauma and Cardiac Life Support Courses:**

**A Tradition of Israeli-Kenyan Collaboration**

THREE years ago a tradition of medical Israeli - Kenyan collaboration was established.

Launched by the Israeli foreign and health ministries, and with the help of the Israeli embassy in Nairobi and the RCK.

Upon the request of the RCK (Resuscitation Council of Kenya), directed by Dr. Grace Adira Achiya, the first two week workshop of emergency medicine was conducted by Dvora Hertz (RN MA) and Sima Farhadian (RN BA) in Kisumu.

A second course followed, in General Coast Hospital, Mombasa, participated by 55 doctors and nurses.

The workshop included basic cardiac and trauma life support sessions, and transmitting theoretical as well as practical skills by Dr Josef Haik, a plastic surgeon and a trauma instructor, Zmora Zohar (RN MA) and Nadim Hadid (RN BA).

As in previous encounters, a keen enthusiasm for learning and cooperating was exhibited by

the Kenyan participants of the workshop, the RCK, and the hosting hospital.

Trauma is a major cause of death in Kenya mainly due to road accidents; therefore, tackling the problem by prevention and various treatment modalities was a noble goal.

The closing session took place on the 9th of July in the General Coast Hospital in the presence of the Israeli Ambassador Jacob Amital.

Both the Ambassador and the tutor of the course Dr. Josef Haik said they are full of hope to develop and continue this fertile collaboration between Israel and Kenya in purpose to improve the emergency medicine care.

Taking down tents, packing up camp and putting everything up again, with a long transport section in between, was as physically taxing as walking the fifteen to nineteen kilometres per day.

Reveille was at 5.00 a.m. every morning to the sound of a Portablast. 5.30 a.m. breakfast was served and 6.00 a.m. the ladies set off.

You will note that the Walkers were all female and their support crew men, bar Anne Taylor, who should have walked but after a knee operation decided this was not on and so volunteered to look after the kitchen.

The only upcountry volunteer, April Webb, had to back out in the last minute due to an appendix operation, but for her sponsors' sake spent the last night in camp with us and joined us for the last seven kilometres leading into "Satao Camp", which proved to be rather unpleasant, as we were drizzled on all the way.

### Kirkland And Torben Rune

Hopefully this was the beginning of some serious rain which Tsavo desperately needs.

It is parched.

However, we had a great reception at "Satao" and were treated to lunch there courtesy of Mike Kirkland and Torben Rune of Southern Cross Safaris.

The Kilulu Chairman, Beverley Herd, was also there to greet

us, and after her little speech during lunch our Treasurer, Peter Doenhoff, gave us the welcoming news that we would pretty certainly reach our target of K. shs. one million sponsorship towards the 'Kilulu Home' at Mtwapa.

The Walkers were: Audrey Antoni, Helen Barker, Marianne Beekes, Ursula Brenneisen, Briony Cooper and Francee Thornton.

Helen Antoni joined us half-way. The support crew were: Anne and David Taylor, Terence Hopking, Bob Brenneisen and Kevin Richards, a nephew of April's, who stood in for her husband Sonny.

The only injuries were a scorpion sting suffered by Francee (and treated with a Piriton and Vicks!) and punctures in our bladder of wine and in Marianne's blow-up bed.

The thorns and burrs were a real nuisance.

Naturally we had a few blisters and other aches and pains, that had to be overcome, but the mood was jolly.

One day a Ranger asked what was wrong with Francee - who

was suffering in silence and usually was full of laughter and jokes.

We all had our bad day at some stage and wished we had never volunteered for such a dumb fundraiser!

We saw more animals than two years ago and experienced three adrenalin raising encounters with an angry hippo that charged, two mating lions that were too close for comfort, and a lone buffalo that insisted on his right of way and

made us retrace our tracks.

Our three accompanying Kenya Wildlife Service rangers dealt efficiently with these situations and anyway we were always in radio contact with a car ahead of us, that stopped every five kilometres (with water and fruit on board) and thus made quite sure that we walked the required kilometres!

### Well Wishers

(We actually walked 150.4 kilometres according to the log.)

Apart from Park fees which everyone paid themselves, we had very few expenses, which were charged equally to the

participants.

Our escorts gave their time, vehicles and fuel for free.

We got about K. shs. 20,000/- worth of provisions from various Mombasa wholesalers, which was a great help.

And our first five evening meals were provided free of charge by various wellwishers, who had cooked and deepfrozen them for us.

## Fahad Bayusuf Set To Make History In Egypt

MOMBASA BASED Fahad Bayusuf will make history next month when he will be the country's sole representative in the Marathon Open Water 25 km championship to be held between October 3-7 in Sharm El Shake, Egypt.

Bayusuf will also be the only Kenyan in the Open Co.Me.N Open Water Swimmers championship to be held from October 9-13 in Ismalia Suez Canal.

The event will cover 10 km. Bayusuf and his coach Mohammed Farid's air tickets have been donated by the Egyptair.

In an interview, coach Farid said this will be the first time in the history of swimming in Kenya to be represented in the 25 km championship. He said Kenyans have specialised themselves in short and long courses, with the longest being 1,500 metres.

### Fukuoka

Farid who has represented Egypt in the 30 km Open swimming championship along River Nile in early eighties said Fahad has been training alongside Waleed Bayusuf, Twalib Bayusuf and Taib Abdallah Taib at Reef Hotel.

Farid further said that Fahad has been undergoing intensive training along the Tudor Sports Club and Fort Jesus in preparation for the Egyptian championship.

Fahad returned from Fukuoka, Japan recently after representing the country in the World championship.

Fahad aged 17 years and who is a student at Mombasa Academy is ready for both 25 km and 10 km open races.

According to Egyptian Swimming Federation (ESF) Secretary General, Dr. Mohi Farid, entries will be accepted from National Federations.

In the invitation letter, Dr. Farid said deadline for confirmation is September 15.

Fahad's participation has already been confirmed by the Kenya Swimming Federation.

Coach Farid said the Federation's chairman Ben Ekumbo has been communicating with the Egyptian secretary general for update.

Coach Farid said Fahad has been training 15-20 km every day under heavy high tides in the Nyali-Mtwapa, Fort Jesus and Tudor Water Sports areas.

Fahad and Coach Farid will depart on October 1.

According to ESF secretary

general, the winner of the 25 km will pocket US Dollars 3,000/= with the second and third prize winners getting US Dollars 2,000/= and 1,000/= respectively.

Cash prizes will benefit the top 15 in both men and women categories.

And in the 10 km championship, no country apart from the host will be allowed to enter more than four swimmers.

Medals will also be

awarded to the top three swimmers in each event.

Deadline of confirmation September 10.

Coach Farid said he was optimistic Fahad who is currently the best long course swimmer in the country will do the country proud.

Farid thanked the Egyptian Airline and the Kenya Swimming Federation for the support they have shown to them.

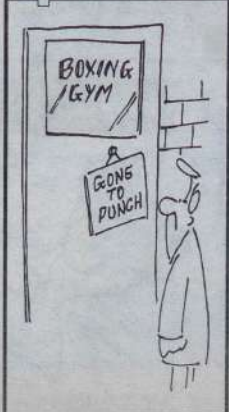
