WHAT A STINK!

EVIL-SMELLING rubbish littered many Mombasa high streets this week in a continuing protest by hundreds of very angry Municipal Council workers demonstrating their frustration over long delayed and continually promised salaries for June, July and August 2001.

On Monday Local Government Minister Joseph Kamotho ordered the workers to end their week-long strike and immediately return to work.

As the strike continued the Ministry of Health ordered 16 health centers managed by the

local authority 'closed' until the salary issue had been sorted out.

Informed that they would be paid in 'full' later in the week the Council employees then demanded an assurance that they would receive their September salaries promptly and on time.

Earlier they had paraded through town singing funeral dirges and carrying a 'coffin' bearing an effigy of embattled Mayor Councillor Mwalimu Masoud Mwachima.

On Tuesday the strikers had avoided riot police and scattered decaying refuse along Nyerere Avenue, Mwembe Tayari, Jomo Kenyatta, and Adel Nasser roads.

Provincial medical officer Dr. S.K. Shariff warned of disease outbreak if the strike continues.

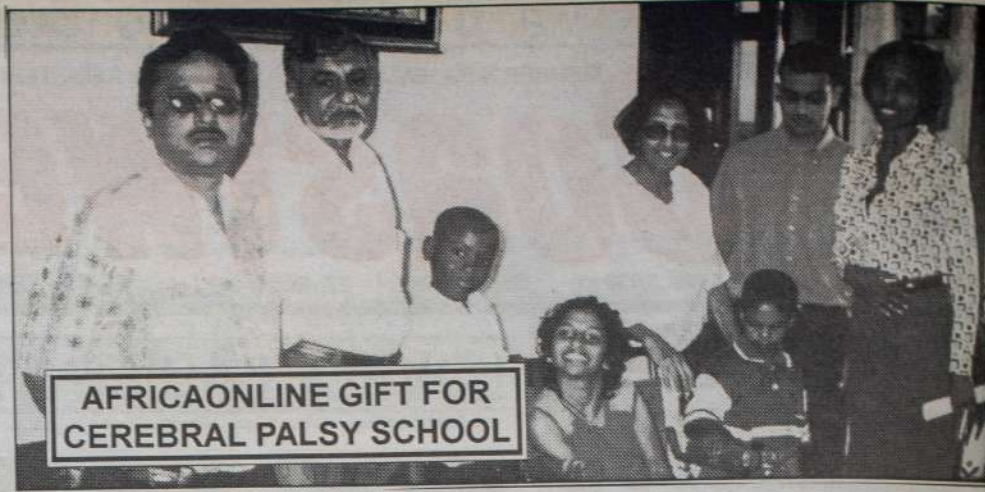

HH Aga Khan Hospital's P.S.G. Hold Charity Film

This is not the first time the PSG has organised such an event.

In 1999, a similar clinic was hosted by the PSG at Aga Khan Hospital Mombasa.

The clinic was headed by Cardiac Paediatrician, Dr. Aseso (Kenyatta National Hospital, Nairobi) where 73 children with heart problems were examined and advised on appropriate management.

An ECHO was also provided free of charge.

The heart clinic is set for January 2002.

Although the PSG does not directly provide financial assistance for surgeries, it can assist by channeling the patient through the other major charities in cases of immediate or life threatening heart surgeries.

The average cost of one surgery is KShs: 200,000/=.

Three such open heart surgeries were carried out in Nairobi this year.

The PSG is playing a vital part in assisting children who need support.

CATHOLIC 'BISHOPS OF SUDAN' MEET IN MOMBASA

THE civil war situation in Sudan necessitates that the Roman Catholic Episcopal Conference meets in Nairobi where a new Secretariat has been established.

After three weeks of meetings the venue was changed to Mombasa.

On September 5 the entire Bishops Conference of Sudan arrived in Mombasa.

A Reception was organised at Whitesands Hotel hosted by Archbishop John Njenga Archbishop of Mombasa in order to help the Bishops "feel at home".

Representatives of the Priests and Religious of the Archdiocese joined them.

Archbishop John Njenga welcomed the Bishops and assured them of the support of the Catholic Church of Kenya.

The twelve Bishops were present Archbishop Gabriel Zubeir Wako Archbishop of Khartoum, Archbishop Paulino Lukudu Loro Archbishop of Juba, Bishop Vincent Mojwok Nyiker, Bishop Rudolf Deng Mjak, Bishop Daniel Adwok Kur, Apostolic Administrator Antonio Menegazzo, Bishop Joseph G. Abangite, Bishop Paride Taban, Bishop Erkolano Lodu Tombe, Bishop Johnson Akio Mutek, Bishop Macram Max Gassiss and Bishop Caesar Mazzolari.

Hundreds of people Priests Sisters Brothers and Laity later thronged Holy Ghost Cathedral to welcome the 12 Bishops of Sudan who had been meeting in Mombasa.

Archbishop John Njenga Archbishop of Mombasa welcomed the Bishops officially to Mombasa.

In his homily the Archbishop emphasised the fact that:

"We need to support one another as members of the same Church.

"In the last twenty years" he said "two to three million people have died.

"More than six million Sudanese are displaced and are refugees in neighbouring countries".

Here in Mombasa the Bishops have looked for healing and refreshment.

A Session for the "Healing of Healers" was proposed for the Bishops in Mombasa with the

support of MISSIO MUNICH Fr Konrad Lachenmayer and Fr Hermann Schluack MISSIO AACHEN" g Seminarians and Religious," he commented,

"The Kenyan Government" said the Archbishop "has played a big role in bringing Peace to Sudan.

"The Government has allowed humanitarian aid to reach Sudan.

"Food and other Commodities are airlifted from Lokichogio.

"It has also allowed the Sudanese Secretariat to be built in Nairobi.

"Assistance has also been given for Sudanese Students to come to Kitale to Bakita Centre which caters for Seminarians, Catechists and Teachers from Sudan."

Bishop Francis Baldacchino the Bishop of Malindi was also present.

He thanked the Bishops for coming to Mombasa.

'WIND SHEER' FACTOR ON ROAD SIDE BILL BOARDS

...I will continue this week in the issue of freak weather conditions and its effects.) BREAK we may call it but sudden squalls and unusually high deposition of rain will happen several times in a year.

It is only the extent and strength that varies.

This variation is the one that begs questions on the design of structures that are put up, some temporary and others permanent.

Bill boards are sprouting up almost by the second around the country.

In principle, each organisation responsible for erection of such structures are expected to obtain permission from some local council or other prior to work.

However, such permission does not extend to the quality of the erection but is more attuned to collecting revenue for the council arising from rental of the space.

Expectations are that the location of the signage will not cause any danger to people living and working in the towns.

The danger can be caused by the location of the signage.

Some signage is put up which blocks the vision of drivers.

Problems are mainly at junctions and roundabouts where low level signs sprout endlessly.

Other signage, whilst not a problem because of being put in the heart of the roundabout causes a different problem for motorists.

Such signage blocks light from vehicle headlights across the roundabout at night.

EXHAUSTION AND EXCESS

In the absence of background lighting from street lights, the blocking of such lighting prevents one seeing other vehicles and realising that there is a roundabout.

This is especially for those who are strange to the towns. Add tiredness, drunkenness and ill preparedness and the recipe for an accident at the roundabout exists as a result of incorrectly placed signage.

With Same Old Boring Adverts - Unfamiliarity Breeds Content

Councils should spend time to review the allocation of licences to agencies that erect low level signage.

They should not allow any such signage in or adjacent to roundabouts as they are a hindrance to the safe use of such facilities by motorists and indeed by pedestrians as well.

The likelihood of such small signage being seen is very low.

However, misguided opinion that there will always be queues and that people will see the message still leads the push to put more signs in the crowded spaces on roundabouts and at junctions.

This must stop and be reversed

In recent foul weather, several large signs have been affected by the wind forces and displays have been ripped off and hurled towards roads and vehicles.

Some have actually caused accidents.

Though not spectacular enough to get into the news, damage did happen to the property of people who should never have been put in danger.

Even canvas displays which have been ripped off cause danger to road users in that they float and can cover the wind-screens of vehicles causing the driver lose visibility and control of his vehicle.

The Town Fathers should, in addition to proper licensing procedures, also set minimum requirements for safety of such structures especially with respect to the structural soundness of the signage.

Minimum wind forces that they should withstand should be prescribed and evidence that the structures can withstand such forces should be required from registered engineers.

This means that typical designs can be approved and random checks made to ensure that structures are constructed in accordance with the approved design.

Such designs could be modular (as is evidenced by most of the structures being put up) minimising the need and possible of recertification. The organisations that group advertising professionals should take a lead towards self regulation in this respect.

ACCEPTABLE

Setting standards and operational ethics which are acceptable to the Town Fathers would weed out the *jua kali* practitioners who are the main cause of grief and ensure that motorists could still enjoy the use of the road without threat of the encroachment of the forests of bill boards that have become the vogue.

As Kachumbari says, self regulation means that attacks can be fended off by demon-

stration of responsible discharge of duty. Could advertisers please advertise and shout about their commitment?



in the interests of road safety.

The other danger can be caused by the quality of the signage.

Advertising bill boards are getting larger and larger so that the message is made easier to assimilate.

Drivers will be able to read and get the message since they do not have to squint to read the writing on the bill boards in contrast to the smaller signage on roundabouts.

These large billboards are therefore liberally splattered along the sides of the road.

Such signage, in general, tends to not cause safety issues with respect to visibility and distraction to road users.

However, concerns arise about the quality of the construction.

The permission process only deals with the collection of revenue and does not deal with whether the structure is sound enough to stand typical weather conditions or long term stability or that it will be maintained.

Basketball Teams To Be Scrapped Off For 'Non Payment'

A NUMBER of teams will be scrapped off from the Coast Provincial Basketball League following non-payment of the league fees, according to the Coast Basketball Association.

Speaking to the Club's representatives during the Association's Annual General Meeting, Coast Basketball Association Chairman Tobby Otum said that out of eleven clubs which are participating in the league, only two have paid while the rest have not.

Otum said that the office currently has a financial handicap and urged clubs to clear their payments or be banned from the league.

He further said that the national office is preparing the provincial side for the play-offs which will take place in Nairobi and winners will be promoted to Division One in National Classic League.

"We will not allow any team to participate in the play-offs if they will not clear with us" he said.

The following were elected to their respective posts:

Treasurer - David Demba takes over from Sammy Kiki who had to step down due to pressure of work early this year.

Previously Demba was the Association's Assistant Treasurer while David Maina who was co-opted as Assistant Treasurer was to continue.

Acting Assistant Fixtures Secretary - Milton Oboto was appointed replacing Jaffer Mohamed.

Financial

He said that Baobab and Congo Nets are the only clubs which have paid while the nine remaining clubs, namely Lakers, Mombasa Polytechnic, Baptist, Rollers, Mikindani, High Level, Kisauni, Gorofani and Shimo have not cleared with the office.

New Marketing Team Soon Ready

An advertising company DDB Communication Concepts Ltd. has been engaged and a full set of communication material will be ready early October including a Destination Logo and Video, also general and special interest brochures.

There will be the official launch of its revamped website undertaken by a local company 3 Mice working in partnership with Symphony and Skipix.

Towards the end of September a 15/20 strong group of marketing representatives and media will be meeting stakeholders in the tourism industry.

They are from what KTB describes as 'Clusters' of countries each with a Kenyan Regional and Exhibition Manager, also Marketing Assistants.

It was over a year ago that expensive tourist offices abroad were closed, KTB then assuming, full responsibility for marketing.

The 'Clusters' are 'USA' including Canada; 'UK' also covering The Netherlands, Italy, Spain and Eastern Europe; 'Germany' together with France, Switzerland, Austria and Scandinavian countries.

The fourth 'Cluster' is 'Emerging Markets' which includes the domestic market.

Said the MD 'within the next 10/18 months Regional Marketing Managers, after finishing their training, will be based in source markets and will be part of that structure and responsible for the development and implementation of the marketing plan'.

It was at the MD's instigation that a meeting with stakeholders was arranged by the Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers & Caterers, Coast, and among those present were the Chairman of the Mombasa & Coast Tourist Association, Kuldip Sondhi, and Chairman of the Kenya Association of Tour Operators, Coast, Tasneem Adamji.

There were apologies from the National Chairman of KAHK, Raymond Matiba, who said how very sorry he was at having to miss this very important and informative meeting.

The KTB Managing Director told stakeholders 'I think you all want to know what we are doing and where we are going and how you fit in, for we need your support'.

She revealed that KTB's next Board Meeting would be held on Sept. 26 'spending two days here so that the industry can

interact with members'.

There was also a promise that KTB would be giving more attention to the coast.

She mentioned that 'on-going' at the moment was a full scale 'Exit Survey' which follows a 'pilot' study at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport and Moi International Airport, Mombasa, to find out as much as possible about tourists expectations and impressions on leaving Kenya.

Said the MD 'research funding will be available by the end of September and the results will be shared with the industry'.

Mrs. Buyu then went on to talk about the 'consumer'.

She said they have changed a lot and are now very demanding, very experienced, know their rights and have many alternatives.

Noting 'today they are not so much looking for cheap holidays, but those that offer good value for money'.

Saying that fewer scheduled and charter aircraft are coming to Kenya, the MD said 'with our marketing strategy now in place we have to see there is sufficient capacity to bring tourists here'.

one classic example being golf. Meanwhile, people have got to know that Kenya has much more to offer than just wildlife and beaches.

Product diversification includes culture, nature and landscapes, archaeology/history, adventure tourism, cruise tourism, sports especially golf, bird watching, Agro-tourism, culinary tourism, conferencing, incentives etc.

She went on there is also a huge opportunity for us in the domestic market, and this will be one of our key priorities'.

The 'Emerging Markets' cluster she explained also includes the rest of Africa, Middle East and Australia/Asia'.

As far as our USA, UK and German clusters are concerned they make up about 90 / 95 per cent of the total volume of tourists to Kenya.

SHORT LISTED

Said Suzanne 'we advertised and received proposals from marketing companies interested in representing Kenya as a destination within those clusters.

Ninety companies from literally all over the world were eager to do so.

Interviews took place in London, Frankfurt, New York and LA of those short listed.

Said Suzanne 'we wanted to be sure that whoever was representing this country knows what they are doing

We are very confident that those selected will be able to work with us and reposition Kenya.

They will be working with our Kenyan Regional Managers responsible for the development and implementation of the marketing plan and will be part of that structure'.

Suzanne then spoke of the need to develop new advertising material and to do so they had invited four advertising agencies in Kenya to submit proposals and costs the tender being finally awarded to Communication Concepts Ltd.

At the meeting KTB's Managing Director Mrs. Buyu congratulated both Kuldip Sondhi (MCTA) and Tasneem Adamji (KATO, Coast) on their election as chairmen of their respective associations.

Dieses Paradies mit seinen weißsandigen, palmengesäumten Stränden, seinem langen Küstenriff, in dem sich Myriaden farbenprächtiger Fische zwischen märchenhaften Korallen tummeln, mit seinen wunderschönen, schnellwechselländischen Landschaften, die vom üppigen Dschungel bis hin zur trockenen Halbwüste reichen, mit seiner faszinierenden Tierwelt, die zu den artenreichsten der ganzen Erde gehört und alle Konkurrenten in den Schatten stellt, mit seinen freundlichen nie und nimmer terroristisch eingestellten Menschen, in deren Herzen kein religiöser Fanatismus lodert, der in Mordlust endet wie beispielsweise in Ägypten, dieses herrliche Fleckchen Erde, das mit zu den schönsten Reiseländern der Erde zählt, übt auf mich eine solche Faszination aus, dass ich ihm total verfallen bin und dem African Safari Club in dieser Zeit schon mehr als dreißig Mitglieder zugeführt habe.

Das macht aber niemand, der nicht durch und durch von dem wunderbaren Land gefangen ist.

Es stellt sich nur die Frage, ob Kenia dieses Reise-Wunderland noch ist, trotz der abstoßenden Medien-Schlammschlacht.

Viele drittklassige Reporter der Regenbogenpresse, die es mit der Wahrheit noch nie genau genommen haben, werden zu sensationshungrigen und notorischen Panikmachern ohne Niveau und Klasse, ohne Sauberkeit der Recherche und ohne Wahrheitsliebe, weil Publikum und Verleger das von ihnen erwarten.

Derjenige Reporter ist für sie der Beste, der die schauerlichsten Schlagzeilen und Schreckensberichte liefert, der Wahrheitsgehalt ist uninteressant.

Die Hauptsache ist Erhöhung der Auflage, Steigerung des Profits.

Der Pseudo-Panikreporter sorgt dann für das entsprechende Angebot aus Kenia, denn kaum ein anderes Land ist bei uns inzwischen so bekannt.

Das Abschlagen ganzer Völker in Ruanda/Burundi kitzelt dagegen überhaupt nicht, da diese Länder kein Begriff sind; Kenia hingegen, das kennt inzwischen jeder.

Irrführend ist auch, dass viele Schreckensberichte zum Beispiel über den Kongo oder Simbabwe mit der Datumzeile Nairobi erscheinen, so dass man sie wieder mit Kenia in Verbindung bringt, obwohl die Länder tausende von Kilometern entfernt sind.

Durch diese Sensationsnachrichten werden viele potentielle Keniareisende verunsichert und wählen lieber eine andere Destination.

Wer aber Kenia selbst kennengelernt hat, weiß inzwischen, dass der Tourist von allen diesen Geschehnissen nicht berührt wird und trotz allem hier wunderschöne Ferien erleben kann."

Nach dieser Lobeshymne für Kenia gab Herr Kütz allerdings zu, dass seine Begeisterung vor zwei Jahren einen Dämpfer erhalten hat.

Als der neue, dynamische Bürgermeister von Mombasa im Rahmen eines Verschönerungsprogrammes die Stadt von den riesigen Abfallhaufen säuberte und mit Blumen bepflanzte, war Manfred Kütz so beeindruckt, dass er seinerseits auch etwas dazu beitragen wollte.

Er bot dem Bürgermeister in einem Brief an, in Mombasa eine Benefiz-Ausstellung abzuhalten mit seinen Bildern mit afrikanischem Charakter.

Als der Ministerpräsident von Belgien von diesem Vorhaben hörte, war er ganz begeistert und schlug vor, diese Ausstellung auch in Brüssel zu zeigen.

Antwort

Leider ist nichts daraus geworden, denn auf den großzügigen Vorschlag ist aus Mombasa nie eine Antwort vom Bürgermeister eingetroffen.

Was Herrn Kütz übrigens auch stört, sind die Taxis in Mombasa, meistens uralte Klapperkisten, die enorm überhöhte Preise verlangen.

Er wird aber trotzdem weiterhin nach Mombasa kommen, denn er sagte abschließend:

"Kenia war schon immer eines der schönsten, einladendsten, freundlichsten und ungefährlichsten Reiseländer der Erde und wird es auch bleiben; man darf sich in Zukunft nur nicht von diesen Panikmachern beeinflussen lassen."

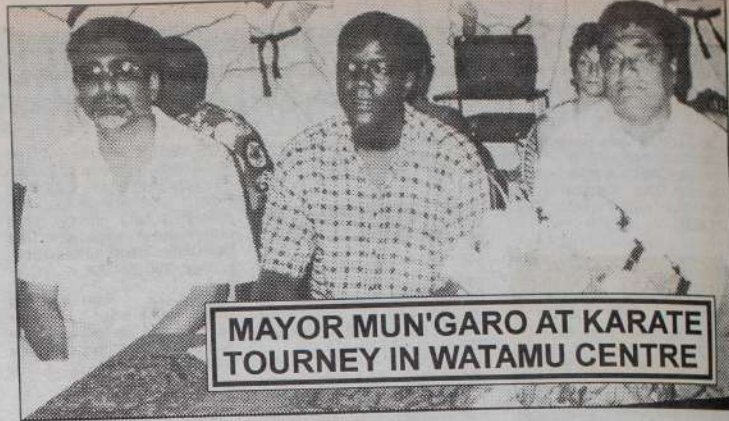

Learn Basic Life Support Actions

Rescue breathing - This provides a non-breathing casualty with the oxygen they need.

It is sometimes called the 'kiss of life' or expired air ventilation. The rescuer breaths air into the casualty by mouth to mouth or mouth to nose.

Although the air blown into the casualty's lungs contains only 17 per cent oxygen, compared to 21 per cent in the atmosphere, this may still be enough to keep the non-breathing casualty alive.

Chest compressions - In a casualty whose heart has stopped, chest compressions are given by pressing down on the chest on the breastbone.

This simulates the pumping of the heart, and maintains the blood circulation, until further medical assistance arrives.

Where Sunlight Has Tinkle Of Ice And Shadows Made With Whipped Cream

THE FISHING on our coast has started with a giant splash as a new Kenya record yellowfin tuna was weighed in at Watamu last Saturday.

Mtwapa anglers were connected to this catch by the fact that many of them were in Watamu on the lucky day and also by the fact that the former Kenya all-tackle record was held by a Mtwapa fisherman.

That was the crewman, Katusya Mutunga who caught his fish from James Adcock's boat *Samvuke* in November 1994.

His record was a yellowfin of 22.5 kilos or 204 lbs, caught on 30 lb line so it will remain as the record in that line class since the Watamu fish was caught on 50 lb line.

The new record tops the old one by a couple of kilos, as the fish weighed 94.4 kilos or 208.1

pounds.

John Andrews, a well-known angler from Nairobi, was the rodsman who caught the fish, and he was fishing on *Alley Cat*, captained by Pete Darnborough of Ocean Sports.

Mtwapa anglers who saw the lure on which the fish was caught were astonished to note how small it was, a size 14 Rapala, and the hooks were the normal size for this lure, surprisingly small.

Who would have thought that such a champion heavyweight slugger would have been brought in on a lure that you might reasonably use in fresh water for catching pike?

But that's fishing: you never have a sand-flea sized idea of what great fish is coming now with its wide jaws to gulp your lure.

Green and black were the colours of the Rapala that caught the fish, a mackerel pattern that

shivered and shimmyed enticingly enough to get the fish committed.

A group of Mtwapa anglers had gone to Watamu to spend the weekend at that most superb fishing hotel, Hemingway's resort, where even the sunlight has in it the tinkle of ice on frosted glass, and the shadows are made of whipped cream.

The Mtwapa-ites maintained a low profile most of the time, supine in the sunshine, although some experienced the coral reef's conjuring trick, jeweled fish shoaling around your floating self, one of the fishes.

Life was more active for those who were out fishing in Watamu, to judge by the flags and the fish weighed in.

On the Saturday there was the record tuna, another of 68 kilos, caught by Philip Revett who has fished in Mtwapa in the past, another of 50 kilos and about a dozen others around 20 kilos plus the smaller ones of about 15, and all from five or six boats.

Add to that the red flags for tagged sailfish, three here, two there, other singles and you have some serious rodding.

Smiling Sardines

Fishing of that quality is about as rare in Mtwapa as smiling sardines in a shark farm, but we do have our moments and, as one of the number remarked, "you never know, we'd better be ready for it when it comes".

Certainly the sailfish were there in Mtwapa waters on Saturday, with Don Allen finally getting his reward for his blank days last season, catching two sailfish from James Adcock's boat, *Vuma*.

The first of these was foul-hooked and took 45 minutes to bring in on 30 pound line, a fish of 32 kilos.

The wahoo are beginning to come in too, and Don got one of

12.8 kilos on Saturday plus two more of 13 and 11 kilos on Monday.

There were a lot of sailfish finning and billing on both Saturday and Sunday, excitement and suspense swimming with them, but they were not easy to entice to the baits.

Eye Go Fishing

Besides that, two as yet unidentified boats reported losing marlin on Monday also, and one of the Voyager boats fishing off Mtwapa caught a yellowfin tuna of about 20 kilos.

So the billfish are in, the rod-bending action has started, it's time to see which of our dreams will come true.

Certainly some of them will, perhaps in the first competition of the season, the Eye Go Fishing, a charity event in aid of the Kwale District Eye Centre, to be held on Sunday, the 11th of November, from The Moorings, the only floating restaurant on the Kenya coast.

This competition is usually a highly enjoyable social event and supporters and well-wishers are invited to attend as are any anglers who wish to enter.
