Still, some fishing people did experience the thrill of the spool spinning to the high whine of the atchet, the rod bowed down inder the pull of strong fish,

and the spray flung leap of the sailfish.

One almost think the sail of this fish was made to catch the air, they leap so high

but the tuna go down, deep and then there is heavy lifting to do

there for the catching.

Interesting names those: th Interesting names those the jack has associations with Jack and The Beanstalk as he was the little one who brought down the giant, and fishing has retained this meaning, with jack being either a small species or an immature fish, as in jack pike in British parlance and jack salmon in American.

The five-finger jack is a small silver fish marked with five dark spots, for all the world like the figer-prints of someone who hald it.

The skipjack is a jack tuna in that it is small too, and another point of interest is that this is not a popular eating fish here but it's what you get in the cans that you buy in the supermarket.

At the other end of the size scale, in the giant league, are the humpback whales that are still in our waters, some of them seen jumping by Allan and Karl on Sunday, although the Flycatcher fishermen saw one heading straight south, "on a mission" Blues Brothers, heading home to Antarctica where the cold waters hold the feed.

And where, who knows but they gather to sing their mysterious, haunting songs in harmony, the great song of their ocean journeys, of which there might even be one that could be called Mtwapa Humpback Blues.


