MALINDI'S once lovely beaches are now free of harassment by traders which should do much to attract more tourists to this historic and charming seaside resort which HABITAT has declared the 'cleanest town in Kenya'.

This very welcome and positive news was revealed by the District Commissioner, Malindi, Patrick Osare, at the launch of World Tourism Day, and three days of celebrations, by the Assistant Minister for Tourism and Information, David Sankori, at Malindi's Eden Roc Hotel.

The previous day the relocation of 108 registered beach operators on to a four-acre site in a popular shopping area next to the DC's office on the sea front had been completed, with Malindi's beaches becoming a non-trading zone.

Said the DC, amid applause 'it is hoped that the same will be happening at Watamu any time now'.

He told the Assistant Minister: "I wish to assure you that whatever decision we take as

leaders in Malindi as far as tourism is concerned will always be done on reaching a consensus with the local people.

This we are doing as we want to remove the idea that tourism is something that benefits only people outside of Malindi and Kenya.

We want to involve the local people in promoting tourism and to see they reap some benefit'.

The Mayor of Malindi, Gedion Mung'aro told the DC:

"I and my councillors support you.

"The town has suffered enough and it is high time we had some order on our beaches'.

Also congratulating the DC for the 'bold step taken' was the M.P. for Malindi, Abubaker Badawy.

Such has been the harassment by beach hawkers over the years that many visitors have vowed never to return, while

business generally has suffered.

News that it had ended delighted everyone but, unfortunately, for some reason or other, very few from the coast's tourist industry were there to hear it.

However, filling the hotel's conference room were many Mayors, Chairmen of County Councils, Town Clerks and

Coun-cillors from all over Kenya who had been invited by the Mayor of Malindi to come and enjoy the three day programme exposing them to the diversity of attractions that Malindi has to offer to help promote domestic tourism.

It had been drawn up by a joint committee from Malindi's proactive tourism industry and on sale was a unique designer 'T' shirt with colourful butterflies on the back to commemorate 'WORLD TOUR-ISM DAY'.

Speechmaking was preceded by the showing of a film made especially for the occasion and entitled 'MAGICAL MALINDI'.

DUNLOP Kenya Limited opened a depot in Mombasa to meet the growing demand for PVC floor tiles, industrial rub products and sports goods.

It will become a standard design for all kiosks there which their owners will build themselves.

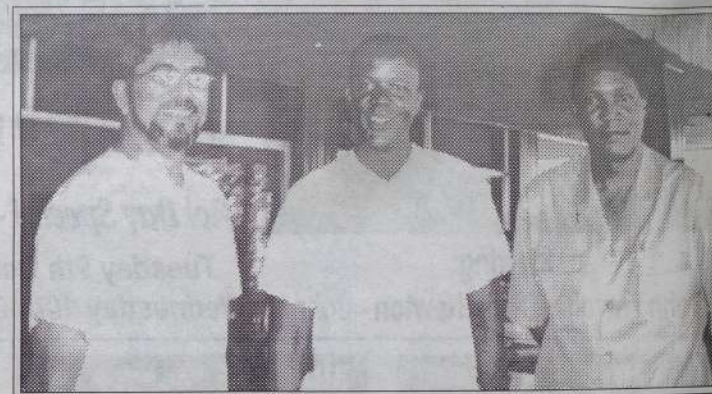
This has been done as they do not know how long BORT will take in raising sufficient funds.

David Sankori 'as you are all aware government has in the recent past initiated some positive developments which have helped spur renewed growth in the tourism industry.

Minister Encouraged By Turn Around In Tourism

Being endowed with many more natural attractions makes Kenya a unique destination.

Referring to international charter traffic into Mombasa's Moi International Airport, the Minister said 'we are encouraged that in the first 24 days of this month (September) alone, a total of 52 charters have landed in Mombasa.

This reflects an increase of six charters even before the month ends as compared to the 46 charters which landed over the whole month of September last year.

To me, this is an indication of good business prospects for the remaining period of the year.

He conveyed his sincere thanks to all who had worked so hard to make 'World Tourism Day' at Malindi such a success and hoped everyone would enjoy the activities lined up for them over the next few days.

Said the Chairman of the Mombasa & Coast Tourist Association, Kudip Sondhi 'it was surely an inspiring idea to hold the tourist calendar's most prestigious annual event - World Tourism Day at Malindi for once again this town is showing us all the way. It was recently voted the cleanest town in the country and I am sure it is also among the best and cleanest small towns in the whole of the continent of Africa.

This is no mean achievement.

Most of the credit for this goes to the tall and handsome Mayor, Gedion Mung'aro, and his team.

Adding 'such good work is desperately needed in the rest of the coast province if we are to have vibrant town centres. We do have an Environment Act which is comprehensive, so let us enforce it'.

He went on 'while tourism is the fastest growing industry in the world today, it is also the most fiercely competitive.

But' said Mr. Sondhi 'if handled properly it brings with it enormous benefits and massive employment for tourism can rescue the country's entire economy'.

While commending government for repairing major trunk roads, particularly from Nairobi to Mombasa, Mr. Sondhi said may we now urge it to complete some sectors that still require attention.

This include the Malindi/Mombasa road near Vipingo, Kilifi. It is no more than a stretch of some 5 kms that needs urgent repair'.

He went on 'the Malindi Airport should be expanded to carry larger aircraft' and suggested 'if this is not possible at the moment then invest in repairs of the existing terminal'.

Referring to what has become a contentious issue - that of private villas at Malindi, Mr. Sondhi said 'this need not be.

Investment in luxurious villas is surely welcome but, on the other hand, if they are really businesses they should be licensed and taxed.

Without scaring away this welcome investment some compromise should be made with the villa owners and one proposal is that they pay an agreed blanket fee of Kshs. 500,000/- annually, or some acceptable alternative'.

He continued 'the buzzword today is Eco-Tourism'.

Kenya has one of the most diverse and beautiful habitats in the world and we should use it more creatively.

It is hoteliers and the people who must chart out the new routes to enhance the quality of our product'

As far as Beach Operators are concerned Mr. Sondhi congratulated the Malindi District Commissioner and Mayor for making the beaches there non-trading zones after relocating 108 'registered' beach operators to a site where it is planned a Tourist Market is to be built.

He said 'this issue must be seriously tackled and finalised along the entire Kenya coast.

The Beach Operators Re Location Trust need about Kshs. 60 million to build and maintain Tourist Markets it plans to establish'.

Adding 'some funds have already been allocated by the European Union and should be released to BORT which was formed specifically for this purpose.

Within six months of the funds becoming available the markets should be up and running and this problem of harassment by beach traders could be behind us'.

Declared Mr. Sondhi 'the building of Tourist Markets to absorb the enterprise and energy of beach traders is a priority.

The beach has to be a non-trading zone if the Environment Act is to be enforced'

He concluded 'because of perceived insecurity in other parts of the world, Africa might in the short term at least prove to be the favoured destination.

If holidaymakers do start returning to Kenya in large numbers we have to be prepared to offer quality and not just mass tourism.

Let this be a wake up call for all of us.

Let the government allow all imported goods for the refurbishment of hotels in free of duty and tax.

We should also reduce our airport tax and visa fee by at least half to encourage tourism'

Following lunch at Eden Roc Hotel, the Asst. Minister for Tourism & Information, David Sankari, together with his permanent Secretary, Francis Baya, and others celebrating World Tourism Day visited the Arabuko-Sokoke Forest and while enjoying a Swahili High Tea heard what the Kenya Tourist Board is doing from its Managing Director, Beatrice Nyiro.

Saying that no country in the world can survive without a strong domestic base, Mrs. Buyu noted we have to start building more on this, particularly following the September 11

AMAZING INCIDENTS INVOLVING MOTOR CYCLISTS

THE BEHAVIOUR of 'two wheelers' in traffic is a constant source of amusement for me.

The kind of things that happen to unsuspecting riders is the kind of stuff of comics.

He indicated his intention to move to the left and one of the drivers let him through.

The usual four lane snarl up was in operation and the ever present traffic cops, in their new fluorescent yellow bibs, were busy exercising their arms and mouths trying to control the traffic flow.

The lights at the junction of Jomo Kenyatta Avenue and Uhuru Highway were not functioning adding to the chaos.

A motor cyclist went past in the space between Kachumbari's car and the adjacent one.

The space was large enough for the rider to travel at speed.

The motorcyclist was one of the town delivery gang who tend to weave their way through traffic to try and get to the destination in the shortest period of time in order to maximise their throughput and earnings.

He shot through the space and headed towards the front of the traffic queue.

Another rider, also caught up in the traffic noticed the same gap and started to weave his way across the lanes so as to

end up in the free space.

He went round the front of a lorry and the next thing he knew was that the front wheel had been knocked and the handle bars he was holding turned round viciously in reaction to the force of the impact.

The two motorcyclists went for the same space in traffic without seeing each other and ended up in a collision that damaged both the front wheels of the motor cycles.

Traffic was beginning to move but the two lanes which straddled the accident could not move till the two gentlemen sorted out liabilities for the incident.

Fortunately the traffic cops were not too far off and came to the rescue of the two courier cyclists and the rest of the road users.

The jam lasted for only about fifteen minutes in which time the cops were able to sort the accident out.

'BLIND SPOTS'

In both cases, the riders were not responding to the dangers around them.

The cyclist did not change his riding habits as a result of the change in weather and hence road surface conditions.

The motorcyclists did not take into consideration that there plenty of blind spots as they wave their way between the lanes of traffic, stationary or otherwise.

As Kachumbari says, defensive road sense is not limited to drivers of vehicles with more than four wheels.

It is required of all road users.

Thrill Of Spool Spinning To High Whine Of The Ratchet

SAILFISH and yellowfin tuna were the fish that Mtwapa waters laid on for anglers last week, but although fair numbers of them were seen it took some skill, perseverance and luck to get them to take the baits.

Still, some fishing people did experience the thrill of the spool spinning to the high whine of the ratchet, the rod bowed down under the pull of a strong fish, and the spray-fing leap of the sailfish.



One might almost think the sail of this fish was made to catch the air, they leap so high, but the tuna go down, deep and then there is rising lifting to do.

On Wednesday three French couples boarded James Adcock's *Vuma* for a day on the waves and they had the excitement of the sailfish's leap and splash and dashing runs.

The rod work was done by Miguel Cauliez, who hails from Paris, and as the French are so well known for their elegant cuisine it was no surprise that one pleasure should lead to another, a sailfish dinner afterwards.

This was laid on for them and James at The Moorings, the French people delighted with the meal and James both very impressed and surprised at the excellent quality of the fish.

Up and down Mtwapa Creek other boats were flying the red sailfish flag, three flags on one boat on Friday.

Saturday was a white flag day for John Webb and Rob Jessop in *Flycatcher* when they caught a yellowfin tuna of twenty kilos and two others of eight kilos each.

Another boat further down the creek was flying two white flags for tuna of over twenty kilos, indicating that the fish are out there for the catching.

The yellowfin were still about on Sunday but difficult to tempt to the lures.

Sue Lawrence-Brown had a rare trip out to sea on Sunday morning, in her husband,

Howard's boat, *Kipapa*, enjoying the sea, the change of colour from jade green near the reef to the cobalt blue of the ocean stream with shafts of sunlight angling down into the water.

She caught one of the yellowfin tuna, a good fish of ten kilos, big enough to bend the rod and exercise the muscles.

There were a lot of sailfish close in to the reef then too, and it was a new experience for Sue to see them jumping clear out of the water,

jumping free.

Allan Jennings' boat, *Cat-22* did have a two-two catch on Sunday, two anglers, Allan and his son Karl, two yellowfin of two kilos each, little ones, and they saw some big ones and missed a billfish that took a bait and dropped it.

The *Flycatcher* team had a mixed catch of a barracuda of eight kilos, a dorado of seven kilos, a skipjack tuna of five, a lesser trevally of three, and a five-finger jack.

Interesting names those: the jack has associations with Jack and The Beanstalk as he was the little one who brought down the giant, and fishing has retained this meaning, with jack being either a small species or an immature fish, as in jack pike in British parlance and jack salmon in American.

The five-finger jack is a small silver fish marked with five dark spots, for all the world like the finger-prints of someone who held it.

The skipjack is a jack tuna in that it is small too, and another point of interest is that this is not a popular eating fish here but it's what you get in the cans that you buy in the supermarket.

At the other end of the size scale, in the giant league, are the humpback whales that are still in our waters, some of them seen jumping by Allan and Karl on Sunday, although the *Flycatcher* fishermen saw one heading straight south, "on a mission"

they said, as unstoppable as the Blues Brothers, heading home to Antarctica where the cold waters hold the feed.

And where, who knows but they gather to sing their mysterious, haunting songs in harmony, the great song of their ocean journeys, of which there might even be one that could be called Mtwapa Humpback Blues.

Fishing is about uncertainty, about change, about adapting to things as you find them, that sudden change of direction as the flock of terns wheels away and the shoal of yellowfin starts churning the water over there, where we will now have to go, so it is within the fishing mentality to process change.

A change this time of date, the date of the Eye Go Fishing competition, the first of the Mtwapa season, the one that raises the curtain on the great drama of suspense and anticipation that is the months of the season stretching so gloriously ahead.

Blues Brothers

In a word, the Eye Go Fishing competition has been changed to Sunday the 18th of November, to be held out of The Moorings, with an auction and social event on the Saturday evening and of course the weigh-in and general get-together on the Sunday after the fishing.

It is all a charity event in aid of the Kwale District Eye Centre, and anglers always anticipate with delight the heavy fines that are levied for trivial offences.

One of these offences might be predicting future catches, but two very jovial gentlemen from Essex in England have put out the word that Tuesday is going to be the day for the action.

Keith 'Matata' Webber and Jack 'Kibonge' Nicholls, who fished here last season, and caused about as much mayhem as The Blues Brothers, will be going out with James Adcock on Tuesday and they assure us all that they are going to catch The Big One.

Otherwise, drinks on them, don't you think?

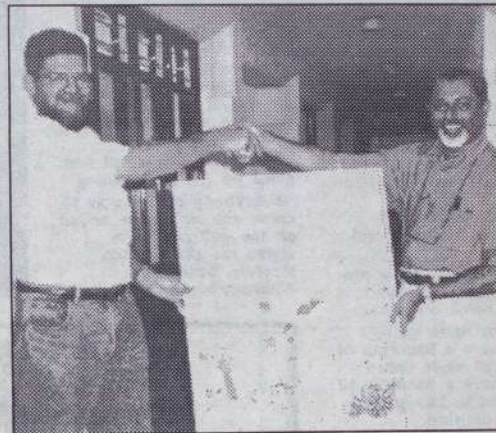

Er ließ sich nie von einer solchen Arbeit abhalten und mit den Erfahrungen und dem Erfolg, die er mit dem Bamburi Nature Trail erlebt hatte, nahm er das Projekt des nördlichen Steinbruchs in Angriff.

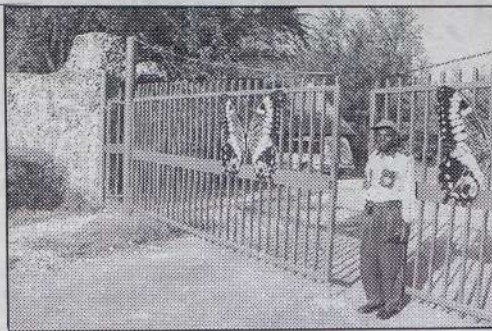
Wie beim Nature Trail wurde die Aufforstung des Steinbruchs in mehreren Phasen durchgeführt. Zuerst wurden Ende der achtziger Jahre eine Million Bäume gepflanzt.

Dieses Mammutprojekt wurde möglich mit der Finanzierung durch eine Hilfsorganisation in USA mit dem Ziel, aus einem toten Brachland einen Forst zu schaffen.

Wie auch bei anderen Projekten der Baobab Farm, nahm eine Reihe ausländischer Studenten teil an verschiedenen Aspekten des Rehabilitierungsprozesses.

Sie arbeiteten mit Begeisterung an diesem Aufforstungsprogramm und konnten sehr viel bei dieser einzigartigen Gelegenheit lernen.

Aber anders als der "Haller Park", der vor allem ein Ökosystem anstrebt mit Tieren, Wildgehegen und Farmarbeiten, wurden die Forest Trails ein Freizeit- und Erholungsgebiet und Besucher werden ermuntert, die Ruhe in der friedlichen Umgebung auf eigene Faust zu

genießen und zu erforschen, wozu sie keinen Führer benötigen.

Auf diese Weise wird dafür gesorgt, dass der Küstenwald erhalten bleibt, indem er

umweltverträglich genutzt wird.

Die Baobab Farm kauft von diesem Projekt die überschüssigen Schmetterlingspuppen.

Im Jahre 2000 wurde in den Forest Trails die Sunset Terrasse eröffnet.

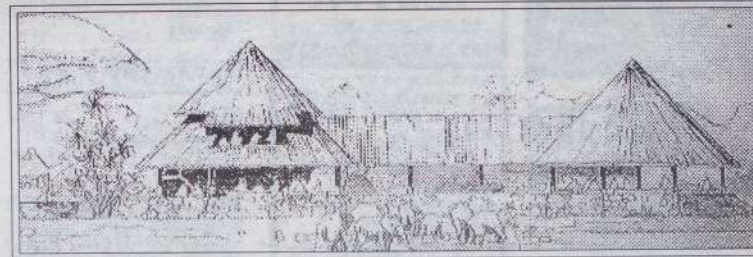

They have 27 points from 28 matches, having won eight, drawn three and lost 17.

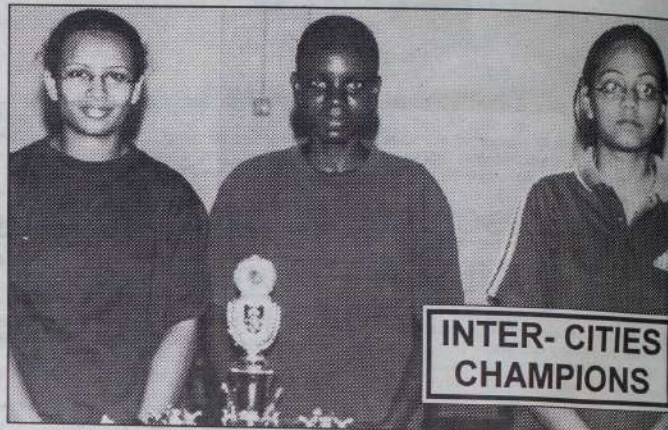
Their colleagues Coast Stars without a match last weekend, succumbed to 12th position from their tenth spot they occupied
