## 'SWISS' KEEN ON COAST

DEMONSTRATING ITS full confidence in the future of tourism in Kenya in a most practical way is Beach and Safaris, Zurich who are chartering extra aircraft to bring more tourists here from Switzerland.

Pierre Schmuki is the dynamic owner of Beach and Safaris, a company that has been operating into Kenya for more than 20 years, writes NETA PEAL.

It is presently sending to the Kenya coast 160 tourists a week on a CONDOR Boeing 737 charter and with KLM/Kenya Airways.

In addition, Beach and Safaris has chartered two CROSSAIR aircraft each with 156 seats, the first of which arrived at Mombasa's Moi International Airport earlier this month.

It is reported to have been "Fully Booked".

Another flight arrived on Sunday, October 21.

Despite all the problems that started after September 11, Beach and Safaris have managed to convince the Swiss tourist market through a big publicity campaign about the advantages of holidays in Kenya.

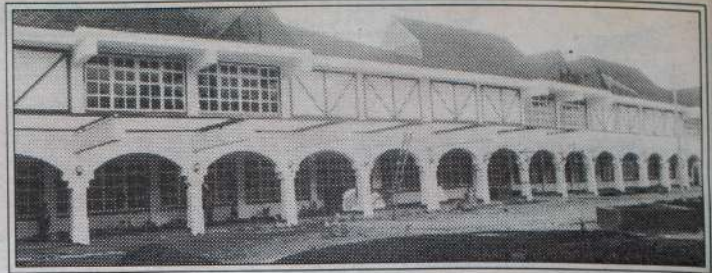

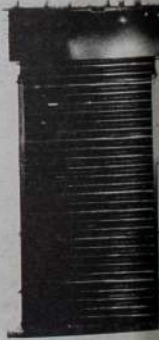

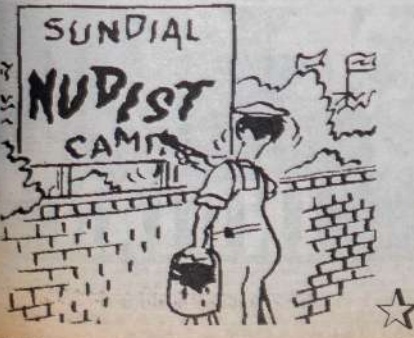

## 'FRIENDS OF TSAVO' WALK TO AID LIMO WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

WALKING AGAIN for charity are the 'FRIENDS OF TSAVO' this time to continue with their support of the Limo Community Wildlife Sanctuary by providing it with two entrance gates.

This project has also received support from the African Conservation Centre through its CORE programme funded by USAID.

It helps local communities to benefit from wildlife thus encouraging them to take care of their resources for their sustainable use.

LIMO has also received support from PACT, the E.A. Wildlife Society and the Kenya Wildlife Services which encourages those in the Mwakitau area of Tsavo West region to convert their land into a wildlife sanctuary instead of farming because of increasing conflicts with wildlife.

The 'FRIENDS OF TSAVO' have been actively involved in this LUMO project and have already donated uniforms and ten pairs of boots for its Rangers who have been trained by KWS.

This 'CHARITY' Walk takes place on Sunday, October 28, from the Patel Samaj on Haile Selassie Road at 8.30 a.m.

It will cover 10 kms there and back.

Mombasa residents and those in the tourism industry have been invited to participate and in this way help reduce the perennial conflict that exists between humans and wildlife in such areas.

As in previous years prizes will be awarded to schools, FOT's very strong supporters, which will include a visit for eight students to Tsavo.

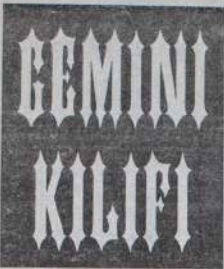

On Your Screen This Week: Ancient Indian Saga, Some Spooky Stuff For Halloween ... And The Ample Curves Of Shilpa Shetty !

INDIAN history and sagas hold great sway over almost the whole world's population.

The rich, classic cultures coupled with real life dramas are a source of attraction and inspiration to many a writer and film maker.

The latest release, simultaneous with Mumbai, at the NYALI CINEMAX is the epic Asoka with Shah Rukh Khan and Kareena Kapoor in the lead.

This Dreamz Unlimited Production (a Shah Rukh Khan, Juii Chawla and Sanjiv Chawia enterprise) has gone all out with this historical drama, liberally sprinkled with romance, great cinematography and swash-buckling battles.

It traces the life of one of the greatest rulers in India, Asoka through his turbulent adolescence, warring manhood and finally his peaceful end.

Asoka, was the third ruler of the mighty Maurya dynasty, bringing his kingdom of Magadha to the pinnacle of prosperity and power 3,000 years Before Christ (which is about 5,000 years ago).

In the vicious power struggle that was very common in those days, as everyone wanted to sit on the throne, and it was not unusual to find brother killing brother or even a mother getting rid of one son in favour of another.

In this setting, the young Asoka, a fearless warrior and aspirant to the throne, is sent away in exile by his mother, who fears for his life from his enemies.

In the forest, Asoka has to live like a common soldier and not the royal that he is.

He meets another royal refugee, Kaurwaki (Kareena Kapoor) from the kingdom of Kalinga.

In a move away from the real saga, and to add a bit of romance and to the story, director Santosh Sivan and scriptwriter Saket Chaudhary have made up a fictional tale about how the great Asoka falls madly in love with this natchi from Kalinga.

He is so obsessed with her that he will go to any lengths for her happiness and just see her smile.

Asoka is called back to Maghada and in his absence, the village where Kaurwaki is hiding is attacked and the beautiful young princess vanishes.

Coming back to marry his passion, Asoka is shattered and mourns her death.

He returns to his kingdom, a hardened man and marries a Buddhist girl (Hrishita Bhatt) out of duty and necessity.

He now rules his kingdom with an iron fist and woe to anyone

who crosses his path - his end would be really a horrific one.

Clashing with all the neighbouring kingdoms in bloody battles, he slowly acquires them under his rule.

After many a battle, his pent up emotions are released one day when he sees the battleground littered with thousands of corpses.

Overcome with emotion, he rethinks his ways and decides to follow the peaceful path of Buddha, the one that his wife has been teaching him all along and which he chose to ignore.

Asoka thus takes on another facet of his life, that of a peaceful preacher of the teachings of Buddha.

Like all things in his life, he follows even this facet to the best of his abilities.

## THIS WAS NOT THE FIRST COELOCANTH SEEN IN MALINDI ?

Do your Coastweek readers know that it is (maybe) not the first time that a coelacanth has appeared in Kenyan waters ?

Here is a text that you can find in the book "Old Fourlegs - The story of the Coelacanth" by J.L.B. Smith.

I have that book in my large coelacanth collection.

In his book "Old Fourlegs - The story of the Coelacanth", published 1956 by Longmans, Green & Co London, J.L.B. Smith wrote:

"Before we left for Mozambique [where a Mozambique native had told about the coelacanth ? fish he got at Bazaruto] I received a letter, dated the 3rd August 1953, from G.F. Cartwright of Salisbury (now Harare), Rhodesia (Zimbabwe).

"He wrote to say that he had been goggle-fishing at Malindi in October and November 1952, and that he had seen us at work there at the close of our stay.

"Later when out over deep water on a reef one day, equipped and armed with spear-

gun, he suddenly saw not far below him a large fish whose appearance gave him a shock.

"It had a huge mouth and a baleful and ancient appearance."

To quote further: "It was a large fish, heavily built, and from 100 to 150-lbs in weight."

"It was totally unlike any fish I had seen or ever saw afterwards."

"It looked wholly evil and a thousand years old."

"It had a large eye and the most outstanding feature was the armour-plate effect of its heavy scales, scales so heavy that it was set quite apart from all other

fish I saw."

Cartwright decided to try a shot, but the harpoon just glanced off the scales and the creature disappeared.

Some anglers and spear-gunners suggests that it could be a Rock Cod, but Cartwright had a large experience of diverse Rock Cods and was quite positive it was not.

After returning to Rhodesia, in some periodical Cartwright saw a photograph of the second coelacanth (caught one month later), he became convinced that he did see this fish off Malindi.

Shortly afterwards he visited the Centenary Exhibition in

Bulawayo, and to his satisfaction found a full size model of a Coelacanth (from the East London Museum, South Africa) on view there.

Now, Cartwright was even more convinced that he really saw a coelacanth !

J.L.B. Smith: "What did I think?" "Well, it was clear that if the Comores was the home of the coelacanth, Malindi was much nearer and much more easily accessible in every way than East London, which one coelacanth at least had actually reached.

"Bazaruto fell in between these places, and Cartwright's experience at least lent colour to the Bazaruto idea.

"Furthermore, from my wide knowledge of the fishes of the western Indian Ocean I could think of no species that fitted Cartwright's description as well as a coelacanth. Not one."

Maybe it was really a coelacanth ?

# Through A Shade Darkly: To 'Tint' Or Not To 'Tint' ?

shades or rather tints are a current discussion point amongst drivers in Kenya at the moment.

The top cop has ordered that all vehicles remove any tint that they have and the date has already expired.

Anyone moving around with tint of any kind had better watch out.

Or had they ? The law as written only talks about someone being able to get out of the vehicle in an impeded way.

It is open to a wide range of interpretations.

And this is the problem with the law as has been the problem in other laws.

We have had the August body on several occasions in the past to enact laws relating to tint control in vehicles and so with respect to smoking exhausts.

Each time the proposals or bills have been defeated primarily because the interpretation and application of the proposals were not sound.

The one being used by the top cop to ask drivers to "be seen" has been in existence for a long time and escaped the scrutiny that other proposals have been subject to.

To try and enforce the edict is like walking through a minefield.

When talking about tint on windows one has to be clear what it applies to and at what level does a tint become a tint.

The most obvious target are the vehicles which have the applied reflective tint.

These are retrofitted on vehicles as part of the customisation process especially in matatus, minibuses and buses.

There are a few people who want their cars to stick out and hence also apply all sorts of additives to the outer surface of the cars include go faster stripes cartoon characters and so forth.

Those who apply the reflective films to the car windows are the easiest to nab.

There are also tinted films which one can apply that does not have the reflective outer surface (or has not been aluminised).

These do not stick out like the aluminised ones.

A cop would have to find these by accident rather than by design.

The final category applies to those vehicles which have factory fitted or retrofitted tinted glass.

This glass has been designed to serve a purpose on the vehicles and if fitted from the factory must be legal in most countries.

Also some of the glass may not just be tinted but could be photosensitive and hence change colour with the level of sun.

The law as written has no specific guidelines on what is and is not tinted.

It is left to the boys in blue to make their own interpretation.

Herein lies the Kenyan problem. Before the top cop made an announcement, he should have looked at how the edict was going to be enforced.

Do we have the exact definition of what tinted means ?

Do we have a cut off point which is allowable and where the tint is not allowable ?

What recourse do owners have where the original factory fitting was tinted or who had photosensitive glass ?

In other countries, where there is a restriction on tinting of glass, very carefully defined guidelines are available prior to the enforcement of the restriction.

As an example, each police traffic post is trained on the

objective of the law and what does and does not comply with the rules.

Measurement devices are provided which will quickly and efficiently and undeniably demonstrate to the driver of the vehicle whether they comply or not.

Guidelines on what complies is also given so that the public knows and does not fit what is non-compliant.

There is no single line statement like what the top cop has done.

There must be items that can comply rather than a blanket ban.

It is all too easy to do and shows a degree of intolerance rather than the will to be fair.

We must stop harassing wananchi until what is illegal that is tinted is defined.

Do we mean the aluminised films which are only one way vision which may stop an observant boy in blue from observing potential crime or unlawful acts being carried out in cars and buses ?

Do we mean the film that is so dark that for all intents and purposes one cannot see into the car ?

In countries where such bans have been effectively applied each cop who is monitoring such issues has a meter that measures how much light is admitted into the vehicle by the tinted film.

If there is sufficient light being let into the car then it means that the boys in blue can also see into the car and they have no quarrels.

However, if the meter says there is too little light then the defaulter is given a set number

of days in which to repair the harm and report back to the cops.

If they don't then the car is impounded and rehabilitated by the cops and then returned to the owner after he has paid for the cost of the work, plus a fine plus a handling fee.

As Kachumbari says, the best way is to be exact in what one expects rather than take a blanket and cover the whole place.

Meanwhile, of interest is the fact that when the new Minister for Tourism & Information, Kibondo Musyoka, was on his first official visit to the coast early July he had remarked 'I note some funding is available from the World Bank' adding 'we will quickly try to access it so we can actualise this very worthy Beach Operators ReLocation programme'.

After giving a 'vote of thanks' to all who had made Raymond Matiba's party such a great success, the Chairman of MCTA, Kuldip Sondhi, had remarked 'it is the duty of government to step in.

We pay our taxes and do every conceivable thing to keep things going and it could help by triggering off the money that is waiting and ready to be used so that these beautiful Tourist Markets can be built for the deserving beach operators who, like hoteliers, must also make a living'.

He thanked Antonia Behrens for donating the Toyota car and also for all her hard work, together with Michele Will, in selling raffle tickets'.

Declared Mike Kirkland Spokesman for BORT 'there is nothing that will make a bigger impact on tourism earnings, as well as the overall economy, than the relocation of beach operators.

Those who make these policies are in Nairobi which is the centre for government and commerce and thus I feel the Board's place is in Nairobi'.

Continuing, amid applause, he said 'with my appointment I believe that the unique problems that affect the coast will receive the attention they deserve and I will make it my business to see to this'.

Referring to one of the problems which affect this region, Mr. Matiba said 'beach traders who are Kenyans like you and I have either by choice or as a victim of circumstances resorted to seeking, gainful employment on the beaches.

The law of the land pertaining to trading on beaches is very clear.

However, in our depressed economy, understanding and compassion have led to the creation of a combined effort to try and find the right solution to this problem.

The beach is a place of leisure and relaxation and not for business and it is also the responsibility of Kenyans to keep it clean for both local and overseas visitors.

Together we must seek permanent solutions because tourism affects each and everyone of us as Kenyans.

A great deal of work has gone into trying to find the right solutions and there was much applause when Mr. Matiba commended members of the Beach Operators ReLocation Trust for their 'exemplary effort'.

Adding 'on the part of KTB whatever more needs to be done in terms of facilitating dialogue rest assured that no effort will be spared.

This is my promise.

Dr. Rashid Ali, Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Tourism & Information, is here tonight and through him and his Ministry there is little doubt they will achieve an acceptable solution'.

He concluded by saying that Marketing Development Representatives

from professional organisations overseas, and recruited with the assistance of the European Union, will be in the country from Oct. 21 for a two week tour and will be visiting the coast from Wednesday, Oct. 24.

Said Mr. Matiba 'I am sure you will be invited to meet them and to air your views'.

When concluding his speech, the Chairman of KAHC, Coast, Robert Kinyua, had given the

KTB Chairman 'a small assignment on behalf of Coast stakeholders'.

It included:

- KTB should assist the less financially endowed Kenya Tourism Federation with some operational funds to run its security centres in Nairobi and Mombasa which have achieved a lot.

- KTB should rekindle the revival of the Tourism Roads Fund that once existed in the

Ministry of Tourism for the maintenance of roads in tourist areas.

- KTB should follow up seriously the issues concerning the South Coast by-pass and the Malindi Airport expansion and add its voice to those of stakeholders in the affected areas.

- KTB should hold more of its meetings here at the coast to give their staff a chance to interact with coast stakeholders.

Bei der Spendenübergabe, die mit großer Dankbarkeit gewürdigt wurde, richtete Herr Strecker ein paar Worte auf Suaheli an die Kinder, die sich darüber sehr freuen und anschließend für die Besucher einige Lieder sangen.

Herr Strecker und Frau Röder trafen im WEMA Centre auch ihre Landsmännin Rajka Habel, eine freiwillige Sozialhelferin aus Saarbrücken, die sich für ein Jahr in Kenia aufhält, um verschiedene Kinderheime zu besuchen.

Sie wird nun neun Monate bei WEMA tätig sein.

## MONICA BAHATI

Als Strecker im April dieses Jahres auf seiner Erkundungstour das Mombasa Children's Home besuchte, traf er dort die 13-jährige Monica Bahati, die bettlägerig war und eine neue Herzklappe benötigte.

Strecker war so gerührt von ihrem Schicksal, dass er beschloss, in Deutschland sofort ein Hilfskonto für Monika zu eröffnen.

Die Operation am offenen Herzen sollte, nachdem sie mehrmals verschoben worden war, anfangs September in

Nairobi durchgeführt werden und rund Kshs 500'000 kosten.

Zusammen mit seiner Partnerin Christa Röder, die ihn mit Rat und Tat und Geld unterstützt, gelang es Strecker schon bald, DM 15'000 zusammenzutrommeln.

90 Prozent wurde von dem Verein "Helft uns leben" über die Mainzer Rhein-Zeitung zur Verfügung gestellt und der Rest hauptsächlich von Kollegen und Kolleginnen der Stadtverwaltung.

Strecker hatte bereits den Flug nach Mombasa für Oktober gebucht, als er hörte, dass die Operation wiederum aufgeschoben war.

Transparenz steht für ihn bei der Verwendung der Spendengelder an erster Stelle.

Im Laufe der Jahre hat er sozusagen im Alleingang rund DM 350'000 (Kshs 12 Millionen) gesammelt.

Verwaltungskosten, die bei großen Hilfswerken oft einen beträchtlichen Teil ausmachen, fallen bei ihm weg, Reise und Aufenthalt bezahlt er stets aus eigener Tasche.

Das Geld überreicht er selbst und überzeugt sich, dass es für den vorgesehenen Zweck verwendet wird.

So kann er garantieren, dass jeder gespendete Pfennig hilft, den Armen das Leben zu erleichtern.

Unter den gegebenen Umständen und nach reiflicher

Überlegung hat Strecker nun beschlossen, die DM 15'000 auf dem Hilfskonto für Monika vorläufig zurückzuhalten.

Er wird sie dem Hauptspender, dem Verein "Helft uns leben" übergeben, damit er mit der Heilsarmee in Mombasa direkt weiter verhandeln und gegebenenfalls das Geld nach erfolgter Operation überweisen kann.

Das WEMA CENTRE wurde 1993 als Förderverein gegründet und betreut zur Zeit 90 Mädchen im Alter zwischen 1 und 18 Jahren.

Sie erhalten dort liebevolle Pflege, medizinische Versorgung und elementare Schulbildung.

35 Kinder aus umliegenden Dörfern kommen tagsüber in dieser Schule ebenfalls kostenlos zum Unterricht.

63 WEMA-Kinder besuchen Primarschulen in Bamburi und Kiambeni und für ein paar besonders gute Schülerinnen übernimmt das Heim die Kosten für Schulgeld, Bücher und Uniformen in einer Sekundarschule.

Die Mädchen können im Heim das Schneiderhandwerk erlernen.

Es stehen dreißig Nähmaschinen (meistens Spenden) zur Verfügung; dreißig Kinder aus der Umgebung werden ebenfalls in der Schneiderwerkstatt ausgebildet.

Dieses Jahr wurde als neues zu erlernendes Handwerk die

Herstellung von Seife eingeführt.

Im vergangenen Jahr wurden mehrere Mädchen von der Straße geholt, die im WEMA Centre Zuflucht gefunden haben, darunter die elfjährige Maria.

Sie lebte auf dem Gehsteig in der Meru Road im Zentrum von Mombasa und gehörte zu den bettelnden Kindern, die Passanten anhalten und mitläuternd "Saidia" (das Suaheliwort für "Hilfe") rufen.

## WEMA CENTRE IN UTANGE

Als ihr angeboten wurde, ins Heim und in die Schule zu gehen, nahm sie gerne an.

Sie geht nun in die 3. Klasse im WEMA Centre und ist glücklich, dass ihr schweres Leben auf der Straße der Vergangenheit angehört.

Der jüngste Neuzugang ist Gertrude.

Sie ist ungefähr anderthalb Jahre alt und wurde von der Polizei halb verhungert in einem Gebüsch gefunden.

Sie war spindeldürr und hatte panische Angst vor Menschen.

Unterdessen hat sie sich gut erholt und langsam wieder Vertrauen gewonnen zu den anderen Kindern und zum Pflegepersonal.

Die Kinder werden im WEMA Centre gesund ernährt und erhalten drei Mahlzeiten am Tag, hauptsächlich Ugali (Maisbrei), Bohnen, Reis und viel Gemüse, das zum Teil aus dem eigenen Küchengarten stammt.

Zweimal im Monat gibt es Fleisch oder Huhn.

Wegen des chronischen Wassermangels, der in Mombasa und Umgebung seit mehreren Jahren herrscht, ist geplant, auf dem WEMA Grundstück einen Brunnen zu graben (was mindestens Kshs 300'000 kosten wird), damit immer genügend Wasser für Haus, Hof und Garten zur Verfügung steht.

Im Garten gibt es ein paar Hühner, Enten, Truthühner, Ziegen und Kaninchen.

Überdies wurde ein Stall gebaut und Gras angepflanzt für die erste Kuh, genannt "Monica", die bald kalben soll und von der dann 15 Liter Milch am Tag erwartet werden!

## LUCY YINDA

Auf die Frage, wieviel Geld das Heim pro Kind benötigt, antwortete Lucy Yinda, dass für das Jahr 2001/2 für Schule (einschließlich Bücher und Uniformen), Gesundheitspflege, Nahrung und Kleidung Shs 150 pro Tag pro Kind berechnet werden, was ungefähr DM 4-entspricht.

Die hochwillkommene Spende, die sie gerade erhalten hat, würde eigentlich für einen Brunnen ausreichen, aber das Projekt wird vorerst zurückgestellt, weil es für die Kinder und ihre Zukunft am wichtigsten ist, dass sie ununterbrochen die Schule besuchen können.

Das neue Jahr steht schon bald vor der Tür und die Kshs 360'000 reichen für Schulgeld, Bücher und Uniformen und garantieren, dass mindestens fünfzig Kinder ihren Platz in der Schule behalten können.

Das WEMA Centre befindet sich in der Bamburi-Utange Region an der alten Malindstraße, rund 12 km von Mombasa entfernt auf einem Gelände von 5 Acres.

Genügend Platz für eine Erweiterung ist vorhanden, sobald das benötigte Geld zur Verfügung steht, um mehr Straßenkinder aufzunehmen, deren Zahl in Mombasa leider ständig zunimmt.

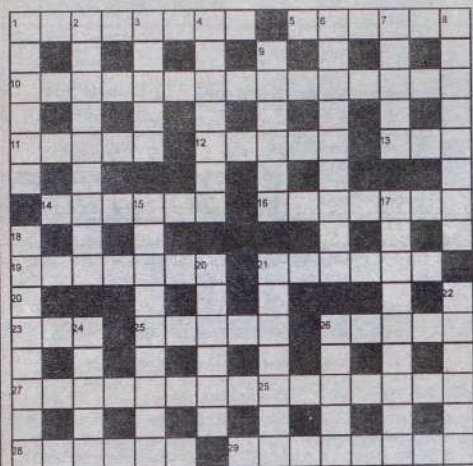

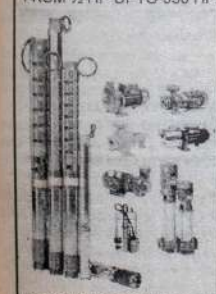

# 'Ol Jogi' Wins Cooper Motor Group Malindi Festival

THE SAILFISH had just arrived around the Malindi area in time for the annual **Malindi Festival**, now in its 43rd year, and generously sponsored as usual by the Cooper Motors Group.

So with four points per kilo and 30 kgs scored for a tagged and released fish, skippers opted to boat for the sail, with only one boat doggedly live-baiting for the big one!

But while the sail were plentiful, especially outside the Leopard Reef on the second day where large shoals could be seen feeding, they were not easy to raise to the baits.

They were also very choosy - those boats which came with a good supply of 'halfbeaks' (*chichungu* in Swahili, *ballyhoo* in American) were the ones that raised the fish, which were scoring the small lures topping bonito belly strips which normally score.

On Saturday, *Neptune* (fished by Russ Brumbry, Filou Salle and skipper Andrew Paul) led from the start, two singles at the first call-up and two more as the day progressed putting them ahead of the field; with *Ol Jogi*, *Instedda* and the beautiful *Cabo 35 Simba* lying second with two fish each.

But on the Sunday *Neptune*, for many years the top scorer

over the year at Malindi, found one fish early, then never raised another all day!

This shows how fickle and difficult the fishing can be.

*Ol Jogi* (Johnny Oerum, Colin MacKenzie, Adam Bundle) and *Tarka* (Sue Aldersley, Peter Lockwood, skipper callum Looman) came into contention as they scored steadily through the day, and a few minutes before the four o'clock lines out call both had added

four fish to their first day score, when *Tarka* announced a fifth fish!

Two boats then with six sail total.

But the clincher was a good fish of 39 kgs, weighed in by Colin McKenzie, and the vital 36 extra points over a released fish gave *Ol Jogi* the top honours

(756 pts), with successful skipper Rob Hellier adding to his proud record of two consecutive wins at the **Malindi Billfish** tournament held every February.

The *Tarka* team were second (721.1 pts), and *Neptune* third (638.5 pts), with this experienced team still scratching their heads over what went wrong on the second day!

A plucky effort from **NAHEED MOOSA**, **IMRAN MOOSA** and **WALID KHALID**, on *Instedda*

with skipper Gaetano, gave them fourth with their four sail, a shade ahead of *Simba*, fished by Tina Allen, Patti Allen and Alan Sibley.

*White Bear* (Mark Jury, Peter Suddaby) was sixth; *Eclare* (Ian Fenton, Adrian Paul) seventh, both with three sail.

Imran Moosa was top angler with four sail, and the best other

fish was a huge 27.1 kg kingfish from Karl Pomer on *Shark*.

Jim Robertson, live baiting both days on *AlleyCat* for that big marlin (a 152kg fish at five points per kilo needed to win!) eventually found a bull shark of 154.6 kgs, but, hooked in the body, it took three hours to land and sadly they could not beat the time limit, tho' the one point per kilo for shark would not have put them in the frame.

A good party followed for the prize giving, with Cooper Motors Group CEO Martin Forster fully on form with his speech, and declaring the company would be back next year with their sponsorship.

The **Churchill Cup** Light Line formula competition was held on the Friday, but the sailfish were not evident; this was won by the same *Tarka* team with one sail and four yellowfin tuna, on 6 and 8 kg line.

*Eclare*, also with the same team, were second, with three

sail, on 8 and 10 kg line, and *Seahorse*, David Darnborough and Mr and Mrs Malty fishing, were third with one sail, and with a total of eight boats, no other boat caught a sailfish.

## LAMU FISHING

October is very early in the season for the sailfish in Malindi, indeed they only arrived a few days before the Festival, but the portents are good, as a lot of these fish are showing at Lamu and Kiwaiyu, reports *Niels Korschen* from Lamu.

This is backed from the trip up to Kiwaiyu by *Albatross*, fishing up via the North Kenya Banks en route to collect a charter at this far northern area.

Tagging a blue marlin in the afternoon, four broadbill swordfish during the night, and seven sail next morning before arrival at the island, they must be hoping to do as well with the charter party on board!

These sail tend to move on south, so hopefully they will settle to find the whitebait around Malindi, where the fishing usually peaks late November and early December, and we will look forward to a bumper season and hopefully tourist fishermen to keep the boats busy.

Not North Coast certainly, very interesting was news of a trip down to the lower tip of Tanzania undertaken by Peter Ruysenaars from the Pemba Channel Fishing Club recently.

Exploring virgin waters south from Mafia Island to Lindi, via Kiswero and Kilwa, they found an exciting wealth of fishing from giant trevally along the edge of the reefs to huge tuna of Kilwa.

Eleven yellowfin over 50 kgs in one day, with the biggest at 104 kgs, sounds like a story after a good evening at the bar!

There must have been some tired muscles there!

## North Coast Fishing with SAMAKI MINGI

MANTISPRAWNS have been the thorn in the side of the angler all week, distracting the sailfish and yellowfin tuna to the point that they were almost uncatchable.

Sailfish were tailing the waves in such numbers that experienced charter captains James Adcock and Howard Lawrence-Brown both likened it to the huge sailfish runs in Malindi waters.

During those Malindi runs the fishing boats come in festooned with red sailfish flags like pennants at a fairground, but the outriggers on *Mtwapa* boats have been bare poles.

The difference is that the Malindi fish are there to swallow baitfish, especially the Malindi herring, and so they can be easily attracted to baits and lures.

But here they are following the mantis prawns and other tiny prey of which there are so many millions that even if one does have an imitation the chances of distracting a fish from the real thing are very small.

The same has been true of the yellowfin tuna, although some of these have been caught.

On Tuesday Edward Chester, a fly-fishing instructor from Britain, went out with James Adcock in the *Sesse* canoe, *Samvuke*, and as soon as they got onto the swell of the sea they came across diving terns and shoals of tuna swirling and jumping.

Very soon one of the thirty pound rods was bowed down and the reel was screaming its sweet, discordant song, and for the next quarter hour and more Edward had some energetic pumping and winding to do.

He brought the fish up from the

blue depths to where it was seen in the clear water, flashing golden, and then it was in the boat, a round-bodied, slim-wristed, blade-tailed yellowfin tuna, all the iridescent colours silvery and shining.

This was Edward's first tuna ever, a fish of thirteen kilos and as the shoals were still churning the water white it seemed to be just the beginning of a fish-laden day.

But the other fish just did not home in on the hook, although the tuna were spread over a huge area of the sea.

Packs of dozens of sailfish were cutting the surface with their scythe-blade tails and the front part of their sails raised, and their bills were wagging side to side as they fed on the finger-sized bait.

Some were jumping clear of the ocean, long slender bodies gleaming in the sun, falling on their sides with a splash of spray flashing.

Edward and James saw one jump six times in succession.

But none of them came to the baits and lures trailing in the wake of the boat, not even any takers, none of them lost, just not interested.

Edward caught a small trevally on the way into *Mtwapa* creek and that was it for the day, but in spite of the long spell without fish he enjoyed it greatly and declared himself thoroughly hooked on small-boat fishing, with the experience of being right down on the water amongst the fish.

Another *Sesse* canoe, *Tenges*, had a good start to the day on Wednesday, catching

three yellowfin tuna with a total weight of twenty-seven kilos, but then the fish got mesmerised by the mantis prawns and would not come near the boat.

These prawns are not like the ones we dine on but are blunt-headed and flattened laterally, as if you had got an eating prawn and cut it blunt then squashed it flat from the top, and they have fragile arms tucked in under them that look very like the arms and hands of a praying mantis.

On Wednesday there were sailfish littering the ocean too, more than fifty seen by those on *Tenges*, but not biting.

One boat solved the tuna riddle on Saturday, a boat so secretive that we shall call it *The Dark Horse*, not revealing its methods, of course, but catching eleven yellowfin tuna, none of them very big.

*The Dark Horse* angler also had a long period of heavy rod work to do as something big gulped a tuna in one go and was at the end of the line, pulling away into the hidden depths for an hour and a half before it broke off and swam away.

Steve Riddles and Neil Reed were fishing on Howard Lawrence-Brown's boat, *Kipapa*, on the same day and they started with a catch of a good crocodile gar of three kilos early on.

Then the boat stirred the salt water for the next nearly eight hours with no more fish although there were shoals of tuna and

some sailfish finning and jumping.

At the eleventh hour Steve heard his reel whirring and when he had the fish behind the transom another line that had been left trailing a *Rapala* began slipping off into the water and Neil leapt to the call.

Steve's fish was gaffed in, a kingfish of eight kilos, and Neil's was a kingfish too, that came to the boat easily but then made some heavy rushes, running off the fifty pound line so strongly that Howard said later he thought it was going to pull the rodster overboard.

No such luck, but this angler, who seems prone to minor fishing and sporting injuries, did just miss getting his arm into the razor teeth of the

kingfish as it was gaffed in, the underjaw sliding over the arm.

But, to maintain his record, he stepped on a wasp on board later and got stung on the walking part, putting that foot temporarily out of order.

Since the other foot was only firing on one cylinder due to a tennis injury, it is a good thing that that was his last fish of the day.

It was a nice kingfish of fifteen kilos, and Steve brought in another small one, not a bad end to the day, everyone afloat and fish in the boat.

Kenneth Adcock jetted in to home base in *Mtwapa* while between jobs, one as wireman in the Azores where he wired a blue marlin of over seven

hundred pounds and some others as heavy as horses.

His other job is captaining charter fishing boat out of Duba and since his father, James, is charter captain too they naturally spent some days together going fishing.

This was in *Samvuke*, and the headed north to Watamu catching one yellowfin tuna on the way and losing some too.

All the way north from Kilifi, Watamu, a whole afternoon boating, the sea was spashed by yellowfin tuna, as tight together as *tilapia* in a fattener tank, some very big ones were long golden fins jumping clear.

There were millions of mantis prawns in Watamu waters too, but a small red jig fished, hundred metres back seemed the medicine needed and Saturday they caught four tons of twelve to fifteen kilos each totalling fifty kilos.

Kenneth hooked a big one even though he put as much bend in the rod as he could, the fish was in control and went down deep again every time got pulled up towards the light.

The fight between fish and man went on for forty minutes and then some other fish swam against the double line and cut.

As consolation Kenneth caught two good fish on Sunday, a kingfish of twenty-four kilos and a yellowfin of seventeen kilos.

Let's hope the red squid will be the trick for all of us next week and don't forget that the **Eye Fishing Competition** has been changed back to November eleventh, which might well be out to be Lucky Sunday.

## MOUNTAINS OF MANTIS PRAWNS DISTRACT THE SAILFISH

## 'Spectacular Fishing' Along The Continental Shelf Off Kiswero

A 104 kg Yellowfin Tuna (229 lb) plus 10 others all over 50 kg each on the same day!

A 37.6 kg Wahoo (83 lb) Black Marlin.

Sharks. Broadbill. Yellowfin Tuna. Karambesi. Sailfish.

How does this grab you as a start to a fishing adventure?

This was how my fishing-adventure started! I had been invited down to fish in Southern Tanzania on an exploratory trip out of Kiswero Haven.

In fact we went further south to Lindi, which is about 30 miles north of the Mozambique border.

On day 1 out of Dar-es-Salaam we fished down to Mafia Island via Latham as I had 12 year old Lorian with me and he needed to be kept occupied and quiet!

He caught a 15 kg kingfish and I got stuck into a 37.6 kg wahoo, which kept me quiet and occupied for 20 mins and nearly broke my back until I got into a harness.

We also had the first big yellowfin tuna of the trip

This one weighed in at over 40kg.

That kept the young man quiet and occupied for a full 20 minutes! A truly excellent first yellowfin tuna for a 12 year old.

The next day between Mafia and Kilwa we did some serious reef-bashing which kept us all occupied for most of the day.

We had a mixed bag of 29 fish - eight Karambesi (Giant trevally, *Caranx ignobilis*), seven rainbow runner, eight yellowfin tuna, two kingfish and four wahoo.

Two of the Karambesi that we lost we estimated to be in excess of 40 kg each.

They both managed to outwit us and get back into their holes.

These were seriously large Karambesi and we would have liked to spend another day on the reef, but we had to move on.

After Kilwa we had a long dash to Lindi which took 36 hours against the current.

## South Coast Fishing with Peter Ruysenaars

Our return trip through these waters to Kiswero proved there are plenty of fish there, as we hit over 400 kgs of yellowfin in less than four hours.

Fishing along the continental shelf off Kiswero and Kilwa we had substantial fishing.

In addition to the 400 kg caught off Kiswero we had strikes from Broadbill, Black Marlin, Yellowfin Tuna and Sharks. This is an area to be explored.

THE BEST DAY, and all days were excellent, was out of Kilwa.

Every fish landed was over 50 kg and there were 11 of them. The biggest being a 104kg (229

lb) Yellowfin Tuna.

A HUGE FISH, which only took 20 minutes to get to the boat.

Unfortunately we had to leave Kilwa sooner than we wanted as I had to get back to Dar-es-Salaam.

From Mafia back to Dar we caught 24 yellowfin tuna all over 15 kg and one over 35 kg

Living on board a fishing boat for any length of time can become very tedious and claustrophobic but we overcame all that - in style!

Each afternoon we would find a safe haven make our way to totally deserted beaches, we used support vehicles had set up our fly-camp some of the most spectacular spots.

After a sizzling hot shower and a short siesta would have a walk along the beach or a d inland and come back to camp in the early evening for ice-cold drinks at sunset.

Each evening after a superb dinner we would sit around a huge campfire - made from all shapes and sizes of driftwood - on the beach.

It wasn't long though before we all made our way to bed and all is silent except for the sound of sea and the sounds of the African night.

We would wake early with the smell of brewed coffee and the smell of freshly brewed bread.

Six-thirty again and off for another day's fishing in the most exciting waters that I have fished very long time.

He switched promptly to the Ace of Clubs and followed with Seven, Declarer 'ruffing'.

Declarer crossed to Dummy's King of Spades, played a Trump to the Queen and 'ruffed' his third Spade.

He crossed to the Queen of Diamonds and cashed the Ace of Trumps, West discarding a Spade.

Although seemingly faced with two Trump 'losers', Declarer saw that he was home.

But 'ruffing' with the Ten worked no better - Declarer simply discarded his Diamond and waited to make both his King and Nine of Trumps, poised over East's Knave-Eight.
