Masons Meet At North Coast

MORE THAN 170 Freemasons from Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and the Seychelles, many with their families, will meet in Mombasa on August 22nd, for the fifth *Freemason's Conference* to be held at the *Intercontinental Resort Mombasa*.

The Conference has been organised under the authority of *Jayantilal Keshavji Chande*, the District Grand Master for East Africa.

It will serve as an educational forum where participants will have an opportunity to learn more about their organisation and discuss various aspects of Freemasonry.

Harnam Singh Mhajan, an established photographic dealer in Mombasa, will chair the conference while chairman of the Organising Committee is *Dr. Rasik C. Patel*, a well-known and noted surgeon who practised in Mombasa for 35 years.

The secretary of the organising committee is *Surinder Singh Dhadialla* an accountant from Nairobi who chaired the last Conference held in Kisumu in 1994.

The Committee has other experienced Masons, including the head of the Lodges of the Coast which was founded in Mombasa in 1987.

Among those presenting papers is the *Reverend Peter Hemingway* of St. Alban's Vicarage in North Harrow Middlesex, England who holds a senior position in Freemasonry in London.

'ZANZIBAR WAS FIRST'

Freemasonry, according to Mr. Chande, originated in England some 270 years ago and is the oldest and largest secular fraternal organisation in the world established and has a membership of over seven million.

The first Freemasons' Lodge in East Africa was formed in Zanzibar in 1903 followed by Kenya where the Lodges were formed in 1905 in Nairobi, 1912 in Nakuru and 1913 in Mombasa.

There are now 47 Lodges in the above four countries, with a membership of about 3,000 operating under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of England.

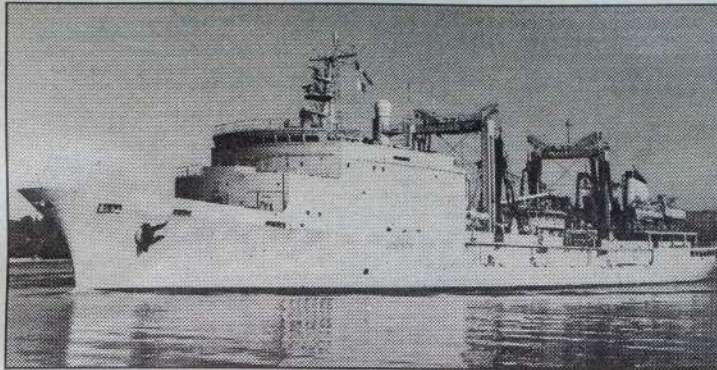

As Command Ship the *SOMME* is deployed in the Indian Ocean area together with the frigate *LA MOTTE-PICQUET*, the patrol frigate *FLOREAL*, the two light frigates *COMMANDANT BORY* and *JACOBET*, and the two support ships *GARONNE* and *JULES VERNE*.

Mrs Antonia Fonseca, assistant to the French Consul in Mombasa, confirmed that the *SOMME* was expected in Port from August 23 to 29.

Amongst disabilities include blindness of one who is deaf and dumb.

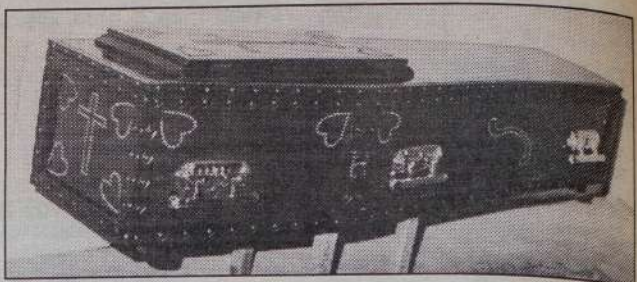
APDK's coffin industry has been initiated by special request.

When compared to the group following the tradition protocol, the patients followed the dynamic programme had greater strength, mobility and overall physical conditioning.

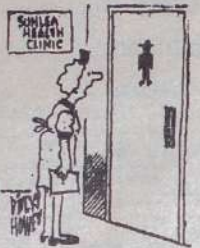

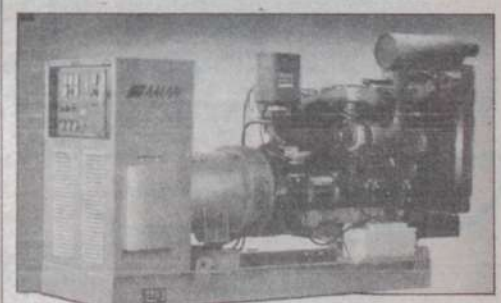

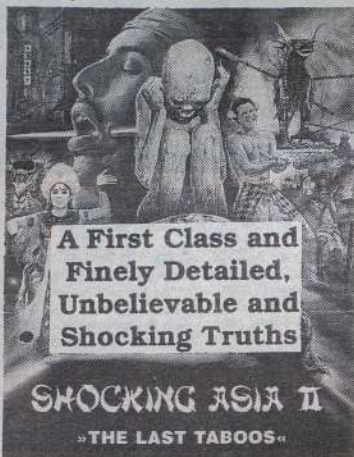

Rotary Aims To 'Kick Polio Out Of Africa ...'

"KICK POLIO out of Africa" is the theme of a campaign to erase Polio from Africa.

25 of the 48 Sub-Saharan African nations have embarked or soon will embark on inaugural national immunization days (NIDs).

World Health Organization (WHO) experts attest that concerted efforts by all these nations to conduct NIDs from June 1996 through January 1997 are essential to eradicate poliomyelitis - the wild polio virus - from the face of the continent.

To strengthen individual countries' action plans for the NIDs, WHO held a series of training workshops for national managers and their partners, including Rotary Polio Plus national chairpersons.

Rotary is the main private organization working with WHO, UNICEF and the US Center for Disease Control and Prevention.

Rotary International launched its PolioPlus programme in 1985.

In 1987, Rotarians all over the World raised US Dollars 246 million in PolioPlus funds and through investment by the year 2005 which is Rotary's centennial year, it will approach US \$400 Million.

"In kind" and personal contributions made by and through local Rotary clubs and districts for polio eradication activities will approach an estimated US \$600 million.

Rotary's PolioPlus programme has contributed US \$ 65 million to polio eradication campaigns in Sub-Saharan Africa.

In the present campaign which will cost US \$31 million, Rotary will contribute US \$ 12 million and CDC Atlanta US \$ 7 Million for polio vaccines and other support activities.

Nearly 50 million children under the age of 5 years, in the Sub-Saharan Africa are targeted to receive oral polio vaccine.

The 25 African countries scheduled to conduct NIDs in 1996 are scattered. In the east are Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, and

Zimbabwe; in the central block are Congo, Gabon, Cameroon, the Central African Republic, Zaire, Equatorial Guinea and Chad; and in the west are Benin, Burkina Faso, Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana and Togo.

Zaire a 26th country is also planning a series of regional immunization days.

COAST PROVINCE

Districts in the Coast Province of Kenya and Nigeria have had immunization days before in the past few years.

Polio can be eradicated when routine immunization activities are supplemented by National Immunization Days and an effective disease surveillance system.

During these National Immunization Days (NIDs), all children of a country, under five years of age are given oral polio vaccine (OPV) within a few days regardless of their previous immunization status.

Two doses of OPV are administered four to six weeks apart.

This is over and above the routine immunization programme.

This needs to be repeated continuously for 3-4 years.

Such national immunization campaigns work because the action of flooding the community with OPV is a very short period of time results in preventing the spread of disease virus and virus which is left outside the body dies.

All countries of Latin America have used this strategy successfully.

The fact that no polio case has been detected in Latin America have used this strategy successfully.

The fact that no polio case has been detected in Latin America since August 1991 is testimony to the impact of nation-wide mass immunization campaigns.

In 1993, China Successfully conducted NIDs where 80 million children were immunized against

polio.

In 1995, India did the same where 87 million children were immunized.

145 countries are now free of polio and most of them achieved through implementation of NIDs.

During 1996-97, over 90 countries will conduct NIDs including 26 countries in Sub-Saharan Africa.

The East African countries, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and Zambia holding their first set of National Immunization Days early this month Saturday 10th August 11th August 1996.

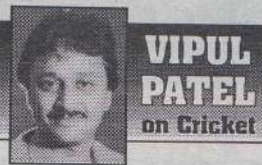
At this point only 40 runs were needed to lead Mombasa Sports Club to victory but, as I

'Brute Force Is Best Way' With Our Road Problems!

THE OTHER DAY I overheard a discussion trying to define which single factor has the most impact on road safety.

The offers ranged from the cars themselves to peoples mind set.

Indeed there are a large number.

The ones that interested me most were the ones where the results were achieved without involving the whole driving public.

These would be easier to implement than those that involved direct input to individual drivers.

Vehicle manufacturers fall into this category.

The relatively small bunch of chaps that decided what should or should not be included in a vehicle have a big contribution towards roads safety.

They are the ones who decide what features should be installed on a vehicle.

They also decide what level of

reliability the individual components should have. In a small way, they also set the cost of keeping the features functional.

It is not many manufacturers that have indicators telling you when your safety features need replacement.

It is all based on time rather than instrumented as the cost would be quite high if they had been.

Brake wear warning is one example.

Very few vehicle manufacturers fit it yet it is one of the essential items in terms of safety for the car.

Non functioning indicators or lights is another.

It is O.K. to check round the car every so often to ensure all of them work.

Murphy's law will ensure that the lights will fail whilst travelling on the one day you choose to inspect them.

It exposes one to risk when one cannot tell other road users what their intention is.

In a lot of cars, the speed at which the tell tale light on the dashboard blinks is an indication of the health of indicators.

If one of the bulbs on the circuit is not working, then it blinks faster than normal.

It is time to change the bulb. There are very few vehicles that have an indication of the condition of the bulb for the headlight and tail light clusters.

These are also necessary for informing other drivers, especially the brake lights.

The technology to do these is pretty straight forward but motor car manufacturers have other priorities.

Roads are provided with features which make them safe to use.

A good and even road surface with few surprises goes a long way to making it safe to drive.

Whether the surface is murrum, coral or tarmac, the main requirement is that it is has no major areas of unevenness (read potholes), it drains well and that it is wide enough to take the kind of traffic it is designed for.

The road verges should have a clear area adjacent to it so that visibility is not compromised.

The additional signage, bollards and so forth should also be placed at safe distances and be visible.

Laws and the code of conduct on roads should be reviewed regularly in light of developing technology and driver behaviour patterns.

This requires very few people to think out strategies and propose solutions to emerging problems.

Enforcement is also in the hands of a few "select" people. Correct action by these parties can have a big impact on road safety.

One of the issues that can be tackled quite easily is the condition of the roads and we do not mean potholes.

On the Makupa causeway and on Nyal bridge as well there are traps that have been created by sheer negligence.

The road dividers in both cases have (had) steel crash barriers.

DIRT AND RUBBISH

These did their job by stopping cars from careering to the next lanes.

However, no one has gone back and repaired them.

What you now find is that as you travel in the right hand lanes, you have big chunks of steel pointing at your car and you have to swerve left to avoid them.

They effectively narrow the road to less than a car width.

The dirt and rubbish has been allowed to take over the street such that the roads are also narrowed down to less than the required or design width.

Traffic lights grow shorter every time they are hit by a vehicle.

The pole on which they sit is not replaced but cut and joined up.

The other issue that has been written about a lot of times, is the competence of the law enforcement agencies.

They should be ruthless, unbribable and armed with teeth breaking legislation that would put fear into the heart of any potential law breaker.

They should be persistent till they achieve results.

Nkrumah road in Mombasa is

an example of such a success.

The people who used to park on yellow lines now no longer do so because they are almost sure that they will be towed.

It has made moving along that road quite pleasant.

A welcome change from three weeks ago.

The road maintenance people, the cops and the driving schools can have the biggest impact with the least effort in reducing the accident rates in this country.

Mass education of drivers, poster appeals and all the other "soft" methods are alien to Kenyans.

Brute force is the best way of tackling the myriad problems on our roads.

As Kachumbari says, we should use the 'fimo to get results as people ignore common sense measures.

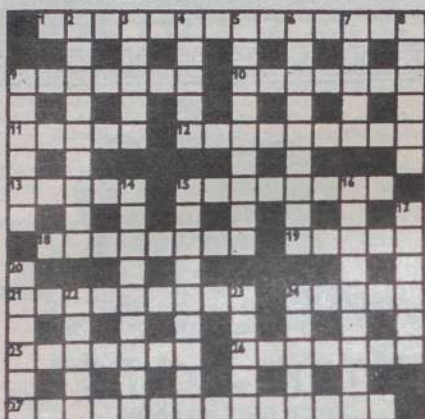

Protecting Winners From Being 'Ruffed'

A GOOD way to prevent a Winner from being 'ruffed' is to lead toward it (instead of leading the High Card itself). If Second Hand 'ruffs', you can play 'low' and save your High Card.

CONTRACT: Four Hearts. OPENING LEAD: King Of Clubs
West wins the first two Club Tricks and leads a third Club, which you 'ruff'.

The Seven of Diamonds is a loser unless the Suit divides 3-3, and you are subject to a Heart 'loser' unless that Suit divides 3-2.

At Tricks Four and Five, you cash two high Hearts and West shows out on the Second Lead, so East has a natural Heart Trick.

The fate of the hand now depends on whether or not you lose a Diamond Trick.

It may appear that Diamonds must divide 3-3; suppose the four Hands are:-

(If East followed suit to the Diamond lead from Dummy, you would of course win with your high Diamond and 'ruff' the seven in Dummy necessary).

Note that you would be set if you led the third round of Diamonds from your Hand, East would 'ruff' and you would be left with an unavoidable Diamond 'loser'.

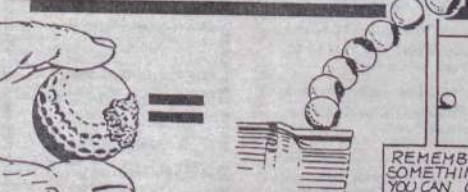
