Oshwal Academy Students Impress With Outstanding 'A' Level Results

OSHWAL ACADEMY have once again obtained 'brilliant' results at the International G. C. E. 'A' level examinations, according to latest figures released on by the University of London Examination and Assessment Council.

Most outstanding results were obtained by the following students who got 'A's in the three subjects they took.

Saleem M. Bagha, Rosemin A. Omar, Rakhee H. Shah, Seema A. Shah got grades 'A' in Biology, Chemistry and Pure Maths with Mohamed A. Bagha got his 'A's in Chemistry, Physics and Pure Maths.

Ritesh K. Bamania, Sonal A. Shah and Dipesh K. Chhedha obtained 'A's in Accounting, Economics and Pure Maths.

Two 'A's and one 'B' were obtained by Mustafa H. Bhajji, Vijay H. Rawal, Ashish G. Shah, Shilan R. Shah and Vimal S. Shah.

Sapna A. Aggarwal, Sameer K. Bachani, Paras D. Shah and Sailesh R. Varsani obtained two 'A's and one 'C'. Rishi D. Shah got one 'A' and two 'B's.

Both qualitatively and quantitatively, the results were brilliant best for Oshwal Academy as it obtained 42 'A's, 17 'B's and 17 'C's - out of a total of 106 entered by 36 students.

'FANTASTIC'

"This works out to a fantastic 74.5 per cent from grades A-C, and 96.2 per cent from grades A-N", said a school spokesman.

Excellent results were also obtained in the following

subjects.

In Chemistry there were 13 'A's, two 'B's and one 'C' - out 16.

In Accounting six 'A's, one 'B' and three 'C's - out 14.

In Biology five 'A's, four 'B's and one 'C' - out of 11.

In Pure Maths 13 'A's, six 'B's and six 'C's - out 33.

In Economics seven 'A's, one 'B' and two 'C's - out 18.

"From grades A - N 100 per cent results were obtained in Accounting, Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Pure Maths."

The Headmaster Mr. M. N. Joseph congratulated the staff on their dedication and

commitment to work and the friendly interaction with the students and he commended the students for their discipline, motivation and initiative to excel.

He added that from the information available to him 21 students are proceeding to various Universities in the United Kingdom.

Those going to the United Kingdom must obtain Student Visas from the Consular section of the British High Commission in Nairobi and obtain a clearance from the Ministry of Education and reach U. K. by late September when most of the Universities begin their academic year.

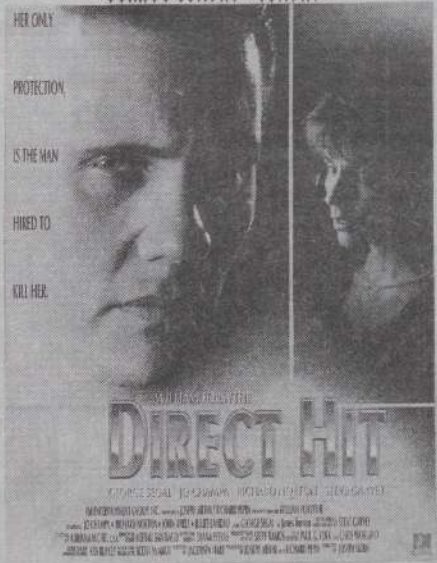

ACTION / THRILLER

TOUR INDUSTRY URGED TO RE-INVEST IN 'QUALITY SERVICES'

KEY PLAYERS in the tourist industry should invest further in improving the quality of their services to international standards, a director of the Indian Ocean Beach Club, Mr. Julius Gecau has advised.

He said as the competition for the world tourist market stiffens, tourists are now demanding high quality service which must be given top priority in the tourist industry.

Mr. Gecau made the remarks last week at a Goldstar Awards presentation ceremony at the Indian Ocean Beach Club, Diani where he was the guest of honour.

He said the club managed by the Block Hotels has become an example of good quality provider on the Kenyan coast after surpassing older resorts.

He challenged managers especially in the hotel industry to practise independent hotel management which he said would create more friendly atmosphere in the working places.

"Hotel workers can not afford to accord warm welcome and quality service to guests if they are afraid of bullying managers", he said noting that the manager should not be seen as a reprimanding tool by workers but a helper when there are difficulties.

He urged hotel workers to be honest and make sure they do not steal from guests so as to make guests have faith in the country.

The few mistakes that hotel workers commit, are among the ingredients of the negative publicity that is given to Kenya by foreign media, he said.

The same function was

addressed by Block Hotels coast area Manager Mr. John Mutua who

commended the management of the Indian Ocean Beach Club saying that tour operator who use the resort say it is one of the most

unique holiday resorts in Africa.

He revealed that Block Hotels has launched a vigorous marketing campaign to promote

its more than a dozen hotels in the country.

"We want to bring guests here and we expect you to workers to deliver good service, good food, accommodation, and above all hospitality".

He disclosed that the Club had invested Shs. 1.5 million in constructing a modern tennis court for the guests.

Indian Ocean Beach Club financial controller Maurice Kifiro told the workers who attended the ceremony that soon the club

would be above the rest of the resorts in the area in room occupancy.

Most of the guests in the hotel, he said, were repeat guest and noted that more incentive groups were choosing the club.

At the ceremony, Evelyn Maria was declared the best waitress after having sold beverages worth Shs. 253,000 in the month of July 1996.

Step Up Your Running Skills - Try Stair Climb

BASIC training logic tells us that if we want to become better at something, we should spend time honing our skills, practising a given activity over and over.

For example, if you want to become a better swimmer, you should spend time doing laps in a pool.

If you want to improve your running times, head to the track and start racking up the mileage.

Increasing mileage however, may not be the only way to become a better runner.

A study from California State University indicates that stair

climbing may do as much to improve your running performance as actual running does.

23 physically active college women completed 9 weeks of training.

While one group trained on a stairclimber for 30 to 40 minutes, 4 days a week, the other group ran for the same length of time.

Both groups trained at 70 to 90 percent of their maximum heart rate.

In addition to improving their aerobic capacity, both groups improved their 1.5 mile run times by 8 percent for the stairclimbing group and 11 percent for running group.

Numerous studies have now demonstrated the benefits of cross training.

In addition to improving performance, cross training is a great way to alleviate boredom and burnout that are associated with training for a single sport.

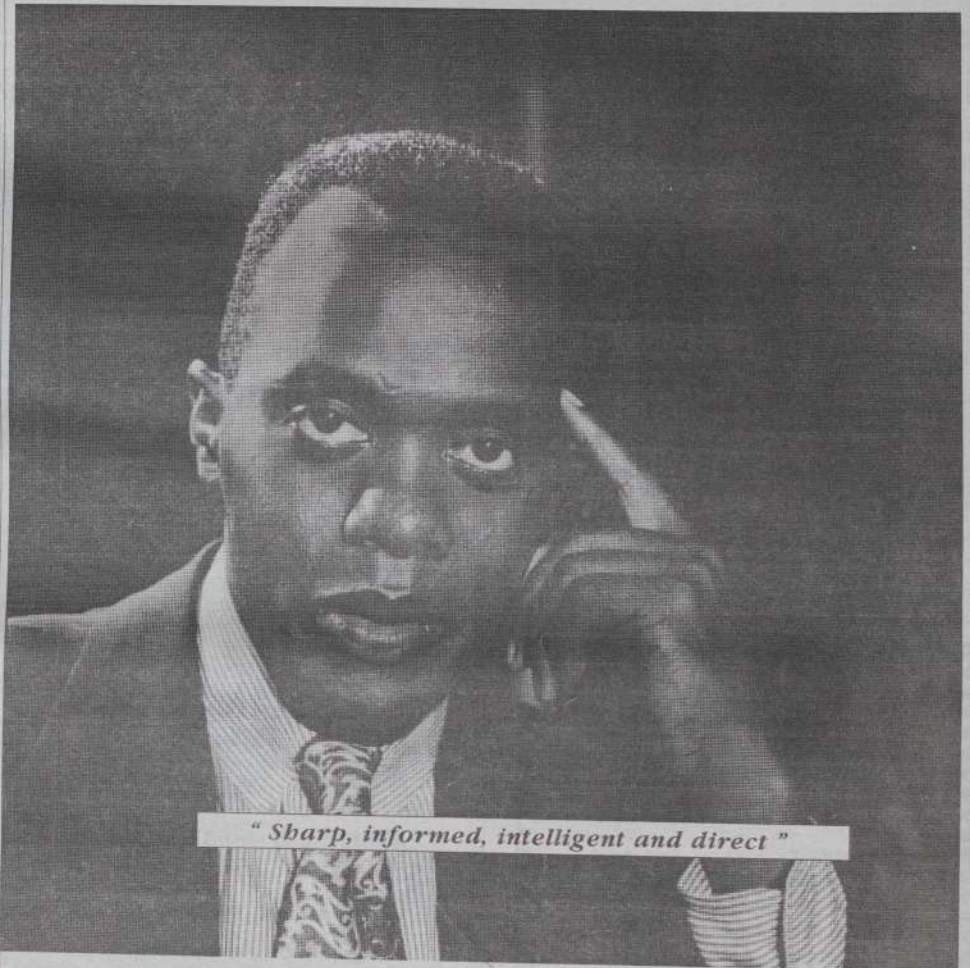

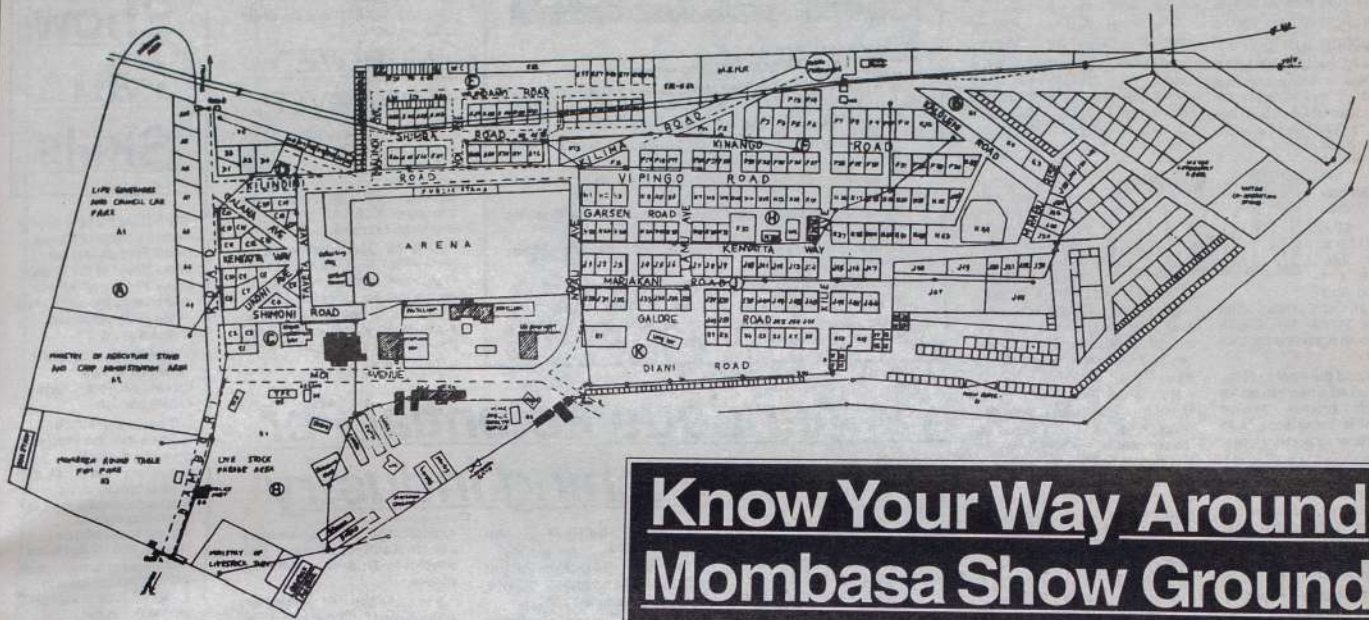

Kenya Ports Authority And Felixstowe Port Consultants Sign Mombasa Container Terminal Management Contract

KENYA Ports Authority and the Felixstowe Port Consultants of the United Kingdom have signed the port of Mombasa container terminal management contract under which the latter will run the terminal for a duration of two years with an option of extension.

The signing ceremony at the KPA headquarters in Mombasa was witnessed by the minister for transport and communications Mr. Wilson Ndolo Ayah and the entire KPA board of directors which included the Attorney General Mr. Amos Wako.

The KPA Executive Chairman Mr. Robert Brenneisen and the port of Felixstowe Chief Executive Officer Mr. Derek Harrington both signed the contract documents.

Mr. Ayah said the signing of the contract marked a new era under the which private sector involvement is being brought to increase efficiency and customer satisfaction.

He said the Kenya government viewed the role of its major port as crucial to economic and social development of the entire East and Central African region and hence the new policy to inject fresh management approaches.

He cited customer complaints regarding the terminal and urged the Felixstowe team to live up to the expectation of the port users,

the KPA, government and the people of Kenya by providing an excellent record under the contract terms.

Mr. Brenneisen thanked the Felixstowe Port Consultants for their flexibility and understanding during the contract talks and noted that this contributed to an agreement best suited to all.

He announced the contract begins on September 1, 1996.

Mr. Brenneisen said that as a sign of dedication and determination of the port ahead, the container terminal engineers have already put up the fourth ship-to-shore gantry crane.

The crane which had been down for more than three years, now increases the speed of service at the terminal.

Mr. Harrington said Felixstowe had a long relationship with the port of Mombasa which would be useful in running the terminal to everyone's satisfaction.

He noted that the port of Mombasa has a strategic location which it would use to tap more trade potential between the region and the international market place.

Under the contract, the operator of the terminal will have responsibility for operation and management of the container terminal with KPA personnel and equipment.

The five experienced team of staff from Felixstowe port in the U.K. will also be responsible for the maintenance of equipment and the supervision of major

The new management team will also assist in the setting up the Mauritius Container Tracking System besides meeting a productivity target of 375 crane lifts per day per crane average after a period of 12 months.

A bonus will be paid if the target is exceeded.

IMPROVED TURNOVER

The contract which costs approximately 1.1 Million US dollars per annum all inclusive and expected to be recovered by higher turnover, will also involve the training of KPA staff on site and overseas if required.

Later, Mr. Brenneisen hosted a reception in honour of Mr. Harrington. Both Mr. Ayah and his permanent secretary Mr. Stanley Murgae, the general secretary of the Dock Workers Union Mr. Juma Khamis and KPA Chief Officers were present.

A very interesting hand was played in last Wednesday's session at Mombasa Sports Club. East/ West - Vulnerable, Dealer: South. The Bidding was as follows:

South led a Small Diamond, won by North's King. Now East counts his tricks.

He has Eleven Tricks (if Hearts break even) and has to make one more trick in Diamonds.

He is sure South has four Diamonds.

After winning with Diamond King, North plays Spade Jack and East's Singleton Ace drops.

East now runs his four Clubs, East discards one Diamond on fourth Club.

Hearts break even so declarer makes his Twelve tricks.

One in Spade, Four in Hearts, Three in Diamonds, and Four in Clubs.

This was a top score for East/ West as they were the only pair to reach in 'Slam'.
