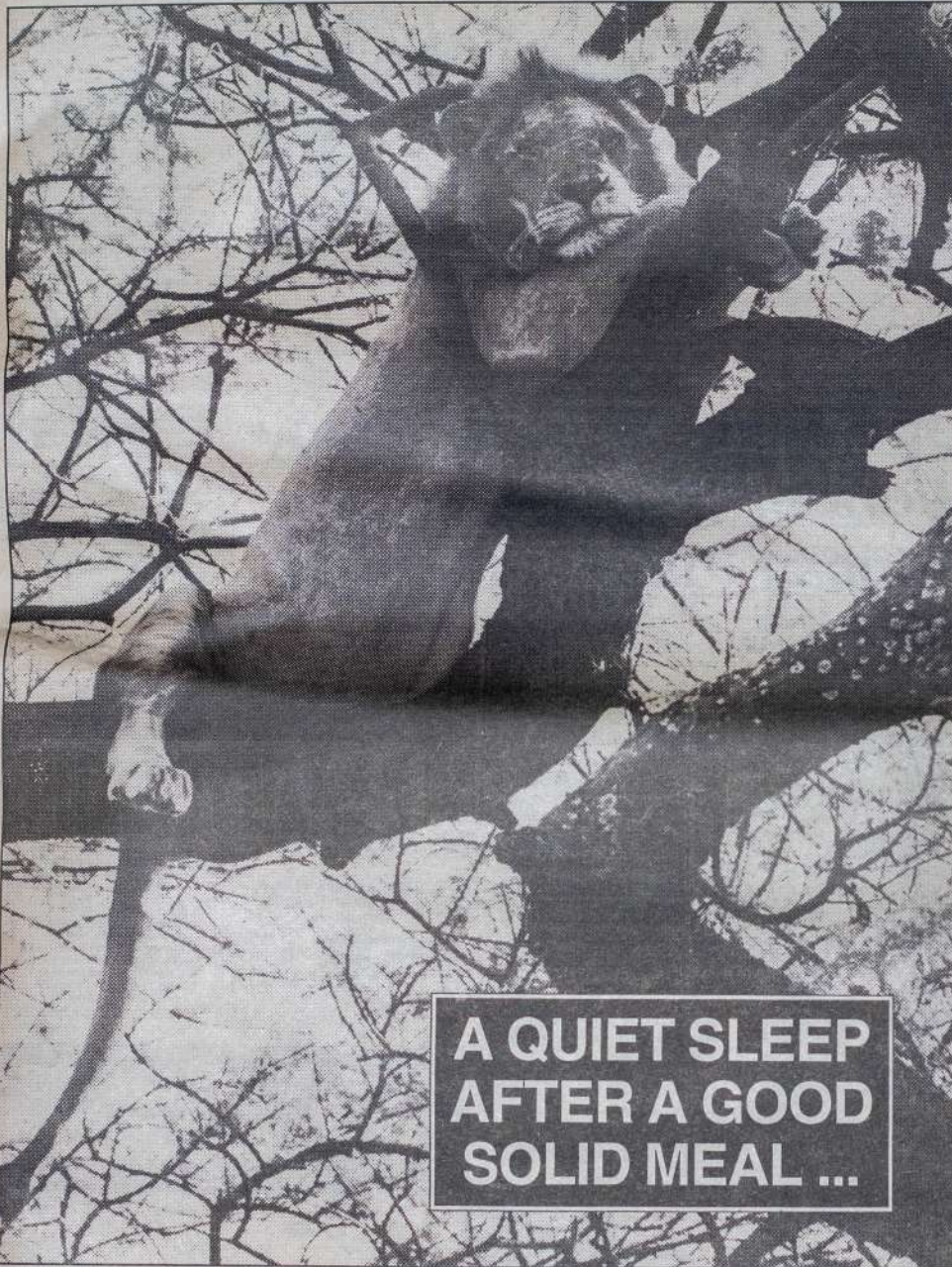

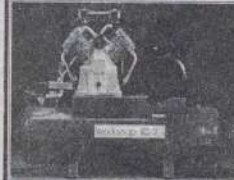

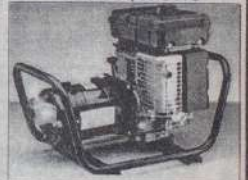

Oshwal Academy Students Also Shine With 'O' Success

Agricultural Development In Coast Province

COAST PROVINCE has the potential to feed her population and even provide food and other Agricultural products to other areas of the republic.

The province is however a net importer of food due to under-utilization of its vast land resources.

Out of the 3 million hectares of Agricultural land only about 300,000 Ha are currently under crop production.

The potential for irrigation agriculture is also high with over 70,000 Ha as irrigatable land using the two main rivers namely Tana River and the Sabaki.

Infrastructure to irrigate about 16,000 Ha is already in place.

Positive programmes of expansion for irrigated land have been initiated as is evidenced by the present implementation of the Tana Delta project and other irrigation programmes currently being implemented by the ministry's irrigation unit.

Despite the recent severe climatic conditions like erratic rainfall with very poor distribution patterns, the province managed to achieve the following:-

1. MAIZE
The province remains a deficit area as far as maize is concerned.

The hectare under this crop during the year 1995 was 48,762 Ha yielding 52,424 bags valued at Kenya pounds 24,409,080.

The average yields of the crop under the coastal climatic condition are considerably lower than those achieved in other high potential maize growing areas in the country.

The existing varieties grown are Pwani Hybrid, Coast composite, Katumani, DLC for the low lower coast while hybrids 511, 512, 514 and 525 are prevalent in the upper medium zone in Talta Taveta district.

The Ministry of Agricultural, Livestock Development and Marketing is continuously battling with agronomic aspects of improving yields while our

Regional Research centre, Mtwapa with other collaborators like ICIPE are looking at varietal improvements to increase yield performance and pest and disease resistance.

2. RICE
Despite the high level of rice consumption in the province, production has considerably remained low.

The 1995 hectare under rice was 1,751 Ha yielding 19,801 bags valued at Kenya pounds 1,247,463.

The current efforts in increasing rice production have been directed at planting high yielding good quality planting materials and expansion of the area under irrigation.

3. LEGUMES
The potential for legume production notably, cowpeas, p/peas and green grammes is very high.

Farmers have over the years increased the hectare under these crops due to good performance even under adverse weather conditions.

The hectare under legumes was 10,611 Ha in 1995 yielding 70,035 bags valued at Kenya Pounds 6,279,120.

Activities to increase the area under legumes, noting that they are important components in the diets of the people of coast, have already been initiated.

At present farmers have a wide variety of legume seeds to choose from.

4. CASSAVA
The crop is widely grown by a cross section of Coast farmers. The hectare under the crop was 14,957 Ha in 1995 yielding 144,001 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 38,000,250.

The crop continues to play an important role as an alternative to the adored maize during hard times.

The Ministry's initiatives as far as the crop is concerned has been to provide clean disease free planting materials.

Several bulking programmes were initiated with a view of phasing out government involvement in bulking.

At present, a number of farmers are multiplying cassava seed materials as government bulking projects have been phased out due to the current policy of privatization and liberalisation.

5. COCONUT
The crop is widely grown in lower coast.

It is an adored crop because of its multipurpose use.

During the year 1995 there were 43,519 Ha of coconut yielding 62,088 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 17,213,100.

As the ministry prepares itself for the implementation of crop sector plan within the Agricultural sector Management programme, aspects of improvement in coconut will be considered along with others..

6. CASHEWNUITS
cashewnuts cultivation in coast province has shown dealing trends.

There were 30,708 Ha of cashewnuts during the year 1995 yielding 10,033 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 9,114,560.

As the cashewnuts industry gradually liberalises both the crop hectare and quality as well prices to farmers for their produce will improve.

7. COTTON
Cotton production in the province has been declining due to poor pricing.

During the year 1995 there were 1,771 Ha of Cotton yielding 2,017 tons valued at Kenya pounds 1,512,750.

The major constraints has been timely acquisition of quality seed.

The current programmed by the ministry of bulk cotton seed 'The HAET 89' is a positive move that will alleviate this problem.

Efforts will be made to keep

the seed clean once it is produced to maintain varietal superiority.

8. SISAL
Most of the province is suitable for sisal production.

During the year 1995 there were 22,000 Ha of sisal yielding 14,000 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 22,000,000.

There is a lot of room for expansion of sisal in the province and potential investors are welcome to venture into this enterprise.

9. COFFEE
The province grows two types of coffee Arabica coffee in the cooler areas (274 Ha) and Robusta coffee in the lower hotter areas (16 Ha).

Programmes for the expansion of Robusta coffee are already in place and with good pricing the province should contribute also towards coffee production in future.

10. SIMSİM
Simsim has been grown in the province mainly as a relay crop. This practice has been encouraged since farmers reap more benefits from such an arrangement.

The area under simsım was 1,003 Ha in 1995 yielding 458 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 466,080. Despite the obvious declining trends in simsım production, efforts are being made to promote white simsım production for export.

11. BİXA
The area under the crop during the year 1995 was 4,534 Ha yielding 2,206 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 5,915,300.

During the year, the crop showed the most variation in pricing.

It attracted very high prices prompting farmers to increase the area under the crop from 3,698 in 1994 to 4,594 Ha in 1995.

With liberalization, most farmers will increase the area under the crop due to the higher

prices offered.

12. HORTICULTURAL CROPS
The demand for both fruit and vegetables is very high in the province.

During the year 1995 there were 7,496 Ha of Mangoes yielding 958,363 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 28,974,400., 8,412 Ha of citrus yielding 78,708 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 53,342,800., 6,887 Ha Bananas yielding 71,195 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 4,425,700., 394 Ha pineapples yielding 4,416 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 5,710,000., 1,225 Ha of Pawpaws yielding 2,133 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 4,747,700 and 2,729 Ha of vegetables yielding 23,557 Tons valued at Kenya pounds 18,810,465.

Programmes to increase the area under the fruit trees have already been initiated. Farmers are being advised to plant high quality varieties for mangoes.

The 'Florida' varieties are encouraged to ensure maximum benefits from the export market.

I take this precious opportunity to welcome you all to the 1996 Mombasa National Show.

The Nations goal as been and still remains to provide food to its population.

The Agricultural sector is charged with this responsibility of feeding the nation.

The Sector has also to provide enough quality products for export.

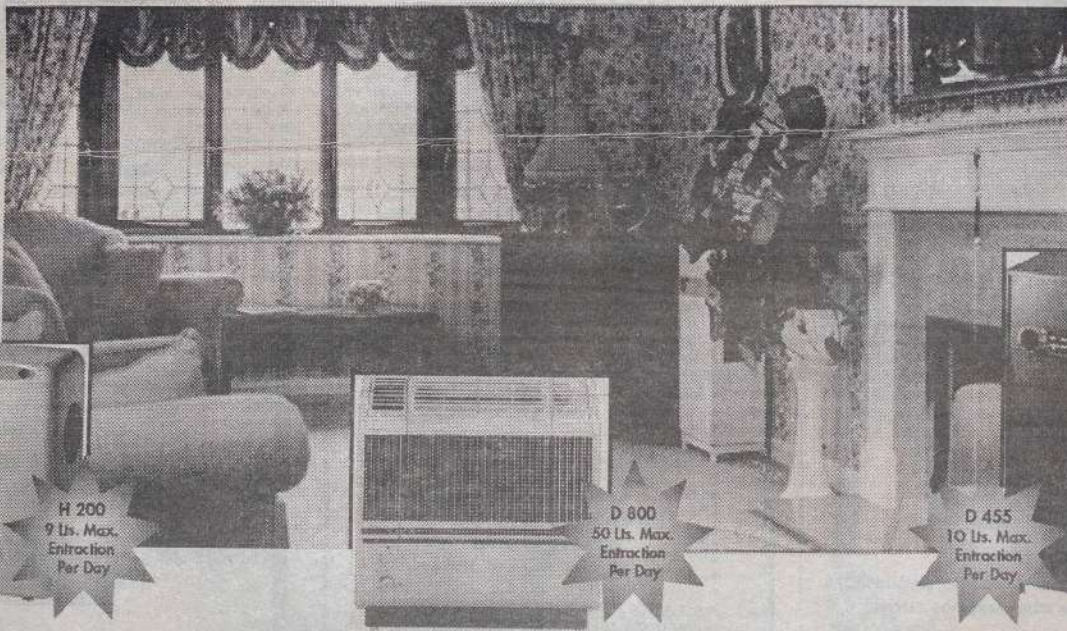

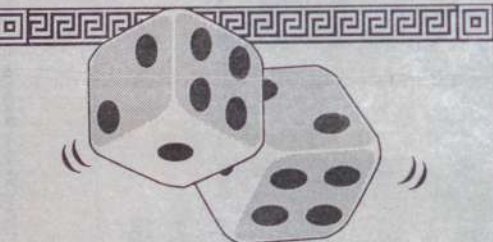

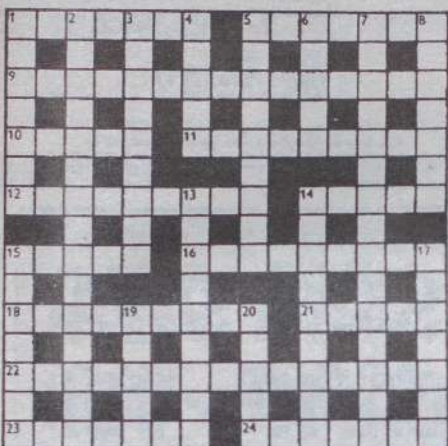

GETTING BACK TO THOSE 'BASICS'

TO CONTINUE with our, Cricket back to basics the concept of a "wide ball" has two very important factors.

One is as to how wide the Ball has gone sideways or upwards and secondly the most important is when it should be called and how can a batsman be out from a wide ball.

Let us first look into how a wide ball is given.

When a Batsman normally comes in to bat he will put his bat showing the edge of the bat along side the stumps in the front to ask whether the ball is covering the leg stump or the middle stump.

This way a batsman can

confirm his standing stance or position so that he can follow the line of the ball thrown (bowled) to him so that he does not worry much whether he is exposing the wicket too much or too little.

Considering the batsman now has his standing position in line with the leg stump (which is the normal position he will take) the Umpire now has a clear view of the wicket.

The bowler when bowling the ball so high over or so wide of the wicket that the batsman can not reach it standing from his normal position then a "wide ball" is called.

Remember here that this call can only be called out when the ball has passed the wicket and

has not touched that bat or the clothing of the batsman.

A lot of controversy happens on this decision. But a very simple rule is applied if the

batsman by moving from his normal position causes the ball to pass out of his reach a wide ball is not given.

This happens when for example the ball passes the off-stump or the right hand side stump the batsman steps back wards towards the left to look like the ball is very far for him to reach then the Umpire shall not give a wide ball!

Secondly the call for wide when the ball goes over the batsman has also its own rules to be followed.

For example for an average Batsman with an average bat can easily reach a feet over him.

Therefore the stature of the Batsman should also be considered in calling a "wide ball".

Now a Batsman can be out from a "wide ball" if he hits the wicket or is stumped or if either Batsman is run out of he hands the Ball or if he is obstructing the field.

The penalty of if he is obstructing the field.

The penalty of "a wide ball" is one run unless runs are made otherwise which are call "wides".

Sometime a ball properly delivered may not reach the batsman and comes to rest in front of the line or the popping crease.

WIDE BALL

A "wide ball" cannot be called in this case and the batsman has the right to hit the ball after all the fields man are told to stay in their position and the non-striker returns to his line.

If he misses the ball or does not want to hit the ball a dead ball is signalled.

Therefore you have to be a good golfer to play this shot.

When presented with the overwhelming evidence in this latest report, maybe people will be receptive to the message - and why not?

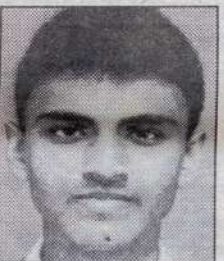

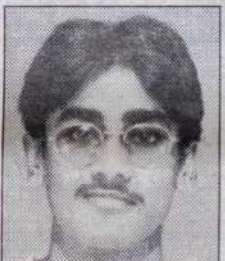

7. Do I let following players through whenever there is an open hole ahead or when I am looking for a ball?
8. Does my idle chatter distract or delay others?
9. Do I try to give a lesson to others during the round?
10. After a bad shot, do I analyse it for my companions' edification, and re-examine my swing needlessly?
11. Do I waste time between nines?
12. Above all, am I considerate of others?

ON THE PUTTING GREEN:

- a) Am I over-careful in reading the line from several angles?
- b) Do I imagine I see things that are not really there?
- c) Do I pick up unimportant things?
- d) Do I lift the ball to "clean" it when it could not possibly need it?
