

Basically, the operation progressed as follows; the outer end of the cable was fixed ashore and then the barge steared by two Divecon tug and tenders was gradually towed across the channel to the other side, with the cable being methodically spooled off the reel.

Once the convoy had reached the other side, the inner end of the cable was then passed ashore for connection to the grid, and as confucious once said:
