'Coast Chapter' For 'Operation Smile' In Kenya

KENYA'S COAST Province will be included for the first time this year in the annual 'Operation Smile' International Mission: the tenth to Kenya.

As additional funding and contributions are currently being sought by the local fund raising committee, 'Operation Smile Kenya' officials will make a presentation to Mombasa's business community at *White Sands Hotel* this evening, Friday, September 13.

The aim is to form a 'Mombasa Chapter' to raise funds and give general support to this worthy cause.

Working in conjunction with the Ministry of Health and local medical teams, 'Operation Smile' International surgeons have performed free facial surgery on 1,587 Kenyan children and young adults since the mission began in 1987.

This year, 'Operation Smile' will send a 108 member medical/surgical team to provide reconstructive surgery on over 325 children, from October 1-15.

Coast General Hospital has now been added to the three existing sites, *Gertrudes Gardens Children's Hospital Nairobi, Rift Valley Provincial Hospital, Nakuru and Nyanza Provincial General Hospital, Kisumu.*

The 'Operation Smile' International team will bring medical equipment and supplies so as not to place an undue burden on the local health care system.

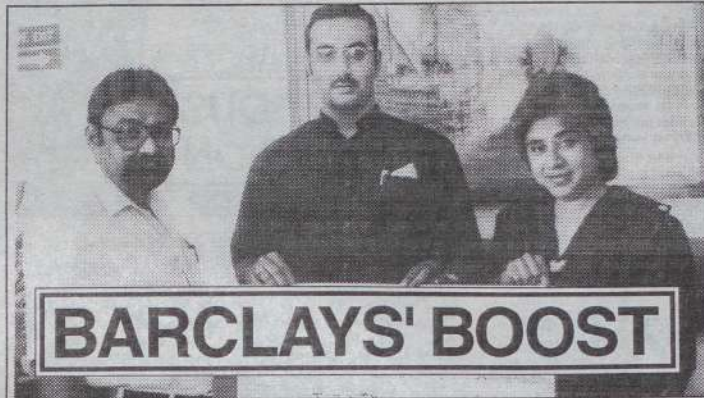
Freight forwarding and transport will be organised by *Transami*, as their contribution towards the mission.

Local flights, transportation and accommodation will be provided through Kenyan organisations, including *Kenya Airways, Firestone and Sarova Hotels.*

As usual, there will be an exchange of knowledge and techniques, during the mission, as well as formal lecture presentations to enable medical professionals in Kenya to perform these procedures the year round.

'Operation Smile' International, a private, non-profit volunteer medical services organisation, came into being in 1982, to assist as many as possible of the thousands of children around the world who are born with facial

Children In Kongowea, Kisauni and Bamburi Benefit From Krystian Belliere Piano Concert

NEEDY MEMBERS of the Mombasa Community now have a shoulder to cry on, courtesy of the Nyali Beach Hotel.

The holiday resort now celebrating five successful decades in the tourist industry has pledged to continue supporting charity projects in order to help improve the living standards of those in need.

A recent charity concert of romantic piano music by British Classical music star Krystian Belliere hosted by the Nyali Beach Hotel will have its proceeds helping various projects and needy children in the area.

Among the beneficiaries will be four form two students who have been sent home due to outstanding fees, according to Vicki Horsey and Dickie Coppinger of the Nyali Assistance Group.

supports 17 children in the neighbourhood.

The needy children live in the locally of Kongowea, Kisauni and Bamburi and whose school fees and further education depends on charitable donations.

"We would like to thank Mr. Krystian Belliere and Mr. John Mutua on behalf of the Nyali Beach Hotel for considering assisting out group", said the

group leaders.

Other beneficiaries include the Goodwill industry based at Kikowani Special School.

This is a self-help vocational training unit for mentally handicapped youths and adults which needs funds urgently to buy tools used for making leather among other products.

Spark Unit for the Cerebral Palsied which teaches both mentally and physically handicapped children on basic life skills alongside with reading and physiotherapy will benefit from funds from the same concert to buy ropes, tricycles and rocking horses to help increase their mobility.

The assistance will be channelled through Sarah Johnson.

When delivering the speech to officially launch the show, Block Hotels coast area manager John Mutua said that the Hotel which has

maintained cordial relations with its neighbours since 1946 when it opened doors to the first paying guests, wishes to continue strengthening the relations.

The Krystian Belliere concert, the second one in Kenya this year, attracted scores of Classic Music fans at the Nyali Beach Hotel's Malaika Room.

It featured famous hit by Beethoven, Gershwin, Liszt and Chopin.

Krystian who performed at his best to satisfy the fans staged three concerts, two for adults and one for students separately.

He would take the audience far away in the bygone days of the famous classical musicians by narrating their lives before reciting any of their numbers.

Tagging is where the fish is brought to the side of the boat by the angler and a tag is then inserted near to the dorsal fin, the hook is taken out of the fish's mouth and it is released to go on its way.

This has become a common practice in certificates of those fortunate enough to bring one of the big ones to the side of the boat.

August, September and October are the months when large schools of Yellowfin

Tuna are running through the Channel.

Fish have been in the 30 kg range with one or two exceptionally large ones around.

It has been a ladies week at the Pemba Channel Fishing Club this week. Herman Ruijsenaars, fishing with his young family, had a very exciting week's fishing.

His ten year old daughter, Hazel, brought in a 115 3/4 lb Karambesi.

This huge fish was only 2 lb off the Ladies World Record! 12 year old Karl Ruijsenaars brought in a 110 Striped Marlin totally unaided for his first game fish ever!

The fishing gene lives on! 18 year old Lucille fishing off one of the new Bertrams caught a 162 1/2 lb Yellowfin Tuna to equal the Kenya Ladies Record.

This too was her first time ever out fishing.

She has become a meek housewife expected to have the meals on the table at the same time every night and to never vary the menu!

When Jane, her 'best mate' offers Shirley the opportunity of going to Greece, she finally accepts the offer but fails to tell her husband of her decision.

This is a very demanding play.

Not only because it is for one person and there are so many lines to learn but also because "Shirley" plays about 10 different characters, each with a different accent.

Jean Koch has studied her lines with a desire for perfection.

one month.

deformities. The organisation carries out reconstructive surgery and related health care to young patients with cleft lip and palate malformations in the main - to children and young adults in developing countries and the United States.

Its activities spread as far afield as China and Kenya, as over the last 14 years 'Operation Smile' has grown from one site in the Philippines to 23 sites in 12 countries.

The Operation brings together volunteer plastic surgeons and a cross section of medical professionals from the public and private sectors, and finances are obtained purely through donations.

It also provides education and training for physicians and other health professionals to achieve long term sufficiency.

Said Mr. Chande 'we consider Mombasa to be ideal for such conference enabling participants to enjoy a holiday with their wives and children'.

While Freemasons were busy enhancing their knowledge, the Masonic ladies of Mombasa kept their wives and children busy.

It included a visit to Bombolulu - the first workshop for the physically handicapped to be established at the Coast which is growing from strength to strength, an added attraction being a Cultural Centre with traditional homesteads of the Kenya people.

They are also symbolic of promises made.

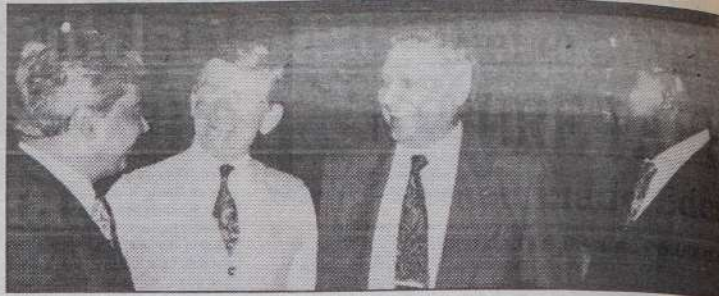

Tricky Business As Divecon Underwater Experts Lay Electrical Sub-Marine Cable

I MENTIONED in this column a couple of weeks ago, that Divecon were in the process increasing the quality of life for those of us who live on the North or South Coasts.

Divecon not only do 'it' deeper but they do 'it' longer too.

The KPLC commissioned two new sub-marine electric cables, the one starting from Mama Ngina Drive on the Island and crossing over to

Likoni, and other from Fort Jesus across to English Point.

The two cables, were 700 mts in length and weighted just under 9 tons each were loaded onto the Divecon Heavy Lift Barge *Marifa* and prepositioned at the two locations.

Basically, the operation progressed as follows; the outer end of the cable was fixed ashore and then the barge steered by two Divecon tug and tenders was gradually towed across the channel to the other side, with the cable being methodically spooled off the reel.

Once the convoy had reached the other side, the inner end of the cable was then passed ashore for connection to the grid, and as confucious once said:

"Many hands make Sittima work".

Sounds simple, I know, but it isn't.

Believe me there was a lot of preparatory work necessary beforehand, and not only that, but the actual crossing is not without its potential difficulties.

The cable has to be spooled out 'just so' other wise there is risk of it turning upon itself on the bottom, water depth, in some spots sixty meters, allowed the drivers only five minutes of 'button time'.

But then having said that, the preparation and execution, in keeping with Divecon standards of professionalism, went without a hitch.

Let's just hope there's enough of those little charlies to push through the lines to make your lives brighted at

the 'Focal Point'.
The very efficient organiser of beach cleaning on the south coast is **Clement Kiragu**, Resident Manager, **Safari Beach Hotel** who has taken over from **Raymond Matiba**, the hotel's General Manager, who is on leave.

He said, 'volunteers will be cleaning some 80 kms from Likoni to Shimoni'.

The **Kenya Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers** are very much to the forefront and, said Clement 'we also have a strong backing from the **Likoni and South Coast Residents' Association** which has agreed to help'.

Mainly retired people they will be responsible for beach cleaning between **Trade Winds Hotel** and **Robinson Club Baobab** (most reside in that area) while hotel staff will be cleaning beaches from **Robinson Club Baobab** to Shimoni. School children will assist at Shimoni.

Meanwhile, **Chale Island Paradise** has assumed responsibility for some 6-7 kms between 'G' South and Chale Island involving around fifty of its staff.

Hoteliers on the south coast will be providing 'soft' drinks and looking after transport of 'volunteers'.

Muthaiga Mini Market at Diani is helping with the provision of plastic garbage bags.

Such is the enthusiasm in this area that a Road Cleaning exercise is also planned.

The north coast area stretches from Malindi to Mombasa's English Point with co-ordinators for each demarcated portion.

Malindi's very active '**Green the Town**' movement will be organising a clean up of the whole town, while **Heien Curtis** is co-ordinating the **Watumu** area.

Here is again hoteliers on the north coast are to the forefront in providing staff, also soft drinks, pencils and plastic bags to put the rubbish in.

Co-ordinator for the Jumba Ruins area is **Robert Jessop**, while **Danny Haller** is responsible for **Bamburi Beach**.

As far as **Shanzu** is concerned there has been a very good and quick response from **Mombasa Inter-Continental Resort**.

Said **David Olendo**, Environmental Education Officer, **Baobab Trust** who is chairman of the Beach Clean Up Co-ordinating committee for the Kenya coast last year we had 774 volunteers who collected 4.2 tonnes of rubbish in 3 1/2 hours.

We hope their numbers will double and the amount of garbage collected trebled.

The response so far 'he said' 'as been quite good with the **Kenya Ports Authority** and **Arclays Bank** responding to our appeal for funds.

But 'he added 'more is needed' 'we shall be giving 'volunteers' (if provided for by hotels) a soft ink.

Funds are also needed for their transport, tools for debris cleaning and for the printing of 'Certificate of Participation'.

AWARENESS

This is the fourth year for the Kenya Coast to participate in this annual International Coastal Clean-up, the aim of which is to create a public awareness about the general state of the oceans, beach and coastlines.

A major source of marine pollution are ocean going ships who deposit their waste into international waters, as well as

spills from oil tankers.

Specific information as to type and possible source of the inorganic garbage collected is recorded by each team.

This is compiled by **Baobab Trust** for use by the Centre for Marine Conservation.

It is an international study to find solutions to ending the serious marine debris problem facing all coastlines and waterways worldwide.

Already mooted is a suggestion that it should be mandatory for ocean going ships to declare how their rubbish is disposed of.

These days some carry special bins in which to store garbage until it can be disposed of at the next port of call.

Mr. Olendo also revealed that a few hotels in America have adopted same beaches and are responsible for their cleanliness throughout the year.

He feels this could perhaps be emulated here if hotels could be discouraged from burning seaweed which, he explained 'is not a good idea'.

Meanwhile, a much needed clean-up of the Mackinnon Market area is planned for Sunday, September 28, this falling within **World Tourism Week**.

Thousands of tourists visit it as part of a city tour.

Unfortunately, its cleanliness today leaves a lot to be desired and it has become an eyesore instead of the very attractive area of former years.

Volunteers will be coming from the tourist trade as well as **Retract Clubs**.

Others who would like to participate are invited. Work commences at nine in the morning.

This clean-up follows the **World Tourism Week Street Parade** in Mombasa the previous day (September 28).

Zul Harunani, an Executive Member, Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association, heads the 'Beautify Mombasa Town' sub-committee which is not only organising the Mackinnon Market area clean-up but a seminar at **Polana Hotel** on Sept. 13.

Invited are shopkeepers and other business people to discuss how best they can beautify their respective areas and to give an actual commitment to help.

Priority is being given to **Moi Avenue** and its surrounds - this being considered a prime tourist area because of its famous **Task Arches**.

Invited to address the seminar are the Provincial Commissioner, Coast, **Peter Killu**, Provincial Police Officer, **F. N. Gichuki**, the Mayor of Mombasa, **Coun. Ahmed Mwidani** and a prominent businessman, **Yusuf Mamujee**, who will speak about Mombasa 'past and present'.

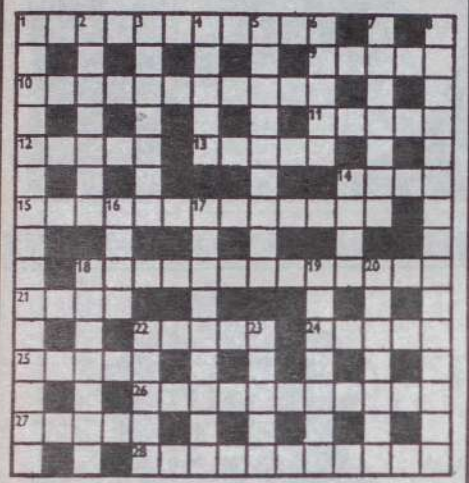

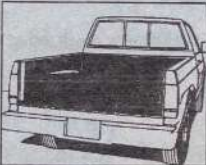

HOW MANY CALORIES DID I BURN TODAY ... ?

IF YOU work out in a Gym the chances are you have tried a stairstepper.

The current models are well known for providing a vigorous sweat producing workout - but are you burning as many calories as it says you are ?

Some of the older models tended to overestimate the amount of calories burnt so the newer models have taken this discrepancy into account.

Were the changes effective ? Researchers at Illinois State University set out to evaluate the accuracy of stairstepper machines and found that all new approximate the users stepping depth rate assuming that everyone step depth is

equal.

If you have ever watched people in a bank of stairstepper you will soon see that everyone's step depth and step rate fluctuate greatly during the workout.

In a control, where 28 individuals completed three sessions on a stairstepper at depths of three, six and nine inches at intensity level five, the stairsteppers were accurate to within five percent.

As a matter of interest, heart rate measurement were higher at depths of three and nine inches as compared to a depth of six inches.

Total calorie expenditure however was comparable regardless to step depth.
