## Eagle Aviation Fly Into 'Jomo Kenyatta'

**EAGLE AVIATION**, one of Kenya's leading aviation companies has been allowed to operate domestic schedule flights into and out of Jomo Kenyatta International Airport - becoming Kenya's first non-designate airlines to be granted such rights by Board the Civil Aviation Board.

**Special Report By Correspondent**

Capt. Kibe said the move was necessitated by pressure from the company's clientele and the need to cut down on extra costs incurred while transferring passengers from Nairobi's Wilson Airport to connect International flights at JKIA which handles up to 80 per cent of Kenya's air passengers.

The national carrier do not fly to Lamu. Under the same agreement passengers either of the two airlines can be transferred into the other in case of overbooking by endorsing the same tickets.

The airline also operates Coach Services to Kilimanjaro from Mombasa three times a week.

The airline has a fleet of seven aircraft's one ATR 42 - 320, two Let L - 410A.

**Eagle Aviation**, which has been operating a scheduled Mombasa-Nairobi flight out of Wilson Airport,

is rapidly setting the standard for quality service in the domestic market and has thus earned a reputation of excellence. The fleet is expected to expand no later for growing demands on the route network.

The Company's Chairman **Captain Gilbert Kibe** said the airline will make its inaugural schedule flight out of JKIA Monday October 7, 1996 by its ATR 42 the Company's new generation high technology aircraft purchased from France last year.

The airline also aims at tapping on the large number of European tourists arriving in Mombasa by charter flights but would prefer starting their safari from Nairobi.

At the same time, **Eagle Aviation** will increase its schedule flights return Mombasa Nairobi flights two to three flights daily.

The ATR 42, used by the airline on the scheduled flights has an optimum capability of flying eight hours a day throughout the year.

"This means the aircraft can comfortably do four return daily flights between Mombasa and Nairobi", said Capt. Kibe.

### MAINTENANCE

He said the Company recently hired highly qualified aviation engineers to service its fleet in "A progressive maintenance schedule".

**Eagle Aviation** formed in 1986, by three youthful local pilots got into an Interline Agreement with **Kenya Airways** two years ago whereby the national carriers passengers can book flights to the historic Lamu Islands from any of their destinations around the world and be freighted by **Eagle Aviation**, from Nairobi or Mombasa.



# Tanzanian Boats Try Their Luck In Slow Start To The Kenyan Fishing Season

WELL the fishing season has started. Unfortunately nobody told the fish!

Last weekend the first competition of the year, 'The Tuna Hunt', was held at Shimoni from the beautiful Pemba Channel Fishing Club.

Two dozen boats entered, which is one of the biggest entries for years and from those only seven boats scored points in two days.

No Tuna of point scoring size were caught and in fact only a dozen point scoring fish were

boated.

Three Striped Marlin were 'tagged' but the most notable catch of the weekend was a Coral Head which I caught and released from 'Jim Gin'.

Notable, in that after we released it Nick 'The Vet' fishing 'Adnan II' caught it again!

Both of us had to send a diver down to retrieve our Rapala and from their description it was definitely the same head!

This Coral was slow to learn for on the Sunday it was again hooked, this time by one of the three Tanzanian boats which came up for the competition.

Young Jason Alexio fishing on the big Dar registered catamaran, 'Pollyanna' hooked into big King fish which took a powerful run into the shallows.

As the fish passed 'our' Coral head the back hook of the Rapala snagged and stopped the fish dead.

Jason, in desperation, put full 'drag' on the reel and pulled with all his strength.

Luckily the line held as the hook straightened and up came his fish which was to put 'Pollyanna' into third place overall.

It was good to see 'Pollyanna' up here again as she fished this competition a few years back as a new boat and Foxy, her skipper and owner is also well known to many of us.

She still looks good and was one of the fastest boats out of the channel at the start.

Also up from Dar was 'Kelly II' with David Sutton on board as skipper.

Many of you will know David from his involvement with the 'Little Theatre Club' and many have seen the production he put on here earlier this year with the help of his team from the 'Dar L.T.C.'

This was David's first big trip with 'Kelly II' and unfortunately he had one gearbox fail before he reached Pemba on the way up.

Still they decided to continue and did not even get a coral head!

Then on arrival back at the Club on Sunday he had just dropped anchor when his second motor gave up.

This forced him to leave the boat here and travel back to Dar by road.

In spite of all this he enjoyed the competition so much that he is coming back next year ... that is dedication for you!

Also from Tanzania, 'Chinook II' a 32 ft. twin outboard powered catamaran came up from Zanzibar.

They had a charter which cancelled at the last minute but owner, Peter Finley and his wife decided to come anyway and fish the comp. with only the two of them on board.

Probably the most exciting moment of the weekend was late Saturday afternoon with almost no fish caught among the fleet and when first position could go to anyone.

'Broadbill', the slowest boat in the competition got a 'double strike' of what they thought was Sailfish, after a few minutes fight they got the first up to the boat and tagged a Striped Marlin!

Then captain Pat Hemphill, in his own words, 'backed his boat up onto the second Marlin faster than the boat had ever moved before'.

They tagged that one as well and then started the 'dash' back to Shimoni against the clock.

Pat, who knows the waters

around Shimoni better than any one, cut the corner into the Shimoni Channel with inches to spare and came at full power to the line leaving a cloud of black smoke in his wake.

He crossed the finish with less than two minutes to spare and those two fishes put him in an unbeatable first position.

Through the two days several Striped Marlin and a couple of Blacks were raised but the only other one to be bought up to the boat was 'White Bear' and that, together with a Falusi and a giant Trevall put them in second place.

'Pollyanna' came third with two King fish.

Nick 'The Vet' also got a strip but the hook fell out when the fish was within tagging distance of the boat.

Apart from the fishing the weekend was a great success with much to much excellent food and plenty of very cold beer.

It was also good to see another very pretty face behind the Club bar which kept more than one 'bachelor' propping it (the bar) up for many hours.

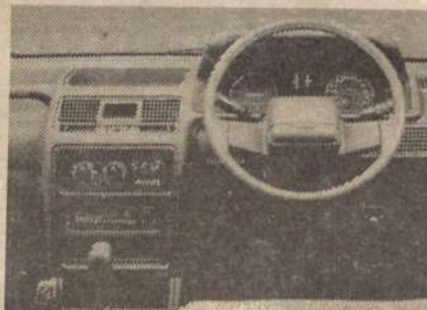

AT LAST the 'big bang' that we have all been waiting for has happened.

The Demolition Derby on the New Nyalil bridge's old toll station has begun in earnest.

In an earlier article, I reported Kachumbari's concern over abandoned structures that were left unattended when their purpose had expired. This old toll gate was one of them.

There have been accidents occasioned by too many vehicles trying to get into an empty lane when confronted by slow moving traffic.

The traffic choke that is the toll booth is not really necessary.

It should be taken down rather than left to be a potential death trap.

How about the one on the New Mtwapa bridge ?

The toll collection place is no longer being used, just as in the case of Nyalil yet the structure is still standing proud, waiting for some unfortunate motorist to begin the demolition process at risk to their own lives.

There are many more scattered across the country which were just abandoned once the authorities realised that they were a very inefficient way of collecting revenue from the public but an extremely efficient way of making rich men out of toll collectors.

But it is not only roads, it is our infrastructure.

Everywhere you look things are falling apart.

The roads, the public amenities, council housing, the housing where the boys in blue spend their off hours and even the 'matatus' are looking more and more dilapidated as the supply becomes primarily second hand vehicles ex the Dubai car mortuary.

Recently there has been talk of starting projects to make our coastal town more presentable to the tourist (and hopefully equally concerned wanchi).

As a one off to mark an occasion it is fine but is it sustainable? The council has re-carpeted the roads to such an extent that the roadside kerbs are at the same height as the road surface in most parts of the town.

This means that everything that is left on the road or created by the roads will find its way onto the pavements.

In addition, the central reserves on the road have ceased to be flower beds and are now serving as free parking.

Whatever flower boxes were put up have been demolished by reckless drivers or left with gaping holes in the wall that all the soil is washed out.

The concrete boxes also serve a different purpose.

It is where the lazy town cleaning gang put all the soil they collect from the street instead of disposing of it in the right place.

Your Mr. or Ms. Average also contributes to the mess.

They will not look for a place to put their rubbish (there is none anyhow) so they just throw whatever rubbish they have onto the nearest bit of street that isn't occupied by the kerb side hawkers.

Even if one were to provide dustbins and other similar receptacles for rubbish and recyclable material, the average man on the street will still continue to litter the streets.

The very vein of our society is affected in a similar way and it will take a Herculean effort to try and maintain a sustainable level of cleanliness and tidiness in this town.

The kiosk owners have to be mobilised to take pride in their temporarily occupied patch.

The shoe repair man and newspaper vendor has to have ownership of the little piece of pavement that forms their trading headquarters.

The street cleaner must be motivated enough to make him realise that he does have an important role to play in life ... that he is not at the bottom of the pecking order.

Der Hafen von Mombasa, der größte und wichtigste in Ostafrika, ist gut ausgerüstet, um die Kreuzfahrtpassagiere zu empfangen, die auf der Suche nach Sonne und Abenteuer diesen Teil des Indischen Ozeans aufsuchen.

In historischer Hinsicht ist Mombasa die älteste Hafenstadt in Ostafrika.

Aus diesem Grunde findet man hier verschiedene östliche und westliche Baustile und Kulturen aus früheren und modernen Zeiten in einer interessanten bunten Mischung, wie sie sonst auf der Welt nur selten anzutreffen ist.

Und in den Meeres-Nationalparks kann man einen Blick in die faszinierende exotische Unterwasserwelt mit ihren bizarren Korallenformationen und bunten Tropenfischen werfen.

Die Tourismus-Infrastruktur ist im ganzen Lande gut entwickelt.

Es gibt erstklassige Hotels und Lodges, gute Straßen- und Eisen-

bahnverbindungen, zuverlässigen Post- und Büsdiens, moderne Banken und Geschäfte sowie Sportanlagen.

Kenia ist ein Land der Kontraste, vom Großen Afrikanischen Graben gleich hinter Nairobi bis zur Halbwüste im Norden; das fruchtbare Mittelland und Hochland, die Berge, Flüsse, kilometerlange Strände und 32 verschiedene Stämme.

All das bildet eine solide Grundlage für das Land, seinen Fortschritt und sein wirtschaftliches Wachstum.

Rund 18.000 Kreuzfahrtpassagiere stiegen in Mombasa während dieser Saison ein oder aus oder befanden sich im Transit.

Der Hafen von Mombasa hat zwei spezielle Liegeplätze für Kreuzfahrtschiffe und verfügt über ein gut erprobtes Programm, organisiert von einem Empfangskomitee, um diese Schiffe, die Besatzung und die Passagiere willkommen zu heißen.

Das betrifft unter anderem Lotsen, Zuteilung des Liege-

platzes, Gesundheits-, Zoll- und Einreisekontrolle sowie Lieferung von Schiffsausrüstung, Proviant, ferner Frischwasserversorgung, Sicherheit, Müllabfuhr, Reinigung, freie Trägerdienste, Taxiservice und Unterhaltung in der Form von Stammestänzen.

Wie sich herausgestellt hat, kann kein Hafen für sich allein in diesem Tourismussektor mit Erfolg arbeiten.

Eine Zusammenarbeit der Häfen ist erforderlich.

Deshalb wurde ein aus 14 Mitgliedern bestehender Hafen-Management-Verband für Ost- und Südafrika gegründet, um gegenseitig Erfahrungen auszutauschen und ein Vorgehen anzustreben.

Dazu gehören verschiedene Häfen vom Roten Meer im Norden bis zum Kap der Guten Hoffnung im Süden.

Mombasa kann davon viel profitieren. Außer Geschichte und Gastfreundschaft, die für diese Hafenstadt typisch sind, zählt als weiterer Vorteil die Lage ungefähr in der Mitte auf dem halben Weg der Schiffsroute.

Mombasas liegt als Ausgangspunkt zu den Inseln im Indischen Ozean ebenfalls sehr günstig.

Obwohl schon viel unternommen wurde, um den Kreuzfahrtschiffen und ihren Passagieren in den Häfen einen guten Empfang zu bereiten, will sich der Ausschub nicht auf den Lorbeeren ausruhen, sondern ständig weitere Verbesserungen anstreben.

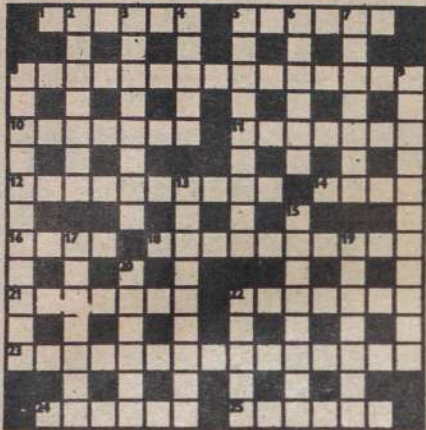

# Importance Of Saving And Creating 'Entries'

SOMETIME YOU have to play a Suit in a very strange way to solve your communication problems, as you shall see in the following hand.

Contract Three No Trumps by South. Opening Lead Queen of Hearts. Since you have no quick entry to Dummy, you can count only five winners: one Spade, two Hearts and two Clubs.

You must win four extra Tricks in Clubs unless you can create an entry to Dummy's Spade Suit.

The best line of play is to win the opening lead, cash the Ace of Spades, and lead the Jack (Knave) of Clubs.

This scheme ensures the Contract against anything but a

When you lead the Jack (Knave) of Clubs, East cannot beat you whether he wins with his Queen or not.

If he does not take the Queen, you can run the six Club tricks; if he takes the Queen, the ten of Clubs becomes an entry to those lovely Spades. All other lines of play are inferior.

If you cash the Ace and King of Clubs first and the Queen does not drop, you will be limited to eight Tricks (one Spade, two Hearts and five Clubs).

Since you have no entry to the Dummy, the Spade Suit is lost.

If you cash the Ace of Spades and then lead a low Club toward Dummy's ten, you will fail unless West has the Queen of Clubs.

If you cash the Ace of Spades, one high Club and then lead the Jack (Knave) of Clubs or a low Club, the Defender who wins with the Queen can beat you by returning a Heart.

Even if Clubs divide 2-2, you will lack the communication to win more than eight Tricks. The full hand is shown above.
