Caleb was Head of Banqueting, and also opened the Japanese Restaurant there.

He was at the Norfolk for six years.

Caleb is a very innovative chef, and some of his exclusive dishes remained on the Norfolk menu for several years.

They include a Banana Basket to accompany Impala, Lamb etc., and a Pumpkin Bisque Soup.

His winning dish in the Cooks' Competition was a Collis of Beef with creamed Paprika sauce.

Potatoes were sculpted into the shape of a pear and stuffed with spinach balls.

First prize in the Cooks' competition was a return air ticket to Johannesburg and attachment for one month to the largest hotel in that city - the Santon.

As well, while working for Lonrho he also spent six months in Zimbabwe working in all seven hotels belonging to the Zimbabwe Investment Tourism Company.

Caleb hails from Siaya District and has a brother who is 'Head of Pizza' at Nairobi's Hotel Inter-Continental.

He is also very artistic and meals at Restaurant Carneval come adorned with sculpted fruit/vegetable which include some delightful doll's slippers made from a corgette.

Caleb is presently working on a new menu for Restaurant Carneval to be introduced in October.

Great things are expected from such a very talented and innovative chef.

More Friends For The Kwale Special School

BLOCK HOTELS has been appointed honorary member of the Parents/ Teachers Association for the Kwale School for the Mentally Handicapped in recognition of their generous contributions to the institution.

The hotel chain with a dozen luxurious holiday resorts in Kenya, three in Zimbabwe and two in South Africa, has also been accorded the respected title, "Friend of Kwale School for the Mentally Handicapped" by the institution administration, said Mrs. Teresia Maina, the Headmistress. Mrs. Maina disclosed this at a Parents/Teachers Association Meeting at the school last Friday. Block Hotels was represented at the meeting by Shimba Hills Tree Lodge Manager Augustus Marubu and Sales Executive Beatrice Ongalo.

"The support Block Hotels has given us is immense and we feel indebted to make the hotel chain one of us in the development programme of this institution", said Mrs. Maina after accepting an assortment of linen, cutlery and refreshments donated by the hotel chain to the school.

Presenting the donation, Mr. Marubu who was representing Block Hotels Area Manager for Coast, Mr. John Mutua, said plans were underway to take the children for excursions in the Shimba Hills National Game Reserve.

He said the group would be assisting the school annually as it valued the handicapped people and wanted to make them feel as valuable as other members of the society.

The hotel chain in 1994 donated a water tank to the school, and later sofa sets, linen and other things.

Mrs. Maina said the school needs help from hotel establishments and other investors neighbouring it to maintain its current programmes and establish a Cerebral Palsy section.

She lamented that some parents were now unable to keep their children at the school after the Kwale County Council introduced a fee of Shs. 20 per month for each child. Already 20 children have been withdrawn.

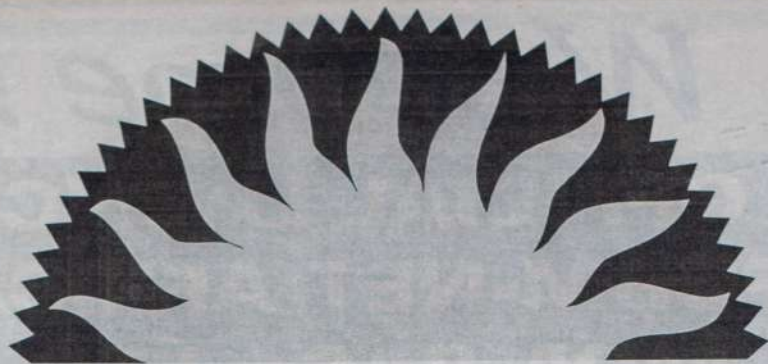

BLINDNESS IN Kenya is ten times more common than blindness in the Western World.

This is due in part to a lower standard of living conditions and different diseases, but mostly the divide is due to lack of affordable, accessible eye care.

In the Developing World 80 per cent of blind people suffer from conditions which are avoidable in that their disease could either have been prevented by early detection and treatment, or it could be corrected surgically.

The most common building condition is cataract.

The treatment and cure is by surgery.

On the South Coast of Kenya, a Charitable, Self Help Group has been formed called Kwale District

KWALE CENTRE CURES BLINDNESS

Eye Centre.

Kwale District is an area of 8,608 sq. km on the Southern Coast.

It is largely rural and travel off the few main roads is difficult.

The Kwale District Eye Centre, is located 11 km South of Mombasa at Magandia just off the main road.

The centre opened in October 1993 and consisted of a single room and a small reception area on a one acre plot.

This single room catered as both an eye clinic for the out patients and as theatre for surgery.

In the first year, 650 eye patients were treated and 50 operations carried out.

The initial staff were an Ophthalmologist, an partnership with the Christoffel-Blindenmission

and has a development worker from the Irish Agency for Personal Overseas.

In 1994 the existing building was

extended to include a modern operating theatre and sterilising room, office, dehumidified store and wash up area.

Running well-water was connected.

This badly-needed extension allows a separate area for surgery with much improved conditions for sterility and patient comfort.

In the second year of existence both out patient attendance and surgical procedures have doubled in number.

The most recent advance has been the implementation of a Community Based Rehabilitation

Programme, began in April 1995.

This was instigated because of the need to teach people that visual disability is avoidable.

The Centre has recruited an Ophthalmic Medical Assistant who works in the field promoting awareness of eye disability and referring those in need to the Eye Centre.

This programme continues to develop and will shortly expand into the very inaccessible areas of the District where no Eye Care is available.

Transport is urgently required for this development.

Funds are also sought to erect an In-patients Hostel to provide accommodation for patients.

Construction of this began on April 12th 1996 and completion is anticipated in November.

This will enable us to offer 24 hour care to our patients, especially important for those undergoing surgery and those who have long distances to travel.

This area will double as a refraction room during the day. Kwale District Eye Centre is a charitable project.

Patients pay a nominal fee. These charges are reduced or waived in cases of real need through the existence of a 'Poor Patients' Fund.

Hence the Kwale District Eye Centre is in need of a continual income.

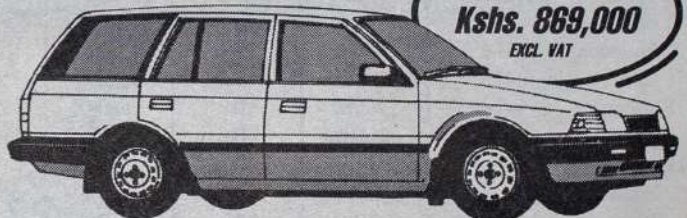

After Watamu confirmed that Charlie was still registered, Peponi's sent their weigh scales by boat to Lamu. Airstrip and got it onto a K.W.S. light aircraft which flew it up to Kwayu Island Strip.

There the camp staff got it down to the beach to weigh in what is being claimed as a new 'Kenya' and 'All Africa' record Sailfish caught on 12 lbs. 'Tipplet'.

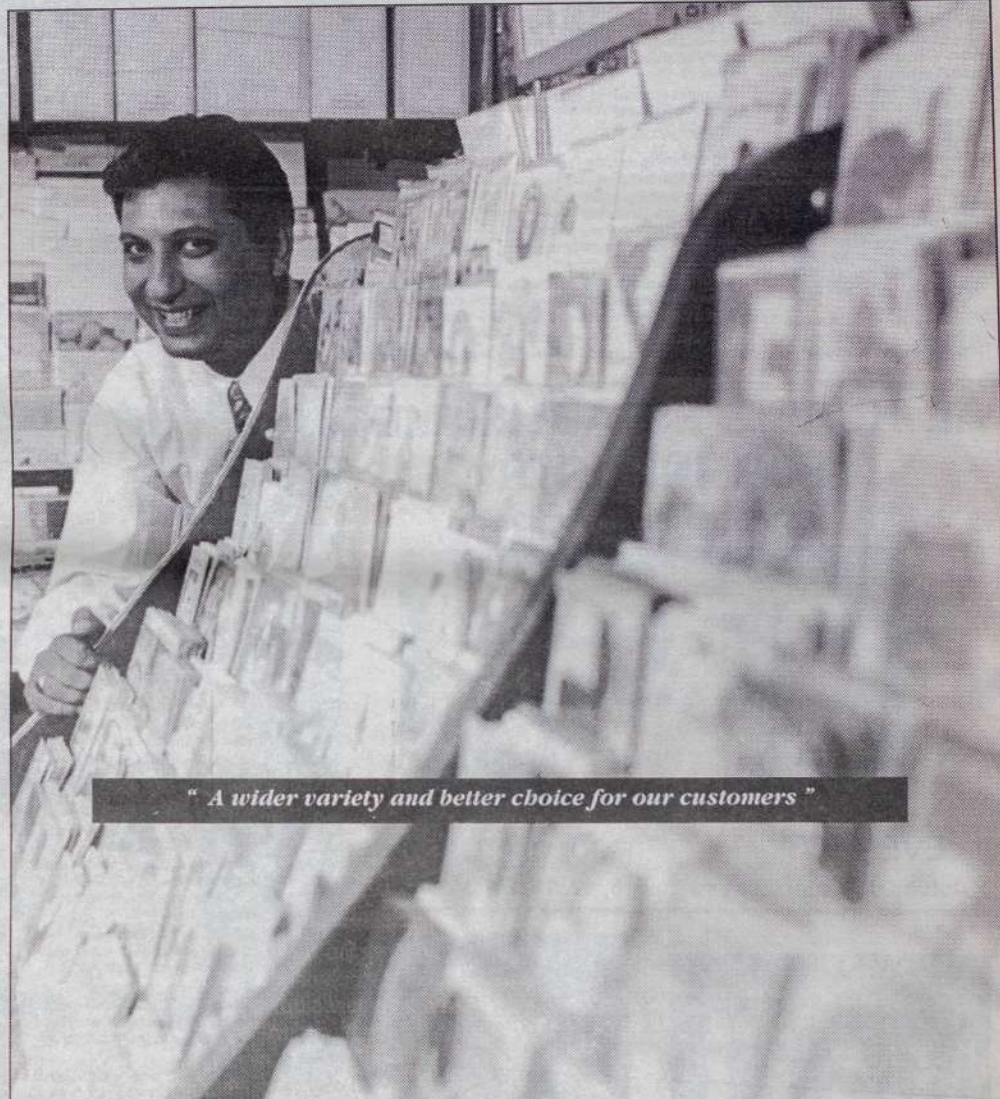

I DON'T KNOW HOW many of you remember that song: "They've Got An Awful Lot Of Coffee In Brazil ..." ?

Well, if you are going to sing anything about the United Arab Emirates, the lyrics would go something like:

"They've Got An Awful Lot Of Money In Dubai!"

To a fourth-world visitor arriving from Mombasa everything seems incredibly rich, lavish, well-organised and new.

The indigenous people are similarly impressive:

The well-educated, healthy, and highly paid men and women executives running the local bureaucracy give out an aura of modern efficiency coupled with an old-world courtesy and charm...

A delightful surprise from the desert!

TOGETHER with several other Kenyan journalists I was earlier this month fortunate to spend a whole week in Dubai, visiting the places and meeting the people.

Elsewhere, and to co-incide with next week's four-day DUBAI EXPO being hosted by the Dubai Commerce and Tourism Promotion Board at the Kenyatta Conference Centre, Nairobi, you can learn up on the 'hard facts' of Dubai.

In order not to overwhelm readers with a list of superlative statistics I thought that, for a change, why not actually write in 'letter' format - giving a few personal observations, passing on some harmless gossip and maybe a small bit of politics!

So, hold onto your seats and to begin at the beginning:

Which brings us not to Dubai, but to Germany in September where I spent a memorable evening in the company of Dr Peter Rudhart, an international economist and director of a large German multinational firm.

He has been very active in promoting the rehabilitation of business and industry in the former East Germany, and it was while discussing the once acclaimed 'German Economic Miracle' of the 1950s that he revealed:

"There are only three words that really matter in any country's economic development".

(Here I had to think hard - thoughts of the 'Marshall Plan'? A stable currency? A dedicated and skilled work force? Large domestic market?)

Of course (you have guessed?) the three words are:

"Infrastructure!"

"Infrastructure!"

"Infrastructure!"

Which, among other items, includes uninterrupted power supplies, clean water, proper communications, security and stable Government.

"Once you have the 'Infrastructure' in place everything else just follows."

West Germany prospered because of its excellent 'Infra-

structure", as will the new united Germany, when the East finally has its own 'Infrastructure' in place.

BACK IN DUBAI the 'Infrastructure' is quite simply superb: six lane highways, an ultra-modern airport, an outstanding Port, huge Dry-dock and the 'Jebel Ali Free Zone'.

This didn't happen overnight.

It took years of planning, budgeting, conserving and foresight, and there is a very interesting side-light on all of this ... much of the cement for this monumental construction came from our own Bamburi Portland complex near Mombasa.

Indeed, throughout the Gulf area, during the time of the Suez Canal closure (1966-1978) Bamburi cement was exported to numerous projects building up the 'Infrastructure'.

Oil (revenue) has been very helpful, but it is the key to Dubai's success - the emphasis in all Government planning has consistently been on proper 'Infrastructure', and it really has paid off many times over.

(Nigeria is similarly blessed with vast oil revenues, but obviously the investment priorities of the long-standing Military regimes have not been on infrastructure.)

IN MANY WAYS DUBAI is a second-world nation with a first world appetite.

There is no democracy, but many people seem perfectly happy with the benevolent autocracy of the ruling family, who are careful to give a tolerant audience to a wide spectrum of local opinion.

The average annual per capita income hovers around US\$16,000 (in neighbouring Abu Dhabi it soars to nearly US\$18,000).

There is free education, free medical, no income tax and ready employment for all citizens.

A lowly traffic policeman is paid close to K Shs. 100,000 a month, with housing, transport, easy loan opportunities and generous holiday benefits.

Officially women are encouraged to join the work force, but there is the familiar 'glass ceiling' and patriotic ladies are directed by a coercive culture to marry young and produce at least eight or nine offspring.

We managed to speak with a senior Government economist about the 'demographics' of Dubai and he pointed out:

"As we are a small country with large neighbours we need more of our own people".

(Anyone who has seen the recent issue of 'National Geographic' magazine showing aerial views of Mexico City will appreciate how

misguided and myopic the viewpoint - with people, it's always 'quality' and not 'quantity' which counts).

ABSOLUTELY AMAZING is the 'Gold Souk' - half a square kilometre of garishly lit bazaar and corridors devoted to Gold, Gold, and Gold ... plus a few million 'mega-carat diamonds and platinum encrusted jewels'.

'Aladdin's Cave' would look positively shop-soiled in comparison!

From all over the world serious savers pack into the narrow lanes gazing at the dazzling displays.

(One very heavy 'wedding set' of rings, amulets, nose and ear ornaments, and necklaces that I was allowed to fondle in the privacy of the security office cost a mere \$ U.S. 45,000!)

All artifacts are guaranteed 'genuine'.

Security is minimal and of the non-invasive kind.

The prices are unbeatable, the craftsmanship unlimited (there are pieces from Italy, Afghanistan, Holland and the United States) and the atmosphere electric!

Not the sort of place to let your lover run wild with a Credit Card.

DURING AUGUST in Mombasa I was privileged to enjoy dinner on board a visiting Greek oil tanker, the 80,000-ton M.V. 'Atlas'.

What seemed impressive at the time was the sheer size of the vessel - there was even a half-kilometre 'jogging track' marked out in yellow paint around the ship's deck.

While touring the Dubai Dry Dock we came across the world's largest oil tanker, the 570,000-ton 'Jahre Viking' (previously registered as the 'Seawise Giant').

As that dizzy demagogue from Iraq might describe it:

"This is the Mother of all ships ... Colossal. Twelve stories high. Just over 460 metres long."

Out of ballast and about to enter the dry-dock for a ten day 'scrape-and-paint' job she seemed like an enormous steel bubble dwarfing the two 'smaller' 320,000-ton VLCCs on her port and starboard. She's so BIG: you might believe that they could hold the entire 'Olympic Games' (complete with Marathon Run) on her decks - forget about 'jogging tracks'!

THEY HAVE TWO enormous 'stand-by' electric generators at the Dubai Port.

One is run for a short while every other alternate week, just to keep them 'tight and ready'.

We asked: "Have you ever experienced a power cut, here?"

The foreman scratched his head: "No, not in my time, ever. But I heard there was a break of eleven seconds way back in 1983."

DUBAI CITY itself is very clean, very organised and very modern.

The buildings are designed to welcome people 'in' and keep the ever present heat 'out'.

Some of them soar right up into the haze, covered with smoked glass that scintillates in the sun.

Parts of this teeming metropolis could be taken as sections of a city from North America or Scandinavia.

But it often reminds one of a new 'Legoland', only built with large blocks.

The landscaping (done in desert conditions) looks very much like an orderly architect's 'impression' - a veritable 'monoculture' comprising four hundred units of plant No. 32 spaced four metres apart on a quadrant etc.

("Why not a clump here of three or four No.s 17, a couple of No.s 11 and 23, miss a line over there, add in some more No.s 14 over here?")

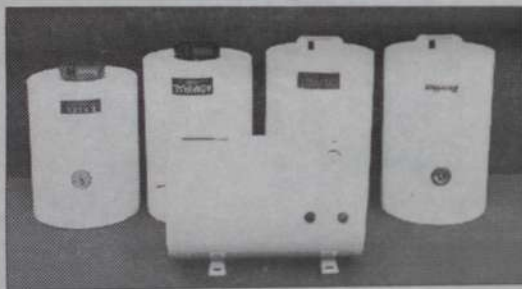
It's perfect. It's not beautiful. They really need the talents of someone like Bamburi's Dr. Rene Haller to advise them on this.

THE OLD PORT is sheer magic.

Full of the sights and sounds of Arabian Dhows, Iranian Sambuks and myriad of smaller trading vessels working their way around the Gulf.

There are also the smaller shops selling traditional foods (including dried, black limes ... used for

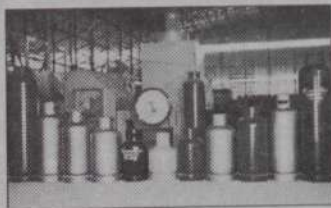

flavouring meat casseroles.)
Best way to see this still ancient harbour is on a tourist 'Dhow Safari' - which is similar in many ways to the Mombasa or Mtwapa equivalent, but very different in its atmosphere.

An evening cruise has the added excitement of all the 'lights' on the waterway and the outstanding array of advertising displays, which go on kilometre after kilometre in almost hypnotic neon arrangements (Move over, Las Vegas!)

STAYING AT the six-star 'Hyatt Regency Hotel' provides an immediate and certain social status ...

There are two bright red Ferraris, several Mercs, a powder blue Rolls, BMW and the new Jaguar parked outside the entrance.

The hotel has its own 'Ice Skating Rink', a marvellous revolving tower restaurant and a very warm, fresh water swimming pool.

There is also a delightful young lady public relations executive from Switzerland, who is a veritable mine of useful information.

A colleague and self were one evening over-heating in the 'steam room' (a two-metre cubicle with approx. ten centimetre 'visibility') when through the mist we sight a third familiar face.

'I know you ... you are from Kenya!' he points to us.

'We know you ... you are Somalia!' we point back.

Yes, it really was a Somalia - the charming younger brother Dinesh, who runs family operations in Dubai.

(At the 'Airport Duty Free' we hear the story come back to us:

'These guys from the Kenya Press even track down Somalia in the Steam Room ...')

TOURING THE new Airport Cargo Complex we see a 'Courtesy Card' hanging on the wall and reminding staff that they should:

- Stand Up and Smile when a Customer enters the Room,
- Always be Polite, Helpful and Honest.
- A satisfied Client is a Customer for life!

THE 25,000 square-metre state-of-the-art 'Air Cargo Village' aims at ensuring the world's fastest sea-air transfers: in fact, they quite often manage a 90-minute turn around.

Thinking of 'eels and elephants, trinkets and trumpets' we ask the Cargo Master:

'What is the most unusual consignment handled through the airport?'

Cars! Believe it or not?

There was this car dealer in Japan who received an order from Seoul, South Korea, for three hundred new LEXUS saloon cars.

There were none immediately available in Japan, so he 'sourced' the vehicles in Dubai, purchased an entire ware house and then over a period of days flew them 'Air Cargo' direct to Seoul.

NIGHTLIFE included a boozy visit to 'Biggles' the Airport Staff Bar (where we acquired the obligatory T-shirt declaiming: 'I got bombed at Biggles in Dubai ...')

Also the 'Forty Niners' Club at the 'Sands Hotel'.

Do you remember that bar at the end of the universe' in the Stars Wars film - the scene where Luke Skywalker mixes it up with alien entities?

Same feeling: Expensive after shave, designer fashions no one

older than 27, and what variety - I met my first Azerbaijani here, not to mention Namibians, Japanese, Brazilians and the regular rote of European 'yummies' (young upto midnight?)

Fast and furious: Live Band, loud music, g-t-e-a-t steaks, Perrier water and draught Guinness.

TALKING with Dubai Airport officials we are informed that for many years Dubai has promoted an 'Open Skies' policy which has resulted in over 70 airlines operating out to more than 100 cities.

'Kenya Airways can fly here five times a day if they want ... there are no restrictions or limitations'.

Wonderful! Just imagine Kenya with an 'Open Skies' Policy?

YOU MUST visit the 'Aquarium'.

This restaurant with a difference - that being the 'Aquarium'!

If you can imagine a huge 'tumbler' or drinking glass, made of safety glass and say five metres across and two storeys high?

The first two metres of the bottom of the 'Aquarium' make up the ceiling of the down stairs bar.

You can drink and look up at the remarkable collection of stunning tropical fish.

The next floor up, the main dining room, is the same 'Aquarium', just a huge round tube coming up through the floor and passing into the ceiling ...

And one more floor up you can gaze into the open tank top.

It's a feat of technical engineering, a work of art and an extraordinary look into the underwater world as inside they have also placed a complete 'coral head' which hangs

down through the three floors!

THEY ARE very keen on racing and sport in Dubai - from million dollar horse races through to power boats, camel derby and falconry.

Travelling 'Business Class' Nairobi-Dubai return was quite exceptional for the comfort, service, hospitality and in-flight entertainment.

We queried: 'How can Emirates' 'First Class' be possibly any better than 'Business Class'?

The reply: 'Well, the seats are a bit larger and wider ... and you can choose your own videos.'

IF YOU HAVE a Kenya Passport you will require a 'Visa' to enter Dubai.

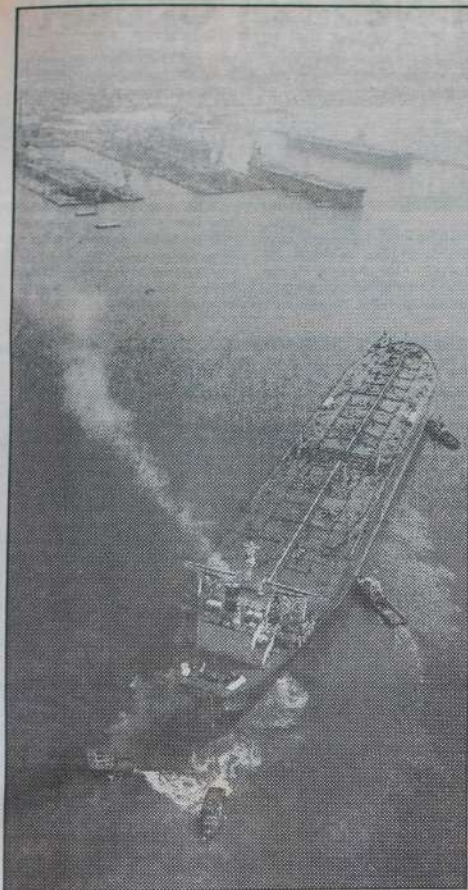
(I was one of the last non-Visa Kenyans allowed into Sweden this summer.
