The varied programme will include prayers, learning and chanting of hymns (kiran), lectures on Sikhism and lives of the Sikh Gurus, talks on Sikh heritage and culture, group discussion and competition.

On the lighter side there will be a cultural evening which will feature the

internationally famed Sikh dances Bhangra and Gidda, sports events, including Sikh Martial arts like Gatka and outings to places of interest in and around Mombasa,

including a ferry trip and fun on the beach and a dip in the sea.

Sports is a way of life for the Sikhs and the sports events are sure to tap the hidden potential among the youth.

This writer who associated himself with the first two camps in the 80's before emigrating to the UK is pleased to be partly associated once again with the camp once again while holidaying in Mombasa.

I am sure it is going to be a huge success and Mombasa Sikhs deserve a big congratulation for hosting it again.

Similar camps are regularly held in the UK and have become an integral part in the Sikh temples all over the country.

Well run youth camps have become powerful learning institutions for the Sikh boys and girls the world over and Mombasa Sikhs can raise their heads high for pioneering such a wonderful project in Kenya.

## Proud History Of Sikhs In Kenya

THE SIKHS first came to Kenya as railway workers almost a century ago.

After the railway project was completed many Sikhs workers returned to their mother land, Eastern Punjab but some opted to stay in Kenya.

Those who stayed set themselves up as entrepreneurs in various fields connected with their traditional and inborn skills.

As they became established they encouraged other members of their families to come to Kenya as free immigrants, thus the Sikh Community rapidly grew.

### ENTERPRISE

One of these pioneers was S. Kala Singh and so famous did he become that his name is still synonymous with the Kenyans.

He arrived in Kenya in 1896 at the age of sixteen to work at the railway.

He soon engaged himself in a trading enterprise.

He travelled far and wide and became very famous with the Kenyans, to date Africans still

refer to Sikhs as 'Kala Singhas'.

Sikhs took an active part in the struggle for freedom from the British and the Colonial Rule in Kenya.

S. Makhan Singh is still remembered as the first Honorary Secretary of Labour Trade Union.

He was also one of the spearheads in attempt to relieve Kenya from the yoke of Colonialism.

S. Jaswant Singh is another name in the African history, who was one of the sympathisers of the Mau Mau which was an anti-white section organisation.

He used to manufacture arms, ammunition and other materials.

He was arrested in 1954 and was sentenced to be hanged but later on the sentence was reduced to life imprisonment.

In the field of sports, Sikhs have also played a prominent part.

S. Joginder Singh is still loved by the Africans as a flying rally

driver.

S. Harbans Singh who is a beacon of light and a tremendous example to the younger sportsmen.

He was the President of *Sikh Union Kenya Cricket Association*.

In 1962 he was honoured for his devotion to Cricket and Hockey.

S. Makhan Singh was another sports pioneer who transplanted the seedling of India's National Game of Hockey on the virgin soil of Kenya.

He was chosen as the captain of the first non racial Kenya Hockey Team against South Africa and Rhodesia.

He was also the coach for the Kenya hockey Team for the

first time when Kenya entered the Olympics in 1956.

Today many Sikhs are well established in various fields, their branches have spread wide and far.

These include law, medicine, architecture, construction and engineering consultancy, auto trade, aeronautics, teaching, hotels, tourism, photography,

insurance and other professional areas.

The Sikhs in Kenya are represented by Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Ramgharya and Namdhari Units.

They have a network of Khalsa Schools, Guru Nanak Hospitals and clinics country wide.

The Sikhs whole heartedly believe in the President's motto of Peace, Love and Unity and the spirit of Harambee and will continue to do so.

## 'Nam Simran' - The Key to Salvation

**NAM SIMRAN**  
The Key to Salvation (Union with God)

Nam is the treasure, it is attained through God.

In Sikhism, Nam is used as the essence of God.

Nam Simran means remembering the lord's name.

The repetition of Nam by mouth, percolation of Nam into the mind and the longing for the vision and union with God.

The functions of Nam:

- ⊙ It removes Evil;
- ⊙ It gives knowledge of Truth, Beauty and Goodness;
- ⊙ It brings one in tune with the almighty.

The remembrance is in three folds: Words, Mind and Action.

One of Guru Nanak's Golden rules is Nam Japo.

Waheguru is our Gurmantar.

By repetition of the word Waheguru by mouth your speech is purified.

By hearing Waheguru with your ears your hearing is purified and by coinciding the two your mind is purified.

Bani says "Wahe guru nam Jahaz hai, Chare so ure paar" meaning, The name Waheguru is a ship and who so ever will sail on it will be taken ashore safely to his or her true home - in the laps of the almighty.

In the Mool Mantar, Guru Nanak gives a description of the attributes of God.

*Ik on Kar - There is one God; Sat Nam - He is the Truth; Karta Purakh - He is the Creator; Nirbhay - He is without fear; Nirvair - He has no enemy; Akal Moorat - He never dies; Ajuni Sahibhang - He is beyond birth and death; Gur Parshad - He is self-illuminated.*

The above gives a description of One God whom we are to worship.

From whom we have come and with whom we have to finally unite through Nam Simran.

Further Nanak Says: *Jaap - Repeat His name because: Aad Sach - He was true in the beginning; Jugad Sach - He has been true through the ages; Hai Bhi Sach - He is true now; Nanak Hosi bhi Sach - Nanak says he will always be true.*

Think for a minute - If the ultimate truth is union with God, then what is life?

Life is an illusion, a drama stage, this body is a costume which we are wearing which also leaves us when we have to go to our true home.

There is more beyond what we see and why not try to find that truth.

We are given the Human birth which is above all the 84,000,000 lives that we have left behind.

Human form is the last rung of this

ladder and through God realisation we can attain salvation from the circle of life and death and unite with the Only Truth and that is only through 'Nam Simran', or else we will again fall into



the vicious circle of 84,000,000 dreadful lives.

Being a true Sikh follow the teachings of our gurus:

- \*Wake up before sunrise (amrat wele);
- \*Bathe;
- \*Recite the Japji Sahib (or if you can recite all 5 banis);
- \*Recite the good name of Waheguru with full concentration i.e. speaking with your mouth and hearing with your ears and overcoming the worldly desires or our mind which is running at all the times in all the directions.

Controlling the mind is the greatest

achievement as Bani says "Man Jeet te Jag Jeet", meaning "If you win your own mind then you win the world".

A look at some of our Gurus' lives: Guru Nanak: As a child while playing he sang hymns with his playmates.

At the Modi Khanna he counted upto 13 (teran) and he remembered tera (yours) - "Oh God, nothing is mine, everything is yours." "Mera muj meh kich nahi, jo kich hai so tera".

Guru Arjun Dev: The first Sikh martyr, even while sitting on the red hot griddle and burning sand being poured over him did not groan because his mind was attached with God, he was repeating the Holy Nam through the period of torture.

Result: A man who realizes God and obtains unity with him loves the will of God, he does not question God that why this is happening to him because "he takes it as the will of God".

"Tera kia mita logeh har naam padarth Nanak magesh".

For him joy and sorrow, gold and dust, nectar or poison are alike.

He is absorbed in the name of God that he forgets his worries and worldly entanglements and attains everlasting happiness.

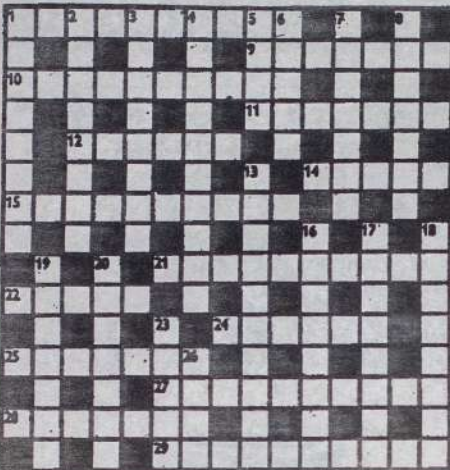

# PITY THE POOR MATATU DRIVERS - SOMETIMES!

THE OTHER DAY Kachumbari witnessed the kind of treatment meted out to 'matatu' drivers and touts when the boys in blue are carrying out their regular raids on non-compliance to traffic regulations.

Some are quite firm and efficient in going about their duties but others treat the matatu men as though they have a hidden agenda.

Kachumbari spoke to some of the matatu drivers during one such swoop recently when the objective of the cops was to ensure that the 'matatus' had no music systems that were capable of producing loud music.

It would appear that the degree of force used is directly proportional to the area where the cop's regular beat is.

During such swoops, a lot of cops are moved from their regular beat to reinforce the strength in the area of operation.

The contingent has to move from one area to another to try and catch as many vehicles as they can since the matatu drivers will take alternative routes once they know where the cops are stationed.

The cop whose area the swoop is in will make the best use of the time.

They will be the loudest and most aggressive when it comes matatus that they know from a day to day basis.

By so doing, they will increase their leverage once things come back to normal.

They will come back and start taking in protection money so that during the next swoop they can be noisy and aggressive again but not really do much harm.

All the noise and bravado during the swoop only ends up with the known matatus getting a cursory glance and no further inspection.

They do not even need to take out the music systems.

They are simply covered up and when the swoop has flown by, it is back to business as usual.

The amazing thing is that there has been so much ado about the amount of music the matatus make yet very little has been done about the state of the vehicles themselves.

Music will make the passengers deaf in the long term but they have an option on choosing to travel on "quiet" matatus.

However, the state of the vehicles that Kachumbari saw being inspected for music and let off left a lot to be desired.

Most had bald tyres. The indicators and other warning lamps were either not there or tied to the body of the matatu with a bit of wire.

Windows were either missing or cracked as to be a danger to the passengers in the vehicles concerned.

The wheels on a lot of the vehicles seemed to be straining to get away from each other as they all pointed away from the

vehicle.

It left one wondering the measure of control the driver had on the vehicle.

The current crop of matatus have even gone a stage further and put all sorts of extra lights on frames that extend off the vehicle body.

Some of these lights can easily be confused with those of emergency service vehicles.

The sounds that come from the horns of these new generation matatus are such that drivers have to think twice before they react.

The sound of a chicken or the moo of a cow is unlikely to cause a driver to slam on his brakes or swerve to avoid an accident

since one would have expected to have seen the animal before reaching the spot.

A loud blast from a normal horn does elicit the right reaction from the driver.

If the boys in blue want to look for things that matatus should not have then they should start preparing a list of things that other road users would appreciate.

Kachumbari's list would include musical horns, extraneous lighting, tinted glasses, all round 'roo' bars, wheels that extend beyond the vehicle frame, excess passengers, uncouth drivers, rude 'manambas' and so forth.

The matatu is a much maligned though essential part of the

county's infrastructure.

It is better to control it rather than ban it.

In a neighbouring country, the problem of overcrowding in public transport has been sorted very simply.

Both the driver, owner and excess passengers are liable for fines should there be a case where a public service vehicle has more passengers than it is licensed to carry.

## EMPOWERED

The fine is meted out instantly since the cop on the street is empowered to enforce the issue.

Repeat offenders face even stiffer punishment including the loss of the licence to operate.

We should take a leaf from other countries that have successfully controlled such public areas.

As a country we are perhaps different in our culture and behaviour but we can't be that different from our neighbours where certain legislation has been brought in and seems to work.

Or, is it that the legislators are themselves so involved in the business that they would hesitate to mess up their own and their most supportive constituents way of earning a dishonest living?

As Kachumbari said, a bad apple, if not removed in time, will quickly cause the rest of the basket to rot!

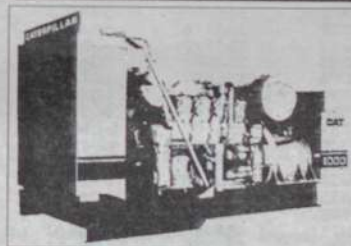
