Alliance Hotels Host Charity Fun/ Run Walk

FOR THE second year running Alliance Hotels have included in its Christmas and New Year Programme a very meaningful event to help the Diani Children's Village which offers a home and loving care to orphaned, neglected or abandoned children.

It is a Charity Fun Run/ Walk in aid of the village.

It starts from Safari Beach Hotel on Thursday, Dec. 26th at 10 am the route being along the main road to Barclays Bank and then back again.

Entry fee is 200/- per person and it is open to all irrespective of age or race.

Several refreshment points along the route have been organised, as well as an emergency back-up service and security.

The organisers are also seeking sponsorship and donations from local shops, hotels and suppliers.

Donations can include food, toys or clothing as well as money.

The Diani Homes Village was initiated and established by Yvonne Matiba, wife of Raymond Matiba, Manager Safari Beach Hotel with support from home and overseas.

It is presently home to eleven youngsters between 2-9 years of age.

They live together as one big family in a very homely atmosphere.

Next year six of the older ones will be going to school at the 'Word of Life' centre, Diani, while the smaller ones will be attending a play group/nursery school at Ukunda.

Some of the children have never been to school and some private tuitions was given to them up to the required standards to be accepted.

Situated between Ukunda and Diani Beach in a very quiet area far from town, the home which is rented - contains four bedrooms, two bathrooms, large living area and verandah and can ideally accommodate a maximum of 12 children.

It has a well with fresh water, electricity, plus telephone connection.

Diani Children's Village is run by experienced personnel and presently employs eight staff - a housemother who is with the children throughout, four assistants who work in shifts, one caretaker/gardener and two watchmen.

It would very much like to have its own premises.

Already well wishers have donated a two acre plot on which a brand new children's village designed for their particular needs can be built as soon as funds become available the intention is to expand and have children living together in separate family units in the village.

Overlooking it will be a club house with restaurant, also a well equipped fitness centre.

Planning started early 1995 and construction in July 1995.

Palms and trees for Woburn Estate's beautiful garden are six years old and come from Elly's plant nursery.

they wish.

The estate will have a stand-by generator making it self sufficient in electricity at times of power cuts, while a centralised TV system, with satellite dish, makes it possible to receive five top foreign stations.

Telephones are being installed and occupants can have their private lines if they wish.

Particular attention has been given to security.

Good Security

Said Franco 'Woburn Estate is very secure and occupants can lock their apartments and return say, after three quarter months, to find them just the way they were left.

Entrance gates will remain closed throughout and only open when a visitor is identified.

Security Guards patrol the estate at night.

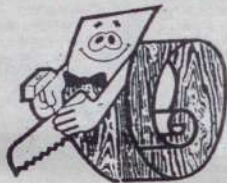

Accidents Will Happen When You Find 'Market Mammies' Mixing It With 'Kamongo Crushers'

MATATUS and buses have borne the brunt of the wrath of the boys in blue especially due to overloading.

Other means of road transport are also prone to overloading. It is however very rare to see them stopped and charged,

presumably because they are not seen as a danger to human life. Kachumbari was in the nether regions of the "Great

Lake" trying to understand the problem weed that is threatening the livelihood of the kamongo men from the lake district.

While driving around investigating the impact of the weed on the fishing activities, he came round a blind bend where a country bus, travelling in the opposite direction had decided to stop and off load passengers and take on some cargo.

While the bus was taking on its load, the other passengers were being subjected to a very heavy sales pitch by the local market women trying to sell their wares through the bus windows.

They were scampering all over the road trying to get to the windows with what they thought was the most likely customer.

In the process they were shouting out "njugu", "rabolo" "tech" and so forth at the top of their voices.

They never heard the approach of the car.

One of the ladies, in her hurry to cut in front of one of the other traders, ended up spread-eagle on the bonnet of Kachumbari's car.

Her wares were catapulted across the road into a ditch full of sewage.

The kamongo men did not become as ugly as their city brethren are wont to be and mete out instant justice.

Instead they took issue with the market women who they told off for running around on the road as though they owned the place.

The women appeared to take this as a joke as they laughed it off as one of the small problems of the trade and only the stupid among them would ever get into a situation like had just happened.

While all this was going on, a sudden crash and followed by a stream of invectives diverted the crowd's attention.

There were two bicycles on the ground and the riders were

just about to engage in fisticuffs.

A few of the kamongo men detached themselves from the crowd and separated the two before they had a chance to start.

Their quarrel was over an accident that had just happened.

The cyclists were both transporting dried kamongo from a co-operative at the lake

shore to the local markets.

They had set off early in the day to get to the co-op in time to get the best deals.

After having secured their material, they off loaded the massive reed baskets and stuffed them with the dried fish.

The baskets were then piled high on the load carrier at the back of the bicycle and strapped tight with lashing made from the shredded inner tube from lorry tyres.

With the loads thus secured the traders set off on the long journey back to their markets.

As was customary, they tended to travel together for as long as they could for both security and companionship.

VELOCIPEDES

The loads were stacked so high that they could not see behind them.

In addition, any wind that came up would have considerably changed the amount of effort

necessary to propel the velocipedes.

When they got to the market where Kachumbari had just had his accident, they started to accelerate as the road was now running downhill.

However, one of the market women run across the road chasing a chicken that was probably meant for the day's lunch.

She did not look to see whether there was any traffic coming across.

The cyclist in front applied his brakes and lost control of his charge and fell over onto the road.

The other cyclist who was following behind had no chance of avoiding the first vehicle and also ended up with bicycle, rider and mountainous load of fish strewn across the road.

It was this rather inelegant accident that caused the two chaps who were normally considered quite good friends to try and fight it out to restore some lost dignity.

The bicycles were in fact completely overloaded such that he two riders had no control over them when they had to take emergency actions.

Yet we see vehicles other than matatus plying the various routes totally overloaded passing right under the noses of the boys in blue.

As far as they are concerned their bread and butter can only be earned from matatus and buses and no other.

They must start realising that their jobs involve TRAFFIC and that means all forms of traffic.

Overloading, misbehaving, flouting rules, discourtesy and all the wrong things we do apply to all forms of traffic and the boys in blue must sharpen their understanding of their lower echelons on what all forms of traffic can and cannot do.

As Kachumbari says, avoid arguing with an imbecile as no one can tell the difference.

Capturing the Diamond Queen with his Ace, he played a Club to Dummy's Queen, crossed to his King and West showed out - there were only eight tricks on top.

Not to worry he told himself, there is still the Heart 'finesse', but when he tried the Heart

When everything seems set fair, that is the time to look for snags, and if possible insure against them.

The Declarer, of course, should hold up his Diamond Ace for two rounds.

He takes the third round, cashes Queen and King of Clubs and learns of the 4-1 break.

Now there is no problem, East can score his Club Knave but has no Diamond to return - if he has another Diamond, it would not matter.
