





Does this mean going 'Back To Basics" as they say so often when someone thinks that common sense is missing, or we are losing sight of our values and purpose?

Maybe, maybe ... Actually, I put it to you that the expression also means:

"Going backwards to a time when things seemed simple", and further, "My basics are the "correct" ones and you should have them too it's often a rather simple power play, don't you agree ?

Going Back To Basics' today doing a Reality Check', means going back to real knowledge and true values, folks, and Authenticity is the theme for any reality check.

In brief, "Authentic" as I mean it
