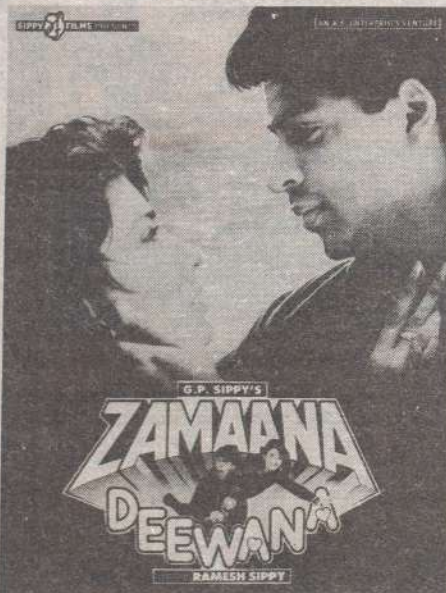

While at Epsom he shot for England on many occasions.

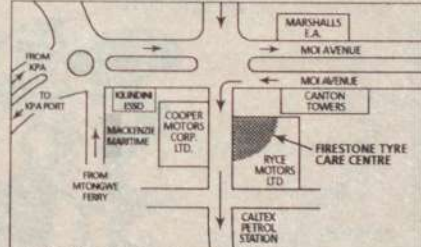

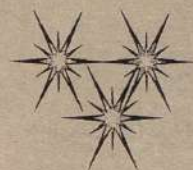

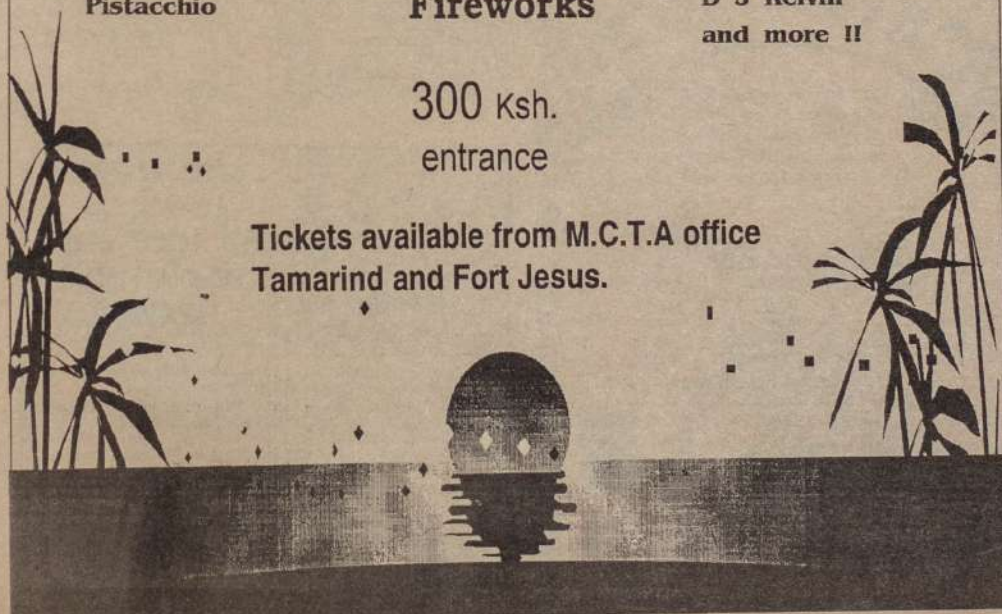

'Reality Checks' And 'Authenticity At Work'

I WANT to ask you to consider doing a 'Reality Check' on your work, shop, business, school, even your home.

Does this mean going 'Back To Basics', as they say so often when someone thinks that common sense is missing, or we are losing sight of our values and purpose?

Maybe, maybe ... Actually, I put it to you that the expression also means:

'Going backwards to a time when things seemed simple', and further, 'My basics are the 'correct' ones and you should have them too'... It's often a rather simple power play, don't you agree?

Going 'Back To Basics' today, doing a 'Reality Check', means going back to real knowledge and true values, folks, and Authenticity is the theme for any reality check.

In brief, 'Authentic' as I mean it

here involves the following challenges to us all:

- The challenge to produce something new, rather than just reproducing old ideas or information someone else gave you.

- The challenge to get involved with an idea, an argument, a plan, or a new service or product - of going beyond what people now think, of developing an in depth, global understanding of a topic.

- The challenge to integrate your own work output with the organisation as a whole, of making that whole greater than the sum of its parts.

The challenge to be truly 'authentic' is a good, even a great, thing because it motivates people to get past the ordinary, it cultivates higher-order thinking, it improves the level of conversation; it gives a sense of ownership, of investment in growth.

One big challenge of the future for forward thinking Kenyans and business people and teachers especially, is to believe in the value of 'authenticity' and bring it to all we do.

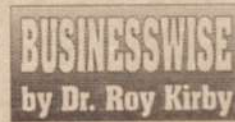
What is an authentic business person, or a family member, or a teacher, or a politician?

An authentic person shares knowledge with others, ensures that his or her own behaviour is based on sound values; he or she

explains things and ideas, shows how his or her own activities contribute to the whole, teaches, will not be satisfied with woolly thinking, rumours, or flabby facts, so demands relevant information; sets high standards, takes responsibility for his or her own results, builds a personal theory of operation - and tests it out in real life.

And what is an authentic organisation?

Many organisations (or families) have little objective understanding



of their own fundamental processes.

It's very difficult to be able to stand back far enough, take the long view, and see how work gets done, of how people relate to each other, to really appreciate how the mission is accomplished.

Work is usually compartmentalised; people think in terms of job descriptions and living within them, rather than going outside them for the extra initiatives.

They ask 'What am I supposed

to do?'

Instead of 'What can I contribute? What more can I do?'

I'm not saying people don't know their jobs; I'm saying people don't see the processes as a whole.

Saying 'But I did my part!' isn't helpful if the whole thing went wrong. Managers must think of staff members as business partners.

Total Quality Management has become an analytical tool, a very sophisticated tool, for thinking about authenticity in working life.

We know that TQ teaches us the fundamentals: to set the mission, to know the customer, to set and live by standards, to work in teams to accomplish more than the individual can.

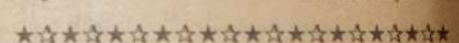
Let's use some TQ approaches to begin a reality check.

Try these questions:

- What employee feedback systems are in place? New versions of suggestion plans are big news these days.

- What is in place to encourage the development of new knowledge?

- How do we get work done around here? How do we expedite things?



- What activities are there in place to help us to integrate, to work for the good of the whole company, to work on the same lines toward a common good?

- What are our core competencies? Exactly what are we good at? Say it!

- What standards do we have? Have we told people? Do employees know them?

- How do we treat our own staff? Do we value respect - give it, and expect it from others?

- Do we have a clear vision, or is it just something we avoid thinking about? Is it a dream, or a plan?

We know that managing people and business concerns of great diversity is coming to us in a global sense, not just a local sense.

We also know that commitment is a big issue, but you cannot demand it.

You must grow it, earn it, make yourself an example.

There you are, I know, a reality check on authenticity is a bit like asking if you are Holy or not - but heck!

If we don't have standards and values in today's turmoil of change, what can people count on?

Think it over, will you?

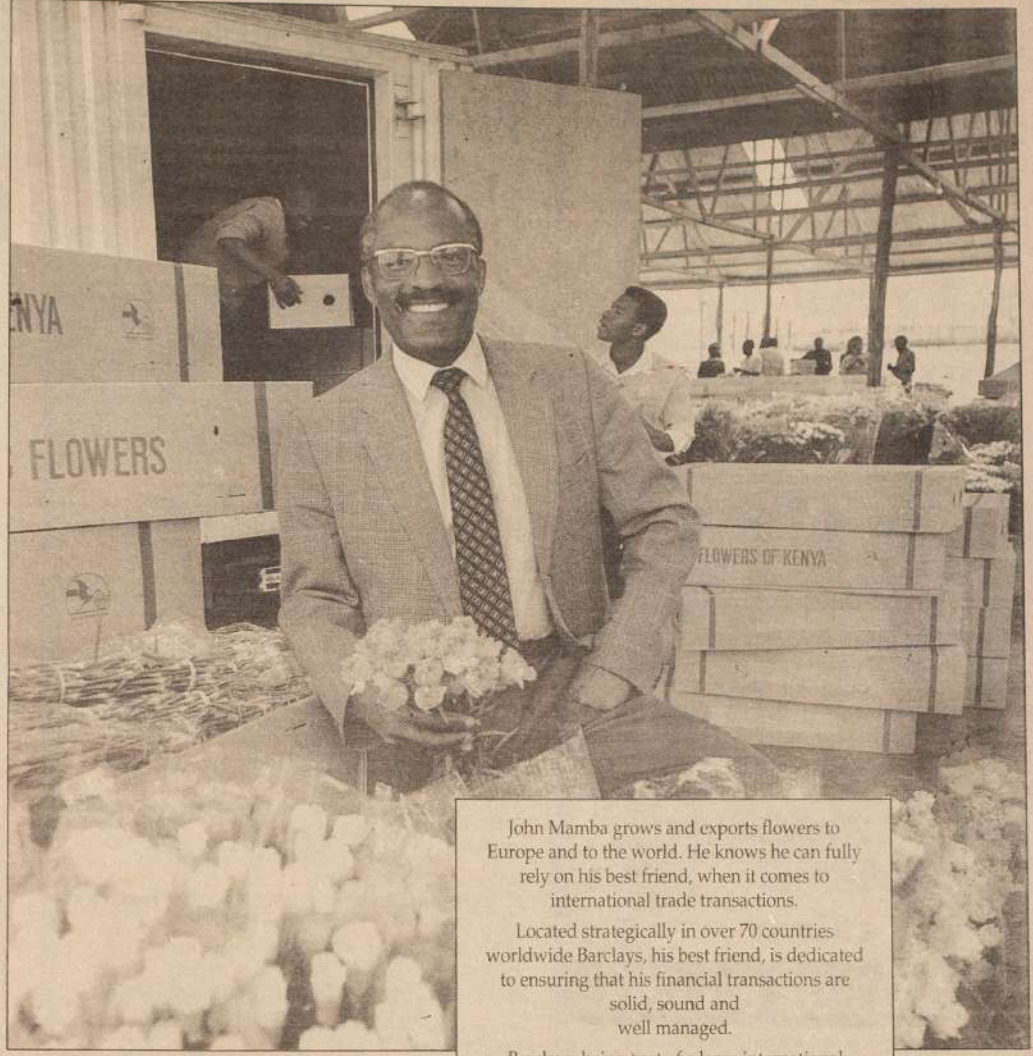

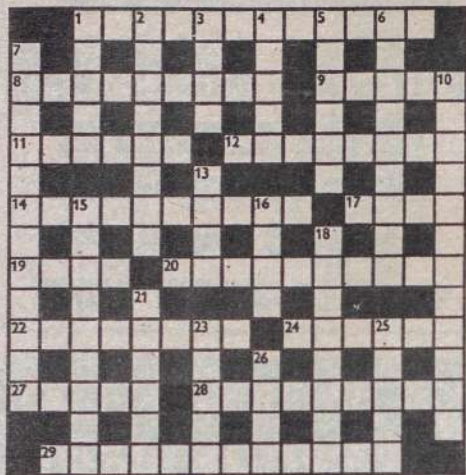

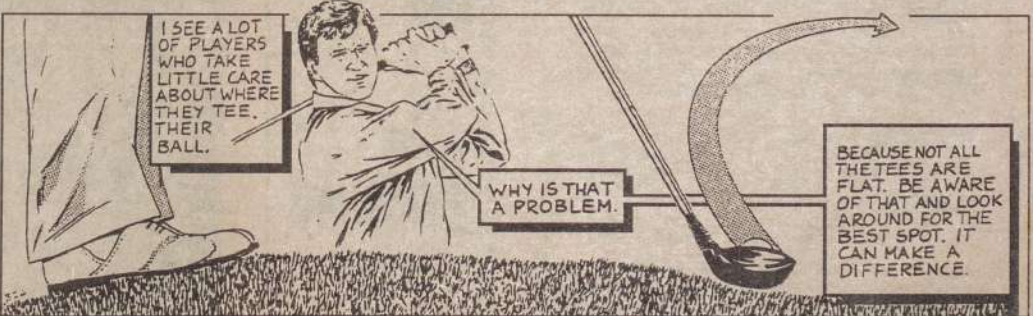
