Dr. Kirby congratulated the award winners and thanked teachers, parents and students for their efforts during the past year.



Let me beg, plead, urge, push shove at readers who recognise themselves as using that vocabulary: Plan, plan, plan.

There is nothing improper about our belief that we can control at least a part of the future, and the destiny of our business.

We are in charge of ourselves; we can control ourselves, we can say what we wish, we can take actions independently. We can plan.

What can we not control?

The weather; the truck speeding towards us with no brakes; the state of the market for our product in remote China; the behaviour of another person.

That's right; you can not control

You can influence them, but if someone decides to Ignore your request, your demands, even, then you are powerless.

You don't believe that?

You say, perhaps: "If my employee doesn't do as he's told, I will fire him!"

Okay, so he gets fired, accepts the consequences of his actions and decision.

Yes, you fired him, but you did not control him.

Did you control him, get what

No. But you can plan for it - set up contingencies to handle possible outcomes.

"If I have to fire Joshua, I will place him with Edward, who eds only a little training to take

Planning, these days, so often revolves around planning for process improvement.

In a rapidly changing global economy, it is almost impossible to do things the old way and make a neat Five-year Plan.

Five years is too long. We just cannot predict that far

setting goals that we might well find un-attainable

attainable, we plan in the short term to improve processes, to build gradual change in to the ways we get things done Every Day!

How many times have I done management seminars with groups and at some point, someone is guaranteed to say "We need more."

More money, more equipment, more people, more time, more something

They just don't seem to get it: the name of the game today is to do more with less.

To work smarter, not harder on the same old stuff.

the same old sturn.

Ask yourselves how many business people, how many administrators, do you personally know who are working as hard as they can, doing things the old way with more and more effort, more and more stress?

Yes, such people are working hard - on the wrong things, in the

By dynamic ! Get rid of nonentributors. Give everyone a

(3) Plan to control, control, control ne processes, not the people.

Setup processes to 100 per cent ensure that mistakes will be seen, very quickly indeed.

(I wondered last week why all attempts to fix a puncture on my Sunny failed, even after a new tube was put in. Then I watched

the repairman - he had never taken out the nail in the tyre. He had not

been given a procedure that included "Run your hand around the tyre inside, and feel for nails").

One employee gluing furniture with the wrong stuff can ruin a whole batch in an hour.

So: at that workstation, put only one kind of glue.

Make it safe, fool-proof. Set up finances on a computer, so that errors cannot be made because

the programme won't accept wrong

Give people checklists of things to do, observe new trainees, use manufacturing jigs, measuring sticks, customer satisfaction

'That's not a plan', you argue?

Look, if we cannot plan for five years, we must plan the processes that are ongoing all the time.

Plan for methods, plan for error-free operations, plan for improve-ments, plan how you do things.

If the company's purpose is really, really, clear to everyone, then all that remains is the HOW we

Plan ! Communicate ! Control !

Build quality in; plan for it.

They could avoid so much pain and fatigue, frustration at poor results, if they would do three things, I promise.

(1) Start planning by focusing really clearly on the main purpose, the Mission, the reason why the business is in business, what you actually do, what's the bottom line.

If you can not say it in a sentence or two - start again.

Be ruthless. Use verbs, such as manufacture, repair, produce, cook, sell, package, educate, drive, report, examine, buy.

Avoid verbs like be, is, are, guide, assist, talk, make, do, get.

Get rid of vagueness! If you are in busi-

ness to rent cars, everythingyou do should get

Don't allow side-tracking, don't let the bean-counters tell you that a hundred bob is worth a fuss, don't let them run your business.

They are there to serve.

(2) A plan is a poor plan unless everyone knows the plan.

Communicate to all staff, put up posters, tell them, sing a company song, write Newsletters, set an example, show people by your actions what the company is all

Inform people about progress toward excellence. Ask people if they have any good ideas

Pay them decently and then ask for high standards, or else.

Make all the demands, then support them all the way. Ask if
