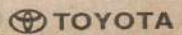

LITTLE ANGELS Playschool was just that - a playschool.

However, from January they will start a Nursery School, whose first term will commence on January 8, 1996, but you may book your child from now by going there - General Mathenge Road - or ringing Mombasa 223196.

In case you don't know General

'Little Angels' Will Open New Nursery School In January

Mathenge Road, it is the one between and parallel to the road that runs from the Aga Khan Hospital towards Kizingo, and the one that leads to Loreto Convent - Oceanic Hotel off Nyerere Avenue (towards Likoni Ferry) or your left.

The Nursery School covers a three-year educational programme and takes children of three - four years.

After nursery (roughly equivalent to Kindergarten) the child will be able to start in "Standards".

And, what's more, Little Angels will assist the youngsters by preparing them for the school of their (or their parent's) choice.

Little Angels has a nominal fee structure.

In the existing Playschool, there are actually several groups, learning separately, so that the class numbers are not overcrowded.

Playschool means two years to three and a half years. The nursery school curriculum exposes children to language development, leading to reading skills.

Naturally this improves conversation and communication. Also they must learn pre-mathematic skills, and simple addition and subtraction; pre-writing skills, creative writing; Arts and Crafts; music and movement, plus theme related activities and physical development.

For the exciting and Nursery Schools Playground, space and equipment is both outdoor and indoor, but there are no vast grounds, and the whole place is walled, meaning that both parents and children feel secure.

Parents often ask about the mid-morning break.

Yes, packaged food, like crisps, is available, plus fruit, and purchased milk.

Little Angels works towards child centred methods and uses Montessori apparatus, particularly for arts and crafts.

The child also has an opportunity to make a choice as to what he would like to work with, within limits.

Once a week the children look forward to the paddling pool and water play.

In the immediate future, Ms. Shirin Alibhai, the owner, sends through us two invitations:

- The first is for those interested parents, who will be welcomed to see her on the morning of November 18.

- The second is the special "Open Day" for existing parents, when they may see what the children have done.

Same date, November 18, but in the afternoon.

Little Angels has a distant future too, when they will introduce the "first-of-its-kind" in Mombasa, being a place for 1½ year-olds.

It will be for toddler and maid.

In these days when mothers have to work but want somewhere safe for the toddler it will only be at Little Angels, where there will be complete supervision and potty training, and the toddler will play as they learn.

Last definite date to remember is, of course January 8, 1996 - the opening of the Nursery School.

During the three day project, several cleft lip and cleft palate operations were undertaken.

The youngest child operated was seven days old.

Also done were several Plastic Surgery Operations for burn scars and release of contractures.

The event was graced by Mr. Francis Baya, the Coast Provincial Commissioner, who praised the efforts made by The Round Tables in conjunction with the Ministry of Health.

"I am amazed at the efforts made by you, and do sincerely request the Round Tables to undertake these efforts on a yearly basis", said Mr. Baya.

"Your project comes during the week of the Moi Day Celebrations, and it is befitting that such a Project is undertaken during this week", added Mr. Baya, keeping in mind President Moi's call for being mindful of others especially children.

Mr. Baya later presented three cartons of biscuits and 10,000/- towards the recovery children's care.

Mombasa Nyali Round Table Number 25 donated paints worth shs. 40,000/- to Coast Province General Hospital for the 'Shine my

Hospital Week" as part of Moi Day celebrations.

The visiting team of doctors and nurses also conducted several lectures and demonstrations for local consultants who witnessed the Operations.

Amongst them being two prominent ENT Surgeons in Mombasa, Dr. Dang and Dr. Mukesh Shah.

Also present to witness the efforts of the Round Tables, were Dr. Sheriff, the PMO-Coast Province and Dr. Getambu the administrator of Coast Province General Hospital.

Also present were HTC Nairobi Convener Manu Shah and his co-convener Rahul Mediratta, who provided much guidance and support.

The convener, Mukesh Sanghavi, said that this year large amount of funds were utilised to repair one of the Theatres and relevant equipment at the Coast Province General Hospital, in order to conduct the Project effectively without interruption from Emergency cases.

The Project involved all the locally based surgeons and nurses who have now had the basic training to undertake similar projects in the years to come.

Convener Mukesh said due to the overwhelming success of this project, both the Round Tables in Mombasa will consider doing the Project on a much larger scale next year.

He thanked the Tablers, Dr. Sheriff, Dr. Getambu, Dr. Radol and especially the Kenyatta National Hospital team under the able leadership of Dr. Omondi for their sincere efforts in making this project run smoothly.

"This exercise has been an eye opener for me as a Convener, and I wholeheartedly pledge my full support to such future projects", he concluded.

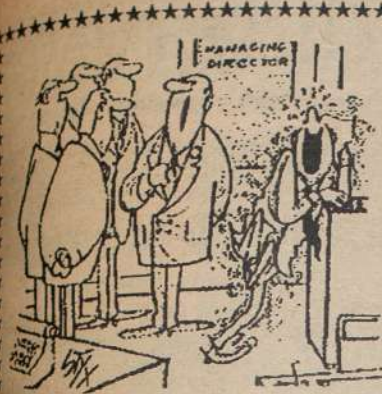
Convener Mukesh appealed to well wishers to come forward and contribute to this worthy project so that in future similar projects could be undertaken on a larger scale, at the same time also extending to include the correction of several other deformities.

Overall this Project was undertaken jointly by the two Mombasa Round Tables, who contributed close to Kshs. 300,000/-

towards this worthy cause for the purchase of expendable medical supplies.

In addition over Kshs. 200,000/- was spent for the repair of one Anaesthetic Machine, providing an air-conditioner for the operation theatre and other materials.

Finally Convener Mukesh thanked all those who supported this project especially the Whitesands Hotel who provided accommodation to all the visiting surgeons and nurses at no cost, his committee Allan Njoroge, Rafiq Parkar, Mehul Shah and Imtiaz Aboo.





Top German Newspaper And Travel Writers 'Delighted By Superb Facilities' Of North Coast's Travellers Beach

SAMPLING KENYA'S hospitality in a grand way are six travel writers from leading newspapers and magazines in Germany.

A Concorde charter flew them direct to Mombasa with *Travellers Beach Hotel* hosting not only their first two nights on the Kenya coast, but also a fabulous welcome dinner which turned out to be an al-fresco culinary feast enhanced by light background music provided by the talented musician and vocalist, Dale.

These journalists were invited to Kenya by *Fischer Reisen* which is among the top ten tour operators in Germany.

'Janice Guzzle' And 'Marie Flood' Are Purpose Built Vessels - The 'Pusher Tug' Fits Snugly Into The Aft Of The Barge And Off They Go

AN UNUSUAL SIGHT CONFRONTED me on the morning of the sixth as she sailed past the office window. I looked, and had, I admit, to take a second long hard look. The effects of the herbal potion must be wearing off! Being abstemious I knew I didn't have to shake off the previous nights excesses.

I thought to myself: 'Now I've seen something like that not too long ago' and then of course I remembered, the 'vessel' in question was the pusher/ tractor by the *Janice Guzzle*, guzzle, guzzle, guzzle, and that being pushed, the barge *Marie Flood*, weighing in 9000-odd tonnes of maize on account of the W.F.P.

Seems a very long, long distance barge in maize but then everything supposedly fits into the equation.

Veritable ship husbands, agents and so on Messrs. *Inchcape Shipping Services* are looking after the two craft while in Kilindini.

MORE ABOUT the 'Guzzle' and the 'Flood' though.

Both are purpose built vessels, but for the course, however these two are perhaps more 'purpose built' than others.

The pusher tug fits snugly into the aft of the barge and off they go, then usually, the tug will go off to another barge to push etc.

A nice concept you've got a tug piece of pushing/ pulling machinery which is not, for sake of argument, tied up as such, but does its job and then is free to search out other barges to push.

I believe the system originates and is predominately in use on the Mississippi and the like.

Rather like the Truck/horse and cart.

Seen are the Thoroughbred *Topper* and pusher tug/ tractor *Betty Wood*, only difference between these two, and the *Guzzle* and *Flood* is that the *Flood* is gearless, whereas you see that the *Topper* is equipped with two cranes.

Strange apparitions really, these pusher tugs, for when detached from the barge, they appear I suppose not unlike a hermit crab about shell, exposed.

Well we've seen some innovative sights in Kilindini over the past couple of years, what with the visits of the lash carriers + barges, the *Betty Woods*, *Janice Guzzle* and so on.

I note however that the Mackenzie Maritime Footer team is doing well in the pwani league.

Sepideh was originally designed to carry 436 passengers, but this has been reduced by almost 50 per cent to 230 allowing more space for customer comforts and perhaps a little more baggage.

There's a refreshments bar, boutique, TV monitors, PA Music video, air conditioning (all featured in each passenger space) 200 passengers are accommodated on or in the main passenger deck, with the other 30 chosen few on the upper deck, from where they might just get a glimpse of the skipper's four gold bar's flying from the epaulets of his starched white shirt!

One of the more interesting features on board, and which I don't believe the other fast cats, hydro-folis offer, is the eight persons, Jacuzzi situated aft of the cockpit, and I say cockpit, for it's more in keeping with an aeroplane than a ship's, with all the sophisticated equipment, dials, joy-sticks.

Sepideh is powered by twin MTU engines giving out 5400 bhp through Kamewa water jets.

Sepideh, built in 1991 is I believe the most modern fast cat in these waters will certainly offer passengers a luxurious crossing.

The fares are very reasonable too, and I'm informed that they might very well be reduced, which

is certainly something to look forward and not a word that one hears often nowadays, reduced, that is.

ANOTHER vessel's been arrested. She's the *Jonian Fame* which came in to load 650 ngamia's (camels).

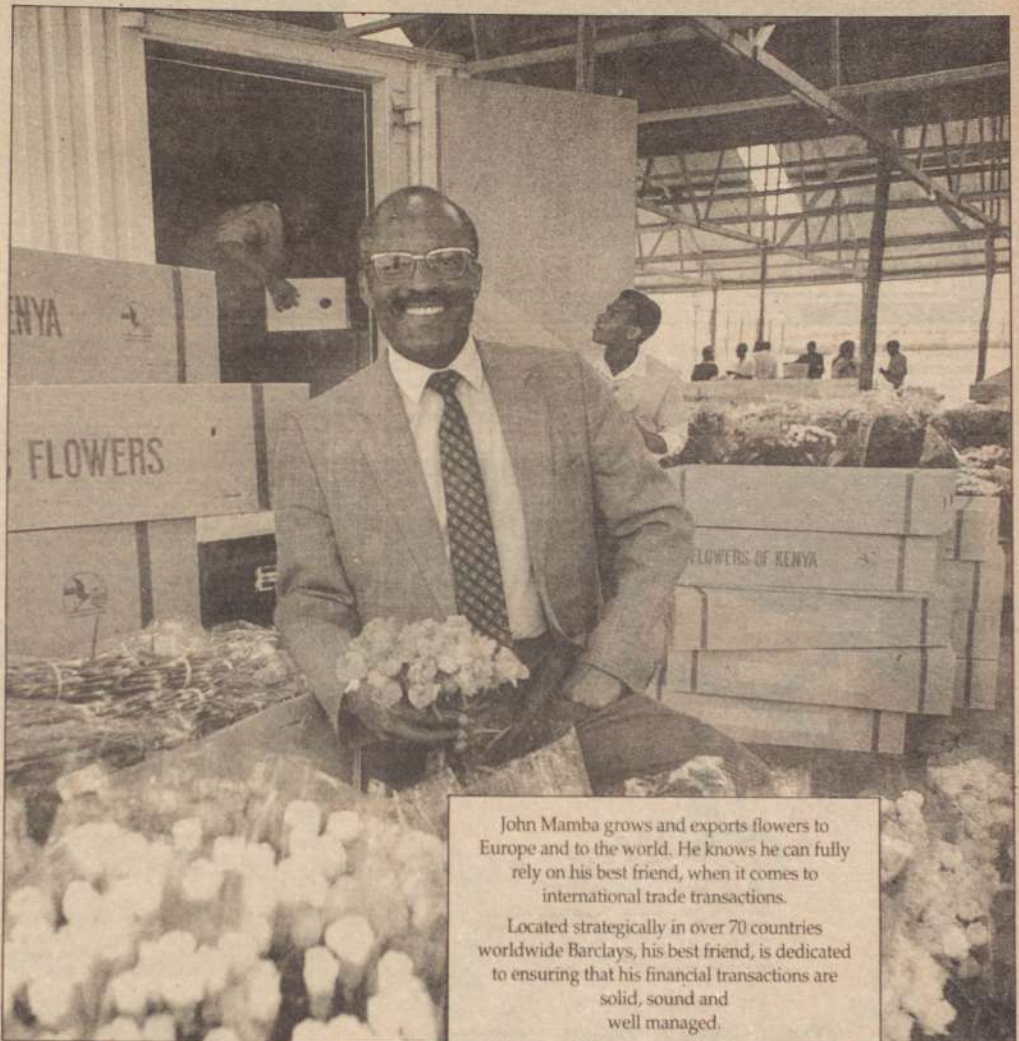
Wonder if they're the cause of the 'fina' which has blocked the vessel and listed as Civil Cause No. 719 of this year.

'TUNA HUNT' HAS FINE FISHING OFF PEMBA CHANNEL

NINETEEN OF Kenya's top fishing boats completed in this year's Pemba Channel Fishing Club's Total sponsored 'Tuna Hunt'. Visiting boats starting arriving in the Channel early Friday afternoon, reporting little or no activity. Kipapa, fishing in from Mtwapa, arrived having caught one sailfish and numerous large wahoo. Saturday, the first day of the two day event saw a number of the faster boats, including Shuwariri and Jasin, the Pemba Channel Fishing Club's Bertrams, speeding to the sea mount.

Last week the sea mount was very productive, but during the competition not as many fish were caught. Seyyida, fished by Alec Dyer-Melville, Eric Stephenson and Peter Wanner were lucky enough to boat a Black Marlin of 196 lbs. The highlight of the day, and of the competition, was a magnificent Yellowfin Tuna of 186 lbs, the second largest ever caught in the Channel. The largest ever caught from

the Pemba Channel Fishing Club was 193 lbs. This huge tuna was caught by John Lyall fishing from B's Nest and was boated in a remarkable 15 minutes. In addition, B's Nest also tagged and released a Striped Marlin, putting them firmly in the lead. Sunday, the wind was still from the north-east. This meant the tuna were still down but the Marlin were up. There were at least nine Marlin strikes, of which three were finally caught, tagged and released. Well done B's Nest, Pingusi and Kamara. The biggest hard luck story of the Competition must surely be Dicky Evans who lost a Black Marlin well in excess of 600 lbs after a 45 minute battle.
