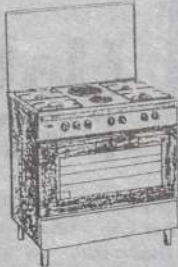
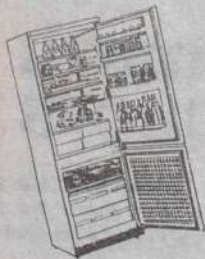

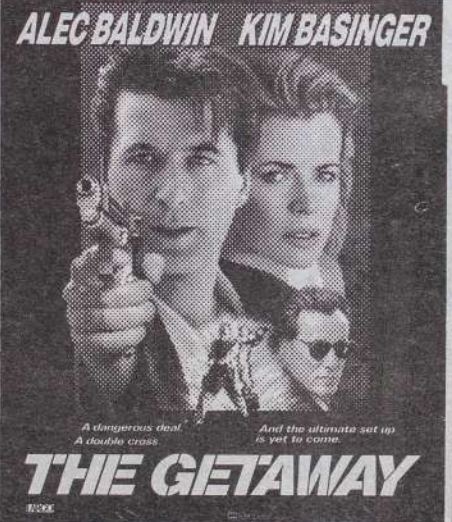

# Nyali Offer Life Saving Saving And Swimming Courses

COMMONWEALTH Development Royal Life Saving Society (RLSS) is recommending that every beach hotel along the Kenyan coast should have at least one qualified lifeguard.

Life saving skills are very essential at the hotels and even in the villages surrounded by water, said RLSS liaison officer Mrs. Sheila Norman and instructor/examiner, Mrs. Natalie Bland.

Speaking at the close of a nine-day intensive life-saving course at Mombasa's Nyali Beach Hotel which was attended by 27 people, the two RLSS officials said it is their wish that life-saving will go a long way in Kenya, especially at the coast.

During the ceremony presided over by Nyali Beach Hotel general manager Mr. John Mutua, five participants who showed outstanding performance during the course were awarded prizes.

The course dubbed, "Life support one" included the latest techniques on resuscitation, First-aid and water safety in which candidates took RLSS examinations.

They were also trained on pool life-guarding, teaching of life-saving, use of life-guard equipment and a special rescue test.

The proceeds of the fees paid by the participants will be donated towards a local charity involved in swimming in the form of swimming or life-saving equipment.

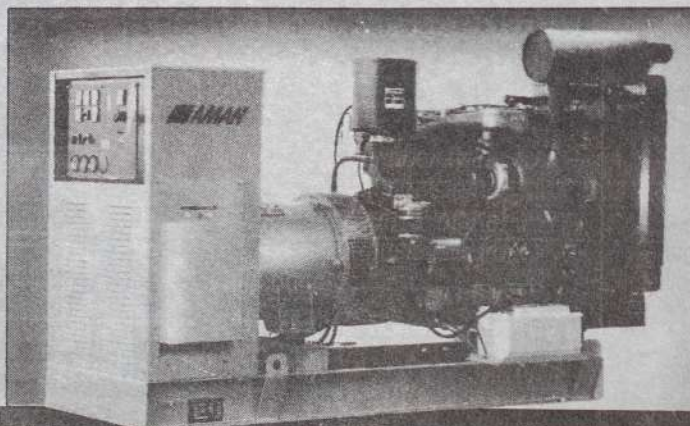

They are gently grilled so as to retain flavour and come with a sauce made from the freshest of mint.

Another tempting dish for non-meat eaters is 'Sweet and Sour'.

Here the vegetable are coated in

butter and cooked Tempura style making them light and crisp. To go with it is a fruity sweet and sour sauce.

For those intrigued by the Peach Fromage comprises a large juicy mountain peach but in two, placed on a bed of grated cheese and coated with a delicious cream cheese sauce.

It is garnished with a chilled salad of chili, tomato, lettuce - and it ambrosia!

For the Croc Pie, the meat is first sautéed in butter with onions and carrots in a Bechamel Sauce then covered in the lightest of puff pastry.

Other delicious concoctions are

made from: Eazelle, Ostrich and Garaffe.

Another winner on the menu is Fish Home Bay with the most delectable sauce made from white wine and topped with fire cashewnuts and prawns to cover a gently steamed fillet of Tilapia from Lake Victoria.

These are just a tantalising selection of the gourmet dishes available to the connoisseur of haute-cuisine.

## 'Johnny Silvo' At Nyali Beach Hotel

PERFORMING LIVE at the Nyali Beach Hotel recently was BBC most popular Music Radio's country mix programme star Johnny Silvo.

Silvo, now based in Stavenga, South Western Norway, staged two live shows at Nyali Beach Hotel's Lanes and L'Orangerie restaurant to a frenzied audience of hotel guests and local residents.

Listening to Silvo sing, is experiencing his life. The simple man he is, Silvo takes his fans to such self-abandoning heights that life would mean nothing without him.

He says the big influx of jazz bands that flooded London during his childhood instilled music in the young musician he was. "There was always rhythm in me" says Silvo who has resisted the musical fame.

Silvo has played for BBC's music radio, Country mix among other country music programmes.

He was the star and producer of BBC's live radio country music programme, Country Mix, and a daily children's BBC TV play school in the 1970s.

The programme where he featured as "Uncle John" was the only programme of its kind in the time. Silvo whose name in Latin means "Woods", his real name, is married to a Norwegian and has one son aged six.

Silvo who is a frequent visitor to Kenya for fifteen times says he has a certain link to Africa with the fact that his father, a former US army soldier died in the war in northern Africa and that he is coloured.

GLASSES WERE raised in a toast wishing Dick and Margaret Roberts 'all the best in their new life in Vancouver, North America' by some ninety guests at a farewell party hosted by the **Mombasa Hospital** which took place in the Sisters' Mess.

They included members of the Board of Directors, Medical Advisory Committee, Doctors, Head of Departments of the hospital and League of Friends.

Mr. Roberts has been Chairman of the hospital's Board of Directors for ten years, and said Chris Groom (his successor) 'his vision and foresight has transformed this hospital beyond recognition'.

Fortunately, he took over as chairman in the nick of time to put it back on its feet again.

He recognised competent staff, won over the loyalty of all cadres of staff, encouraged the establishment of the **League of Friends** and enlisted the support

of some well-known benefactors such as the Mamujee Foundation and - more recently, the Premchandbhai Foundation to help finance new developments.

As a result of Dick's effort the

Shs 214 million has already been received.

In thanking the Foundation and Dhuru Shah, Dick Roberts declared, amid cheers 'this will go towards our new ICU'.

Mr. and Mrs. Roberts leave Kenya at the end of the month to join their children and grandchildren in Vancouver.

Mr. Roberts came to Kenya in 1944 as an engineer in the Army.

He joined the Public Works Department in 1946, retiring as Chief Hydraulic Engineer, Ministry of Works, in 1963.

He was Managing Director of Bamburi Portland Cement Company Limited from 1963 to 1984 and Vice-Chairman of the Board of Directors of BPCC, also chairman of Simbarite.

He was also chairman of the Income Tax Local Committee until recently, and chairman of Nyalii Golf and Country Club for three years.

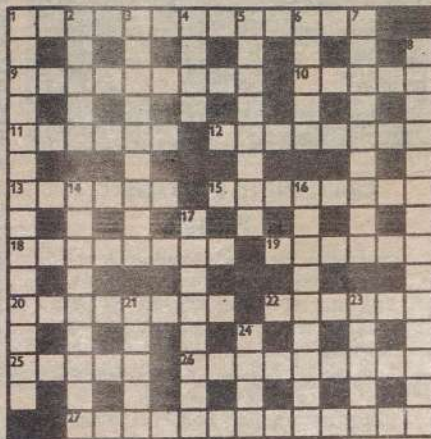

It happened on the road as Kachumbari was driving to an associate's office in another county.

In this case it was customs officers involved.

The customs office in question was located about two kilometres from the nearest bank.

Each day, towards the end of the day, one of their top accountants and a clerk would leave the premises with the days takings and head for the bank.

This they did in whichever unmarked customs car was available.

On average, the mix of the day's taking would be primarily cheques with a small amount of cash.

Though small by customs terms it still represented a handsome amount of money for a desperate,

unemployed and imaginative chap!

A group decided they would make a try for the loot.

On this particular day, the customs fellows did as they had done for yonks.

They closed the cash office at three in the afternoon and prepared to catch the bank before the close of business at four before the close of business at four thirty.

They put the day's taking in their usual locked bag and ordered an unmarked car from the pool.

But why leave it to partner to understand that Diamond shift is essential?

So East does not do any signalling.
