

Well, What 'Do' People Want From Their Jobs?

A COUPLE OF weeks ago, COASTWEEK, printed a 'Fax Survey' form to help in a little research on what people want from their jobs ... What's important to them in their work.

The idea was to make it easy for readers to check off their priorities on a list of questions, then we would compile the results and tell you what we learned.

It looked easy - but was received only a very few responses.

At first I was quite disappointed, but than I began to realize that the very lack of responses was in fact a significant piece of information.

Now, it is relatively easy to tally-up response items from, say, 100 survey sheets; one just counts the numbers for each question, to get numbers for each question, to get the first picture, then one looks at how one item and another inter-relate for the second picture, and

Take the raw data, interpret it, and Bingo * you have useful, interesting information.

No data, however, is like silence when a question is asked.

We know it means something. but what?

With no data on the survey its we have to turn to what we do know and than see if it fits here, too.

You might call it an educated uess. Here goes, then.

Most people want several things from their work, and these things can be put into a set of levels.

Each level meets some personal need starting at the bottom with the basic needs of human survival: food, shelter and warmth.

Once these needs are met, people seek to meet their needs for personal security and decent living/working conditions.

Then they want to feel that they belong to group, of organization, a

family, a 'gang'.

After that, our needs become less tangible and more emotional: love, affection, being valued; and all the way up to a spiritual, or philosophical pinnacle of a kind of



The traditional first and last Saturdays for the monthly medals for both men and ladies is a perfectly good arrangement.





A UNIQUE MEDICAL FACI

THE SIRI Guru Nanak Clinic was set up by the Executive Committee of The Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Mombasa.

The Clinic was set up in 1982 through the initiative of the then Sabha Chairman Mr. Dalip Singh Dhanjal.

It was set up by converting the then Makupa Sikh Temple which was established in 1962.

Due to expansion of The Sikh Temple at Mwembe Tayari Road it wasthought fit to convert the temple at Makopa into a Charitable Clinic to serve the less fortunate members of the society, irrespective of caste, colour or

in November 1982 to mark the birth anniversary of Siri Guru Napak Dev.

OBJECTIVES

THE AIM of running Siri Gu Nanak Clinicwastoprovide complete Primary Health Care Services on subsidized rates in a charitable set up.

For this a Medical Committee has been set up by The Executive Council which manage for the clinic. stheday to day running

the clinic on a non-profit basis.

Thus the committee has to structure the fees charged in such a way so that the day to day expenses are made good

All capital expenditure and expansions are financed and provided by The Sabha either through its funds or donors or through fund raising.

The clinic started on a very humble note of providing medical services to the less fortunate at very nominal fees of Shs 10 per visit.

PRIMARY HEALTH CARE

THE PROVISION of Primary Health Care was undertaken stepwise.

The aim was to set up one service and make it self-financing and then

OUT-PATIENT SERVICES

THESE SERVICES were first stroduced at the very inception of the

From the year 1982 to 1990 these services were provided from approximately one-fifth of the present

Curative out-patient care which included consultation, examination and dispensing of medicines and injections were provided.

These services are now being rovided at shs 100.00 per visit when taking into consideration the present medical costs is very nominal and well apprecized by the lower income group.

The Clinic Pharmacy is well stocked and has all the first line antibiotics and other medicines and most illnesses are

Approximately on an average 100 stients are seen treated daily.

The clinic is staffed by a Qualified Doctor, a Senior Community Nurse tow fully qualified nurses and other subordinate staff.

Due to the escalating costs of medicines the clinic can run into a small deficit but keeping in mind its aims and objectives the committee hopes to offset such a deficit through fund-raising rather than raising the fees. MATERNAL CHILD HEALTH

AND F. P. SERVICES

To introduce these services a major partitioning of the clinic was required. Also it was mandatory to employ a fully qualified community nurse with KEPI training, for immunization

The estimated cost of running the centre on monthly basis was Shs. 10,000.00.

The cost of partitioning and equipping was approximately Shs 200,000.00.

On daily basis the Community Nurse Mrs. Diana Joram provides these service to both the expected mothers and mothers immediately after

For the Ante-Natal Mothers special cards are maintained and regular visits are planned and at each visit appropriate examination and advise is given to the expectant mother.

Also two doses of Tetanus Toxoid

So far only routine urine tests are carried out and they are referred for other tests like the Blood Group, Heamoglobulin, VDRL etc to the

hospital.

When ready for delivery they are referred with their cards to The Coast General Hospital and are advised to bring the new born baby to the baby clinic and to report herself for The Post-Natal Services.

In the Post-Natal clinic the mother ally examined and then motivated to except family planning services.

Both The Ante-Natal and Post-Natal vided at a very nom e of Shs 50,00 per visit

FAMILY PLANNING SERVICE

At present Family Planning Service are provided daily with the assistance of the Municipal Council and the Family Planning Association of Kenya who provide all the consumable free of

Family Planning Services of the first line i.e. Pills, Injectables, intra-Uterine Devices, Condoms and other Barrier methods are provided after thorough counselling and examination for the most suitable method.

This service is again provided at a very nominal fee of Shs 50.00 per visit

WELL BABY CLINIC

These services are also provided daily and all childhood immunizations are provided asper National Immunization Schedule.

they are regularly checked, weighed, examined and necessary advice and

Anominal fee of Shs 10.00 is charged

DAY CARE CENTRE LABORATORY AND THEATRE PROJECT ND MINOR

Having set up The Maternal, ChildHealth and Family Planning Unit and successfully sustained it to run economically the next phase was obviouslytosetupthe Day Care Centre, Laboratory and Minor Theatre to

the Curative Out-Patient Services THE LABORATORY

The tests which the lab is expected to carry out are: Blood: Blood Group, Haemogram, VDRL and Malaria

Urine: Routine, Microscopy and

Stools: Routine and Microscopy Stoos: Rotume and Microscopy.

The abovetests will support the Ante-Natal, Post-Natal, Family Planning Services and also the general patients attending the clinic and are the basic tests and it is estimated that a nominal

fee of Shs 50,00 should suffice for each

THE MINOR THEATRE

The second line of Family Planning Services are the provision of Surgical Methods i.e. Tubal Lightions for the females and Vasectomics for men.

Methods are available which can be arried out in a simple minor theatre on

These methods will first be established with the assistance of Volunteer Gynaecologists and General

Besides the surgical cases of family planning the minor theatre will carter for procedures such as incision and drainage of abscesses, suturing of cuts, application of plaster of pairs for simple

ractures and many other min orgical and gynaecological cases.

It is planned that no procedure will ost morethan Shs 500,00 to the patient.

DAY CARE CENTRE The Day Care Centre will have a Male Ward with four beds, a Female Ward with four beds and Childrens ward with four beds.

Day care services will be provided mainly to the above family planning cases and all minor surgical and gynaecological cases

It will also provide service to the sick requiring observations for a few hour like the dehydrated for rehydration, the anaemic for TDI infusions etc.

It is planned that the daily charge all be a nominal fee of Shs 100,00 per

The plans for the clinic were drawn by Mr. Kuldip Singh Soar and the construction carried out by Dhanjal Brothers Limited.

The entire project has been uccessfully completed.

Equipment consisting of beds, mattresses, and some other accessories have been donated to the clinic bythe Rotary Club of Bahari-Mombasa and the Rotary Club of Miami-Shores.

Thus with some equipment already available and some procured the Day Care Centre is ready to provide the much needed essential services to the residents of Mombasa.

Clinic Has Gained A **Reputation Of Providing Excellent Services**

My role has been that of the Project. Director and Medical Advisor.

Inthis capacity I have seen the Clinic grow from its humble beginning in 1982 when it was started.

Till 1990, it provided only curative at patient services.

Then in 1990, the Maternal Child health and Family Planning services were introduced.

Thus, achieving the status of a primary Health Care.

These services have made the clinic wrypopular with the low income group for whom private medical treatment is out of reach.

This growth has been slow for us but

At all times we have been able to keep our fee low and run the clinic on no profit no loss basis.

In November 1992, the clinic completed 10 years of service to amanty.



Forcing Matatu Drivers To "Toa Kitu Cha Maana" Not Only Lines Pockets, It Also Ensures That Mwananchi Develop Hypertension

THE MATATU menace continues unabated.

They are an important service to the wanarchi but they still get on the nerves of most motorists and also, so I have been told, on the nerves of the users.

They are necessary evil since no-one has really taken any interest n controlling what they do.

Whatever attempts have been made have in the main backfired. Kachumbari remembers well the first attempt to control these assential vehicles.

Some clever guy came up with the idea of enhancing the PSV label that matatus were supposed to have so as to distinguish them tom the other vehicles that were also required by law to carry the very same PSV label.

The clever guy decided to add in "M" in brackets after the PSV logo which would differentiate the matatu from other PSV type vehicles on the road.

This however was only carried outfor a few months as the creative and malicious rumour mill decided to give the abbreviation a sinister connotation.

As it would seem, the matatic continue to be very imaginative in the ways that they irritate other read users, the excessive noise that they tend to have has gone on unchecked and now the decibel level in the matatus has gone beyond what for most norms one every consider medically safe. uld consider medically safe
