Two Talented Dutch Artists Capture Kenya On Canvas

POEN DE WIJS and Marion Van Nieuwpoort, both very well-known painters in the Netherlands, came to Kenya for the first time in 1992 and since then made our country their only destination for their annual holiday.

They love both painting and Kenya so much, that painting Kenya is all they have done for the past three years.

While here on a holiday, having a rest from a very busy life in Holland, they soak up all the natural splendour, sun and colours Kenya has to offer while thoroughly enjoying the friendliness of its people.

Once back in Holland, their brushes are dipped in warm colours like golden ochre, raw sienna, burntumber and cadmium red in order to conjure up pictures of Africans they've met or animals they've spotted on their safaris.

This year they not only spent five days in the Masai Mara Game Reserve, but also went on a most inspiring south coast bush tour, had a moonlit dinner on the romantic Tamarind Dhow and went on a trip to Malindi, where they made lots of pictures of impressive birds of prey at the falconry, afterwards enjoying Malindi's nightlife.

A visit was made to the Gedi ruins, where Poen couldn't stop taking pictures and we are sure we'll see them soon in one of his paintings.

Ultramarine And Cerulean Blues

Whilst stretched out on their beach beds in the beautiful tropical gardens at Jadini Beach Hotel at Diani Beach, one of the three Alliance Hotels where Poen and Marion enjoy their comfortable room, a friendly service as well as an excellent cuisine, they never tire of watching the Indian Ocean, with all its amazing cool shades of ultramarine and cerulean blues and turquoise greens.

Both artists finished their studies at the Royal Academy of Art in The Hague and over the years slowly made it to the very top of artistic Holland.

In 1983 they were invited by the Dutch government to represent their country on an art exhibition trip through Indonesia.

Their diaries are fully booked with exhibitions all over Holland for the year to come.

Once a year they travel to Switzerland in order to produce a number of stone-lithographs.

Poen's style of painting is the complete opposite of Marion's, which makes them into a most interesting couple in the world of art.

Poen's paintings are more realistic than photographs.

Admirers feel like pressing their noses against them, wondering how he could ever have managed

such an unbelievably beautiful reproduction of the face of an old Masai, a monkey's fur or a frangipani's petal ...

While looking at one of

Marion's paintings, one steps back, overwhelmed by the action, warmth and colours that seem to be splashing over the canvas like a wild dance !

In fact dance and movement always have been Marion's greatest inspiration.

She used to take scenes from Dutch ballets as subjects for her paintings.

Now that she's fallen in love with Kenya, it's Masai dancers, Ukunda drummers, racing cheetahs and galloping giraffes and ostriches that keep moving over her large paintings.

Both artists thus create completely different atmospheres: Poen is the philosopher and idealist who'd love to see the world turn into one big melting pot.

He combines African with European subjects in his paintings often in a somewhat mysterious way.

Marion reproduces scenes from Kenya in a very happy, spontaneous and uncomplicated, through often slightly impressionistic, manner.

Last year one of her exhibitions, in one of Holland's finest galleries, was opened by His Excellency Mr. S.O. Magoto, the ambassador of Kenya to the Netherlands.

On November 16 of this year Poen and Marion exhibited some of their Kenyan drawings and stone-lithographs in Nairobi.

The very successful exhibition

was held at the ABN AMRO Bank which organised the event in a perfect way; their work was tastefully framed and presented, hundreds of guests were present.

There was a warm buffet provided by the Norfolk Hotel and not only members of the press but also the television crew were there.

After the opening of their

exhibition at the ABN AMRO Bank their work is being exhibited at the "One Off!" Gallery at Libra House in Nairobi until Christmas.

After a few more days of rest under the swaying palm trees of their beloved Jadini Beach Hotel, Poen and Marion will go back to Holland, with a suntanned skin and a suitcase filled with sketches and films with over a thousand pictures, their minds zooming with inspiration on lots of new paintings to make of Kenya !

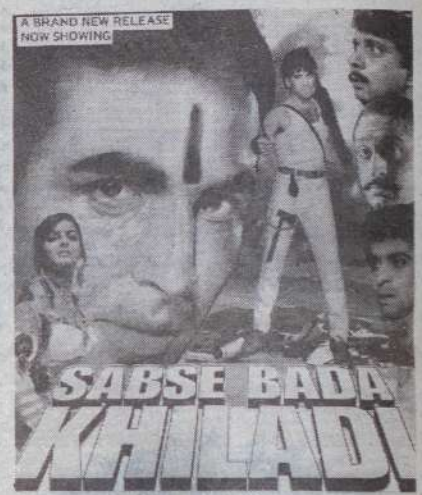

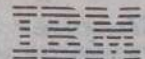

KWALE DISTRICT EYE CENTRE NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

BLINDNESS IN Kenya is ten times more common than blindness in the Western World.

One person in every hundred is blind (as defined by the World Health Organisation of <3/60 in the better eye).

This is due in part to a lower standard of living conditions and different diseases, but mostly the divide is due to lack of affordable, accessible eye care.

The Kwale District Eye Centre has been established to overcome this difficulty and is working to bring affordable eye care to the people of the South Coast.

In the Developing World 80 per cent of blind people suffer from conditions which are avoidable.

Their disease could either have been prevented by early detection and treatment, or it could be corrected surgically.

The most common blinding condition is cataract.

The treatment and cure is by surgery.

The Kwale District Eye Centre corrects cataract by removal of the cataractous lens and insertion of a plastic lens which remains in the eye.

This method is now considered the most successful world wide.

Kwale District is an area of 8,608 square km on the Southern Coast.

It is largely rural and travel off the few main roads is difficult.

The Kwale District Eye Centre, a Self Help Project, is located 11 km South of Mombasa at Magandia just off the main road.

The Centre opened in October 1993 and consisted of a single room and a small reception area on a one acre plot.

This single room catered for both an eye clinic for the out-patients and as a theatre for surgery.

In the first year, 650 eye patients were treated and 50 operations carried out.

The initial staff were an Ophthalmologist, an Ophthalmic Technician, a cleaner and three 'askaris'.

MODERN OPERATING THEATRE

In 1994 the existing building was extended to include a modern operating theatre and sterilising room, office, dehumidified store and wash up area.

Running well water is now connected.

This badly-needed extension allows a separate area for surgery with much improved conditions for sterility and patient comfort.

In the second year of operation

the numbers of patients attending the Centre has increased by 50 per cent, with over 150 operations.

The most recent advance has been the implementation of a Community Based Rehabilitation Program, begun in April 1995. This was instigated because of the need to teach people that visual

disability is avoidable.

The Centre has recruited an Ophthalmic Medical Assistant who works in the field promoting awareness of eye disability and referring those in need to the Eye

Centre.

This programme continues to develop and will shortly expand

into the very inaccessible areas of the District where no Eye Care is available.

Transport is urgently required for this development.

Funds are also sought to erect an In-patients Hostel to provide accommodation for surgical patients who have to travel long distances to get to the Centre.

This facility is of great need since most of the surgical patients are elderly and suffering from very poor sight.

It will also provide an opportunity for better after care.

Kwale District Eye Centre is a charitable project. Patients pay a nominal fee only.

For example, the cost of a consultation is only Kshs. 40/-.

EXTRACTION

A cataract extraction operation, with implant lens costs the Centre Kshs. 5,000/-, the patient however is only charged Kshs. 3,500/-.

Even these charges are reduced or waived in cases of real need through the existence of a 'Poor Patients' Fund.

Hence the Kwale District Eye Centre is in need of a continual income.



"Kenya Wildlife Service" Projekt zum Schutz der Wasserschildkröten

DER "KENYA Wildlife Service" (KWS) führt an der Küste ein Projekt durch, an dem die einheimische Bevölkerung beim Schutz der Wasserschildkröten aktiv beteiligt ist.

Die Leute werden ermuntert, entlang den Stränden nach Nestern Ausschau zu halten.

Wer dem KWS den Standort eines solchen Nestes meldet, erhält Shs 500,- und wird gebeten, dafür zu sorgen, daß das Nest nicht gestört oder zerstört wird.

Wer dem KWS mitteilt, daß die jungen Schildkröten ausgeschlüpft sind, erhält Shs 5,-, nachdem der lebende Beweis erbracht worden ist.

Dann werden die Schildkrötenbabys von KWS Beamten, im Beisein von Einheimischen und Besuchern, im Meer ausgesetzt.

Dieses System hat sich gut bewährt, und die Anwohner machen eifrig mit, wahrscheinlich angespornt durch die finanzielle Belohnung.

In Bamburi an der Nordküste wird unter Privatinitiative ebenfalls ein Projekt zum Schutz der Wasserschildkröten durchgeführt.

Bestimmte Personen sammeln Schildkrötenier am Strand, bevor diese geraubt oder zerstört werden können, und bringen sie zum künstlichen geschützten Brutplatz in Bamburi.

Wenn genügend Schildkrötenjunge ausgeschlüpft sind, werden Einheimische, Touristen und andere Besucher eingeladen zu einer Zeremonie, wobei die Babys im Meer freigelassen werden.

Gewöhnlich nehmen an einem

solchen Anlaß 100 bis 300 Personen teil, die eine winzige Schildkröte in der Hand halten und alle fast gleichzeitig ins Meer setzen.

Der KWS hat festgestellt, daß Wasserschildkröten entlang der kenianischen Küste innerhalb der 20 Meilenzone weit verbreitet sind, hauptsächlich wo es Korallenriffe und Seegras gibt.

Die Schildkröten machen es wie die Zugvögel, sie legen weite Strecken von ihren Futterstellen zu den Brutplätzen zurück.

In kenianischen Gewässern wird das Vorkommen der Wasser-

schildkröten auf über 800 geschätzt, dabei sind hier lebende sowie nur hier brütende Tiere berücksichtigt.

Diese Zahl scheint recht groß zu sein, aber durch Plünderung der Nester, Jagd auf ausgewachsene Schildkröten und auf Eier, durch Wasserverschmutzung, Erosion der Strände und ständige Ausbreitung der menschlichen Siedlungen werden die Wasserschildkröten immer stärker bedroht.

In einigen Gebieten ist der Anteil der zufällig in Fischnetzen gefangenen Schildkröten sehr

hoch.

In kenianischen Gewässern wurden fünf Arten von Wasserschildkröten registriert, nämlich: Grüne Schildkröte (*chelonia mydas*), Falkenschnebel (*aretmochelys imbricata*), oliv Schildkröte (*lapidochelys olivacea*), Dlackopf (*caretta caretta*), Riesenielederrücken (*dermochelys coriacea*).

Es ist interessant und ermutigend, daß beide Projekte, KWS und Bamburi, mit beachtlichem Erfolg arbeiten, obwohl die Schildkröten jahrelang von den Küstenbewohnern gejagt wurden, da sie doch einen gewissen Wert darstellten als Nahrungsmittel und für kulturelle Zwecke.

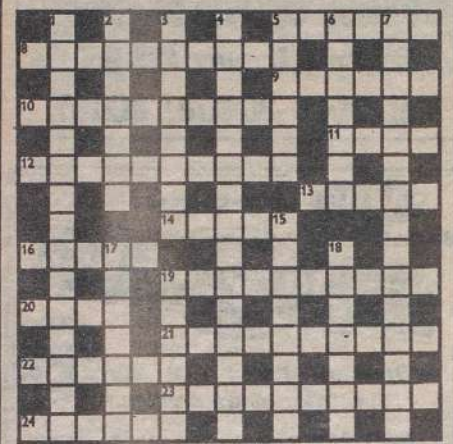

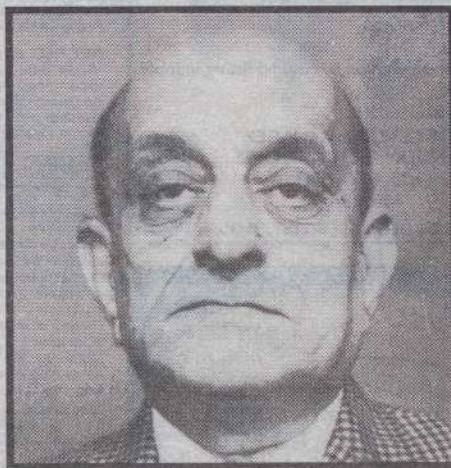

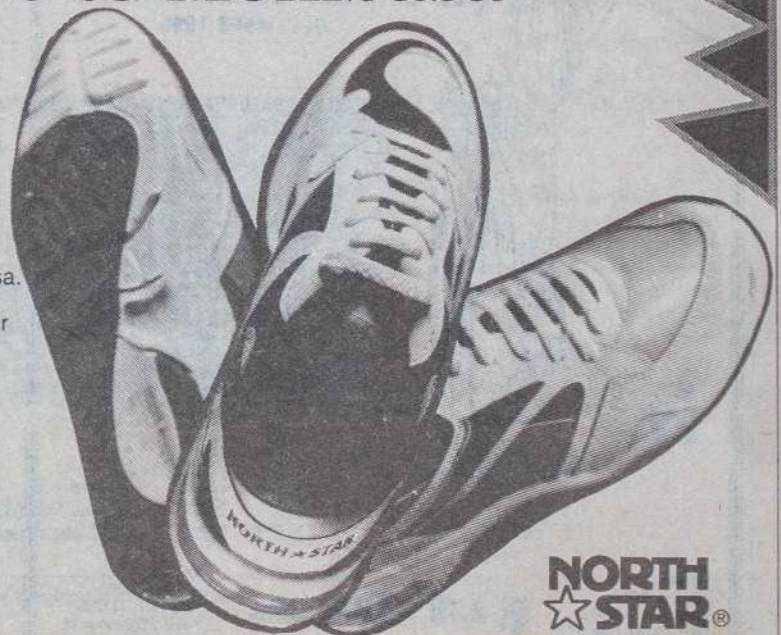

THE OTHER day, Kachumbari came into my office and told me that one his in-laws was doing a study on second hand cars.

I asked him what the study was for and he told me that he wanted to do what to ensure that he got the best value for money.

I asked Kachumbari what factors his in-law was taking into consideration during the study and his answer left me wondering how many people make the same mistake.

It is a common mistake both with new and second hand car purchases.

Most people buying cars will only look at the price and what one gets for the amount they pay.

Fitted items and specials thus go along way to selling a car under these circumstances.

The service history (or promise, for new cars) is also another factor that a lot of car buyers take into account when deciding which car to make to buy.

However, the "total cost of ownership (TCO)" should really be the deciding factor when one is setting out to buy a car.

The resale value is also an important consideration.

The latter should however be treated with care since fashions come and go.

A car that potentially had a good resale value when one bought it

could lose it very rapidly should the model develop serious problems... as did the earlier Italian "boxers" which were considered rust machines and the British Marinas that were pretending to be good cars but ended up as the worst product that particular manufacturer ever put on the road.

The TCO is a combination of a number of factors which contribute to affordable motoring in the long term.

pare their profits to a bare minimum in order to gain our custom.

However, this is done with the intention that we will service our vehicles with the dealer.

The reality is that we don't hence the dealer must hike up the price of parts in order to earn his ugali without bankrupting the company.

So the inflationary spiral continues.

We buy a car and refuse to use the dealer's workshop because the cost of labour and parts is seen to be high.

The dealer must make a living out of servicing so long as we do not go there he must charge those who do a higher than normal rate in order to keep his cash flow on the level.

We lose money when we sell the car because it was not dealer serviced.

The next chap who buys the car cannot afford the dealers service anyhow so he goes as far as making his own components rather than buying the ones from the "like original" shops dotted around town.

As Kachumbari says, if only dealers kept a totally fair pricing system and the user was honest enough (and had the money) to use the dealer then we could reduce the steepness of the upward spiral that we have created.



The initial cost is but only one item in the equation.

The running costs, repair costs, cost of spares and the depreciation are all important

items when one considers buying a car.

The long term reputation of the manufacturer is also another consideration.

All so often, when someone buys a new car, they will service it with the dealer only for the duration of the warranty period.

After that, economics come into play and the Jua Kali garage then starts seeing the car more often.

Such as Jua Kali outfits are getting more reputable, they will not replace the inherent guarantee that servicing with the local agent implies.

The major consideration for a motorist who has splashed out quite a bit of money for a car and can ill afford the luxury of dealer attention is that they have to balance between servicing the car, keeping it running and also paying for all the associated costs like insurance, road tax and so forth.

If one can show that the vehicle has been regularly serviced by the agent and only "genuine spares" have been used, the resale value of the car should be higher than if one explained that they had used a reliable Jua Kali garage owned by someone who used to work for the dealer.

The potential for cooking the results in the case of the Jua Kali user is too far high for the apparent saving in service costs.

The dealer also need to do their sums.

As motorists we already fork out a substantial amount of money to own a car.

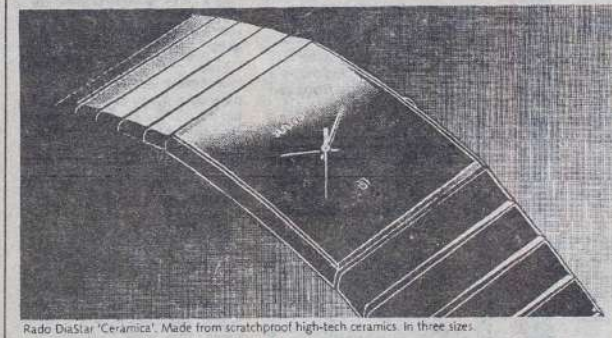
