## Rotarian Clubs Rescue Ziwani School For Deaf

The Ziwani School for the Deaf is to get a much needed facelift with the help of Rotary International.

This follows the joint efforts of the Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa and their international partner in Holland, the Rotary Club of Voorburg and the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

The desire to assist Ziwani School for the Deaf dates with the Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa back in 1995-96 when the then Club Chairman, Rtn Dr Varinder Singh Sur approached the Municipal Council to be allowed to develop a commercial property in the school compound

with a view to making the school self-sustaining from income generated and also at the same time have a Rotary center to assist the Coastal populace.

While the idea was well received by the Municipal Authorities the project had to be shelved.

In the Rotary year 1998-99, the Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa made another attempt to apply for assistance for the school

under Children's New Opportunity Grant from Rotary Foundation of Rotary International.

The demand for the 20 million dollars available with the foundation was so high worldwide that the application was time barred by just 20 days.

Rtn Johan van Scherpenzeel visited the Rotary Club of Voorburg in Holland and made a video presentation of the school.

Rtn. Dr Rob van Dongen from the Rotary Club of Voorburg visited Mombasa.

He was taken by his host Rtn. Johan Scherpenzeel of the Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa to visit Ziwani School for the Deaf.

On his return he addressed his club.

An international relationship was developed between the two clubs.

Club members of Voorburg approved the rehabilitation of The Ziwani School for The Deaf and set out to raise funds locally towards the project.

Rtn Johan van Scherpenzeel having completed his contract with the Kenya Petroleum Refineries bought many crafts from Mombasa and took them to Holland to be used for fund-raising.

The Voorburg club raised, over a year of activity, some US\$ 14,500.

Their Rotary district 1600 also contributed US\$ 4,500 from their District Designated Fund.

On its part the Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa raised the equivalent of US \$ 2,000 which was matched by Rotary District 9200 District Designated Fund by the then Governor Rtn Vijay K. Talwar to make in all US \$ 4,000.

With their joint collections in the kitty amounting to US\$23,000 both Rotary Clubs and District raised a successful application for Matching Grant from The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International for a similar amount.

## All Clever And Crooked, Raunchy And Racy, Sexy And Steamy ... Its That Sort Of Week!

WHEN YOU have a Gene Hackman starrer you know you have a surefire winner and if you add him to Danny DeVito, Delroy Lindo and Sam Rockwell mix with a generous fast paced plot, whisk in Director David Mamet and the result is a stupendous recipe for success.

**Heist**, which opens at NYALI CINEMAX this week has everything in it for the discerning cinegoer and must be seen.

Crack burglar Joe Moore (Hackman) has everything going for him - together with his loyal partners Bobby Blane (Delroy Lindo) and Pinky Pincus (Ricky Jay) he is the best at his job, a beautiful, young and very intelligent wife Fran (Rebecca Pidgeon) and a life of luxury amid the trappings of his spoils.

One day a job goes awry and his face is seen by a clerk.

Joe decides it is now time to retire but Mickey Bergman (Danny DeVito) the so-called businessman who buys all their loot has plans of his own.

Bergman is as crooked as they come and he arm-twists Joe into one final job - a shipment of gold coming on a Swiss airline.

To make sure that Joe goes through with the plan, Mickey sends his thick as a bat nephew Jimmy Silk (Sam Rockwell) with a reluctant Joe.

The plan is as complicated as a spider's web, getting stickier every step.

Joe manipulates his team through a series of plans to make the mission a success, yet he has to stay one step ahead of Mickey all the time.

Patrons please note that this film is rated 'R' for language and violence.

In true Bollywood style, David Dhawan has lifted the super comedy **Blue Streak** with Martin Lawrence and passed the film as his own Chor Machaaye Shor at the NYALI CINEMAX this week.

No doubt, the copy is excellent, especially that **Dhawan** has cut out the crudeness of the Hollywood film making this film a family entertainer which will have one and all in splits right through till the end.

Bobby Deol, Bipasha Basu, Shilpa Shetty and Paresh Rawal are the perfect cast for this out-and-out comedy.

# A Constant 'Knocking' Sound Spells 'Trouble' For Your CVs

With CVs becoming the norm, it is important that drivers should be aware of the maintenance needs of these sensitive components.

CVs - Constant Velocity Joints can clock very high mileage provided that the protective boots are in a sound condition.

A minor split or tear will allow grit in and damage to the CV will be very rapid.

When constant velocity joints begin to wear, one will hear a clunk as they engage at full power when the steering is at full lock.

In order to check the inner joints of a CV, turn a steering to full lock and then ease the power on and off and listen for any clunking.

Do this both ways and with both locks.

When the knock appears only as one turns then the offending joints should be replaced within two thousand kilometres.

If the knock appears when the car is being driven in a straight line then the offending joint should be replaced immediately.

One can get a few more thousand kilometres by swapping the shafts from one side of the car to the other.

This can only be done on cars where the lengths of the drive shafts are equal.

If the shafts are not equal in length then one has to remove the joints and swap them rather than simply swapping the shafts.

When a vehicle has vibration that increases with speed or kicks in at different speeds then there is excessive play in the inner or outer joints or a bent drive shaft.

One should replace the worn shaft assembly.

If one hears a clunking noise when engaging automatic

transmission it is likely that the inner or outer joints are worn.

One should replace the worn shaft assembly.

If there is a continuous knock

This indicates either a worn inboard joint or problem with the transaxle in the differential.

One should replace worn shaft assembly or repair transaxle as necessary.

If one hears a clicking or popping noise then it indicates a likely worn outer joint.

The remedy for this is to replace the shaft assembly.

If there is shuddering from the drive area during acceleration or deceleration then it is also an indication of a worn inner CV joint.

Again the shaft assembly should be replaced.

When the vibration is cyclic, then the inner tripod CV joint is worn and again the shaft assembly should be replaced.

### MAINTENANCE

Servicing the Constant Velocity (CV) joints is a maintenance task that should be performed at least every 80,000 kilometers or so.

The grease in the CV joints will harden and lose its lubricating properties over time.

If not replaced in time, this could lead to premature failure of the joint.

A properly and regularly maintained joint will easily outlast most street-driven vehicles.

While not too terribly difficult, it

at low speed then the likelihood is that the vehicle has a worn CV joint.

One should replace the worn assembly.

If a car has a continuous humming or growling noise coming from the drive areas then it is likely that there is inadequate lubrication on inner or outer joints.

One should check the boots for tears or leaks.

The noise may also be as a result of worn gears or wheel bearings.

All these should be inspected. If it is the CV joint making the noise, it should be replaced as necessary.

Sometimes, there could be a clunking noise during acceleration or deceleration.

## TWENTY THREE YEARS AGO

COASTWEEK, September 7 - 13, 1979:

OVER 16,000 job-seekers were registered in Mombasa during the ten percent additional employee intake drive. The Provincial Permits Officer, Mr. J.M. Odhiang, who also doubled up as the Provincial Employment Officer attached to the Kenyanization of the Personnel Bureau, said that 443 job vacancies remained.

He attributed the high number of vacancies remaining to job-seekers' low skill level as well as their apathy toward farm work and non-white collar jobs.

KENYA'S Civil Aviation Board (C.A.B.) rejected Enterprise Holidays's application for a charter service licence in a move that came as a great shock to many.

A subsidiary of British Airways, Enterprise Holidays was pioneering long-haul destinations to a hitherto virtually untapped mass market in the U.K. at very competitive prices.

A RICE shortage hit Mombasa as anxious residents awaited President Moi's personal directive on the prompt delivery of wheat, flour and rice to be implemented.

Mr. Mbalu, Maize and Produce Board area manager said that supplies of rice in areas with fewer consumers may have to be diverted to Mombasa to offset the shortage.

MASTER story-teller and 'griot' American-born Mary Carter Smith was visiting the Coast spending six days at the Trade Winds Hotel, Diani, where she gave a free show to honour the International Year of the Child.

In West Africa, a 'griot' was known as 'a keeper of history and master story teller.'

Over the years she had worked for a better understanding among blacks and whites, doing it the Griot way with stories, song and poetry, history and humour.

She had in the past performed for the Smithsonian Institute and the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington.

KENYA Cinema was beginning its run of "The Next Man" starring Sean Connery who plays Khalil Abdul Muhsen, an Arab Prince with a dream of peace who is sent by his King to address the United Nations to speak of compromise and hope.

NAAZ Cinema meanwhile was moving on to "Lawman," an action-packed story set in the wild West starring Burt Lancaster.

REGAL Cinema was still showing "The Ten Commandments" with Charlton Heston and Yul Brynner to packed audiences even though it was coming to the screen for the eight time that year.

dures, the application was approved and The Rotary Foundation has now sent to The Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa the total of the approved and collected funds amounting to US \$ 46,000 ( Shs. 3.4 million equivalent).

The Rotary Foundation is the world's largest foundation and offers assistance through Rotary Clubs throughout the world in humanitarian, educational and cultural grants.

The amounts are to be used to refurbish areas within Ziواني School for The Deaf to benefit the children by improving their living conditions.

The Rotary Club of Bahari-Mombasa will oversee the project.

In principle, the water supply and utilization needs improvement and that also Sanitation

and Toilet facilities are in dire need of rehabilitation.

Leaking roofs over the Dormitories and the kitchen are to be redone while external works that involve re-plastering and repainting of the accommodation areas will also be carried out.

The Ziواني School for The Deaf is a Municipality Primary School offering Boarding and tuition facilities to about 150 children with hearing disabilities under the general auspices of the Kenya Society for Deaf Children.

The day to day running of the school is met from the school fees that the parents of the disadvantaged children pay and also from well-wishers.

The school was started in 1970 with only one class of about 5 children.

Currently the school has a complete primary section and

two nursery classes.

The first lot sat for the K.C.P.E. examinations in 1982 and performed well.

The Rotary Club of Bahari Mombasa was chartered in May 1984 and has accomplished many community projects.

The current Chairman is Rtn. Maina Njanga, a practicing Lawyer.

The Club is in Rotary District 9200 (comprising of 90 Clubs in Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda).

# Giant Marlin Opens New Season

## With A Splash!

Once again a new fishing season has opened, as the months roll by, for those piscatorial enthusiasts whose year is governed, not by the passing of summer and autumn, nor by the wet and the dry, but by the wrath of the ocean abating to let the boats get back in the water, with their clean, newly painted hulls and gleaming metalwork shining.

The rods have been stripped and varnished, the reels serviced and greased, and we all look forward to hearing that vibrating scream of the ratchet that signals a strike!

But even the most optimistic dreams of skipper Adrian Paul of the well known Malindi charter boat *Eclare* on only his second trip of the new season did not envisage boating a giant black marlin of 381 kgs!

Thanks to *Gail Shaw* for this report below:-

The new fishing season started with a bang last Wednesday (10th July) for Malindi boat *'Eclare'*.

First day out for skipper Adrian Paul with Andrew Mott fishing, down for a quick weekend at Hemingways.

After live bating a 10kg yellowfin tuna for nearly an hour, they were just about to move on, when the bait was taken by something large, initial thoughts a shark, but after a massive

eruption out of the water, shouts of Marlin came from the crew.

One and a half hours later the fish was on the trace, but with one sight of the boat, ripped the line out of the crew's hand and jumped once more.

Now it was apparent that this was a large fish and estimates of weight from 400 - 700lbs were being whispered by the other anglers and crew on board.

Remaining just below the boat for the next 3 hrs, finally dragging the boat out to the 'Boiling Pot', the fish gave up and was brought quickly to the surface where upon the real size was realised.

All seven people on board were involved in controlling the gaffed fish.

After spending 10mins trying to drag the Marlin into the safety of the boat away from prowling sharks, this was found to be impossible, so the fish was tossed behind the boat arriving in Malindi well after dark.

The fish, a Black Marlin, weighed in at an amazing 840lbs (only 2lbs smaller than the biggest Black Marlin ever caught in Kenya).

Let's hope this will be the first of many big fish to be caught this season.

This is a most unusual catch for the beginning of July when small marlin are the norm.

But apart from one of 99 kgs on stablemate *Snark*, this is the only

marlin to have been caught so far, though as the seas calm off in mid August we would hope that these fish would start to show.

There are some sailfish, nearly all the strikes coming in the shallows near the reef at the bottom of the Watamu Banks, where both *Eclare* and *Tina* picked up three each in early August, and some singles have been caught since, but the yellowfin tuna have made most of the running this season so far, just as they did all last season and the one before.

Both Malindi and Watamu boats have been catching half a dozen a day, mostly in the 15-30 kg range with the odd biggie over 50 kgs.

The mantis prawns are the catalyst for these golden sided battlers, and these are still shoaling around the top of the Banks.

Never have they stayed for so long in their previous visitations many years ago, as they now enter the third year of their stay, and where the tuna are, there are, of course, sharks.

### HEMINGWAYS

*B's Nest* from Hemingways, made an early start this season, and was catching seven yellowfin in a day by 4th July, and tagged a sail of 20 kgs for Glenn Bond from Cumbria in UK on their next trip.

This same boat has caught, tagged and released, a silvertip shark of 100kgs, and three bull sharks running 120 to 160 kgs.

conditions for the AirKenya Gamefish Challenge out of Malindi.

Sailfish were plentiful, outside the Leopard Reef, in contrast to close in at the Banks where most of the fish have been recently, but they were most disinclined to feed, and even the skills of Malindi's top boats were not enough to get them on the line, with the exception of *Tarka*, where J. Stymiest, P Burrow and C. Dean found four the first day and one on the Sunday - putting them in the money as no other boat landed a sail at all! *Snark* finished runner-up, with a giant trevally and other fish, and Neptune third, a kingfish as their best catch.

But the fact that the sailfish were there is a good omen, as in Malindi waters the sail are always reluctant to take the baits early in the season, while the profusion of whitebait and prawns would indicate plenty of feed to attract the fish when they do decide to turn on and bite!

In the fortnight preceding, Malindi boats had been catching quite a few sail, with Thomas Wright notching up a pair on both *Tina* and *Neptune*, and this latter boat also scored a pair with Nick Plydell and J. Mott, as well as a big 23 kg kingfish - plenty of steaks in that one!

Down the coast at Watamu, Hemingways boats were scoring on the Banks, with Andrew and Freddie Poplewell, a father and son team, tagging a black marlin each on *Oi Jagi*, at

100 and 75 kgs a nice day out. The same boat tagged a stripe marlin and a sail with Anthony and Terese Verploegh two days before, and *B's Nest* had the sail with the Morse family from Manchester, while Anthony Woodburn was disappointed to have his marlin eaten off the line by a big shark!

Quite a common occurrence at Watamu waters, and this sort of fishing is more like what you used to expect from Watamu August in former times!

*Tarka*, *AlleyCat* and *Cast Lager* have been running a from Ocean Sports, with the former on great form with a sail or two most days, while a catch of 32 kgs was a notable catch and mixed catches of yellowfin kingfish, wahoo and barracuda were general on the other boats.

So the fish are around, and the weather improves we look forward to good catches.

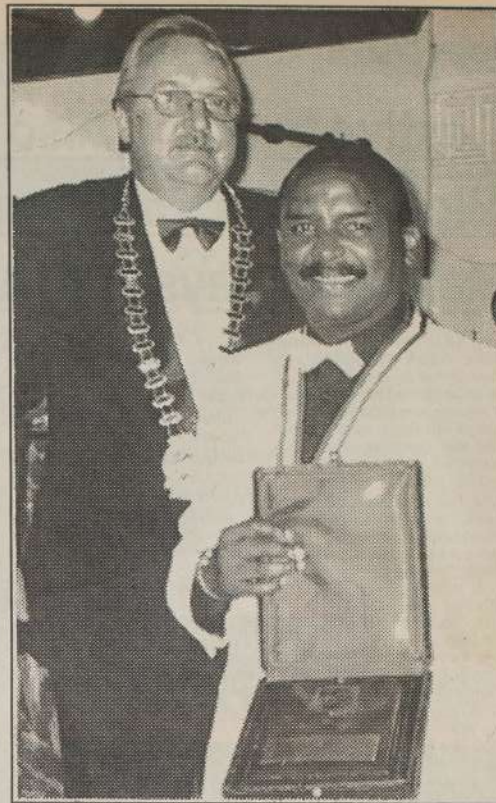

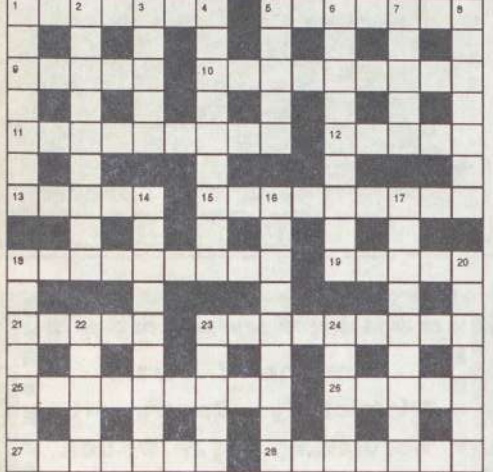

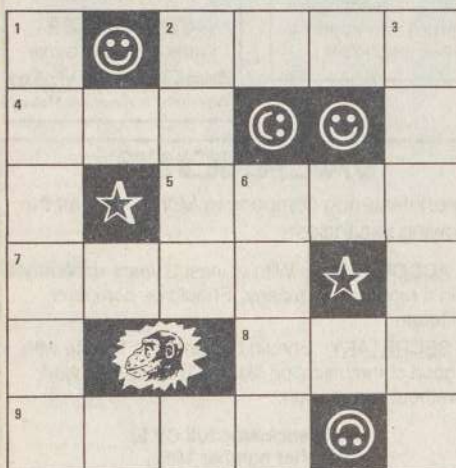
