The Buccaneer Wrecks team received permission to depart from the Comarco Base, were Dania has spent the last year undergoing extensive preparation, shortly before 07.00 hrs.

At which point M.V. Dania was towed to her KWS designated position 50m outside the natural reef off Bamburi Beach.

Captain Bahero started pumping water into the bowels of the vessel at 11.00

Thirty minutes later the kettle patches that were plugging the pre-cut holes in Dania's hull were forcefully ejected by the weight of water accumulating behind them and Dania's gradual descent began.

At 12:32 p.m. Dania started to list to her port side, but as the water continued to pour in she straightened up and at 13.05 p.m. she disappeared within a matter seconds to her watery grave.



13.05 p.m. - DANIA disappeared within a matter seconds to her watery grave off the Bamburi reef.

The Buccaneer Wrecks Diving crew proceeded to follow her to the bottom some 20 minutes later and found her sitting perfectly upright in 30 m of water in a north south line.

On Monday the Buccaneer divers based at Whitesands and Voyager Resort visited her again and found much to their satisfaction that she had already been inhabited by Remora, Sardines and Fry

FOR ALL you lovers of Robert Ludlum feast your eyes and senses on the hottest release at NYALI CINEMAX with Matt Damon in The Bourne Identity.

The book may be old (a 1980 print) but the story is still just as fresh as this morning's dew on the leaves and director Doug Liman gives it that extra oomph.

The story begins with a young bullet-riddled man who is rescued from the high seas by Italian fishermen.

On gaining consciousness, the man does not know himself from Adam, for he has totally lost his memory.

With the passing days he experiences strange and specific talents that are hidden within him.

He can fight like a professional, is multi-lingual and his self defence skills would put a commando to shame.

With these kind of qualifications it becomes very obvious that this is no ordinary man.

Add to that the fact that a microfilm has been surgically implanted in his hip.

Further examination of the negative reveals a number to a Swiss bank account which holds four million U.S. Dollars and a name - Jason Bourne.

Now that he has a name - any name - Bourne feels that his past is definitely a very hairy one, especially since there are people who seem to know him and some who don't want him walking the earth.

Desperately searching for his identity and past, he is assisted by the rebellious Marie (Franka Potente) and their journey takes them through some of the most scenic and exciting places in Prague, Paris and Italy.

Going Into 'Three Dimensions' With Computers

Many of us have invested because you have all "heard" that they can do wonders in terms of reducing labour intensive tasks

Yet a lot of us do not make full use of them or invest further to train staff to run the softwares installed in them.

With today's cheap and powerful computers and the software that you run, this could potentially transform the way

The benefits are huge, but there are also too many options - and never enough time to get to grips with them all.

Of course first you need to need to learn how to use each software application you buy.

The following articles focus on what you can do with the softwares that are already available in your computer.

Here is how you can make full use of word processors, spreadsheets, databases, contact management software, accounting groupware. software and

Word processing e.g Microsoft Word:

Word processing is most often used use of computers today, your business will use it for everyday paperwork, such as letters, price quotes and product leaflets, but are you making full use of its potential ?

A networked business can make a full set of correct, up-todate, standard documents

This is mostly useful for documents like price lists, letters etc. which keep changing.

Mail shots are easy to do using mail-merge and most often ignored today in Kenya.

The fact being that we are not trained enough to use the potential of it.

Basically what you do is to copy all the addresses into the 'data source', and then link it to the 'form letter' and then print it out with the names and address being picked from the database for each individual letter.

This saves a lot of time and energy instead of typing out the addresses individually and sending it to print.

If you familiar with mail merge then and mail different addresses with each mail shot

consider using a spreadsheet or database as your source of addresses

Spreadsheets e.g Microsoft

Spreadsheets are most ideal for displaying and manipulating data in tables and making simple or even complicated calculations

include budgets, inventories stock, Vat and work schedules

You can also use spread-sheets to organize and track You can schedule activities in the form of table

For example, your production department can use tables to track orders through different stages to completion.

By inserting a column for each stage of the production, you can generate progress reports.

For example each column ends when the order is completed.

The spreadsheet can then tell

you how many orders in total are production plan for that

You can also use codes (letters or numbers) to show which person (or supplier, or storage location) is linked to the item in question.

Tasks such as promotional mail shots and sales campaigns are easy to control using spreadsheet.

Spreadsheets are also used for staff and management reporting. Individual

They simply fill in the boxes under each heading designed to suit the reports necessary. Calculations such as margins, total volume and total sales are

done automatically daily. The reports can then be combined to form a summary

report weekly or monthly. Administrative work that might

have taken hours each week can be done in minutes, and is less likely to contain errors as the reports are inputted directly from the staff and managers.

Most spreadsheets allow you to display data in graph form also which helps in statistical survey of the business.

At the same time spreadsheets can be used as a do-it-yourself accounting tool

They are ideal for modeling what if scenarios. For example, costing, budgets be mapped onto a spreadsteet You can find out the effed on

the bottom line of changing and one item from the budgets the you have set for the year. You can use a spreadshed b quickly sort and display ker information contained in lists and

reports. Filter the list according to different criteria - by date or alphabetically, or by code alphabetically, or by code numbers, or by size of order.

For example customer ist can be alphabetically sorted while sales can also be sorted date wise

You can then use three dimensional graphs to compare data from different periods of the activity

To compare profit margins for example on three different products over a year on one diagram use pie charts to sho the relative importance different items.

Or to show how different para your business contribute your profits

Your spreadsheet can also be compatible with any accounting software you use.

You can then import data into the spreadsheet straight from your accounts and analyze to display it in whatever way it most useful





The heritage of Classical Greece, both scientific and philosophical, was largely returned to the West, as it had been lost for centuries to the west, through translations undertaken in Islamic Lands.

Muslims also learnt the technique of making paper from the Chinese warriors they had captured in a battle in Samarkand and eventually relayed the process to Europe.

ABUL DASIM KHALFF IBN AL-ZAHRANI - Known in Europe as Albucasis, was one of those muslim scientists surgery.

Born in 936 AD in Cortova, spent his life working as a practicing physician and pharma-cist-surgeon.

Lso contributed to theology and natural sciences.

Al-Zahrani was the first to recommend surgical removal of broken patella (knee-cap) and devised new obstetrical for-

He also gave original descriptions for manufacturing and using probes, surgical knives and scalpels of hooks of various shapes and designs.

After 50 years of dedicated work in the field of medicine and surgery, he wrote his book "Tasrif Li-man Ajjaza- Anal Talif", completed in 1000 AD, translated into several European languages which laid the foundation of Western Surgery.

It was studied by students of surgery in Europe till the 19th

AL-HASAN IBN AL-HAYTHAM - Astronomer Mathematician and physician Known in the west as Al-hazen and had a 20th century mind in the 10th century world.

Born in Basra in 965 AD educated in Basra and Baghdad.

Later moved to Cairo, then the hub of Islamic world and a great centre of learning.

A pioneer in scientific studies in Optics and Light.

First to draw the eye to illustrate phenomenon of the expansion

of flat surfaces and to explain the phenomenon of Reflection and Expansion.

His great work is "Kitab Fill His great work is "Kitab Fill Manazir," the Book on Optics translated in Latin and published in Basle in 1572 under the title "THESAURUS OPTICS" and formed the basis of optical works of Roger Bacon.

His pioneer work on optics influenced Loenardo da Vinci, Johann Kepler and Sir Isaac

ABU RAYHAN ALBIRUNI - Born in suburb of
Kath, Khwarizan in 973 AD,
studied and acquired a reputation as a versatile scholar of
the highest order as scientist
and mathematician, astronomer
and one of the greatest
historians.

Studied Sanskrit and Indian custom and spent 40 yrs in quest of knowledge.

Invented the 'Biruni Method' for measurement of Radius and discussed the rotation of the earth on its axis, accurately measured latitudes and longitudes

Also invented a method to measure generic weight for nine

Discovered the nature of liquid pressure and a method to extract salt from the sea.

Other famous are Qanun Al-Masudi, an astronomical ency-

ABU ALI AL-HUSAYN IBN ABDALLA IBN SINA -Most influential of all Muslim philosopher scientists in the western world, where he was known Avicenna and had a reputation as an outstanding physician.

"Kitab AshShifa" (Book of Healing) and Al Qanun Fi At-Tibb (the cannon of medicine).

The former is vast philosophical and scientific encyclopedia, probably the largest of its kind ever written by one man.

The latter book became the medical authority for several centuries and a text book as late

IBN SINA - Distinguished 15 types of illnesses and prescribed 760 remedies.

Also studied tuberculosis

IBN ZUHR - One of Islam's greatest medical practitioner during the western caliphate known as Avenzoar in Europe, Born Seville, Spain in 1090 AD.

Became the father of Dietetics composed the 'Kitab al Taysir Fil Mudawat- Wal Tadbir' (Practical Manual of Treatment

He described pericarditis (inflammation of the memberanous surrounding the heart) and outlined surgical procedures for trachestomy, excision of cataracts and removal of kidney stones.





day of every month, at the Camonth, at the Ca-tholic Dispensary, provides afford-able care and medication to the

ever-growing numbers attend-ing this clinic. Opened in 1999, under the auspices of the Kenya Association of the Welfare of Epileptics, the clinic is now selfsupporting and is run on a charitable base by a team of hard working volunteers.

The first clinic attended to just 17 patients, today nearly 100 patients are seen at each clinic, with the numbers rising by a steady ten per cent per month.] Also rising is the cost of providing the much-needed medication.

Each patient pays just Ksh 50/ for consultation and medication, which is about half the actual cost involved

Clinic committee are most grateful to some very caring Diani groups. In making up this short fall, the

Two members of this Woman's League have continually helped at each clinic since 1999.

The Diani/ Ukunda Catholic Church, under the Father in Charge, Father Angelino and his church committee has been ever supportive and encouraging in this project

The clinic is held in the church

hall, with several of the volunteer helpers coming from the Church women and youth groups.

Sister Germana Mkiwa, the Sister in Charge of the Catholic Dispensary is vested with the over all responsibility for the medical direction of this clinic.

She, in associ-ation with volunteer clinical offi-cers from the Tiwi Rural Health Cen-

tre, Kwale Hosp-ital and N'Gombeni, carry out the consultations and treatment of

Detailed records of each patient's progress are kept and home visits made to encourage parents and families to understand the need for continual daily use of medication.

Three members of the Similani Development Organisation, an Ukunda community based organisation, have been working volunteers with this clinic since it started.

One members, Mr. Idd Mwa-ropia, having been chairperson of the Clinic Committee for two years

Committed individuals from the Diani/Ukunda area are also in-volved, resulting in a well-run caring clinic

The patient's awareness and appreciation is clearly visible.

The Diani/ Ukunda Public Health Office actively encourages awareness and treatment for persons with epilepsy.

The clinic is grateful to the understanding and support extended to the clinic by the Ministry of Health and the District Public Health Office.

Kwale Health Forum also encourages each of the 29 registered NGOs and CBOs, working within Kwale District, to include an element of support for epilepsy sufferers in their





The ocean is one place where one often does see the end of the rainbow, although this tends to away as one approaches, and so it must have seemed to the fishers on two boats from the Kingfisher fleet at Malindi on the first day of the Cooper Motors Group sponsored Festival as they roared mile after mile northwards looking as they roared mile after mile northwards looking for their crock of gold - golden yellowfin tuna in this

Eclare, with Ian Fenton, Robert Duff and Adrian Paul on the rods, were lucky to have the fun of one of their tunny being swallowed by a big black marlin, estimated around 600 pounds, which they eventually played to the boat

But on a short, thin leader designed for the tuna, not marlin, they were unable to get either a tag or a gaff in, and the magnificent fish swam away free en the leader broke in the mate's hand

Bad luck for their score, though, as with the remaining time they only got 24 tuna, and with

another 13 on the second day, they managed an easy second place, tho' with only half the points score of their sister boat.

Meantime, Ol Jogi, with skipper Rob Hellier, one started from Watamu and fished the Banks both

With a sailfish tagged the first day, and two the next day, plus seven wahoo and a kingfish, the team of D. Griffith, P. Hitchen and A. Monro secured the third position, a great break from their holiday at Hemingways

Simple Auto Electronics: Wires, Connectors And Fuses

This week we will start looking at the electrical system of the car.

The first and major component is the wiring harness that goes round the whole vehicle.

The main components of this harness are simple ... t connectors and fuses the wires.

There are also bores in the system such as the engine management computers, alarm and security systems and so forth.

Reliability of these components has improved immensely in the recent years.

Along with increased reliability, the complexity of car wiring systems has increased dramatically.

Cars now have literally thousands of circuits

Let us start with looking at the wires.

A car's wiring has to distribute power from the battery to devices located all over the It also has to transmit data as

well as a variety of digital and analogue signals from switches and sensors This means that there are many

different types of wires in the Wires that transmit signals from

switches or sensors carry almost no current.

Those that provide power to electric motors or power devices have to carry lots of current.

The amount of current that each wire can handle depends on certain characteristics such as its length, the material it is made of, its thickness and how it is set up (or bundled) in the car.

If a wire sees more current than it is designed to carry, it can overheat and melt.

Each of the wire's characte-nstics affects the wire's currentcarrying capacity

Let us start with the length. Each type of wire has a certain amount of resistance per metre

The longer the wire, the higher the resistance that length offers to the flow of electric current

If the resistance is too high, a lot of the power that flows down the wire will be wasted as it is

Ultimately, heat build-up limits the current-carrying capacity of

It is also important that the temperature must not get high enough to melt the covering (insulation) of the wire

The wire used in vehicles is usually made up of a bundle of many fine copper strands.

The finer the individual strands, the lower the resistance per strand and the more current the wire can carry.

The type of copper used has

an effect on the resistance of

The down side is that the finer

the strand, the more susceptible it is to breaking.

There must be a balance between the size of the strand

and the strength requirements

The wire gauge, or thickness of the wire (bundle of strands), also determines how much resistance the wire has.

The smaller the gauge, the

A 16-gauge wire is thicker than a 24-gauge wire.

If the wire is in a bundle with 50

The next component that we will look at is the fuse.

The main job of the fuse is to protect the wiring from a malfunction in the device to which it is supplying power

Malfunctions tend to cause devices to draw too much power

Fuses are sized and located to protect the wire they are connected to. protect

If a device in the car such as the car radio were to suddenly draw enough current to blow the fuse, the radio would probably be

The fuse is there to protect the wire, which would be much harder to replace than

the radio

There are generally two groups of fuses in cars.

The first group are the so called heavy duty fuses meant for devices like cooling fans, the anti-lock brake pump, the engine control unit and so forth

The second group of fuses are for lighter current users such as internal lighting, in car entertainment systems, indicators wash wipe systems and so forth.

These fuses can be grouped in two separate fuse boxes with

lighter current ones in a fuse box inside the passenger compartment of the vehicle somewhere under the dash

The trend in recent years is to have all the fuses located in central, easy to find location in

In the last section we say how the heat build-up in the wire depends on the resistance of the wire and the amount of current flowing through it.

PROTECTION

Fuses are really just a special type of wire in a self-contained connector

Most automotive fuses today have two blade connectors and a plastic housing that contains the conductor

There are also some fuses that are in the wiring of the car, called fusible links

The wire inside the fuse is made of a metal that has a lower metting point than the wire being protected.

The size of the conductor in the fuse is calibrated very carefully so that when the rated current is reached, enough heat generated to

Coming Over The Top

A blown fuse must be replaced with a fuse of the same amperage. One must also check and find

out why the fuse blew in the first

It is a good habit to check fuses in the vehicles at least once every three months.

This will give one the confidence that when one needs to operate some of the components that are infrequently used then they will at least have a power supply. The most foolproof way to

check a fuse is to pull it out of its receptacle and hook up a continuity tester to both blades of the fuse

But if this check is done whilst the fuse is plugged in, there could continuity through a path other than the fuse (for instance both sides of the wire may be grounded when checking the

One can usually tell if a fuse is blown by a visual inspection.

We will continue next week with connectors.

As Kachumbari says, fuses do not protect the devices in the vehicle but instead protect the
