



Following the appalling atrocity in Mombasa when an international terrorist organisation from outside Kenya targeted Israeli interests and killed nine Kenyans and three Israeli citizens, the situation is as follows

We have received an overwhelming number of messages of support from many leading international tour operators in our source markets and it appears that the level of cancellators has been far lower than might have been expected.

The government has indicated that extra attention is being given to security issues, particularly at airports and fourist to answer that the safety of

given to security issues, particularly at airports and tourist resorts to do everything possible to ensure that the safety of our visitors remains a high priority.

Our KTF Safety and Communication Centre continues to monitor all aspects relating to the security of our tourist visitors on a 24 hour basis.

KWS continues to maintain an effective presence in the parks to see that our tourists' safety is well looked after.

- Since the Mombasa afrocity, regular meetings are being held between the senior Government officers, Kenya Tourist Board and KTF on behalf of the private sector tourism stakeholders to ensure that everything possible is being done to ensure that Kenya remains an attractive holiday destination. for our overseas visitors.

To emphasise this message and to demonstrate that Kenya is operating as normal there will be increased marketing undertaken in our key overseas source market

Kenya is part of the international community and it is a sad fact that in this modern day and age there is an increased threat of random terrorist attacks in most parts of the free

The British High Commission in Nairobi has informed us that they received a specific threat relating to their building and therefore deemed it prudent to vacate their offices while this threat was being investigated.

The offices would have been closed anyway over the ublic holiday and week-end and they re-opened as usual on Monday.

However in the meantime they have recommended that British visitors avoid the immediate vicinity of the High Commission which is located at some distance from nearest tourist hotel.

The British High Commission has informed us that they do not consider this threat to their building to be a general threat to British interests in Kenya and that British companies and other organisations in Kenya should operate as normal but naturally should exercise caution as in other countries worldwide

The British travel advisory relating to Kenya remains unchanged and the British High Commission indicated that at the present time there is no reason to alter it so British visitors may continue with their holidays to Kenya as normal.

It is worth noting that the British travel advisory on Kenya warns that UK nationals anywhere in the world should be aware of the risk of indiscriminate attacks on civilian targets in public places, including tourist sites worldwide, so this is not a threat that is specific to Kenya.



Over 500 prisoners and staff members have been treated by the Abha Light Foundation

What was exceptional about this medical camp, however, was that the medical team exclusively prescribed with Homeopathy, a system of alternative medicine.

Abha Light Foundation (ALF) is a Nairobi-based NGO spearheading the introduction of Homeopathy into Kenya.

We never saw this kind of medicine before but some of us

"I hope they will return soon

As a science of natural medicine, Homeopathy stands about halfway between traditional herbal medicine and conventional medicine

Didi Ananda Ruchira explained "Homeopaths do not see any conflict with either herbalists or doctors of Western medicine.

NATURAL SOURCE

"All our medicines are derived from natural sources such as herbs and frees and in places such as USA, Europe and India, homeopaths cooperate with many hospitals and health care systems."

In Nairobi, Abha Light is presently running two clinics in Kariobangi North and Mathare

ALF sends out mobile clinics.


Last April the first six students graduated from the homeopathy course and are now practicing their new-found profession.

Another fifteen are in training and in January, a new session of freshman students will begin

The course is two years of intensive study in homeopathic medicine and basic primary health care.

Return Of 'Kaskazi' Heralds Good Catches Of

The wild leaps and dramatic runs of sailfish brought intense excitement to anglers on some Mtwapa boats last week

James Addock's boat Vuma, a Norweigan angler based in Nairobi had the thrill of the first sailfish of his life bending down his rod and pulling out the

This was Stig Ornes, who was fishing with compatriots Ivar Stromso and his nine year old son Marcus, on Wednesday.

The sailfish stayed on the hook but freed itself of the water and took to the air, leaping many times, twisting and shaking, then

Sailfish, Yellowfin Tuna, Kingfish And Dorado

Eventually it was pulled to the boat, where it was 'tagged' ready for refease, but it had been damaged by the hook and had to be taken on board.

It weighed 23.4 kilos, about fifth perfect as a pour series.

fifty pounds, an average sailfish for these waters

Young Marcus caught a fish

Another sailfish showed itself on the wide stage of the sea on Friday, rising against the backdrop of a turbulent sky, slashing its bill at the clouds.

This one was on the end of Martin Meissner's line when he was fishing on another of James Adoock's boats, the Sesse cance Samvuke

The sailfish was hooked while the boat was drift-fishing, using colourful party balloons as

It jumped and cut the sea with its failing run and jumped again and when it seemed done with jumping it took to the sky once

After twenty minutes of rod work, when it was very near the boat, it made a final jump and set itself free, which was fine with

Two other fish were even luckier, two good-sized kingfish that Martin

the boat too, and they both shook the hook and got

big Captain's fish, though, and took it to his favourite restaurant and had it for dinner.

MWALIMU

Two other kingfish were caught on the same day by John Webb and Rob Jessop who were fishing on Ontos

These weighed seven kilos and six kilos, and they caught a golden dorado, also of six kilos, and a rainbow runner and a small trevally and a coral trout.

Not bad fishing for them on day when some other boats found the hot, still, sultry weather had dulled their hooks as well as their judgements.

Steve Blanchet was one of the fishermen who caught nothing that day, no change for him as he had never caught a fish in his

Never say never, though, and Steve very sensibly set about learning to fish last week

The first two times, he caught nothing, which he thought a good thing as you don't want to peak before you're properly started

Then in his own boat Akach on Saturday he did catch, he caught four small five-finger

A good way to begin, with small fish, and then the next day he went out in Vuma and caught kawakawa of four another step up the scale

Sensibly again, he took two of his daughters with him, eight-year-old Olivia and seven-year-

Neve held the rod for a bit while the kawakawa was spinning line off the spool and she summarized the experience

"It was tough !"

Three other young anglers were on board, thirteen-year-old Charlyne, nine-year-old Ron and Tamara, aged seven, and they saw flying fish and turtles.

Their father, Andre Artenstein also caught a fish, a kingfish of four and a half kilos, making an enjoyable day.

Munar Dhanjee had two days ishing in the Yamaha canoe, Paw-Paw, and caught a dorado rainbow Saturday.

He also rodded a good, big long wahoo right to the boat but it away sped away from the gaff

The next day Hershil Rawal and Daniel Shah joined him and they caught a small trevally.

Hafiz Mangalji's Maverick had a kingfish day on Sunday catching four of over ten kilos each and eight kawakawa.

Ontos caught fish too, at least those on board did, Rob Jessop, John Webb and Stephen Webb.

They caught a dorado of three and a half kilos and two small trevally, and they released seven five-finger jack.

An unusual event, releasing five-finger jack, probably brought on by the mind-numbing combination of all those five and sevens, too much for the brain of a fisherman, best put them all back, pretend it never happened.

Martin Meissner had more success with his kingfish on Sunday catching one of thirteen kilos, and also a rock cod and a



RE-OPENING OF THE DELPHIS BANK LTD

- Alean balance sheet with broad based capital base at Kshs. 1.25 billion;
- An improved liquidity position supported by fresh capital cash injection of Kshs. 300 million by the local shareholders; and
- Anew professional team of management and a newly constituted board of directors.

Upon re-opening, the bank will offer all types of commercial banking services and all depositors and creditors are requested to surrender the relevant original documents and to complete claim forms available at any of the branches of the bank

Depositors and creditors are advised that they may, if they so wish, withdraw their funds or simply reactivate their accounts since an amount of Kshs. 100,000 will be readily available, safe

Creditors without accounts will be allowed to open new accounts and continue operations if they so wish.

The management of the bank will operate under the newly constituted board composed of five directors.

The Chairman of the board will be Mr. Girish V. Shah while Mr. Yogesh M. Shukla will be the Managing Director.

The other board members are Messrs. Vipul T. Patel, Azim J. Virjee, and Prabhulal J. Shah.

In the meantime, a steering committee has been established to oversee the implementation of the Scheme of Arrangement.

The bank will also remain under close supervision and advise from the Central Bank

The Central Bank wishes to thank the various parties who have been instrumental in the successful restructuring of the bank.





PRESBYCUSSIS (OLD AGE HEARING IMPAIRMENT)

Hearing difficulty caused by the aging process is just one of many problems faced by the elderly Largely because of advances in medical science in the last two decades, the number of aged persons in our society has increased steadily.

Hearing loss that develops as a function of advancing age has been termed PRESBYCUSSIS. It is the most common kind of Sensory Neural Hearing Impairement.

It should be expected in men by the early 60's and women by the late 60's

The loss of hearing by presbycussis is a rather slow, insidious process and probably starts early in life although the symptoms of hearing loss are usually not manifested until the person is over 50 years.

The higher sound frequencies are affected first, and as the disorder gradually progresses, the person has trouble in hearing lower frequency sounds as well. Comprehension of speech is affected.

It is for this reason that an older person may be labelled as being inattentive or senile, when actually he just has presbycussis.

Presbycussis has no contributing etiological factors except advancing age

Lesions in presbycussis are not restricted only to the cochlea.

The aging process undoubtedly produces alterations in many areas of the auditory system including the tympanic membrane, Ossicular chain, cochlea windows, and the central auditory nervous systems

However poor hearing should not be considered just another problem.

The process of communication is vital if we wish to maintain our social well-being. The ability to communicate with one's friends and

neighbours during the twilight years can help alleviate some of the myriad of problems during these years. Since it is a gradual and a progressive loss, audiological

assessment periodically after the age of 50 years may assist towards early intervention.

Provision of amplification through hearing aid may help many although a hearing aid is not the total answer

A greater understanding of this problem by other family members is needed.

Rehabilitation in this type of a case should involve family counselling, so that its members can do their share in improving communication, shouting at persons having presbycussis does not help

Instead talking more slowly and distinctly helps

It is also important that the family realise the advantages. and disadvantages of hearing aids and how they operate.

POOR INSULATION - CAN CAUSE VERY MYSTERIOUS ENGINE PROBLEMS

Basic Facts On Vehicle Ignition Systems

After having looked at the spark plug and the coil we turn to the

This component handles several jobs.

Its first job is to distribute the high voltage from the coil to the correct cylinder in the engine.

This is achieved by the operation of the cap and the

rotor, which spins inside the

contacts with one contact for each cylinder. each contact, a high-voltage pulse comes from the coil.

The voltage pulse jumps across the small gap between the rotor and the contact (they don't actually touch) and then continues down the spark-plug wire to the spark plug on the

appropriate cylinder when one goes for a tune-up, one of the things replaced in the engine is the cap and rotor — these eventually wear out because of the arcing.

Also, the spark-plug wires eventually wear out and lose some of their electrical insulation.

This can be the cause of some mysterious engine problems

Older models of vehicles are likely to have been fitted with distributors with breaker points

These types have another section in the bottom half of the distributor whose role is breaking the current to the coil

The earthed side of the coil is cted to the breaker points A cam in the center of the distributor pushes a lever connected to one of the points.

There, the pulses signal a transistor to break the low-voltage sub-circuit and release high voltage from the coil to the spark plugs.

These short-lived electronic ignition systems were a transition from the points and condenser system to the computerized ignition system.

Currently there are cars that need their first tune-up after at least 100,000 kilometres.

One of the technologies that enables this long maintenance interval is an ignition system that does not have a distributor.

Instead of one main coil as in the old systems, this modern type of ignition has a coil for each spark plug which is located directly on the spark plug itself. The coil in this type of system works the same way as the larger centrally-located coils.

The engine control unit controls the transistors that break the earthed side of the circuit, which generales the spark. This gives the ECU total control over spark
