The Portuguese explorer, with a fleet of three ships, arrived in Malind on 15th April 1498, seeking the assistance of a local pilot to

He got a triendly reception from the Sultan and the people of Malindi and the ships were provided with food and fresh water, various entertainments; and the experienced pilot Ahmed libn Majid.

Vasco da Gama got to India, and on his return to Portugal he again called in to Malindi on 7th January 1499 to get supplies and then he put up a stone cross pillar near the Sultan's Palace.

This was taken down and later erected on the point near Malindi's harbour where it stands today.

The Malindi Museum Society felt that the 500th anniversary of Vasco da Gama's first visit to Malindi could be used to organise events an important tourist destination and provide an opportunity for community cultural activities.
