"The improvement of Kabaa School should be addressed as a matter of priority because of its current situation", said Fisse.

The tourists visited the school early in the week and donated a wheelchair to Ellis Ndete Makau, a 15 years old disabled student.

They have also donated clothes to the less privileged people of Kabaa village.

Welcoming the visitors at the school, school Headmaster Muvea Nyumbu commended the couple for their assistance they have been giving the community and urged them to continue supporting the school in

future.

Mr. Nyumbu said that the school has 750 pupils including those in nursery school.

He added that the school needed adequate facilities to enable it cope with the big number of pupils.

He said an average class had 55 pupils which he noted with concern was a very big number.

The tourists were escorted by Lawfords Beach Hotel Manageress Ms. Edith and Turtle Bay Beach Club Food and Beverage Manager Charles Nzioka, who is an 'old boy' of the Kabaa school.

The couple has been visiting Kenya for the past few years and has spent over shillings 1.5 million in assisting schools, hospitals and self-help groups in Malindi district and Coast province.

# Saving Our Mangroves

## CONSERVATIONISTS ISSUE "MOMBASA DECLARATION"

MARINE Biologists, conservation and environmental experts have called on the Governments of Kenya and Tanzania to continue protecting 'Wetland Areas'.

Following a 'Mangrove, Shrimp and Aquaculture Workshop' organised by the East and Wildlife Society and hosted at the Reef Hotel, the scientists issued an important new conservation document to be called 'The Mombasa Declaration.'

Salient points include:

- Governments conserve and protect wetland areas - in particular

mangrove forests, rivers, lagoons, inlets, bays, estuaries, swamps, marshes and tidelands through a joint management system with local communities.

- Governments ensure that the development and operation of aquaculture, in particular shrimp aquaculture, does not adversely affect biotic and abiotic environments and artisanal fisheries and the communities which depend on them.
- Governments enhance efforts

to integrate coastal zone management plans and promulgate appropriate environmental laws.

- Governments encourage sustainable natural and/ or traditional Shrimp Aquaculture, which includes an emphasis on the carrying capacity of the environment as well as the real and effective participation of all groups that benefit from coastal resources, particularly the local communities.
- East African Wildlife Society, together with local, regional and international Non-Governmental Organisations, establish an 'Alert Network System' to monitor destruction of coastal habitats, especially caused through industrial shrimp aquaculture.

Of interest is the fact Una recently completed an MA in Africa Area Studies as a full-time student at London's University's School of Oriental and African Studies.

Born in London of Irish parents, Una has performed all over Britain and Continental Europe, as well as in Australia, Finland and Kenya.

And so, through the formal and informal curriculum we would hope that our children would absorb necessary values and make sound relationships that enable them to benefit to the full, not only from the multi-cultural community in which they live, but also the wider world.

## EXPERIENCE

For any school the teachers are its most important asset and the international school is in a position to attract and retain teachers of a high calibre from within the host country and overseas.

Teachers who feel valued and have opportunity to develop professionally give their best to a school and the success of a school is often judged on the rate of turnover of its staff.

For a school to succeed, it must engineer a curriculum that will provide scope for maximum internationalisation.

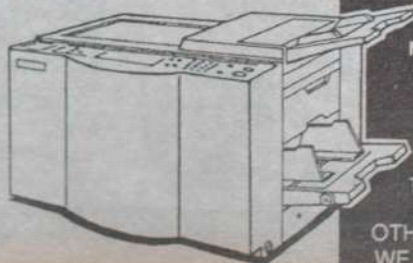

lectual, creative and social development for all abilities - a curriculum that is challenging and appropriate for all concerned and provides positive educational experiences for the child.

Such a curriculum will be coordinated from Standard 1 to Form 6 in terms of its progression, breadth and appropriate development of skills.

The curriculum needs to provide international recognition, facilitating ready transfer to other educational institutions world wide.

Courses of study usually culminate in the IGCSE, and the International Baccalaureate, examinations, which in themselves are not solely indicators of academic capability, but also of commitment and maturity.

Das "Village" befindet sich in einem verlassenen Steinbruch entlang der Straße zu den führenden 5-Sterne Strandhotels in Shanzu.

Diese kulturelle Attraktion direkt vor ihrer Tür, wird bestimmt viele Hotelgäste anlocken.

Auf den 14 Acres sind Casuarina-bäume und drei künstliche Seen, wo sich farbenprächige Vögel wie ägyptische Gänse, Perlhühner und Eisvögel niedergelassen haben.

Kenianer verschiedener Stämme wurden aufgefordert, sich an diesem Projekt zu beteiligen, ihre traditionellen Dörfer zu errichten und nach ihrem überlieferten

Lebensstil zu leben.

Eif Stämme sind in zehn Dörfern vertreten.

Bevor sie ihre Behausungen bauten, bestellten sie ihre Felder. Jedes Dorf ist für sich abgeschlossen und von einem Waldstück umgeben.

Die Dorfbewohner führen ihr tägliches Leben nach alter Tradition, sie kochen, verrichten Hausarbeiten, Kinderpflege und stellen traditionelles Kunsthandwerk her, das die Besucher kaufen können.

Sie haben auch Gelegenheit, die leckere afrikanische Küche zu versuchen und Volksmusik zu hören, die auf traditionellen Instrumenten gespielt wird.

Den Akamba Holzschnitzern kann man bei der Arbeit zusehen und ihnen auch eine Bestellung nach Wunsch aufgeben.

Die Preise sind günstiger, wenn man direkt und nicht durch Zwischenhändler in einem Laden einkauft.

Es gibt einen Ausstellungsraum, und die Qualität der Arbeiten ist so gut, daß Ngomongo im vergangenen Jahr für Kshs 10 Millionen kunsthandwerkliche Waren exportieren konnte.

Das Dorf erwartet mindestens 200 Besucher am Tag, nicht nur Touristen, sondern auch lokale Leute und Schulkinder.

"Das Ngomongo Village ist das einzige kulturelle Projekt dieser Art in Ost- und Zentralafrika," sagte **Rahab Mwendwa**, Sales und Marketing Direktor.

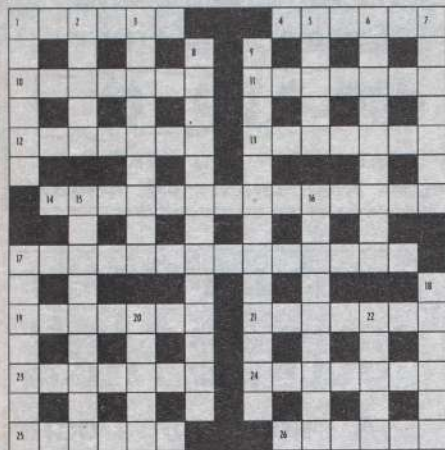

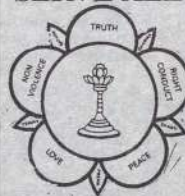

**Hofmann Beats Off Tiger Sharks To Land Winning Marlin**

PETER DANBOUROUGH'S *Pussycat* won the 33rd Delamere Cup at Kilifi over the weekend, thanks to team members Peter Hofmann of Switzerland landing a 600lb Blue Marlin after a dog-fight with three tiger sharks.

As Bengt Hubaik of Germany, third man in the team, witnessed Hofmann's two and half hour fight with the Marlin, the sharks closed in - led by an enormous 1,400-pounder.

They eventually allowed Hofmann to reel in what was left of the Marlin - which weighed in at over 200 lb.

Although the team could not land a catch on the second day of the competition, their first day's score of 1,500.4 points which included a tagged Sailfish and a Fellusi, was enough to win the team the top prize - a holiday in the Seychelles - organised by the Seychelles Tourist Office, Africa.

**Paradise Island**

The winners will be flown to the paradise islands on Air Seychelles and will spend three nights at the Desroches Island Lodge combined with two days fishing on the island's 36-foot *Cookie Two*, courtesy of Travel Services Seychelles.

Runner-up James Adcock, fishing with Michael Keri in

*Samvuke*, chalked up 929.6 pts which came from two Barracuda, Kawa-Kawa, five finger Jacks and three tagged Sailfish, giving him the most tags for the competition.

He was also the best in the small boat category with *Samvuke* powered by an 8 h.p Yamaha outboard motor.

Husband-and-wife team, Beppe and Elaine Scarpellini, fishing with Muin Malik, took third spot in *White Mischief* on 745.2 pts, with a haul which included a tagged Sailfish, Barracuda and two Skipjacks on Sunday.

A good entry of 27 boats competed in this year's event, run by the Mnarani Fishing Club from Swynford's, in which tagged Billfish earned more points than if landed.

Thirteen Sailfish were tagged as part of Tag-and-Release programme run by the African Billfish Foundation and sponsored by Yamaha Marine.

Miss Deborah Colville, daughter of the late Diana, Lady Delamere, this year teamed up with Air Seychelles and Desroche Island Lodge to make the Delamere Cup one of the best sponsorship seen by the game fishermen for a long time.

Representing the Seychelles Ministry of Tourism and Transport

and competing in his on right on Albatross, Maurice Loustau-Laienne pledged to support this competition again next year.

The International Game Fishing Association representatives for Seychelles, Mr. Lorraine and his fishing partners Christian Lenterna

(Managing Director of Travel Services Seychelles) and Colin Church (Seychelles Tourist Office Regional Manager for Africa) came in 14th overall after bad luck led to the team failing to land several billfish that they caught over the course of the weekend.
