MOMBASA COUNCIL SEEKS LOCAL ADVICE

REPORT

DUE TO a great shortage of the right type of refuse drums, rubbish in many areas of the Mombasa Municipality is piling up on the ground making collection more difficult with dustmen having to spend extra time wielding spades to clear it all.

A new Shs. 840,000l- dustcart was added to the Council's fleet this year. However, while there is now an adequate number of such vehicles in operation, the work of collection has been

made considerably more arduous by refuse becoming mountainous heaps on the ground.

Flies and mosquitos loved these additional breading areas,

Bitumen drums which are strong and hold six cubic ft. of refuse are ideal, but in very short supply.

The acting Town Clerk, Mr. A H Nasser, as appealed for suggestions on alternative containers, or help in locating more such bitumen-style drums.

For smaller quantities of rubbish, the Council has dustbins available at Shs. 2001- each. These will hold about 1 1/2 cubic ft. of refuse.

Good news for motorists is that Moi Avenue, right to the railway bridge, is going to be resurfaced. Work, which will be carried out by contract labour, is due to commence in October when, hopefully, the rains may have stopped.

Meanwhile, the Mombasa Municipal Council is still await-ing the 'go ahead' from the Ministry of Local Government to repair the Mtongwe Ferry at a cost of £65,000.

A sum of £30,000 has been set aside by the Council for this work, leaving a balance of £35,000 still to be found.

1 Barracuda about 2 1/2-3 1/2 ib/ 1.25-1.5 kg. 1 teaspoon salt. 1/2 teaspoon pepper. 8 ozs./ 225 g. fat bacon, 4 oz/100g cooking fat. 2 tablespoons plain flour, scant 1/2 pint/1-5 dl cold water.

Remove the scales with the back of a knife or a special scaling knife and then rinse under cold water and dry with kitchen paper.

Mix together the salt and pepper and rub the inside of Barracuda with this seasoning Cut the bacon into thin strips and, using a larding needle, thread the strips through the flesh of the Barracuda at right angles to the backbone.

Ole! Sammy Wafula Returns 'Home From Home' In Sunny Spain

SAMMY K Wafula, a former Tourist Officer, Coast who has been living in Madrid, Spain, for the past six years was back in Kenya again for a short holiday at his favourite hotel - Mombasa Beach.

Mr. Wafula, who was accompanied by his wife and four Children, is in charge of the Africa Region of the World Tourism Organisation, its head-quarters being in Madrid.

He is ther on secondment from the Kenya Government. Mr. Wafula was also a director of the Kenya Tourist Office, Paris, for three years.

Interviewed at Mombasa Beach Hotel he described Spain as being a great potential tourist market for Kenya Explained Mr. Wafula the upper classes, with wealth accumulated during forty years of political stability in Spain, are providing a considerable market for long-haul holiday destinations.

He said that Kenya hoteliers

and tour operators were now stepping in to maximise their share of the market, and mentioned that the next International Tourism Fair takes place in Madrid during February 1984. He hoped to see much greater participation, and suggested that those attending should hold Kenya Information Evenings with travel agents and tour operators there.





The new owner stays with the vehicle for an indefinite duration, two or more years, without transferring it to his new name.

When they think of selling the vehicle, they do it without any problems, since the previous owner had signed blank transfer forms.

This might sound like robbery without violence. Someone is avoiding payment of transfer fees to the Government, and can suit themselves into the crime field.

One will be inclined to wonder why an office in the road transport office does not detect any such short-comings?



MORE CARGO IN AUGUST

THE month of August has realised the highest tonnage of dry the highest tonnage of dry general cargo handled in a single month so far this year. The per-formance for the month was 284,053 deadweight tonnes.

284,053 deadweight tonnes.

The throughput for August consisted of 190,438 tonnes of imports and 93,615 tonnes in August this year. In August last year a total of 190,078 tonnes of dry general cargo comprising 117,254 tonnes of imports and 72,824 tonnes of exports was handled.

During August this year a large amount of bulk wheat was discharged at Kilindini, accounting for 60,747 tonnes of the month's throughput in dry general cargo. In the preceeding month of July 5,729 tonnes of bulk wheat was discharged.

Over the month of August 56 general cargo ships called at the port while 64 ships called over the month of July.

Kenya Ports Authority has meanwhile acquired a new 17 metre general purpose workboat named Korongo. The boat was offloaded in mid stream from a MSC Vessel, M. V. Sandra S on September 8 using the 60 tonne floating "Jumbo" crane.

The Cheverton Workboats who have built the boat delivered six other boats in July this year. They included a 8 mefre general

purpose boat, a 12 metre mooring tug boats. Two other boats - 22 metre pilot cutter are to be delivered by the Cheverton Workboats by December.

Two Police Patrol boats named Iwo Police Patrol boats named Mchunguzi (Investigator) and Mlinzi (Guardian) also built by the Cheverton Workboats were acquired by K.P.A. in November last year.

The nine port services crafts excluding Kenya Police patrol Boats) are part of a British aid package to the Government of Kenya. All the crafts are built at Cowes in U.K. by the Cheverton Workboats.

Twin Screw

The newly acquired Korongo has a combination of different roles. It can be used for fire fighting, pollution control and towing assignments.

The twin screw craft has a capability of pushing and towing as a tug and it has a carrying capacity for equipment and passengers in the supply/ service role:

The craft carries oil dispersal and fire equipment. It has a capacity for 450 litres of foam and 450 of oil dispersant. The vessel has a bollard pull of 4 tonnes and a top speed of 12.75 Knots.

A vessel awaiting readiness of 5,000 tons bagged beans at R' anchorage is the 1968 built Greek vessel Sithonia of 15,000 tons d.w. She is one of the Japanese standard built Freedom' type. She arrived on 6th September.







The pole vault is an act of great agility and Thompson had the best vault of the day with 5.20 metres.

The javelin is an action replay of the shot and discus. The same, overtired muscles had to be used, but Thompson still managed a best throw of 65.24 metres.

Then came the final act. The 1,500 metres slog rounds off two gruelling days.

Thompson did his job perfectly, finishing with a time of 4 min. 29.72 sec. The gold was his.
