TANZANIA GOVERNMENT CRACK DOWN ON VAGRANTS

SOME 889 people were detained in Dar-es-Salaam this week in a campaign launched to net the jobless in the city. This move is an implementation of the Human Resources Deployment Act which binds every able-bodied person to be gainfully employed.

The campaign conducted by militia men and national service corps did however have some flaws since a number of people holding genuine identitiy cards were apprehended as were some

The national airline Air Tanza-nia Corporation has confirmed that it had sold two fokker friendship F27-200 aircraft to British Midland Airways of Great Britain at a cost of about 15.5 million shillings (f million US dollars and 180,000 sterling nounds) pounds).

American Film Crew On Location At Lake Magadi And Malindi

MOMBASA Island took a leap 100 years back in time when a British crew with a cast of American and British actors began shooting parts of the American television series Masters Of The Game this week writes Gray Phombeah.

The series adapted from Sidney Sheldon's latest best seller is scheduled to hit the American small screen in February next

year.

Horses and coaches rode into town, and colonial Askaris marched through the streets as a cheering crowd tagged behind.

The shooting of the film took place around Mombasa's old port and the treasury square. In Malindi, a big 'outside catering' exercise for Jambo Hotels was to look after the

It is the first time for Rosemont Productions to make a film in Kenya. It has a British film crew, and AmericantEnglish cast, and will be primarily for American TV.

It is being produced by Norman Rosemont who has had a very successful run in producing classic stories which have included A Tale of Two Cities, "Nanhoe" and Hunchback of Nortre Dame.

It will be a nine hour 'mini' series broken down to three 3 hour shows to be screened on consecutive nights.

The TV team are in Kenya to shoot a small part of the film from the beginning of the story circa 1883.

It is being shot over three locations - Mambrui (because of its desert-like area south of the town); Mombasa's Old Port/Government Square and outside Nairobi towards Magadi. The latter being the main location in Kenya.

Other sequences have already been filmed in New York, Paris, Nice, London and Pinewood Studios.

They were filming at Mambrui for five days, with many of the cast and film crew staying at Jambo Hotels - Sindbad, Blue Marlin and Lawfords leaving at six in the morning and not returning until seven in the evening. They found conditions 'very hot and humid' among the sand dunes.

THE record held by the 333,000 d.w. ton tanker MEDUSA as being the largest vessel yet seen off the port of Mombasa was short lived for last Friday yet another giant ULCC (ultra large crudeoid carrier) arrived off the port this time in light condition. She was the 1975 built Norwegian flag HILDA KNUDSEN whose deadweight tons is 424,000. She is owned by the well known Norwegian shipowners Knut Knutsen O.A.S. of Haugesund.

The vessel was bound for the Gulf and I believe she had come out of "lay up".

Tanker operators are evidently finding Mombasa offshore bunkering a considerable saving over taking bunkers in the Gulf for some unaccountable reason.

Three times this year they have answered calls for help from Likoni, due to the indescriminate lighting of fires in dry bushland.


With the best of intentions a fire started in the type of area such as Likoni, especially during high Monsoon winds, will be impossible to control.

OVERALL winner of the three day Malindi Sea Fishing Festival was Mr. L. Von Menyhart's boat 'Waridi' with 584.9 points, tished by Jurgen Kagerah, Eberhard Kuhimann from Germany, and Abbillis Badi fees Germany and Abdulla Badi from Malindi, writes Note 1

These German fishermen had come to Kenya and specially for the Festival. They were first introduced to Malindir by Klaus-Drabert from Cologne who, since 1968, has brought thousands of fishermen from Germany to this country.
