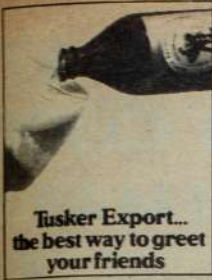

## 'FOUR MILLION PEOPLE CROSS LIKONI FERRY'

MOMBASA's Likoni Ferry carries 24 million passengers a year - 2 million more than London's Heathrow Airport.

This was revealed by Manasseh Tande, Ferry Manager, Kenya Bus Services (Misa) Ltd. While addressing a meeting of the Likoni and South Mainland Residents' Association on the ferry operation and problems with which it is faced.

The meeting of the one-year association took place at the Nomad Restaurant, Diani.

A major problem is the alarming rate at which pedestrian traffic has been growing over recent years.

Most use it between 6.30 to 7.30 a.m. when the ferry is then carrying some 7,000 pedestrians an hour.

While pedestrians are carried free, motorists who have to pay often find there is no room for them at such times and have to wait until there is space.

The situation has been aggravated by the closure in May of the Mtongwe (Pedestrian) Ferry due to the deteriorating condition of the jetties both on the island and mainland. They now travel on the Likoni ferry.

The Mtongwe ferry had been carrying 4.2 million passengers a year.

### NETA PEAL reports

The upkeep of these jetties are the responsibility of the Mombasa Municipal Council which has been trying to obtain funds from central Government to enable repair work to be carried out.

It is understood that while the Mombasa Municipal Council has provision for Shs. 600,000/- towards their repair, a further Shs. 680,000/- is still needed to

MORE THAN Kshs. 300,000/- are expected to be raised in the Ring Us Up Television auction programme set to go on the air tonight in Mombasa. Items worth Kshs. 323,000/- have already been received from donors and will go up for bidding in the three-hour televised programme coming live from the Mombasa studios of the Voice of Kenya, writes Gray Phombeah.

The programme is being run by the two Mombasa Round Tables (Mombasa No. 4 and Nyali No. 25) in conjunction with the Voice of Kenya and the Kenya Posts and Telecommunication Corporation.

Air time for the show which will run from 8.00 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. and later from 10.00 p.m. to 11.30 p.m. has been co-sponsored by Inland Container Depots and Jaffer and Jaffer group of companies together with Mwangi Coffee and Zubeidi Brothers.

Twenty lines have been allocated to telephone No. 314421 which will be used by viewers for bidding during the auction.

According to this year's convener Mr. Abdulwahid Aboo a record collection of 140 attractive items had been made by Wednesday.

There will be six ordinary dukas, one special duka and three slots of quickie dukas with five items each for Christmas.

Bidders can drive off with a super bargain in a new Suzuki Skyhawk to be auctioned at the show's special duka. This top item has been donated at a special price by Cooper Motors corporation of Mombasa.

Some 800 kgs of Kenya Tea and 120 kgs of Coffee will view for the highest bidder in tonight's auction.

The items have been donated by Mwangi Coffee Exporters and Mombasa Tea Trade.

Holiday vouchers, donated by Jambo Hotels, Pollmans Tours and Safaris and Severin Sea Lodge will also be up for bidding.

There will be one week for two at Lawfords Hotel Malindi, three days and two nights trip to Salt Lick and Amboseli, and seven days for two at Severin Sea Lodge.

Other items include a "Jet Stream" mower donated by Neff Autospares and Hardwares, Six tons ordinary Portland cement from Bamburi Portland Cement, a 2-door refrigerator (Kaydee Construction), one remote controlled Mercedes Benz truck (Castle Hotel), a gas cooker with four plates and an oven grill, and a return air ticket from Nairobi to London.

One of the highlights of the

show will be Christmas carols presented in English and Swahili by children from the Mombasa SOS home.

Mr. Aboo requested successful bidders after tonight's show to come forward and collect their items from the Ring Us Up showroom next to Commercial Bank of Africa on Moi Avenue between December 27 and January 8. The showroom will be open during office hours and Saturday morning.

# TUMEPIGA HATUA KUBWA YA MAENDELEO

KWA ujumla nchi yetu ya Kenya ilipiga hatua kubwa ya maendeleo katika mwaka huu wa 1983 kutoka ukumbi wa kisiasa pamoja na mambo mengine yanayohusiana na michezo kwani klubuu yetu ya AFC Leopards pamoja na timu ya taifa ya Harambee Stars na wanariadha waliutwala uwanja wa michezo katika Afrika Mashariki na Kati.

Tukizungumza juu ya michezo, hatuna budi kurudi nyuma hadi mwezi wa Januari ambapo timu zetu mbili za AFC Leopards pamoja na Gor Mahia zilipowakwama nchi yetu katika mapambano ya kung'ang ania komba la klubuu bingwa za Afrika mashariki na Kati.

Mapambano hayo walifanyika huko kisivani Unguja yaani Zanzibar na kila timu iliyojitokeza ilikuwa na nia kubwa ya kusimamisha utawala wa timu zetu za Kenya katika mashindano hayo lakini wapi! Wanagozi wetu walioundoka hapa kwa kuhifadhi bendera yetu, hawakutisha na vitisho vyovyote vya timu nyingine.

Hali kuwa ajabu vyote wakati wanasoka wa AFC Leopards walipoweza kurudi na kombe hilo kwa mara ya tatu mfululizo na kulibakisha hapa nchini maisha. Rais Moi alishikilia hatamu hizo mnamo mwezi wa Agosti wakati Mwanzilishi wa taifa hili, Hayati Mzee Jomo Kenyatta alipoaga dunia hapo mwaka 1978 mnamo mwezi Agosti tarehe 22 alipokuwa mapumzikoni hapa Mombasa.

mazungumzo ambayo ni ya manufaa kwa mwananchi wote wa Kenya.

Mwezi wa Oktoba pia ulikuwa mwezi mzuri kwa Wanariadha wetu ambao walitulea medali nyingi wakati wa michezo ya Arika, Mashariki na Kati yaliyofanyika huko Jinja nchini Uganda. Ingawa Wanariadha wetu walishindwa kutuleta hata chembe ya medali wakati wa michezo ya Jumia ya madola lakini ushindi wa Jinja ulikuwa tuzo bora kwetu Wakenya.

Mnamo mwezi wa Novemba, tulikuwa nna furaha ya kupita kiasi wakati viongozi wa mataifa matatu ya Afrika Mashariki na Kati, Marais Moi, Nyerere na Obote walipokutana huko Arusha nchini Tanzania na kuafikiana kurudisha uhusiano mwema baina ya mataifa haya ambayo yalikuwa ndugu aliyezalwa "tumbo moja" hapo awali.

Mkutano huo wa Arusha uliafikiana jambo ambalo lilisubiriwa kwa muda mrefu yaani kwa mipaka ya nchi mbili zetu za Kenya na Tanzania kufunguliwa na hii imefungua ukurasa mpya wa uhusiano

mwema kati ya nchi hizi mbili na wananchi ambao wengine wana jamii kati yake watakuwa huru kutembeleana na kujana hali.

Wanamichezo wetu hawakutosheka na ushindi wa AFC Leopards na Wanariadha pekee, bali Wanasoka wa timu yetu ya taifa ya Harambee Stars nao wakahifadhi heshima ya Kenya kwa kulichukua tena kombe la Challenge na kulibakisha nchini milele kutokana na kulinyakua kwa miaka mitakuo mfululizo.

# LOOKING AT A VERY GOOD CHRISTMAS!

INDICATIONS are that it is going to be a Very Merry Christmas and New Year at the Coast, for beach hotels have been working flat out to make this festive season the best ever, writes NETA PEAL.

Among the visitors from home and overseas will be many 'repeat' guests.

The arrival of Papa Christmas at the Coast, although dressed in the traddy pillar-box red suit and sporting a long white beard, is not so traditional - for he has no chimney pots to squeeze down!

So, he sometimes arrives by boat, 'mini' moke, pony cart, parachute or camel bearing sacks laden with presents for young guests.

Entertaining at the coast over the festive season will be the famous African Heritage band playing 'black' African music including jazz.

The band recently returned from a successful tour of Mauritius where it added to its collection of traditional musical instruments.

Their tour of the Kenya coast includes performances at Jadini Beach Hotel on December 20 and 21.

At beach hotels there will be carols around illuminated Christmas Trees, lively entertainments programmes, all the traditional Christmas fare, and lots of other mouth-watering cuisine to enjoy.

Helping draw up the Christmas menus at Nyali Beach Hotel has been Eamon Mullan, Block Hotels Executive Chef, from the Norfolk, Nairobi, who together with Kathy Eldon compiled 'Tastes of Kenya' a recipe book of epicurean cuisine.

Interviewed at Nyali Beach Hotel, Eamon said he is hoping to include some locally made Foie Gras on the festive menu.

Other highlights will be quails, pheasants from Langata (ordered as early as June), milk fed turkeys from the Nightingale Farm outside Nairobi, which will be served with chestnut stuffing and cranberry sauce.

Eamon, together with Julius Kamau, executive chef, Nyali Beach Hotel, has created an incentive gourmet men for the Mvita Grill on New Year's Eve.

It will include pheasant pate with Cumberland sauce, and between the Sauté of Lobster Natignon and Supreme of Duckling Montmorency, a Champagne Sorbet will be served to refresh the palate. Among the many gorgeous desserts will be Soufflé Glace Grand Marnier.

## FESTIVE FARE

Apart from spectacular and traditional festive fare, Nyali Beach Hotel's entertainments programme swings into action on December 19 with a Fish Buffet and Jazz band, while on December 22 there is a 'Sing Along' combined with Happy Hour.

On Christmas Day, the Gala lunch on the Mvita Terrace will include a Jazz Band. On December 26 a Mexican Evening will be staged on the Pool Terrace, followed by a Fancy Dress competition in the Blues Disco.

A fashion show, and the ninth-making selection of 'Miss Nyali Beach Hotel' from male competitors takes place on December 29.

meet the full cost of the work.

Approval from Central Government to this 'supplementary estimate' is still awaited, and the necessary money found.

Mr Tande mentioned that although the number of passengers using the Likoni Ferry had increased by 150 per cent, they were still being paid the same subsidy.

Consequently, they had been pressing the Ministry of Transport & Communication for this to be increased.

The Likoni ferries carry an average of 66,000 passengers a day. The 'Safina' can accommodate 50 cars and 1200 passengers, and the 'Mvita' 32 cars and 900 passengers. The channel crossing takes 3-4 minutes.

He said that in 1981, Kenya Bus Services had commissioned professional Surveyors to draw up a plan for the expansion of the ferry service. This had been presented to Government in April 1981. Nothing had transpired.

In 1982, they had submitted a plan to Government on suggested pedestrian control as this traffic was expected to increase even further when the Tanzanian border re-opened.

Said Mr Tande 'although we have done everything possible, pedestrian traffic at peak hours is beyond our control'.

He also mentioned that it would be impossible to operate more than two ferries at a time with existing facilities.

In the meantime, the Kenya Government had proceeded with a feasibility study on the possibility of a bridge, or 'chunnel', to connect Mombasa with the south coast mainland.

During question time members pointed out that while some coxains are very helpful in controlling pedestrian traffic, others were not.

They felt that if all could be instructed to use the public address system and ask pedestrians to wait until the ferry is empty before embarking, this would be a great help.

Pedestrians should also be warned of the danger of walking in front of moving cars when disembarking.

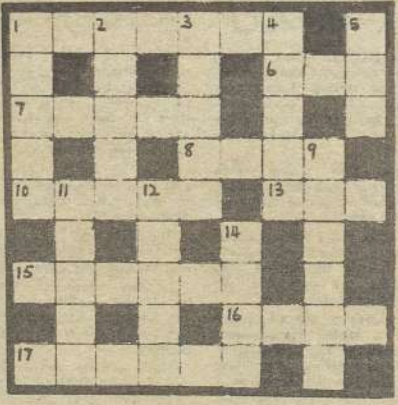

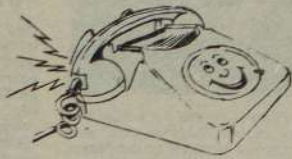

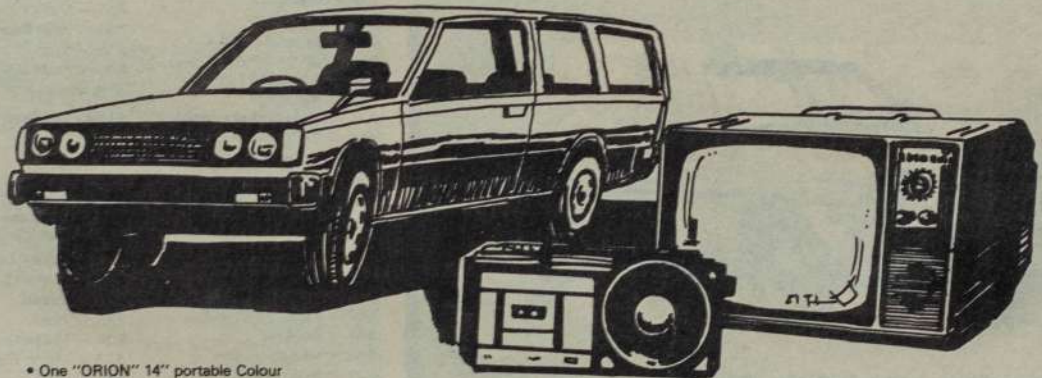

# Rail Crash Horror

21 PEOPLE died and 136 were injured in what has been described as the worst train accident since the central line was built by the Germans in 1914. The derailment which occurred near Makutupora, some 90 kilometres west of Dodoma in Central Tanzania, caused a loss of 48 million Shilling. The present evidence available strongly points towards sabotage since it is reported that the iron bar which the train crashed into was intentionally placed across the rails by some unknown persons.

Some survivors related stories about seeing an angry mob stoning a man suspected to have put the iron bar on the rails and said that the man was subsequently rescued by the police who sent him to hospital.

The Tanzania Railways Corporation (TRC) plans to form a probe team to investigate the circumstances that led to the accident so that it may take adequate measures to prevent the occurrence of such a tragedy again.

The central line which was closed to traffic after the accident re-opened two days later after the railways corporation deployed worker who worked round the clock to get the line operating.

The last train accident in country occurred in 1978 near the Dar es Salaam railway station during which two people died.

savings deposits with the banking sector rose by 27 per cent while time deposits increased by 57 per cent. The increase in deposits have been primarily attributed to a rise in interest rates announced in July last year.

The statement also mentions that due to government measures taken against economic offenders and against hoarding of unauthorised currency, there was a marked decline in money supply expansion which rapidly fell from 27 per cent in the 1981/82 fiscal year to 7 per cent this year.

The statement pointed out that notwithstanding the deceleration of money supply, if inflationary pressures had not shown any significant abatement, it was due to constraints in the supply of goods.

It also noted that the country's gross domestic product (GDP) had recorded a decline for the years 1981 and 1982 and also discounted significant growth

this year, noting that although production of some crops, particularly cotton, cashewnuts and sisal had recovered, industrial production declined.

**CORDIAL LINKS**

In Zanzibar, the chairman of the Zanzibar revolutionary council, Aboud Jumbe who is also President of Zanzibar and Vice-President of Tanzania, stressed that the 1964 Union between Tanganyika and Zanzibar is there to stay although its enemies were bent on destroying it.

## 'Kenya Should Help In Tourist Market'

ONE OF Kenya's leading and international tour operators Geof Kent has arrived in the country on an inspection of facilities and services to assess the prevailing standards in order to comply with the Minister of Tourism's call to triple the tourist input by 1990.

Mr. Kent who is the managing director of Abercrombie and Kent with offices all over the world, has been reorganising and updating the tour programmes on offer to meet with the changing demands of the up-market in which his corporation specialises.

The Abercrombie and Kent executive went on to say that Kenya could have increases if more aggressive marketing of the Kenya Conference Centre was carried out as this was a valuable asset.

He was excited to see that the minister had advocated that charters be permitted as long as the loads were shared with the national carrier.

He reiterated his plan to contribute at least ten thousand tourists during the current season as Abercrombie and Kent's first steps for contributing to the Ministry of Tourism's goal of one million visitors by 1990.

Maulid Nabi was then said by Sajjad Gulamhussein, Maalim Mohamed Hussein and Maalim Idri.

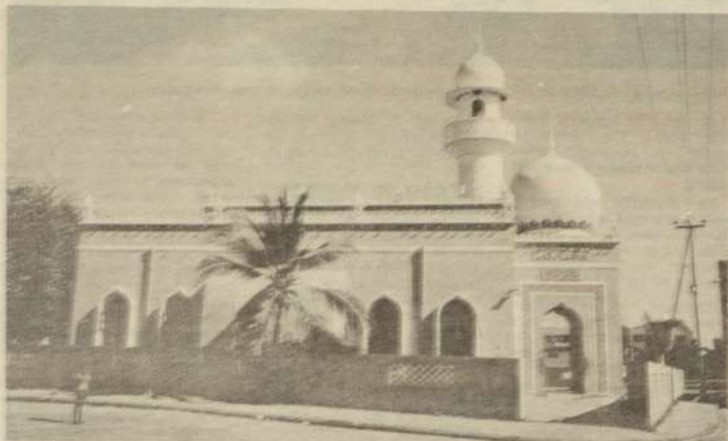
Other Qasida in Kisiwahili were presented by Madressatul Islamiya of Kibokoni, Al-

Smartly dressed Muslims, mostly in white kanzu, marched in unison, chanting verses from the Holy Koran in praise of Allah. Groups of Qasida joined in the procession reciting the life of the Holy Prophet.

At the Makadara grounds the procession broke up for evening prayers before the night's Milad-Un-Nabi programme.

## 'THE OLDEST DRY CARGO VESSEL'

ONE OF the oldest if not the oldest dry cargo vessel to have berthed at Kilindini is the American flag 15200 d.w. ton "Penny" built 40 years ago (in 1943) which arrived alongside No. 11 berth on 14th December to discharge 14200 tons Fertilizer in bulk and bags loaded at Tampa, Florida, U.S.A. When putting into Durban on Nov. 30th for bunkers on the voyage across she grounded for one hour having to be pulled off by tugs. Considerable damage was done the vessel's bottom and tips of the propeller blades damaged.

On completion of discharge at Mombasa she has been reportedly sold to Karachi Shipbreakers for scrap which can be the only destiny for an old lady nearing the end of her days.

The last remaining deep sea cargo liner wholly owned by Ellerman City Liners, the 14000 d.w. ton m.v. "City of York" duly arrived a week ago on schedule and continues discharge.

December, thereafter she will proceed to Mauritius to load sugar. This is the first dry cargo vessel to fly the red ensign to be seen in Mombasa since the demise of the P&O "Strath" vessels.

The "City of York" is commanded by Captain John Macleod who has served with Ellerman vessels and known Mombasa on and off for the past 20 years. His vessel was also the last Ellerman vessel to call at Mombasa in 1981 when the "City of York" had to call at Mombasa for repairs for one week whilst on passage from Mauritius to London.

A vessel which has called at Mombasa on several occasions, mainly for bunkers and repairs, over the past year will be seen no more having become a victim of the Iraq/Iran war. She is the 26,200 d.w. ton Greek bulk carrier "Iapetos" built in 1963; I recall her being a particularly ugly looking vessel having twin funnels athwartships on her after accommodation.

### ARABIAN GULF

Apparently she was struck by rockets in the Arabian Gulf with a full cargo of steel from Europe and subsequently the crew abandoned ship.

The "Nedlloyd Hongkong"

due yesterday to load for the Far East on the Nedlloyd regular liner service is to be sold to Korean interests on her return to the Far East and completion of discharge. This means that all three of the Nedlloyd "H" class serving Mombasa, the "Hobart", "Honsu" and "Hongkon" have now been sold.

### FAR EAST SERVICE

A newcomer the "Nedlloyd Auckland" is due early January on the Far East Service. Built in 1968, so much the same vintage as the "H" vessels, the "Nedlloyd Auckland" is slightly larger both in size and carrying capacity.

The Mercury line vessel "Mercury Lake" was at No. 12 berth last weekend and amongst her cargo were 11 Giraffe travelling to Doha in the Arabian Gulf. At No. 14 berth completing her loading of cattle was the cattle carrier "Lembu" which also sailed last weekend.

The Hapag Lloyd cruise vessel "Europa" arrived on schedule on Tuesday morning and made a fine sight at number one berth.

The arrested vessel "Rhodian Carrier" evidently settled her debt and was allowed to sail over last weekend.

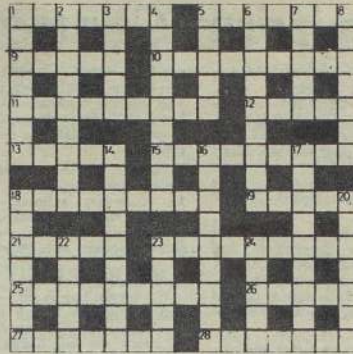

**SCRUMPTIOUS SALADS**

Salads are cold dishes of either fruits, vegetables cereals and protein foods usually served singly but mostly in combination dressings. Salads can play an important role in our meals.

When selected and served carefully, they add colour, texture, flavour and a variety of nutrients to our diets. The basic ingredients of salads are fruits and vegetables.

Besides their vitamins and minerals, most of the basic ingredients used for salads contain fibre or roughage which aid in digestion and body elimination.

When handled carefully, salads provide the most efficient methods of preparing and consuming foods with least loss of nutrients.

**VARIETY OF SALADS**

Salads can be made in several ways using varieties of ingredients and salad dressings. They lend themselves to creative cooking and imagination.

Originality can be achieved by creative cooks by combining different ingredients and dressings to create interesting colours, flavours and textures.

Salads are so versatile that they can be served at different times of the day and in different courses of the meal. The ingredients and the salad dressing used more or less dictate when and how to serve them. For example:

- When served before a main course, they are called appetiser salads. These need to complement the main course but need to be light to help create the appetite for the main course.

- Salads served along with the main course, are called accompaniment salads. They create a different atmosphere on your table altogether by adding a contrast in texture, taste and appearance, apart from contributing different types of nutrients to the whole meal. When the main dish is hot and soft, a crisp and cold salad gives a sparkle to the meal.

- Salads can also be served as the main dish. When served that way, a combination of ingredients to make a balanced diet needs to be considered.

A combination of such ingredients as fruit and vegetables with meats, fish, poultry, cheese, macaroni, cooked rice and potatoes can achieve this goal. Again a combination of vegetables, fruits, protein foods and salad dressing can create the different qualities of salads stated earlier.

For example, chunks of cooked chicken combined with cooked macaroni or potatoes, crunchy slices of celery and pickles served on crisp lettuce leaves with salad dressing of your choice. Usually mayonnaise is a good choice in its quality of binding ingredients.

As main dish, salads need to be hearty and nutritious.

- Served as desserts, salads need to be sweet. Whether they should be light or heavy will depend on the main course. If the main course was on the heavy side, the dessert should be light and vice versa.

The following ingredients can be used:

- Tossed Salad, mainly uses leafy vegetables with other ingredients with salad dressing.
- Chef's Salad, as main dish, uses a mixture of meats, fruits, vegetables plus salad dressing.
- Moulded Salad uses gelatin as the binding ingredients with either fruits, vegetables or meats.

A combination of the following ingredients can produce appetising, nutritious salads: boiled eggs, canned or cooked meats, coldcuts, different types of cheese, pickles, cooked macaroni, bacon, ham, croutons, chopped fresh herbs and spices, peanuts, shredded coconut, raisins, currants, gelatin

flavoured and unflavoured, fresh or dried fruits, fresh or cooked vegetables, etc.

**SHOPPING TIPS:**

Select fruits and vegetables which are: firm, fresh, free from blemishes and at their right stage of ripeness.

**PREPARING SALADS**

Greens have tender leaves which if not carefully handled will be bruised. Bruising will result in loss of nutrients.

Salads taste best when they are crisp. Maximum crispness is achieved through washing greens in cold water as soon as you bring them home.

Excess water when left in the leaves spoil them. Therefore pat them with a paper towel before storing in the refrigerator. A bit of water will help to create moisture to make them crisp. Be sure to refrigerate them in a plastic bag, foil or container with a tight lid.

Tear greens with soft leaves in bite-size servings. Exceptions to this rule are cabbage and Chinese cabbage, both of which can be shredded, grated or cut into small pieces.

**SALAD DRESSING**

Salad dressing can be French, mayonnaise or cooked, depending on the ingredient and the methods used for preparing them. French or vinaigrette uses vinegar or lemon juice, oil and seasonings like pepper and garlic.

They are then beaten or shaken vigorously before use to form a temporary emulsion. Cooked salad uses white sauce as a base, and various seasonings like egg, vinegar or sugar.

Mayonnaise is a richer creamy dressing which uses oil, vinegar, seasonings in egg emulsion to bind it together. Light oil and vinegar dressing can be used for leafy tossed salads.

Salads made of ingredients like macaroni and potatoes need a thicker type of dressing like mayonnaise to bind them together.

Spices, garlic and herbs can be added to any salad dressing to enhance its flavour and taste. Remember that too much salad dressing makes salads limp and soggy. Therefore add just enough for flavour and binding together quality.

**IMPORTANCE OF HYGIENE**

Remember when preparing leafy greens for salads to make sure that greens are thoroughly washed to kill unseen bacteria found in the soil, and which may have come into contact with the leaves.

**EXAMPLES OF MAIN DISH SALADS**

**CHEF'S SALAD**

Half head of lettuce, small batch of other vegetables of your choice (2 or 3) 2 medium tomatoes, cut into wedges, 8 oz. cooked chicken cut into thin strips, 8 oz. cooked ham cut into thin strips, 8 oz. cheddar cheese cut into thin strips, and 1 medium onion sliced into rings.

Wash salad greens in cold running water. Dry thoroughly. Refrigerate in a tight container until ready to serve. Tear greens into bite size pieces, arrange in serving bowls. Then top with the remaining ingredients. Serve with salad dressing of your choice.

**POTATO SALAD**

6 large cooked potatoes - cubed, 3 hard-boiled eggs sliced, 3 medium sweet pickles chopped, half cup chopped celery, half onion finely chopped, half cup chopped cooked chicken or other meat. Prepared or dry mustard (optional), and Salt and pepper to taste.

Combine all ingredients in a bowl. Mix with salad dressing.

Dressing: 1/3 cup mayonnaise, 1 tsp. vinegar, 1 tsp sugar, 2 tsp cream or milk. Mix and pour over salad and toss.

**TOSSED GREEN VEGETABLE SALAD**

4 cups torn lettuce, 3 tomatoes cut into wedges, 3/4 cup shredded carrots, and 1 cup sliced raw cauliflower (optional)

Clean and drain vegetables. Put into a bowl. Toss lightly with salad dressing of your choice.

**QUICK AND EASY SALAD DRESSING**

2 tsp finely chopped onions, 1/8 tsp onion salt, 1 tsp celery seed, half cup salad oil, half cup sugar, 7 tsp tomato sauce, and 6 tsp salad dressing or mayonnaise.

Combine all ingredients. Beat with rotary beater, electric mixer or shake well in a covered jar. Serve on tossed salad.

## KUESTENSTREIFEN

Diese Abenteuersafaris wurden von John Arkle, General Manager von UTC Küste, ausgearbeitet und vorbereitet, der sich im Küstenstreifen bestens auskennt. Auf diesen Ausflügen werden die Touristen an Plätze geführt, die sie sonst nie zu sehen bekommen, und sie lernen auf diese Weise viel mehr von Land und Leuten und ihrer Lebensweise kennen.

John Arkle hat auch das Buch "Camping in Kenya" geschrieben

und ist gleichzeitig Präsident des "Skal Clubs" in Mombasa und Vizepräsident der "Mombasa and Coast Tourist Association".

Um diese neue Tour den leitenden Angestellten, dem Verkaufspersonal, den Mechanikern und auch einigen Vertretern von Reisebüros vorzustellen, unternahm John Arkle mit ihnen eine Probefahrt, von der alle hell begeistert zurückkehrten.

Der an der Seite offene Lastwagen ist mit 20 komfortablen Sitzen ausgestattet und führt genügend Kühltruhen mit, um während der ganzen Reise stets eiskalte Getränke zu liefern. Mittags gibt es ein Picknick hoch oben in den Shimba Hills.

Kurz nach der Abfahrt im Jadini Beach Hotel verließ der Lastwagen die Teerstraße und fuhr an der Ukunda Landeplätze vorbei durch schmale, mit Bäumen gesäumte Wege nach Ukunda, wo jedermann den 600 Jahre alten Baobabbaum *Adonsonia Digitata* Lin. bestaunen konnte.

Vor vielen Jahren wurde eine Notiz folgenden Inhalts gebracht: "Auf Wunsch und Verordnung des Präsidenten von Kenia, Jomo Kenyatta, ist dieser Baum geschützt für das Volk von Kenia und seine Kinder". Der Baum ist etwa 25 m hoch und der Stamm hat einen Umfang von 21 m.

Anschließend wurde ein typisches Digohaus aus Boritstangen und getrocknetem Lehm besucht. Vor der Hütte stellte eine Frau Krüge und

Kochtöpfe aus Ton her, die sie auch verkauft. Es wurde den Gästen gezeigt, wie das lokale Material zu vielseitigen Zwecken verwendet werden kann. Aus einer Dumpalme werden zum Beispiel Matten und Seile hergestellt, mit denen man Wassereimer aus dem Sodbrunnen zieht.

Die Baukosten für ein Lehmhaus mit zwei Räumen belaufen sich auf ungefähr Shs. 3600/-, wenn der spätere Bewohner es selbst baut.

Die Reise ging weiter in ein anderes Dorf, wo viele Frauen Frangipani Blüten im Haar trugen. Unter einem Mangobaum wurden Stammestänze vorgeführt, die eigentlich zur Feier einer Hochzeit bestimmt sind. Die Taikitsitzer haben auch für Präsident Moi getanzt. Die Gäste wurden aufgefordert, mitzumachen. John Arkle, der als Geschenk einen Fliegenwedel erhielt, wurde von den Taikitsidamen unvorwörtlich, die alle mit ihm tanzen wollten.

## NASHORNKAEFER

Der Lastwagen fuhr dann an einer unglaublichen Vielfalt von Bäumen vorbei in die Shimba Hills. Abgestorbene Palmen ragten wie kahle Stangen in die Höhe, nachdem die Nashornkäfer das Palmenherz gefressen hatten. Man sah auch Kapokbäume, Dumpalmen, Mangobäume, Zitrusfrüchte, Cashewnüsse und Bixa. Ein aromatischer Duft von gerösteten Cashewnüssen erfüllte die Luft.

Das Shimba Hills Naturreservat erstreckt sich über ein Gebiet von 75 Quadratkilometern. Der Bedford brachte die Leute zum Pengo Hügel etwa 440 m ü.M. durch einen Wald mit knorrigen Baumriesen; im Hintergrund leuchtete der Indische Ozean.

Es wird geschätzt, daß sich etwa 400 Elefanten in diesem Reservat aufhalten sowie Büffel, Roanantilopen, Säbelantilopen, Wasserböcke und Buschschweine. Kürzlich wurden sogar einige Giraffen angesiedelt. Man hat auch Leoparden und Paviane gesehen. Allgemein wird das Reservat als Paradies für Ornithologen und Botaniker beschrieben.

Diese Safaris im Bedford werden täglich, je nach Verlangen, von der Nord- und Südküste durchgeführt. Abfahrt erfolgt ca. 10 Uhr morgens, Rückfahrt gegen 7 Uhr abends, damit man einen unvergesslichen Sonnenuntergang in den Shimba Hills miterleben kann.

# Robinson Club verteilt Weihnachtsgeschenke
