### Underneath that warm exterior is a warm interior!

AFRO hair surrounding his broad and pleasant features, Peter Brent is back — and still in search of an identity. Most audiences think he already has it.

already has it.

Rich in voice, as smooth an entertainer as any who have been here in the last 10 years (and that includes Millie lackson), wiscoracking, ad-libbing, or just singing, Brent seems the self contained man, complete in himself.

Talking to him quietly, off the record, it's clear it's only the self disciplined impression created by a professional in every sense of the word.

Brent is a quester, an

every sense of the word.

Brent is a quester, an intelligent, questioning, self-seeking neurotic. The extrovert poise hides the introvert heart; the shy, the diffident and the insecure — as in every articulate creative personality — are all melded beneath the showbit exterior.

And of courses he have the

showbiz exterior.

And of course he has the butterflies which go with it. Doctors have told him he uses as much adrenalin in half an hour on stage as an office as an office clerk in a week.

Judging by the performance he's just finished at the Chateau, the elegant supper club atop the Nairobi Inter-continental, all of 70 minutes long, he should be in the intensive care unit down the road.

But he's fine. He's amazed, too, because with all this adrenalin burning away, and already at 38, there's no clear reason he can see as to why he should feel so fit.

He wanted to get away from the biography — he thought date of birth, hometown (it's Dagenham actually), first appearance and all that had already appeared in about twenty thousand different versions.

The way he stopped the reporting process was significant. It was imperialistic, autocratic without intention, a man who knew what he wanted as a professional. He even articulated it, precisely, by giving expression to what he was long desired. He wanted somebody to find the real Peter Brent.

In a way, that changes the

Peter Brent.

In a way, that changes the style of this column. If Mr Brent needs to discover himself he should really call on David Taylor, of Punch, the most intelligent and creative writer of show business personality profiles who has yet arisen.

We found some common round. Brent knows the rounds institutional life and in this e touched on a shared sperience for long ago I was municipal authority foster

He's back in Kenya for the fourth (or was it the fifthf) time after seven months in Hong Kong. A claustrophobic place. He even had a crack about wall-to-wall people just now in his act.

He's not looking for roots. He never knew his Jather. He broke contact with his adoptive mother when he was 27. But he's English, of that he has no doubts, no matter what his antecedents.

But he's more now, of course, after travelling the world — more than 30 countries in the last 10 years and like most itinerants he now finds the ordinary Englishman extraordinarily insular and bigotted.

The appeal he finds in Kenya is clear enough — a degree of social intercourse between all races and all classes not found anywhere else.

And something else. Three times he's established house records in the Chateau. And there's the seven months he spent running the Bacchus.

#### Sal Davis

Yes, he agrees, it feels like home. He first came in 1974 after Sal Davis saw him performing at the Lusaka intercontinental. He's just kept on coming back — always more popular, the act a little more polished than before each time. You have to improve, he points out. Performers have pressures within themselves and from outside from which there is no escape. If you want to stay at the top, you have to remember you're only as good as your last show.

He drinks little, he signs his own contracts with a hand-shake,

shake.

He turned down a lucrative cruise engagement because of his handshake to fulfil Christmas and the New Year at the intercontinental. He pretends to be the cynic. It's a crust to avoid the disappointments of someone who, when it mattered most, met only disappointments.

But underneath the bland

But underneath the bland, self-assured, successful performer the real Peter Brent is very visible.

Just a very nice guy who really doesn't want much more out of life than to entertain you. And to find that trust can be cherished, reciprocated and endure.

— and endure.

But don't take him for a ride please. He's in a tough enough business anyway and does he really need you when he's already sold out theatres and supper clubs around the world?

It's not something he voices. But it's there in his manner, his cloak of protection. But if he can trust you, there can't be many better people to have as a friend.

After all, you only have to

After all, you only have to hear him sing to know he's someone different.

VOI (K.N.A.) — A packed Voi court has been told how a group of rungu weilding administration policemen and prison warders threatened two police officers investigating the

theft of a radio/cassette

After hearing the evidence, Voi resident magistrate, Gacaku Gakuhi sentenced John Mwashigandi to six months for theft. Joel Kiprono Langat was acquitted.

Both had been charged with

stealing a radio/cassette player from Mr Hannington Juma of Bura Dogo Village in Taveta on March 20 last year.

acquitted.

The court was told that at around 8p.m., Mwashingandi an administration policeman attached to the Taveta D.O.'s office, and Langat, warder at the Taveta Detention Camp, went to the house of one Joshua Mokaya under the pretext of searching for smuggled.

On reaching the house, they found Mr Juma and Mr Mokaya there and said they were searching for a stolen radio/cassette player and bicycle hidden in the house.

After a fruitless search, they took Mr Juma's radio/cassette player, claiming that it was one of the smuggled items, the court heard

court heard.

Mr Juma said he showed a receipt of purchase but was told that if he did not hand over some 'chai' the matter would be taken to superiors.

The matter was reported to Taveta police the following day and two police officers set out to search the two men's houses.

to search the two men's houses. At Mwashigandi's house, the police officers were confronted by administration policemen and prison warders armed with fungus who ordered them to leave the premises.

The police officers retreated but Mwashigandi and Langat were later arrested and charged with the two offences.

Delivering judgement, Mr Cakuhi said he had acquitted both men of demanding money with menaces because the testimony of Mr Juma had not been corrobarated by any other prosecution witness.

He also said the case against

He also said the case against Langat on the theft count had not been proved beyond reasonable doubt.

#### **BIG DRIVE** TO RAISE **HARVESTS**

KILIFI (K.N.A.) — Agricultural growth will be the focus of Government action in 1980, Kilifi D.C. B. A. Omuse has announced.

"Much emphasis will be put on agriculture to ensure that the local people grow enough food to feed themselves and have a surplus for the nation", he said in a New Year message.

To implement the programme the Government had made available tractor hire services in the district He appealed to the farmers to make use of the service and plough their farms in time for the rains. He urged them to adapt new farming techniques and follow the instructions of agricultural extension staff.

The D.C. called on parents associations to redouble their efforts to provide decent classrooms and teachers' houses. He noted with concern that in some pupils were learning under trees.

Mr Omuse warned that the District Education Board would be meeting early next year to probe all the parents' associations and action would be taken against dormant ones.

He promised to support the Government in ensuring that all commodities are distributed to the wananchi without discrimination.


Mr Bujra, who is a businessman and a farmer, called on the Government to speed up investigations into the mangrove exportation ban and give permission to the wananchi to resume the business.

MR MATIBA, welcome back to the Coast. You are down here this time to witness the first anniversary celebrations of Africans Sea Lodge. Can you briefly explain what this project is and how it's tied up with the Alliance Hotels Group, of which you are the chairman!

the chairman?

A.S.L. is, of course, part of the Alliance Croup of Hotels. It is located immediately next to Jadini because we owned Jadini initially, then we acquired the next door plot, and two years ago, we thought we should develop the second plot because we saw a need for more accommodation for tourists at the Coast. So we embarked on the project and it is now complete, and in fact running to the end of its first year. It has been a very very successful project, The construction of A.S.L. took six months — and received its first guests on December 23, 1978, and has more or less been full ever since. In fact we have had to carry out an expansion programme since we opened, and we are now embarking on a second expansion programme to bring the hotel to its maximum capacity.

Alliance Hotels is not just the Coast, if's also

Alliance Hotels is not just the Coast, it's also elsewhere in Kenya. Have you found this 'success' is true of tourism everywhere in Kenya or is it only at the Coast that this tremendous expansion has gone on?

Kenya or is it only at the Coast that this tremendous expansion has gone on!

I think it is true to say that the boom is mainly at the Coast. Up-country, particularly in Nairobi, the situation has been different, mainly because Nairobi over-expanded its bed capacity several years ago when all the tourists coming to Kenya were stopping in Nairobi. When Mombasa's Moi International Airport was opened, it meant that most of the tourists from Europe came direct to Mombasa with these charter flights and Nairobi suddenly found itself with extra capacity that it could not utilise. There are signs that the situation is improving, but I am afraid it's very, very slow. In fact the situation has been made worse by the fact that the Kenyatta Conference Centre, which was expected to bring in a lot of people into Nairobi, is under-utilised at the moment. There aren't as many conferences as we had anticipated coming into Nairobi. The net result is that we are now finding it difficult to fill our hotels. There is an element of undercutting in Nairobi, in that most of the hotels, including the top class hotels, are underpricing themselves just to try and attract business; one way or another, which is not good business. I am the chairman of the Association of Hotelkeepers and Caterers, and in that capacity, I have been talking to the Government regarding the promotion of Kenyatta Conference Centre. I regret that we have not been able to find a solution to that problem, but it needs to be done and it must be done. It must be tackled vigorously now, otherwise the hotels in Nairobi are going to find themselves in financial difficulties for a long time to come, which is unnecessary. We have all the facilities and we feel that they should be promoted and be fully utilised.

Do you see your Group expanding further at the Coastf A new hotel on the North

Do you see your Group expanding further at the Coast? A new hotel on the North Coast perhaps?

Well, we have good possibilities of expanding on the North Coast because we have a very good site, for example, on the North Coast, but we have not considered that, in fact if we could get another site on the South Coast when we have tinally completed the expansion and all facilities in Jadini and AS-L. we would still develop the South Coast first, because it is the "im place" and it's very, very popular indeed. Of course we suffer certain drawbacks here. The Likoni Ferry is a problem. It tends to discourage people from coming particularly locals, they just feel that it is easier to go to the north because there is a bridge and now it's going to be even better because of the new bridge that's going across the channel there.

Mr Matiba, you're a man of many parts. You are also the chairman of the Kenya Breweries and in the last few weeks you have been actively involved in this new Premium beer. How has it gone?

It has been received extremely well, very, very well indeed. I'm very happy at the way

snat we nave not been able to satisfy the demand. Naturally, because we didn't know how it would be received, we did not brew a lot of it or bottle a lot of it. Now, we are in a very embarrassed position because we cannot satisfy the demand. Mind you, it's been a very pleasant embarrassment, as far as I am concerned

Are the Breweries doing something to get sufficient supplies to meet demand?

Oh, yes, Oh, yes we are, Oh, really! Judging from the comments people make, I think there are a lot of people who are more or less permanently changing, to the brand, and we must, therefore, be in a position to continue supplies in adequate quantities.

Are these new beer drinkers, or are they regulars' switching from the old brands?

A lot of them are switching.

You haven't noticed a decline in some of your other beerst

your other beers?

Not yet, not so far. Let it not be forgotten that in fact, our original intention in establishing this new product, was to capture export markets overseas. That remains our objective and our plans now are that we shall try the product on the local market for several months before we start our export drive or campaign. After that, we will try and get as many markets as we possibly can — the United States, Europe — and we know we will have to be competitive.

There is 'informed talk' that the Breweries may be expanding the Kisumu side, is that right?

right!

Well, we are — well, it's not just that we might, we are already fully committed to start the construction of the Kisumu brewery. In fact, we have already ordered bottling lines, we are ordering other machinery as we go along. We have now started going out for tenders for some of the buildings, and we hope that by the end of February or early March we shall be laying the foundation stone of the brewery, so that it is completed, ready for production by the end of 1981 or the

You are still recalled as "Mr Football" in Kenya, even though you may be over that now, how do you see our sports future in this Olympic year? Do you have any suggestions or ideas or opinions on this at the moment?

Olympic year! Do you have any suggestions or ideas or opinions on this at the moment!

Yes, because once a sportsman, always a sportsman, although I have no desire to comment on tootball as such because it's a sore subject and I would rather not get involved in it. Being the immediate past schairman of the K.F.F. I would prefer to keep out of the football controversies. Generally speaking, on the whole, what I feel about sporting events in Kenya is that more could be done than is being done at the moment. I am always in touch with sports administrators and I am afraid I must express my concern at the way the Government, you know, particular government officials, handle our sporting activities. We have tremendous potential in almost every field in this country, be it boxing, swimming, soccer, athletics, the potential is terrific, but we have never really found a systematic and effective way of harnessing that potential In athletics, for example, our stars are almost discovered by accident. Very often one doesn't seem to detect a systematic method of discovering the talent that is there. And I remain critical of this because I feel so much more could be done without necessarily having to incur a lot of costs. Even encouragement alone, verbal encouragement, and those authorities responsible being seen to take interest in the sport or sporting activities, that in itself would draw more people to participate in these activities. At the moment that is not apparent. It is not apparent that, for example,

the Atinister for Sport will go to a district and attend a sports meeting and therefore draw a lot of interest and get youngsters enthusiastic get them to be seen to be wanting to show somebody, a higher authority, a senior government official, what they can do. That to me is sadly lacking. And it is not only now, I mean, it has been sadly lacking for a long time. I remember when I was the chairman of soccer, it was so very difficult to get senior officials to come and attend even our international matches, let alone local competitions, and that to me is a mistake, and that does not cost a lot of money to do that. In fact, I always say that just counting on the expenses of the officials who might be travelling around, if competitions were to be organised and senior officials attend those competitions, such enthusiasm will be generated that we will begin to see a change. But when sports organisers, you know none of them are paid, no officials of any of the sporting organisations are paid, when they see themselves struggling to sponsor competitions, to solicit for donations, to assist their own particular sport, and then the authorities do not seem to be interested in even coming to give them encouragement, then they get discouraged, they get disheartened and they cease to be enthusiastic. That to me is the problem.

problem:

Now, lets come to international sports, I know we have been publicly committed to host the All Africa Games in two years' or three years' time because His Excellency the President told the president of the Supreme-Council for Sports in Africa that Kenya would host the All Africa Games. I am extremely worried about that commitment and the timing of it. If we are going to do that in the next three or even four years, we should be committing ourselves now. In fact, I would go as far as saying that we should have been committed by not to be starting work on establishing the necessary facilities for that.

Such as the stadium. And unless that can

Such as the national stadium!

Such as the stadium. And unless that can be done, that commitment can be done immediately. I fear that we are not going to be able to handle the situation within the time which the S.C.S.A. would like us to stage this competition. I am sure we can't, it's not going to be possible, certainly not by 1982, even 1983. And, generally speaking, let's face it, they normally give countries which are going to stage these games six years at least to prepare. Now why Kenya has suddenly found itself being given three years. I can't understand, but it's not for me to take up this, I'm just sounding a caution about this because I feel that either Kenya commits itself to a realistic date and then it starts work now, or it gives notice straight away that we are going to be unable to do what the Supreme Council would want within the time they have set us. If we don't do that we are going to find ourselves in a very embarrassing position in the not too distant future.

Now, Olympics. I am hopeful that we are going to do well in the Olympics. I think we should; my assessment is that if we can be selective and if we can intensify our selection so that we only send the best we can still achieve a very high ranking by having the top few winning getting gold medals, and if we got ten gold medals, we would obviously rank very high. All right, we may not be one of the first four, five or even ten, but to be even within the first twenty would be very good. It's the new year and we are faced with competitions now, I am sure the Sports Council are alive to the fact that they've got to get cracking and they don't have much time to waste.

Finally you are the man who brought Pele to

Finally you are the man who brought Pele to Kenya. Are we going to see the return of this football maestro through your sponsorship again?

again?

Well, I have been in touch with Pele. I try to keep in touch with him although he is very busy and I am equally busy myself running my own affairs. I think probably we stand a chance of seeing Pele coming here as a visitor. I try and interest him in business here so even if he comes I don't think he will be very much inclined to be on the sporting side, but I'm sure if he comes here and we have a football match he would possibly like just to go and watch. So I am hopeful that we'll see him back here in time.

The council's toughest task will obviously be to find a source of revenue. Projects such as the new road to the Shelly Beach area on the South Coast have been stalled because of lack of revenue. Most of council's services have also been affected by this factor.

It would be unrealistic to expect quick changes under the circumstances. However, we hope that the Mayor's considerable experience will help the council to overcome the diffi-culties facing it.

### West Germany's 1980 Election

Nuclear energy, nuclear weapons, the envi-ronment and inflation are the issues in West Germany. The political campaigns there are on the same schedule as in the United States, moving toward national elections next fall. But the choices are clearer for Germans than But the choices are clearer for Germans than they are for Americans. German voters al-ready know who the candidates for chancel-lor will be; the parties have chosen their lead-ers, and there is nothing like the long U.S. ritual of the primaries. The other great differ-ence is, of course, that geography and history draw the choices much more tightly for the

Germans.

Take, for example, nuclear energy. Many Americans wonder whether the country should not stop building power reactors altogether. Helmut Schmidt, Germany's chancelor and a Social Democrat, crisply argued that for Germany there is no alternative to nuclear energy. All of Germany's oil is imported, and it possesses nothing like the huge U.S. reserves of coal. Without nuclear reactors, the chancellor argues, there will be little economic growth of any sort for West Germany. Without growth, there is no way to finance social advances — either for the West Germans or for the poorer countries to the south that depend crucially on expanding markets in the industrial world.

The sharpest opposition to the West German reactors comes from the environmentalists who have now organized themselves into what they call the Green Party. But the Greens are in an awkward position. If they press their campaign, they might conceivably defeat Mr. Schmidt — bringing into power a fiercely conservative government led by the irrepressible Franz Josef Strauss. In his skill

and his appeal to nationalism, Mr. Strauss

and his appeal to nationalism, Mr. Strauss occupies a place on the political compass that is, for example, roughly similar to John Connally's in the United States.

In much the same way, circumstance constrains the debate over the emplacement of new nuclear rockets in West Germany. Chancellor-Schmidt observes that you cannot negotiate arms control with the Russians unless you have arms. Over the past autumn the Russians attempted to intimidate West Germany on the rocket decision, but the tactic Russians attempted to intimidate west Ger-many on the rocket decision, but the tactic failed. There are not many West Germans who would really have wanted it otherwise — certainly not Mr. Strauss and the conserva-tive coalition that he leads.

But there is a good deal of tension within the Social Democratic Party itself, where the left wing feels itself isolated from the main thrust of government policy. The left knows that the government will probably win again next year, under Chancellor Schmidt's leadership. It also knows that any attempt to push him toward a more marked socialism would be fatal to the party itself.

West Germany's wealth and standard of living have increased enormously during these past 10 years under Social Democratic chancellors. That, paradoxically, has left West Germany less inclined than ever to so-cialist experimentation. Recent experience has apparently confirmed the West German predisposition toward a careful pragmatism that assigns high value to stability. Perhaps it is a general rule of politics that prosperity tends to diminish the appeals of party doctrine and program.

In London, the Brandt Commission, appointed to inject a greater sense of urgency into the struggle to close the gap between rich and poor nations outlined a strategy to avert what is called an impending world catastrophe. But at about the same time in the Venezuelan capital, caracas, OPEC, the 13-nation cartel of major oil exporters, were inflicting yet another blow on the global economy. Arguing that the minimum price should be raised to \$34 a barrel, the Libyan delegate declared: "The industrialised world can pay what we ask".

This assessment seemed to ignore the fact that proportionately, the worst hit victims of the soaring cost of oil since 1974 have been the vast majority of developing

President Nyerere of Tanzania underlined this fact

in a speech in Dar es Salaam. He said that his country, which had to import every drop of oil, espected to use 700,000 tonnes nest year. This was 100,000 tonnes less than in 1972, but the cost would be ten times greater.

He added that as Tanzanians would be using up more than half their foreign exchange on buying oil, they would have to go without some non-essential commodities.

The Brandt Commission, formally known as the Independent Commission on International Development Issues, was appointed two years ago with the former West German Chancellor, Herr Willy Brandt as its chairman. Its members include two former Prime Ministers, Edward Heath of Britain, and Sweden's Olof Palme, together with leading political and economic figures from the Third World of the developing countries.

Among these is the Commonwealth Secretary-General, Shridath Ramphal. The Soviet Union and its East European allies were invited but did not take part in the deliberations.

The Commission is the brain-child of the President of the World Bank, Mr Robert McNamara, and its report will be published when it is presented to the United Nations' Secretary-General, Dr kurt Waldheim, in February.

However, judging from the outline presented by Herr Brandt, it is clear that the document will have a considerable impact on the international stage, and its major proposals will stimulate widespread discussion.

The commission warns that

The commission warns that because of problems such as food shortages, the arms race and the instability of the world financial system, "urgent and drastic steps must be taken to avert impending catastrophe".

Its suggested remedy is a four-pronged strategy which would include a large-scale transfer of funds to the Third World; an agreement on the

#### New methods of raising funds

Apart from contributions from the richer countries based on their relative wealth — and the participation of the Soviet bloc is assumed — new methods of raising funds should

be tried.

One way, says the commission, would be to impose a modest levy on international trade, on the exploitation of minerals from the seabed, and on arms purchases — "the most wasteful of all forms of spending".

#### GATHER YE TAXES, WHILE YE MAY'

THE following is the first of a series of articles on income tax, aimed at explaining to readers their obligations as taxpayers.

AS we move into another year, the tax gathering season is with us again, and during the next few days many readers will receive income tax return forms through the post.

The accompanying notice requires each taxpayer to complete this form, showing the income received from all sources during 1979, and to return the form to the Income Tax Department within 30 days.

Lateness in returning this form is permissible, if the taxpayer can show good reason for it, for example being out of Kenya on a business trip at the time the form was issued.

Income Tax Department rarely
invokes its powers in this

No action was taken, and so long as the return forms are submitted within a reasonable time, the Income Tax Department is not unduly worried.

In fact, if all the return forms of Kenyan taxpayers were submitted by the end of January, it is unlikely that the department would have sufficient manpower to handle them all immediately.

them all immediately.

If you don't receive a tax return form, don't think that you're going to get away without paying any tax this year, since the Income Tax Act requires anyone not receiving a return form by the end of April to notify the Commissioner within 14 days.

Failure to do so can result in similar penalties to not submitting the return form at all.

As a result of last year's Finance Act there is a great incentive to complete one's tax affairs as quickly as possible, since any tax not paid by the due date is subject to an interest penalty of 15 per cent.
